AS A FRESHMAN (2008): Second-team All-South Region and first-team All-SEC pick at second base who was also a member of the league's All-Freshman Team...Became the first rookie from Florida to earn first-team All-SEC kudos since 1991, when pitcher Marc Valdes collected the honor...Achieved Freshman All-America status from three different organizations: Baseball America, Rivals.com and the Louisville Slugger team chosen by Collegiate Baseball... Started 57 games for the Gators at five different positions (30-2B, 18-3B, 4-LF, 4-CF, 1-RF) and hit .330, fifth on the club...Led UF in slugging percentage (.536) and doubles (17) and tied for second in homers (eight)...Also ranked second on the squad in on-base percentage (.430) and RBI (51)...26 of his 69 hits went for extra bases and he was 11-for-15 on the basepaths...Adams totaled 21 multiple-hit games and 12 multiple-RBI outings...Third on the Orange and Blue in SEC play with a .354 clip and had a team-high 27 RBI, 22 runs, 10 doubles and five homers...Was 0-for-4 at NCAA Regionals but tied for the team lead with three runs...Was 1-for-7 (.143) at the SEC Tournament, with a single against South Carolina...Helped UF sweep No. 13 Vanderbilt by going 5-for-12 (.417) and driving in four runs... Also scored three runs and drew a pair of walks in the series...Cranked a two-run homer in the fourth inning of the game three to bring UF within 7-3...Delivered an RBI single in the fifth and

scored on Bryson Barber's game-tying three-run homer...Stroked a base-hit in the 11th before Jon Townsend's walk-off single and was 3-for-6... Went 2-for-3 and notched an RBI single against Bethune-Cookman...Hit 4-for-11 (.364) on the weekend versus Georgia, with a double and a home run...Tied for a team-high four runs scored and drew three walks...Started the first game at Kentucky at second base, made two starts at third and saw time at shortstop when Cole Figueroa was injured...Was 3-for-11 (.273) with four walks and three runs...Led Florida at the plate against Arkansas by going 6-for-11 (.545) with three RBI and three doubles...Went 2-for-4 in the finale with a two-run single in the fourth inning...His 3-for-4 effort keyed Saturday's 6-1 win...Continued to produce in league play, going 5-for-12 (.417) at Tennessee with five RBI... Started UF's second triple play of the season in the fifth inning...Went 3-for-5 and drove in three runs in game two, featuring a two-run homer... Had two doubles and drove in two runs during the opener...Opened the Jacksonville series with a career-high four hits and matched his personal best of five RBI by going 4-for-5...Mashed a three-run homer in the fifth inning of the finale with No. 8 Ole Miss...Chosen as the SEC Freshman of the Week after an impressive .727 (8-for-11) league debut in the sweep of Auburn...Tallied three multi-hit efforts and reached base 10 times in 13 plate appearances...Drove in a team-high six runs and smacked three doubles...Delivered a first-inning single to help the Gators draw first blood in the finale...Cranked a three-run homer in the first stanza of game two, added an RBI single in the second and a double in the fourth... Finished 3-for-4 with two runs and a stolen base in the opener...Hit .400 (4-for-10) with four runs and three walks against Brown...Contributed a sixth-inning RBI double in the 6-2 win at Miami (Fla.)...Opened his collegiate career by starting all three games in center field versus Siena...Batted .333 (4-for-12) with a team-high seven RBI and was 2-for-2 on the basepaths...Saved his best performance for the finale, when he belted a grand slam on a 3-2 pitch with two outs in the third inning and later added a solo shot in the fifth stanza...Added a two-out, two-run single as part of Florida's four-run outburst in the sixth that snapped a 6-6 tie on the way to a 10-7 victory in Kevin O'Sullivan's head coaching debut.

