Overcoming adversity and building character are adjectives that often replace victories and achievements.

The Florida basketball team had its share of both in the 2000-01 season. Florida also had its share of faith.

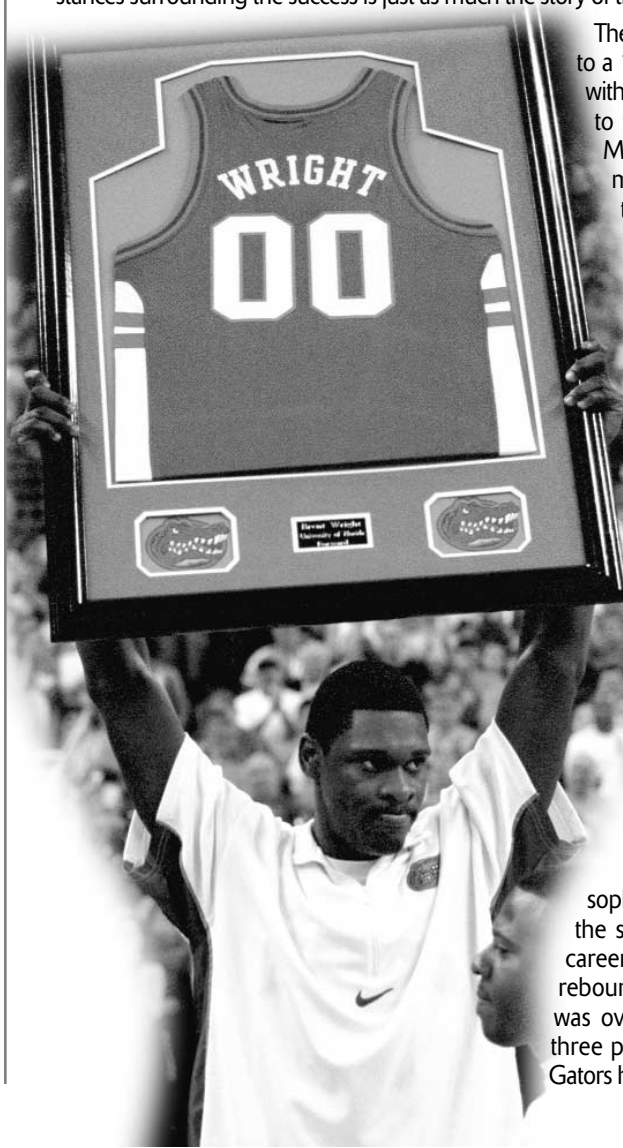
The final tally showed a school-record tying third-straight NCAA Tournament appearance, the first back-to-back Southeastern Conference Championships in school history and a school-record tying third straight 20-win season. Florida won its opening round game in the NCAA Tournament for the third straight year and for the first time in school history. The final ranking of No. 8 in the Associated Press Poll was the highest in school history and its current school record streak of 43 consecutive weeks is fifth longest in the nation. The 24 victories was the second best total in school history and Florida was ranked wire-to-wire in the polls for the second consecutive season.

There is no doubt it was a very successful campaign – one that continues to solidify the University of Florida as one of the premier basketball programs in the nation – but the circumstances surrounding the success is just as much the story of the 2000-01 season.

The season began with Florida racing off to a 10-1 start before conference action, with the lone loss coming in East Lansing to the defending National Champion Michigan State Spartans. Florida moved up to a program best No. 5 in the January 1st Associated Press Poll with the defending Southeastern Conference Champions set open up league play on the road at South Carolina.

Before the game in Columbia, the Gators learned they would be without the services of senior co-captain Brent Wright, who was averaging a 15.0 points per game and 6.8 rebounds per game. But Wright, who suffered a stress fracture in his left foot that sidelined him for at least three weeks, was more about scoring points and rebounding. He was the front man on the ferocious press and usually was matched up with the opponent’s top scorer in the half-court. But most of all, Wright was the heart and soul of the Gator team.

Without Wright in the SEC opener, sophomore Matt Bonner stepped into the starting lineup and posted his first career double double (18 points, 15 rebounds) in his first career start. His play was overshadowed by a buzzer beating three pointer by Travis Kraft that sent the Gators home with a 69-68 loss.



Back in Gainesville, the news got worse. Junior shooting sensation Teddy Dupay was discovered with a herniated disk in his lower back and surgery scheduled to sideline him until mid-February. Florida traveled to Starkville, Mississippi with just eight scholarship players, looking for a victory in a building where they had won only once in the 1990s.

The Gators trailed by seven at halftime and by as many as 12 during the game and appeared to be well on their way to an 0-2 start in conference play. A 15-0 run in the second half sparked a Gator comeback and Brett Nelson's 18-foot jumper with just a half second to go gave UF an improbable 81-80 win.

Even with eight scholarship players available, the prospects still looked bright with four of the next five games at the O'Connell Center, where UF had won 36 of its last 38 games, including 13 in a row.

Despite playing in front of the Rowdy Reptiles, Florida found itself down by as many as 10 points to Georgia in the conference home opener. Another late Florida flurry got the Gators back in the game. With just over a minute left it appeared the Gators would take the lead after a Justin Hamilton steal at halfcourt and two-on-one fastbreak. As the high flying Hamilton drove to the basket his left ACL tore. The Gators lost possession of the ball, the game and Hamilton for the season.

With three starters gone from the lineup and the team suffering three injuries in less than two weeks, the Gators limped back to the court three days later against Vanderbilt. With seven scholarship players Florida still had a chance to win the game, but Orien Greene's length-of-court run and layup fell short at the buzzer. Florida lost consecutive contests for the first time in a school record 60 games and fell to 1-3 in league play.

