Exhibition Game 1: Florida 95, Miami Suns Premier 41 Nov. 4, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Florida used a 27-point performance from junior forward **Bernice Mosby** to defeat the Miami Suns Premier, 95-41, at the O'Connell Center Thursday night in its first exhibition game of the 2004-05 season.

From the opening tip-off the Gators controlled the game, jumping out to a 16-6 lead just over four minutes into the contest. Four Gators scored in double figures, while UF senior **Tashia Morehead** just missed a double-double, by chipping in nine points and pulling down 10 rebounds.

Danielle Santos scored all of her 16 points in the second half, when the Gators outscored the visitors 48-18. **Brittany Davis** added 12 points on 5-of-6 shooting for UF, which shot a blistering 57.6 percent in the final period.

"This was a test of putting everything we have worked on in practice together and getting contributions from everyone on the team," head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "The style we want to play this year will require depth. Being able to get contributions from several people tonight off the bench was very important."

The Gators opened the game on a 14-2 run, hitting a perfect six-from-six from the charity stripe. The scoring continued in bunches as Florida turned 19 Suns turnovers into 26 points in the opening period.

Mosby led all first-half scorers as she netted 14 points, pulled down four rebounds and picked off four passes. Mosby's four steals led a Gator defensive charge that held the Sun Premier to nine field goals on 27 attempts. The Florida defense also took two charges and hauled in 10 rebounds.

Florida maintained a double-digit lead almost the entire first half, as the Sun Premier would only climb within eight points after the opening run by the Gators.

The second half would open much like the first, as the Gators darted out on an 11-0 run in the first three minutes of play. The Gator defense turned up their play in the second half as they held, the Sun Premier without a field goal for the first 11 minutes of the deciding half.

Santos led the Gator offensive charge in the second half, as she netted all of her 16 points in the final half. Mosby added 13 of her game-high 27 points in the final period, while also grabbing three boards.

Exhibition Game 2: Florida 95, EA Sports 88 Nov. 15, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Bernice Mosby powered in 16 points and 14 rebounds as the University of Florida women's basketball team defeated EA Sports 95-88 at the O'Connell Center in its final exhibition game of the season.

"We showed some signs of improvement in this game," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "One of the biggest things was our contribution from the bench. We had 28 points from the bench at the half and 40 for the game. We also obtained most of our statistical goals. We had a lot of unselfish play today and our intensity and effort was even improved over the first game (against Miami Suns Premier)."

The unofficial double-double would have been the 11th of Mosby's career. Florida's frontcourt dominated the game as Mosby, **Dalila Eshe**, **Brittany Davis**, **Tashia Morehead** and **Briana Phillips** combined for 61 of the Gators' 88 points and helped establish a 49-36 rebounding margin for the game.

Davis netted 10 of her 14 points in the first half, while Eshe added 12 points and Phillips ended the night with 10 points. **Tishona Gregory** also tallied double figures, scoring 11 with five assists. **Morehead** finished with a solid game, contributing nine points and five assists in 18 minutes of work.

The two teams traded baskets for the first few minutes of play before the Gators went on a 15-6 run capped off by a jumper by **Brittany Davis** to take a 22-14 lead with 13:38 left in the first half. The lead grew to as much as 17 in the first half after a **Depree Bowden** three-pointer with just over two minutes remaining and the Gators entered the locker room with a 56-42 halftime advantage. Former Gator **Tonya Washington** paced the EA All-Stars with 11 points in the first half, finishing with 15 points and seven assists.

The EA Sports began the second half quickly and cut the deficit to eight. However, the Gators responded with a run of their own to push the lead back to 17 points, 83-66 with 7:04 remaining. With the Gators holding a 88-79 lead with just under two minutes remaining, **Kate Bulger** nailed a pair of three-pointers during a fast 7-0 run to shrink UF's lead to 88-86 with 1:04 on the clock.

Briana Phillips finally ended the run with a three-point play with 39 ticks remaining. **Maria Conlon** canned a jumper for EA Sports five seconds later, but that was the last time the visitors would score, as the Gators hit four of five free throws in the waning seconds to seal the victory.

Game 1: Florida State 72, Florida 62 Nov. 22, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Danielle Santos scored 16 points and guard **Tishona Gregory** recorded 12 points with six assists and led a furious late rally, but it wasn't enough as the University of Florida women's basketball team fell short in its season-opening 72-62 loss in in-state rival Florida State (2-0). The loss snapped UF's 16-game win streak against the Seminoles, who earned their first victory in the series since a 90-78 overtime win on Dec. 15, 1991.