HIGH SCHOOL: Earned a pair of state championships in 2005 and 2007 while playing for head coach Gil Morales at Eagle's View Academy... Chosen by the Minnesota Twins in the 30th round of the 2007 Major League Baseball Draft with the 932nd choice...Current Gator assistant

Hit .352 with 28 RBI in his freshman season...A three-time Offensive Most Valuable Player for the Warriors, Adams claimed the "Triple Crown" of leading EVA in batting average, homers and

RBI in 2004 and 2005...He was the MVP of the 2006 Osceola Invitational and earned a Gold Glove at the 2005 Westminster Tournament.

AS A JUNIOR (2008): Member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the second time... Selected in the 40th round of the Major League Baseball Draft by the Washington Nationals with the 1,201st pick... A second-team All-SEC selection, Barnes led UF in a variety of offensive categories, including batting average (.360), on-base percentage (.434), hits (81), runs (65), stolen bases (26-for-29), triples (four) and sacrifice hits (four)... Ranked second on the club with 23 multiple-hit games, tied for third with 29 walks and was fourth with 11 doubles... Started 55 games, 53 in left field and two as the designated hitter... Hit .357 (5-for-14) during the series sweep of Vanderbilt and tied for the team lead with four runs... Erupted for a 4-for-5 effort in the opener and delivered a clutch two-out single in the eighth with the score tied... Was a home run shy of the cycle with a 3-for-5 performance in the 12-2 victory over USF... Led the Gators in hitting at a .615 clip (8-for-13) at South Carolina and with five runs scored... Paced UF with a .563 (9-for-16) showing at Kentucky and was 8 for his last 11 (.727) over the final two games... Became the first Gator since Jeff Corzaletti (vs. UCF on March 22, 2005) to have five hits when

he was 5-for-6 in game two... Continued hot streak with team-leading .444 (4-for-9) showing in the two games against North Florida... Delivered his first sac fly of the season in the 3-2 win after contributing three hits and two thefts in the opener... Enjoyed visit to Tennessee with a .500 (6-for-12) average, five RBI and a pair of three-hit games... Helped UF salvage the finale by going 3-for-3 with three runs, including a solo homer... Three of his five career HR have come against the Vols... Went 2-for-4 with two infield hits in the finale with LSU... Career-high 14-game hitting streak ended at Jacksonville... Led the Gators with three hits in the 6-1 triumph over Florida State... Tripled and scored the winning run in the eighth inning on Cole Figueroa's sac fly to down FGCU, 2-1... Tied for the team lead with a .500 (4-for-8) performance during the series with Brown... Delivered a bases-loaded, pinch-hit walk-off single to give UF an 8-7 win to salvage a split of Saturday's doubleheader... Went 6-for-9 (.667) in the doubleheader sweep of Eastern Michigan, with three hits in each contest... Was 3-for-5 and matched a career high with four runs scored in the nightcap... Belted his first homer of the year with a two-run shot in the eighth of game two and set a single-game best with two stolen bases... Had two multiple-hit games in the season-opening series against Siena, including a 2-for-5, two-run effort on opening night.

AS A SOPHOMORE (2007): Earned Academic All-SEC recognition... Started 37 games in four different positions (26-2B, 9-CF, 1-LF, 1-DH) and played in 47 games... Hit .293 with 40 runs, 27 RBI and drew 18 walks... Had nine multiple-hit games... Was 4-for-6 on the basepaths... Was 16-for-64 (.250) with 18 RBI and 17 runs in 19 SEC games... Had a spectacular finish to the regular season against Tennessee, going 6-for-11 (.545)... Entered the second matchup with the Vols boasting one homer and a total of 15 RBI... Enjoyed the game of his life, tying Florida and SEC records by driving in 10 runs in the Gators' 20-2 win... Connected on a grand slam in the second inning and later belted a three-run shot in the eighth inning... His 10 RBI matched Adam Davis' school record that was set in the second meeting with Tennessee during the 2005 series... The four runs equaled his personal best set the week before in Baton Rouge... Set a career high with four runs and was 2-for-6 with a stolen base in the 19-3 romp over the Tigers...

