## UF By The Numbers...

**+1.4** ... UF led the SEC and finished seventh in the nation in assist-to-turnover ratio, posting a +1.4 mark on the year

**8.1** ...The Gators return 8.1 offensive rebounds per game (of their 11.1 a year ago)

**10** ...Florida returns 10 scholarship players, its most since also returning 10 players prior to the start of the 2006-07 campaign (eight are scholarship players)

**12.1** ...Florida finished the year turning the ball over just 12.1 times per game, the second fewest total in school history and the fewest ever by a Billy Donovan-coached team

## Under the Radar

Florida enters the 2009-10 season in the flying under the radar. After back-to-back appearances in the NIT and the departure of leading scorer Nick Calathes, the Gators returned to the gym early and often in an effort to carve out a new identity for 2009-10.

What they've found through the summer is a blue collar bond and a group prepared grind out the rigors of the long season. And they've found greater numbers, and more players surfacing in their natural positions. While they lost one of the great point guards in school history, Erving Walker, who played primarily off the ball in 2008-09, slides over to the point. The Gator frontcourt will benefit from the addition of transfer Vernon Macklin, who spent a year in the system red-shirting and now gives UF the wide body at center it so sorely missed a year ago. His presence allows Dan Werner and Alex Tyus to slide back and play their more natural positions of small forward and power forward.

Another year of seasoning for Chandler Parsons, Ray Shipman, Kenny Kadji and Eloy Vargas, as well as the return of Adam Allen who miss all of last year, gives the Gators a combination of size, strength, shooting and experience. Explosive freshman guard Kenny Boynton and promising freshman forward Erik Murphy give the Gators their most versatility and deepest roster in several years.

Under the radar and back to basics. The Gators have options at every position, a balance it lacked a year ago, budding chemistry, and size to match the ability to knock down shots from the perimeter. More complete and more focused, the 2009-10 Gators will have as many options as dimensions.

Florida brings the perfect compliment of youth, experience, size and quickness on the perimeter, ranging from 5-8 lightning bug point guard Erving Walker to lineups that will include 6-9 Chandler Parsons at the two guard. Walker moves over to the point after playing primarily off the ball as a member of the SEC's All-Freshman team. He knocked down 70 three-pointers a year ago, second on the squad and the most by a Gator freshman since Anthony Roberson hit 74 in 2002-03. Walker is joined in the backcourt by McDonald's All-American Kenny Boynton, one of the most decorated players to ever come out of South Florida. Boynton averaged 33.0 points per game at American Heritage last year and has tremendous range, but also the underrated ability to lock down and defend. Ray Shipman returns for his sophomore season after showing tremendous promise, particularly as the season

went on a year ago. With quick hands, many of his points came in buckets in transition off steals. He is among the most athletic players on the Gator roster and his perimeter game gained confidence as the season went along. Adam Allen hopes to make a successful return after missing the entire 2008-09 season. Allen hit 43 percent from three-point range as a freshman, and at 6-8, is able to stretch defenses with his ability to step out and hit threes, much like Parsons and Dan Werner.

The Gators enter the 2009-10 season with a wealth of options in the frontcourt and the ability to play more players in their natural positions. The addition of redshirt junior center Vernon Macklin will enable the Gators to slide Alex Tyus back to the more comfortable power forward spot and have Dan Werner see more time at small forward. Macklin is a wide-framed, long, athletic body the Gators lacked a year ago, giving them a more natural center. Tyus played very well as an undersized center a year ago, leading UF in rebounding, but should benefit from more time at the more natural power forward spot. Werner has played a bit of everything during his time in Gainesville and will be able to play forward spots for the Gators. He can step out and shoot threes, but also finished second on the Gators in rebounding with over 6.0 per game his sophomore season. Chandler Parsons has spent time at both forward spots over his first two years and has added muscle in the off-season to help add to his 5.7 rebounds per game a year ago. The continued development of bigs Kenny Kadji and Eloy Vargas will be critical to the Gators' depth at the power forward and center spots, as both stand 6-10 and can give UF a tremendous height advantage. Freshman Erik Murphy brings a combination of talents, with the ability to step back and knock down shots from the perimeter, while bang down low and provide rebounding.

**28** ...Alex Tyus led UF with 28 blocked shots a year ago, as he and Kenny Kadji combined for 52

**41.9** ...Erving Walker led all UF three-point shooters at 41.9 percent, the best by a UF freshman since Lee Humphrey set the Gator freshman record at 43.9 percent in 2003-04.

**69** ...Florida has won 69 games at home over the last four years (69-8), the most in a four-year period in UF history and second in the nation in that time

**70** ...Erving Walker knocked down 70 three-pointers a year ago, just three shy of the team lead and the most by a UF freshman since Anthony Roberson hit 74 in 2002-03

**78.0** ...Dan Werner has hit 78.0 percent from the free throw line over the past two years, including a team-high 79.1 last season

**261** ...Florida's 261 wins during the decade of the 2000s rank fifth in the nation and tops in the SEC