"I've got to compliment Florida State," UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "They came in and played hard, especially in the first half. They shot a lot better than they did in the first two exhibition games and the Xavier game."

Santos nailed a three-pointer to close the spread to eight points, 38-30, with 17:05 remaining, but FSU ripped off a devastating 23-7 run to extend its lead to 61-37 with just over six minutes remaining.

After the teams traded free throws, the Gators' offense finally sparked and the defense came alive, as UF rallied with a 19-2 run and cut the deficit to seven, 63-56, with 1:20 on the clock. But the Seminoles made 7-of-10 free throws to preserve the win.

Santos led UF with 16 points on 6-of-9 shooting, including a 3-of-4 effort from the three-point line. **Tishona Gregory** added 12 points with six assists in 35 minutes of work for the Gators, who shot a woeful 30 percent (9-30) from the floor in the first half when FSU built a 36-25 halftime lead. **Bernice Mosby** snatched a team-high 10 rebounds to go along with nine points in the loss.

"We are extremely excited to beat a very good Florida team," FSU coach Sue Semrau said. "It's been a long time coming for us, and I'm very proud of our team's effort."

Senior guard Linnea Liljestrand was the shooting star for the Seminoles, igniting for 15 points in the first half en route to a game-high 20. Ganiyat Adeduntan added a double-double for the Seminoles with a game-high 11 rebounds and 12 points, while Alicia Gladden tallied 12 points with six steals for FSU, which shot 47.1 percent (24-51) for the game.

Both teams hit 24 field goals in the game, with UF canning seven from the three-point line compared to four for the Noles. The difference came at the free throw line, where the Seminoles were 20-of-35 compared with the Gator's 7-of-12 effort.

Game 2: Iowa 65, Florida 62 Nov. 26, 2004 • Grand Bahamas • Junkanoo Jam First Round

Danielle Santos scored a career-high 23 points with five rounds, but it wasn't enough to lead the University of Florida women's basketball against Iowa (3-0), as the Gators lost to the Hawkeyes 65-62 in the first round of the Junkanoo Jam in the Grand Bahama Island.

Florida, which is 0-2 for the first time since 1992-93, looks to avoid tying the worst start in program history with the 1979-80 squad that began the year losing its first three games of the season.

Friday's game was similar to UF's season-opening loss to Florida State, as the Gators again dug themselves a large deficit and staged a rally that fell just short. Another comparable stat from UF's first two games was that the Gators again outscored their opponent from the field - 57-53 - and the difference game at the free throw line, where Iowa connected on 12-of-17, while UF was just 5-of-6. The Gators also were out-rebounded for the second straight game, losing the battle of the boards 39-35.

With Iowa holding a 45-31 lead with just over 14 minutes remaining, **Tamia Williams** scored six straight points to launch a 21-8 run over the next six and a half minutes, capped by a Santos' three-pointer, as the Gators were within one, 53-52, with 7:28 on the clock.

But Iowa immediately responded with a 6-0 spree over the next two minutes and built its lead back to seven. Florida again used its defense to chop away at the deficit, as **Bernice Mosby**, who finished with 18 points, canned a jumper that started a 5-0 run and brought the Gators within two, 59-57, with 3:05 remaining.

After the teams traded baskets, Iowa's Crystal Smith hit the next two field goals that gave the Hawkeyes a little breathing room with 51 seconds on the clock. On UF's ensuing possession, Santos capitalized on the Gator's third straight offensive rebound by nailing a three-pointer from the left side and had UF within three, 65-62. Santos then stripped Smith on the other end of the floor and the Gators had the ball with 15 seconds remaining. UF set up a final play, but never got a good look as **Tashia Morehead's** last second attempt didn't connect. Morehead, who continues to nurse a strained right quadriceps she injured Nov. 17 during practice, played only the final 15 seconds of the game.

Iowa took a 34-26 halftime lead as the Gators shot just 32.4 percent (11-34) from the floor and were out-rebounded 23-14. The Hawkeyes shot 46.7 percent from the field thanks to several offensive rebound put-backs.

Game 3: Florida 77, Akron 38 Nov. 27, 2004 • Grand Bahamas • Junkanoo Jam Consolation

Florida earned its first win of the season using a devastating 35-7 run that began midway through the first half en route to a 77-38 victory over Akron in the consolation game of the Junkanoo Jam held at St. Georges High School in the Grand Bahama Island.

