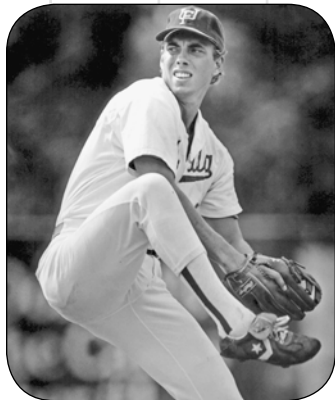
Three-year starting shortstop Justin Tardi signed professionally with the Cincinnati Reds after earning second-team All-South Region and second-team All-SEC honors in '05.

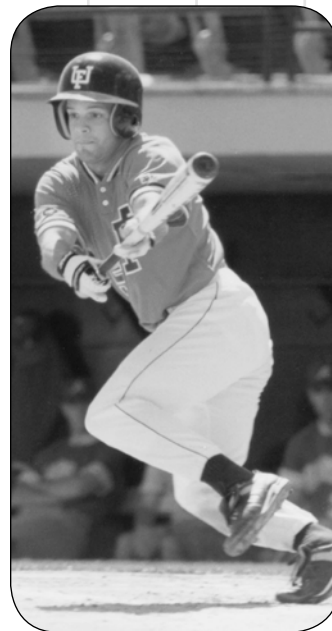
Jim Watkins was the initial Gator to be taken in the first round when he was chosen by the Atlanta Braves in the 1978 draft.

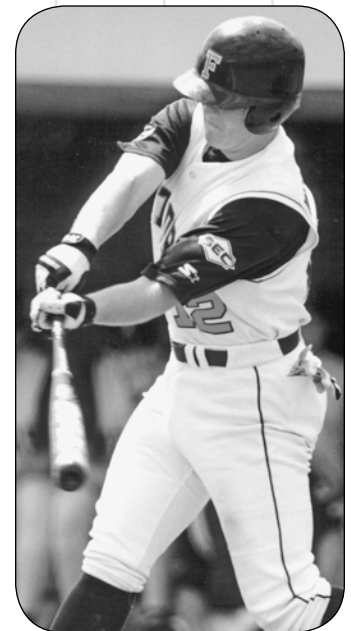