Was 3-for-3 with an RBI double and drew a career-high three walks in the 16-7 win over No. 1 Florida State in Jacksonville... Went 6-for-13 (.462) and scored seven runs during the sweep of George Washington... Finished 3-for-5 in the come-from-behind win at USF.

AS A FRESHMAN (2006): Started three games at second base and played in 15 games as a rookie... Batted .227 (5-for-22) with four runs and an RBI... Finished 2-for-8 (.250) in SEC play... Went 1-for-4 with a run and notched his first RBI in the 4-1 win over Texas A&M on March 4... Collected his first collegiate hit with a bunt single in the seventh inning versus Florida State and scored when Adam Davis was hit with the bases loaded... Saw his first action in the final game of The Pepsi Baseball Classic against Wake Forest on Feb. 26.

SUMMER: Played for the Anchorage Glacier Pilots of the Alaska Baseball League in the summer of 2007... Batted .284 in 20 games with 18 runs and was 14-for-15 on the basepaths... Enjoyed a tremendous '06 season playing for Altamonte Springs of the Florida Collegiate Summer League, where he was ranked as the eighth-best prospect by Baseball America... Finished second in the league with a .361 batting average and ranked first in both runs scored (37) and stolen bases (24 thefts in 27 opportunities)... Was presented with the Tim Raines Sr. Base Stealing Champ award as the FGSL's top thief... Among the league leaders, Barnes rated third in doubles

(nine), fourth in hits (39) and RBI (24), fifth in total bases (56), sixth in slugging percentage (.519) and seventh in on-base percentage (.413).

HIGH SCHOOL: Four-year letterwinner at Santa Fe High School for head coach Todd Gray... Batted .500 with 32 stolen bases, 32 RBI and 10 doubles as a senior en route to earning the Florida Dairy Farmers' Class 3A Player of the Year... Participated in the 2005 Florida Athletic Coaches' Association All-Star Game in Sebring for the North team... Named as one of the 2004-05 Athletes of the Year by The Gainesville Sun... A first-team all-state and all-area selection as a junior on the diamond, Barnes batted .398, scored 29 runs, totaled 25 RBI and swiped 24 bases... AS A SOPHOMORE (2008): Made the SEC Academic Honor Roll for the first time... Made 18 appearances and tied for third on the Gators with 11 starts... Was 4-5 with a 5.01 earned run average and led the club with 63 strikeouts in 82.2 innings... Held opponents to a .277 average, second-lowest by a Florida starter... Had a 3-1 record in SEC play, registered a 4.43 ERA in 10 appearances and started nine of the 10 conference series... Appeared in both games of the NCAA Tallahassee Regional, working 1.2 scoreless innings against Florida State and taking the loss to Tulane... Started the SEC Tournament elimination game versus South Carolina and suffered the defeat (1.1 IP, 6 H, 5 R)... Went seven innings in back-to-back outings against Vanderbilt (May 15) and Alabama (May 9)... Tied his career high of seven strikeouts over 5.1 innings and picked up the 9-3 victory at No. 12 South Carolina that began the series... Established a personal best with seven K in the first meeting with fifth-ranked Georgia... Scattered 10 hits and two earned runs in the dramatic come-from-behind triumph over LSU... Tossed a career-long eight innings at No. 8 Ole Miss, allowing five hits and four runs, but was

not involved in the decision... Started UF's league opener against Auburn and delivered 6.1 innings of one-run ball to earn his first career conference win... Bullock's first four appearances of the year were from the bullpen... This was highlighted by a six-inning stint on opening night against Siena in which he allowed just one run and had six K... The Orange and Blue notched a 10-7 win in Kevin O'Sullivan's head coaching debut and Bullock collected the decision.