Benice Mosby scored 14 points with 10 rebounds to post her 11th career double-double, leading a balanced Gator attack where 10 of the 11 players on the roster scored. **Dalila Eshe** contributed 13 points and nine boards, while **Sarah Lowe** added 11 points and **Briana Phillips** tallied a career-high 10 points for the Gators, who forced 35 Akron turnovers and held the Zips to a 26.5 shooting percentage (13-49).

The 39-point win is the second largest margin of victory for UF under third-year coach **Carolyn Peck**, while the 38 total points scored by Akron is the lowest opponent output since Dec. 20, 2000 when the Gators defeated Chicago State 79-30.

Florida (1-2) shot a steady 55.9 percent (19-34) from the floor in the second half, 43.5 percent for the game, while holding a 47-36 rebounding edge. The Gators also dished 22 assists and collected 22 steals in the game.

"We really picked up our defensive pressure and again **Depree Bowden** had a lot to do with our run," Peck said. "It got our momentum going and helped create scoring in transition. We got some easy baskets and it took pressure off our offense. Once our shots started falling, we started having fun."

Jessie Crooks was the only Akron player to score in double-figures, netting 10 for the Zips.

After Akron (0-4) took a 12-6 lead with 11:41 remaining in the opening period, the Gators turned up their defensive intensity and began to pound the ball inside, resulting in a 26-4 run to end the half with a 32-16 lead entering the locker room. Seven different Gators scored during the scoring spree, with **Benice Mosby** tallying six. UF also crashed the boards harder than in their previous two games, earning a 28-22 advantage that included 13 offensive rebounds that the Gators turned into easy put-backs.

Neither team looked comfortable in the first half, as UF shot 31.4 percent (11-35) and Akron just 24.1 percent (7-29). The Zips turned the ball over 18 times in the first 20 minutes, compared with the Gator's 13 miscues.

Game 4: Florida 67, UCF 42 Nov. 30, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Bernice Mosby scored 16 points in leading Florida to a 67-42 win against UCF before a crowd of 1,855 Tuesday evening at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. The Gators (2-2) extended their series lead over the Golden Knights (1-3) to a perfect 23-0.

Two other Gators ended the game in double digits as senior **Tashia Morehead** and junior **Danielle Santos** netted 15 and 10 points, respectively, as all 11 players scored for UF.

The Gators, playing their third game in five-days, recovered from a tough shooting touch to start the game and led by nine points at the half at 29-18. UF used a 13-2 run midway through the second half to pull away from UCF in building a 20-point lead at 50-30 with 8:10 remaining in the contest.

"The thing I'm most proud of is that we played with intensity for 40 minutes," Florida coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "In both halves, even if we made mistakes, we kept up our intensity. UCF is a very scrappy team and have proven that they've got scorers."

Sophomore Francine Houston led the Golden Knights with 14 points and four rebounds.

In the second half, a UCF three-pointer with 14:50 remaining cut Florida's lead to nine, 37-28. But a jumper by Mosby ignited the critical 13-2 run in giving the Gators a 20-point cushion the Golden Knights couldn't recover from. After Mosby's bucket, Santos popped a three, which was followed by a Mosby free throw and a basket before Santos nailed another trey to make it 48-30 Florida. Senior **Tamia Williams** added a layup at 8:10 to give the Gators at 50-30 lead.

In the first half, both teams went point-for-point until the Gators began to pull away with 5:01 left to play. Coming off the bench, Morehead rallied the Gator offense to an 11-5 run through the end the first half to give Florida a 28-19. Despite being hampered with a strained quad muscle, Morehead led the Gators in scoring in the first period with nine points, shooting a perfect 4-4 from the field.

The Gators' defense has stepped up the pressure in the past two games forcing 56 turnover, including 21 turnovers by the Golden Knights, which led to

Tamia Williams' career-high 23 points led all players en route to the UF women's basketball team's 77-58 win versus Temple.

Thanks to Williams and fellow senior, **Tishona Gregory**, the Gators (3-2) tied a school record for most three-point field goals made with 11. The duo combined to go 10-of-14 from the three-point arc, with freshman **Depree Bowden** adding the other three-point shot.