The Gators got some good news in the next game at Auburn, as Wright returned to the court and saw 13 minutes of action. Greene atoned for his miss against Vanderbilt with two key free throws in the last minute and Udonis Haslem and Brett Nelson scored 32 of UF's 41 second half points. Auburn had several last-second attempts to tie the contest, but UF escaped with a 65-63 win – Florida's fifth consecutive game decided in the last minute.

Florida avenged the conference opening loss to South Carolina with a 69-57 win over the Gamecocks in Gainesville and a Tuesday tilt with No. 8 Tennessee was on the horizon. Just 20 days after his back surgery, Dupay makes a surprise appearance in the game and sparked UF to an 81-67 victory over the Vols.

The victory jump started Florida's season ending run in which it won 11 of its 12 final games with the lone loss coming in Lexington on a Tayshaun Prince last second shot. Along the way, UF won a school-record six consecutive won against ranked opponents and racked up a school-record six conference wins on the road. During the stretch, Florida lost Wright to a fractured thumb for one game and then he aggravated his stress fracture, which ended his season.

Before a sell-out record crowd and a bundle of faith in their hearts, Florida secured a share of its second consecutive SEC Championship with a 94-86 win over Kentucky.

Without Wright and Hamilton, two of the top defenders on the team, Florida fell just short of a third-straight Sweet 16 appearance after losing to Temple, 75-54.

The accomplishments of the 2001 Gators however, were not lost.

Team Highlights

- Florida tied a school record with its third straight NCAA Tournament appearance (the Gators went to the NCAA Tournament from 1987-89).
- UF won its opening round game for the third straight year in the NCAA Tournament for the first time in school history
- Florida’s 24 wins is the second best total in school history (the 1994 and 2000 squad share the school record with 29). UF won 20-plus games for the third consecutive year for only the second time in school history
- UF won a share of its second consecutive Southeastern Conference Championship (UF had won only one prior to the arrival of Billy Donovan). UF rallied from a 1-3 league start to win 13 of its last 14 conference games
- UF and Kentucky are the only two SEC teams to repeat as league champs in the past 25 years
- Florida was ranked No. 8 in the final AP Poll, the highest finish in school history
- Florida was ranked wire-to-wire for the second consecutive season and it’s current school-record streak of 43 consecutive weeks is the fifth longest active in the nation.
- UF won a school record six consecutive games against ranked opponents during the season and overall have won nine of their last 12 meetings with ranked foes
- Seniors Brent Wright and Major Parker finished their career as the all-time winningest class in school history with 89 victories and both are on schedule to graduate in May
- Florida players missed a combined 33 games because of injuries and UF players had four surgeries during the SEC schedule. UF played at full strength for just nine games this season (8-1 in those games) and no games after December 28th. Florida played one game with

seven scholarship players, 11 games with eight scholarship players and 10 games with nine scholarship players

- UF averaged a school-record 12,063 fans for SEC games and 10,543 for the year, up 4,142 since Donovan’s arrival
- Construction began on \$10 million practice facility. The two-story 45,000 square-foot facility will be completed by the Fall of 2001

Coach Donovan Highlights

- Has won eight NCAA Tournament games, one more than UF had won prior to his arrival in Gainesville
- His .727 winning percentage (8-3) in NCAA Tournament record is fifth best among active coaches
- Has led UF to 43 consecutive rankings in the AP Polls after UF was ranked 42 times prior to his arrival
- Reached the 100-win plateau at Florida quicker than any coach in Gator history, reaching the milestone in 154 games
- Only Duke (60), Michigan State (59) and Stanford (55) have won more games than Florida (53) during the last two seasons
- Signed three McDonald’s All-Americans and has now inked seven McDonald’s All-Americans after the school had just three prior to his arrival

Individual Highlights

- Udonis Haslem was named Third-team All-American by the Associated Press, while teammates Brett Nelson and Teddy Dupay were named Honorable Mention. Haslem is only the second Gator in school history to be named to one of the first three AP All-American Teams. Neal Walk, the second player selected in the 1969 NBA Draft, was a Third-Team selection in 1969 and Second-Team selection in 1968
- Udonis Haslem and Brett Nelson were named First-Team All-SEC by the league coaches. Haslem, who was third-team selection as a freshman and sophomore, is only the third UF player in school history to be named All-SEC by the league coaches three times. Andrew DeClercq (1993-1995) and Ronnie Williams (1981, 1982, 1984) were the others
- Udonis Haslem and Brett Nelson were named First-Team All-SEC by the Associated Press marking the first time in school history UF had two players tabbed First-Team by AP in the same season...Matt Bonner was also selected Third-Team All-SEC by the AP
- Matt Bonner became only the third Academic All-American in school history after carrying a 3.96 GPA in Business. Andy Owens, currently a judge in Sarasota, last earned Academic All-American Honors in 1970

Game 1 - No. 11 Florida 85, Florida State 70

Nov. 17, 2000 Leon County Civic Center Tallahassee Fla.

Florida won for the 10th-straight season on opening night, and the third straight over the Seminoles by a combined 66 points...Florida led by just two points at halftime (37-35), but took control late in the second period...The Gators held FSU scoreless for a stretch of 4:38 in the second half and the Seminoles could not manage a field goal for a stretch of 6:24 in the final period...UF led by at least six points for the last 14:22 and trailed for less than 30 seconds the entire game...Florida was led by Teddy Dupuy, who returned from off-season surgery on his left shoulder, with a career-high 27 points, the most by a Gator on opening night in 15 years.