AS A FRESHMAN (2007): All 15 of Bullock's appearances in his first season were starts, including 10 in SEC play... Finished 2-7 with a 6.31 ERA in 61.1 innings... Registered 37 strikeouts and issued 24 walks... Did not receive a decision in the 5-4 win over Kentucky on April 22 despite holding the high-powered Wildcats to one run on five hits over five innings... Limited Georgia to one run in 5.2 innings of work as the Gators completed a weekend sweep of the Bulldogs with a 3-2 decision in 11 frames... Fired five scoreless innings in the 20-3 romp over George Washington in the series finale... Tossed a season-high seven innings and totaled six strikeouts in the 1-0 setback to Kent State on Feb. 25... Collected the Gators' initial win of the campaign in his first start, a 7-0 shutout of VMI... Struck out four Keydets and gave up four hits over 5.2 innings.

HIGH SCHOOL: Four-year letterwinner at Riverview High School for head coach Bill Leiby... Served as captain during his senior year... Selected in the 20th round of the 2006 Major League Baseball Draft with the 593rd pick by the Los Angeles Dodgers... Established single-game school record with 16 strikeouts during the '06 season... Hampered by a rib injury as a junior, he was 2-0 on the mound and registered a 1.17 ERA in 18 innings... Was tabbed as a 2005 Louisville Slugger Preseason All-American... 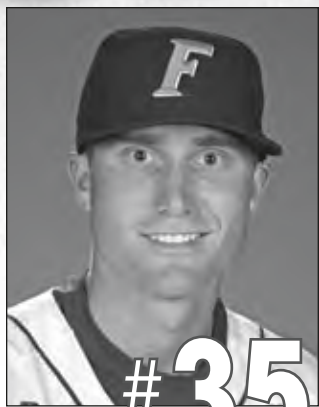

AS A FRESHMAN (2007): Made 19 appearances and six starts in his first collegiate season... Was 2-1 with 27 strikeouts and 22 walks in 38.1 innings... Threw 2.1 scoreless innings in the 5-3 setback to No. 7 South Carolina at the SEC Tournament... Kept Tennessee off the scoreboard over 2.1 innings in the regular-season finale... Worked a total of 3.2 innings in the series at top-ranked Vanderbilt and permitted only one run... Notched three strikeouts in two innings of work in the 5-4 victory at No. 1 Florida State on April 18... Collected the win over the Seminoles in Jacksonville on April 3 with two scoreless frames in which he issued three walks and totaled a pair of K... Chapman's first six appearances were mid-week starts against Florida A&M, Florida State, USF, Jacksonville, Army and Bethune-Cookman... 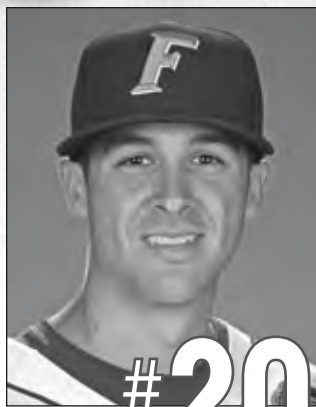