Williams was UF's spark plug the entire day, scoring 10 points on a momentum-changing 15-4 run in the first half to give the Gators a commanding 30-12 lead with little more than six minutes remaining in the half. The senior, who in four games had not made a three-pointer, went 6-of-7 from beyond the three-point arc while tallying three rebounds, one assist and a steal.

UF ended the day with 19 assists while shooting 45.6 percent (26-57) from the floor during the game, including 51.6 percent during the decisive first half when the Gators canned 8-of-14 from the arc.

Gregory had the hot hand early in the first half, scoring 11 of UF's first 13 points in little more than five minutes, with nine of those points coming on 3-of-4 three-point shooting. It was her three-point shot that tied the school record and put the finishing touch on her season-high 17-point day.

UF was able to catch onto Gregory's shooting touch to shoot 52 percent in the first half, a significant improvement from its previous four games in which it struggled to find a rhythm during the first half.

Temple (3-3) was led by Candice Dupree who scored 18 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field while grabbing a game-high 11 rebounds. Ari Moore chipped in 10 points with a game-high six assists for the Owls, who held a 41-35 rebounding edge.

The Gators combined their offense with a fierce defensive assault, pressing Temple all day in its back court while disrupting its half-court offense. In the first half, Temple committed 13 turnovers to UF's five while shooting 33 percent, all of which led to a 44-21 UF halftime lead.

For the game, UF converted 28 points off of Temple's 20 turnovers.

Sarah Lowe led the defensive effort with four steals while also leading the team with five assists on the offensive side. The Gators capitalized on their free throws going 14-of-18 from the stripe, including a 5-of-6 night from junior **Brittany Davis** who had nine points and a team-high five rebounds. UF's bench, led by Williams, outscored Temple's 44-12. Sophomore **Briana Phillips** was able to put in eight points off the bench on 4-of-5 shooting and added three rebounds in 17 minutes of play.

Game 7: Florida 75, Stetson 62 Dec. 8, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center Bernice Mosby scored a season-high 27 points to lead Florida to a 75-62 victory over Stetson Wednesday at the O'Connell Center.

The game, which was UF's five consecutive victory, marked the first time this season UF won after trailing at the half. Down 38-36, the Gators (5-2) opened the second half by hitting their first 10 shots to spark a 14-2 run that would give them a lead they would not give back. Five different players contributed to the run while six different players combined to hit UF's first 10 shots. It wasn't until the middle of the half that the Gators missed a shot.

Stetson (1-4) managed to stay within five points with 13 minutes remaining in the game until seniors **Tamia Williams** and **Tashia Morehead** hit back-to-back shots, including a three from Williams, to push the UF lead up to 10. Stetson would not get closer than nine points the remainder of the game.

Mosby put on a personal clinic, shooting 11-of-15 from the floor while having team-highs with eight rebounds, two blocks and a steal. On her final basket, Mosby had a behind-the-back lay up on a fast break to put the crowd on its feet.

Danielle Santos also had a double-digit night in points scored with 10, while tying the team high in rebounds with eight and dishing four assists. Senior **Tishona Gregory** also had a solid overall night, tallying four rebounds and a team-high five assists while scoring four points.

Stetson was led by senior Kristy Brown who played a game-high 39 minutes for the Hatters on her way to notching a double-double with 24 points and 13 rebounds. Sophomore Kim Manning contributed 12 points and a game-high six assists for Stetson.

Both teams enjoyed runs throughout the first half, with Stetson going on a 13-2 run early in the game before UF responded with 9-2 and 12-2 runs later in the half. Still, the Hatters managed to go into halftime with a two-point lead, due in large part to Brown's play. Stetson had an overwhelming 15-8 offensive rebound advantage in the first half, leading to 15 second-chance points in comparison to UF's six. But UF closed the gap in the second half, with every player on the roster grabbing at least two rebounds by game's end as the Gators finished with a 48-39 rebounding edge.

The Gators also stepped up defensively, recording a team season-high 10 blocks, including a career-high five from junior **Dalila Eshe**. UF has held its opponents to less than 40 percent shooting from the field during its five-game win streak.

Game 8: Florida 82, Oregon State 70 Dec. 12, 2004 • Gainesville, FL • Stephen C. O'Connell Center Brittany Davis' career-high 20 points, along with junior Bernice Mosby's third double-double of the season, led to the University of Florida women's basketball team's highest point total of the season in a 82-70 win versus Oregon State. The victory was UF's sixth consecutive, the longest win streak in two-plus seasons under **Carolyn Peck**.

Davis shot 8-of-11 from the field and added three rebounds, while Mosby had 20 points and a game-high 10 rebounds for her third double-double in the past six games. With four minutes remaining in the game, junior **Sarah Lowe** stole the ball near mid-court and took the ball herself to the other end to give the Gators a 78-60 lead and all but seal the win.

For much of the first half, the teams matched each other basket-for-basket before the Gators (6-2) managed to end the half on a 7-2 run to go into halftime with a 37-32 lead.

Shannon Howell carried Oregon State (2-5) through the first half, scoring 20 of the Beavers' final 22 points of the half. Like Howell, Davis managed to lead the Gators through the end of the first half, scoring 11 of UF's final 18 points of the half. Davis also blocked a shot to create a fast-break opportunity for senior **Tishona Gregory**, who got fouled and made 1-of-2 free-throw shots in the middle of the 7-2 run to end the half.

The Gators carried their 7-2 run from the end of the first half into the beginning of the second half, to go on a combined 16-4 run. The run gave UF a 12-point lead with a little less than 18 minutes remaining in the game, with the Beavers never getting closer than 10 points.

The Gators clamped down on defense in the second half, implementing a half court trap to disrupt Oregon State's offense, and with Howell the only Oregon State player to score until 12:24 remained in the second half, six different Gators had scored in the same time span.

Eight different Gators had scored by the time UF finished an 8-0 run to increase its lead to 20 points with 10:11 remaining in the half. Because of the defensive pressure, the Gators forced 27 turnovers and had an overwhelming advantage in the paint where they outscored the Beavers 40-20.

Leading the defensive effort were Lowe and junior **Danielle Santos**, who both tied career-highs in steals with six and five, respectively. Santos' six assists were one shy of tying her career high.

Oregon State's Howell finished with a season-high 36 points and a career-high seven steals while Kim Butler was the other OSU player in double-figures with 14 points.

Senior **Tamia Williams** and junior **Dalila Eshe** were also in double figures with 12 and 10 points, respectively.

Game 10: Richmond 79, Florida 77 (2OT) Dec. 21, 2004 • Gainesville, Fla. • Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Despite the efforts of junior **Bernice Mosby**, who netted a team-high 20 points and a game-high 17 rebounds, Florida dropped a double-overtime thriller to Richmond, 79-77.

In the waning seconds of the second overtime period, Richmond guard Saona Chapman lobbed the in-bound pass to a wide-open Kate Flavin under the basket for the final two points of her game-high 36, with only two seconds remaining. Florida senior guard **Tishona Gregory** pushed the ball quickly up the floor, however time expired before she was able to attempt a game-winning shot.

The game, which featured seven ties and four lead changes, was decided in the final seconds of the second overtime as the Gators (6-4) could not hold on after rallying from a five-point double-overtime deficit after overcoming a 13-point second-half hole.

In the first half the Gators jumped out to a nine-point lead at the 14:06 mark, however as the opening period continued, the Spiders chipped away at the Gators lead. Richmond (8-0) grabbed its first lead of the game with 5:10 to go in the first half and began to open a small lead that would increase to seven by the end of the first half, carrying a 36-24 lead into the locker room.

The Spiders opened the second half on the attack and extended their lead to 13 with 13:14 to go in regulation. However, the Gators responded much like the Spiders did in the first half. Slowly chipping away at the lead, the Gators used solid offensive performances by Mosby and **Tamia Williams**, who netted 13 and 10 second-half points, respectively, to help the Gators overcome the 13-point deficit and tie the game at 62 apiece with 37 seconds remaining in regulation.

In the first overtime period the Gators struck first when senior **Tashia Morehead** connected on three of her 17 points just five seconds into the extra frame, canning a trey from the top of the arc. The Gators then took a five-point lead early in the overtime period after junior **Brittany Davis** backed in for a layup.

Richmond responded with two baskets from DeUnna Hendrix and a three-pointer from Chapman to take a 69-67 lead with 1:23 remaining in the first overtime period. Flavin added one free throw to give the Spiders a three-point lead with 42 seconds to go. However, Morehead struck again, nailing her second three-point basket of the overtime period to knot the game at 70.

In the final frame, Richmond struck first behind Flavin's efforts and built a five-point lead with 1:47 remaining. Davis cut into the Richmond lead as she converted on two free throw attempts and then after a Morehead rebound, Gregory knocked down a jumper to bring the Gators within one with 43 seconds to go.