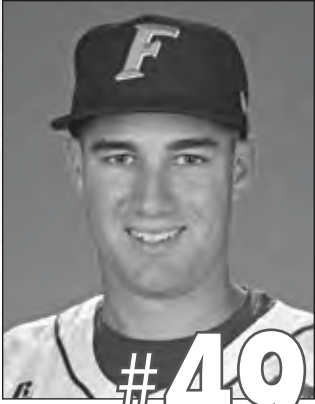

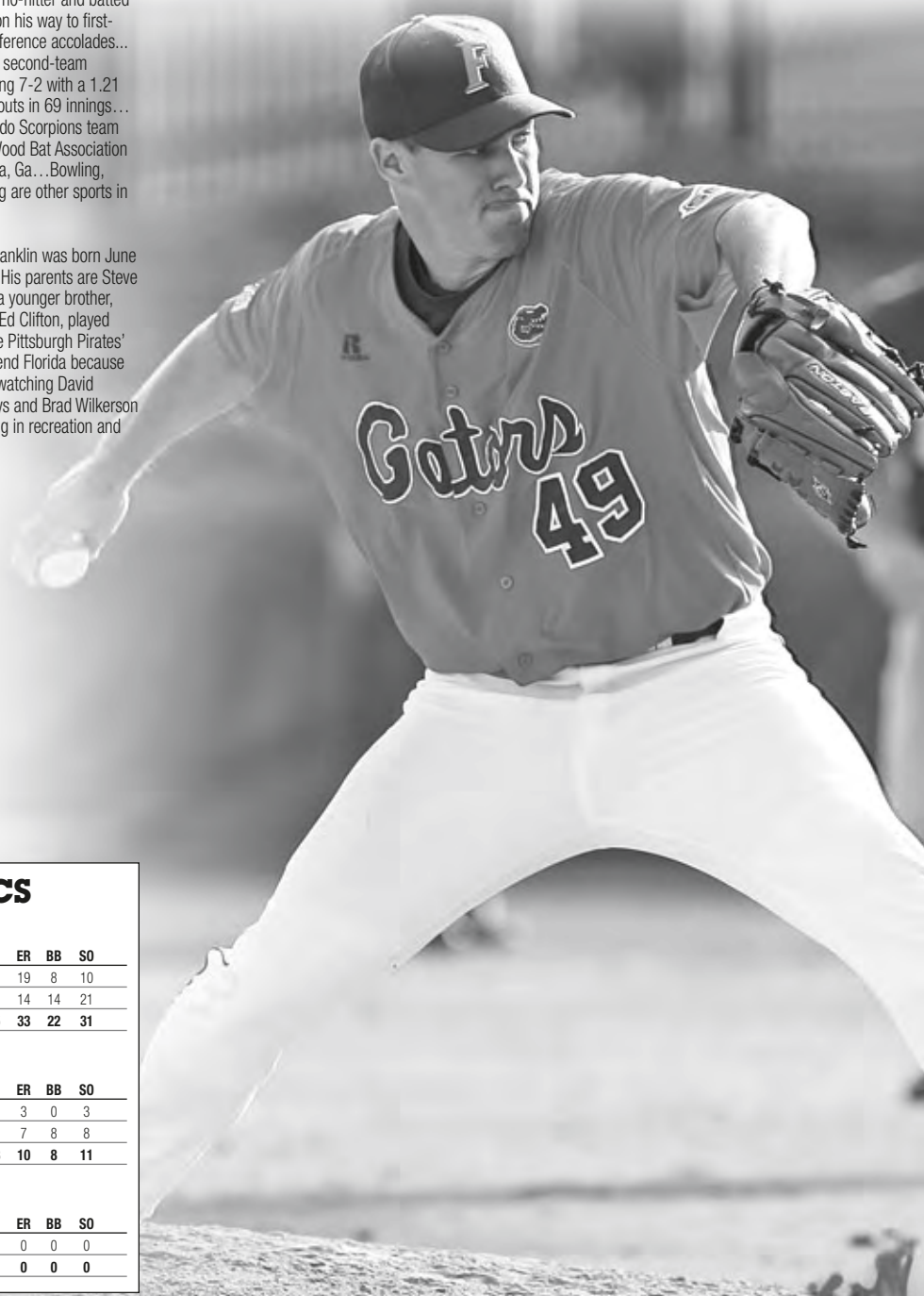

AS A JUNIOR (2008): Became the first Gator pitcher to achieve first-team All-South Region and first-team All-SEC status since Justin Hoyman in 2004 after compiling a 7-0 league ledger with a 3.28 earned run average in nine starts... Member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll... Made a team-high 14 starts and was 8-1 overall with a 4.16 ERA... Also had three appearances out of the bullpen... Was second on the club with 52 strikeouts and his 84.1 innings led the team... Claimed his first seven league starts and was named the SEC Pitcher of the Week following a complete-game effort in a victory over eventual Western Division champion and World Series participant LSU at the end of March... Was an unblemished 5-0 at McKethan Stadium with a 1.88 ERA...