Mosby was fouled with seven seconds remaining in the second overtime period. She missed the first free throw attempt, but converted the second to knot the game at 77.

Richmond then in-bounded the ball and pushed it up across half-court before calling timeout to set up for one final play, setting the stage for Flavin.

Bernice Mosby scored a game-high 19 points leading the Gator women's basketball team to a 66-59 victory over Boston University Wednesday night in the first round of the State Farm Classic held at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. Florida (7-4) advances to Thursday's championship final against the Charlotte 49ers (11-1), who defeated Florida A&M, 78-49, in the first game of the tournament.

The Gators began the game with a 12-2 run, highlighted by four field goals from Mosby. Boston pulled within two points at the 8:09 mark when the score read 16-14, but UF would go on a 9-2 run for the next four minutes. BU pulled within three points just before halftime before UF's **Tishona Gregory** nailed a 3-pointer with 11 seconds remaining to give the Gators a 34-28 lead entering the locker room.

Florida continued its brilliant passing and tough rebounding and defense well into the second half, opening up a 46-36 lead with 13:28 remaining. Boston responded, however, and held the Gators scoreless for nearly four minutes while using a quick 12-0 run to take its first lead of the game, 48-46, at the 10:15 mark. After that there were seven lead changes, but Florida took the lead for good when junior Sarah Lowe stole the ball with 2:30 remaining.

Boston held a 59-58 lead after two free throws from Corinne Jean with under three minutes remaining, but those would be the Terriers final points of the game, as the Gators scored the final eight points to earn the victory. UF was 5-for-6 from the free throw line in the final 26 seconds to preserve the win and advance to the State Farm Classic title game for the 14th time in the 14-year history of the event. Senior Tashia Morehead hit a clutch 15-foot jumper with 1:05 remaining and then came up with a steal on Boston's ensuing possession with 29 ticks on the clock.

Both teams had three players in double digit scoring. In addition to her game-high 19 points, UF's Mosby pulled down seven boards. Senior guard Tishona Gregory notched 15 points and dished out three assists, while Morehead finished with 15 points and four assists.

For the Terriers, guard Rachael Vanderwal scored 17 points with a game-high five assists, Adrienne Norris had 17 points and four rebounds and guard Erica Kovach contributed 12 points.

The beginning of the game was delayed 19 minutes by a lighting malfunction in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Game 13: Florida 58, South Florida 50 Jan. 2, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Bernice Mosby and **Tamia Williams** scored 13 points apiece in leading a balanced attack as Florida defeated USF for the 14th consecutive time by a score of 58-50 Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida (9-4) won its third straight game after trailing by as many as nine points in the first half and improved its record to 34-3 all-time against South Florida (10-4), which had won its last five games in a row.

Florida used a critical 10-0 run in the late stages of the second half in turning a five-point deficit into a five-point lead that the Bulls couldn't overcome. The Gators then sank 10-of-12 free throws in the final five minutes of the game to hold off the Bulls.

Mosby recorded her fifth double-double of the season after hauling in 13 rebounds, while **Dailia Eshe** contributed nine points and seven rebounds with eight of those points coming in the final 2:46 of the game.

The Gators outrebounded South Florida 48-34 in improving to 7-0 this season when collecting more caroms than their opponent, while the Gators also held the Bulls to a meager 30.5 shooting percentage for the game (18-for-59). Anedra Gilmore paced South Florida with 15 points.

The Bulls opened the second half with a 13-4 run in the first 3:38, as South Florida went ahead 35-26. The Gators then came back within one at 35-34 after scoring eight straight points with four coming from both Mosby and **Brittany Davis**, who capped the run with a layup at 11:55.

South Florida forged ahead with the next three points before the Gators tallied the next 10 points in a stretch of 4:02. Davis got things going with a free throw at the 8:34 mark before Mosby added a basket with Davis following with another to make it 40-39 with 7:27 left. Williams then notched a layup at 5:44 to give the Gators their first lead since recording the opening points of the game at 41-40. Mosby added a free throw before Williams sank a 3-pointer from the corner to cap the run and give Florida a 45-40 lead with 4:32 remaining.

The Bulls came back within a point at 45-44 with 3:32 left, but the Gators hit their last basket of the game at 2:46 on a put-back from Eshe to make it 47-44 before sinking 10-of-12 free throws to close out the game.

In a sluggish offensive first half for both teams, Florida took the early lead before USF kept the Gators scoreless for more than six minutes in building its own six-point advantage. The two squads finished the half with a flurry of points as UF scored on six of its final 10 possessions of the half to tie the game at 22-22 entering the locker room.

After the Gators tied the game at 6-6 on a basket from Davis at 14:30, Florida failed to register a point on their next 12 possessions as the Bulls went on top 14-6. The Gators then mounted their comeback beginning with a basket by Williams at 7:50, which triggered a 9-2 run over the next 3:25 that saw the Gators cut the deficit to one at 16-15. Mosby and **Depree Bowden** had field goals in the stretch, while **Sarah Lowe** added a 3-pointer.

USF responded with a 6-2 run to push their lead to five at 22-17 before the Gators closed out the half with the final five points on a trey by **Kim Dye** and a pair of free throws from Mosby.

Game 14: Florida 68, Arkansas 56 Jan. 6, 2005 • Fayetteville, Ark. • Bud Walton Arena

Tamia Williams tied her career high with 23 points leading Florida to a solid 68-56 victory over Arkansas. The victory was the Gator's first Southeastern Conference season-opening victory since the 2000-01 season.

Williams scored 13 of her game-high 23 in the first half, when UF (10-4, 1-0 SEC) built a 43-26 lead. **Tashia Morehead** turned in a well-balance performance with 11 points, nine rebounds and five assists in 31 minutes of action. Eight of the 10 Gators who played scored for UF, which shot 39 percent during the game, including a 46.7 mark (7-15) from the three-point line.

Arkansas, which did not have a player score in double-figures, committed 22 turnovers while shooting just 30.8 percent (20-65) from the floor. The Lady 'Backs did hold a 42-40 rebounding advantage, which included 24 offensive boards.

UF began the second half committing three turnovers in the opening four minutes after having just four miscues during the first 20 minutes. Arkansas took advantage by scoring the first five points and chipped away at the Gator's 43-26 halftime advantage, eventually cutting UF's lead to 10 points, 49-39, with 13:37 remaining. However, **Tamia Williams** nailed her fourth three-pointer of the game and **Brittany Davis** added a chip shot, as UF regained a 15-point advantage, 54-39, with 12:30 remaining in the game.

The team slowly traded buckets, as both teams had troubles scoring and Florida's turnover woes continued but the Gators still held a 60-44 lead with just under five minutes on the clock. Then April Seggebruch, who didn't even play in the first half, came off the bench to nail her first of two three-pointers during a quick and furious 10-3 run as Arkansas cut UF's lead to single digits, 63-54, with 3:07 remaining.

Arkansas had several chances to get even closer after dominating the offensive rebounds, but had trouble converting and was forced to stop the clock and begin fouling. Williams closed out the win by hitting 5-of-6 from the charity stripe in the final 1:36.

The Gators closed the first half on a 12-2 run to take a 43-26 halftime lead. UF netted five straight free throws to begin the spree, which was capped by a pair of three-pointers, one from Williams and the other by **Sarah Lowe**, who netted the final points of the half with two seconds remaining.

UF began the game scoring the first seven points, with scoring from **Williams**, **Morehead** and **Tishona Gregory**. Kristin Peoples answered for Arkansas, hitting back-to-back treys, as the Lady Razorbacks used a 8-1 run to even the score. The Gators responded with a 6-0 run, before UA again rallied to tie the game at 16-all with just under 10 minutes remaining.

Williams then caught fire and scored eight points during a 12-4 run that gave UF a 28-20 lead with 6:22 on the clock. After the teams exchanged buckets and Arkansas had closed within six points, 30-24, with 3:37 remaining in the period, UF ripped off a 12-2 spree to end the half and take a 43-26 lead into the locker room.

Williams' 13 points led UF's outside shooting during the first half, when the Gators hit 45.5 percent (15-33), including 5-of-9 from the three-point arc, as Williams went 3-of-4 from deep. Arkansas, which held a 20-17 rebounding advantage that included 11 on the offensive end, shot 33.3 percent (10-30) and committed 14 turnovers in the first half.

Game 15: Florida 67, Auburn 60 Jan. 9, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Tamia Williams' 23 points and **Bernice Mosby's** 17 point, nine-rebound effort propelled Florida to a 67-60 victory versus Auburn in front of a crowd of 3,842, the sixth largest in UF history, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Sunday afternoon.

Tishona Gregory, who missed her first seven shots of the game, nailed her lone field goal, a clutch three-pointer, with 1:36 remaining in the game after Auburn's Natasha Brackett closed UF's lead to one point, 58-57. The Gator's then sealed their fifth consecutive victory by hitting 6-of-8 free throws in the final 39 seconds.

Williams scored eight straight points during a one minute, 31 second span with under five minutes remaining when the lead changed hands three times. She first hit a driving acrobatic layup with 4:07 on the clock to give UF a 51-51 lead, but Louise Emeagi nailed a three-pointer on Auburn's ensuing possession to give the lead back to the Tigers. Williams canned back-to-back three-pointers, the first one with 3:25 remaining that brought the season-high crowd to its feet, to give the Gators a 55-54 advantage and the lead for good.

Williams finished with 22 points on 4-of-8 shooting from beyond the three-point arc, while adding four rebounds, two assists and two steals. Mosby tallied 10 of her 17 points in the second half, while collecting a team-high nine rebounds.

Dalila Eshe added eight points and eight boards for the Gators (11-4, 2-0 SEC).

Auburn (9-5, 0-1 SEC) was led by Louise Emeagi's 29 points and six rebounds. Natasha Brackett added 12 points with eight rebounds, while Marita Payne collected 12 boards and Tiffany Presley 10.

UF fell behind in the second half after an 11-0 Auburn (9-5, 0-1) run put the Tigers up by six with 7:40 remaining.

Junior **Brittany Davis'** free throw with 11:35 remaining in the game broke Auburn's run and was followed by four Mosby points to cut the Auburn lead to one.

Auburn went on to score five unanswered to extend its lead to six points, before the Gators gradually worked their way back into the game to set up Williams' three-pointers.

Early in the game, UF appeared to be in cruise control after senior **Tishona Gregory** made two free throws to give the Gators a 20-12 lead at the 10:10 mark of the first half. It was then, however, that Emeagi went on to score 10 of Auburn's next 12 points and at one point get the game tied at 22.

Despite Emeagi's effort, who scored 14 of her team's final 19 points in the first half, the Gators managed to go into halftime with a 29-27 lead.

The Gators were able to capitalize off 14 Auburn turnovers, scoring 17 points off the miscues in comparison to Auburn's five points off four turnovers.

UF received key contributions from junior **Dalila Eshe** who notched eight rebounds, and from senior Tishona Gregory's team-highs in assists and steals, with four and three, respectively. The Gators also shot considerably better from the field in the second half, notching a 47.8 percent mark in comparison to a 32.3 percent mark from the first half. UF held the Tigers to 36.7 percent shooting from the field. In 10 of the Gators' 11 wins this season, the defense has held its opponent to less than 40 percent shooting from the field.

Game 16: No. 3/2 LSU 64, Florida 47 Jan. 13, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Tamia Williams scored 15 points, while **Tishona Gregory** added 12, but it wasn't enough as Florida battled No. 3 LSU much closer than the final 64-47 score might indicate Thursday evening at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Tigers (15-1 overall, 2-0 Southeastern Conference) used an 18-8 run in the late stages of the second half in turning what had been a close game into a relatively comfortable win as the Gators (11-5, 2-1) dropped their first conference game of the season and had their five-game winning streak snapped.

Bernice Mosby added 15 rebounds for the Gators, just three shy of her career high, as the Gators outrebounded LSU 43-34. Florida was plagued by a season-high 24 turnovers, but the Gators remained in the contest until the latter stages until the Tigers pulled away. Florida held LSU to 40.7 percent shooting as the Tigers entered the contest ranked eighth in the nation while shooting at a 47.4 clip. LSU's 64-point output was the second-lowest for the Tigers this season.

Williams hit double figures in points for the eighth time in her last nine games and led the Gators in scoring for the fifth straight game. Seimone Augustus led the Tigers with 18 points.

LSU opened the second half by outscoring the Gators 6-3 in the first 3:30 with a 3-pointer by Gregory representing Florida's points as the Tigers went ahead 31-21. But the Gators fought back within five after a jumper from Gregory followed by a trey from **Tashia Morehead** cut the lead to 31-26 with 13:12 left.

The two teams then traded baskets before LSU extended its lead to eight at 36-28 with 9:47 to go. After a pair of free throws from **Sarah Lowe**, the Tigers hit a 3-pointer to bring their lead to nine at 39-30. Williams responded with a trey from the corner to bring Florida back within six at 39-33 with 9:06 left.

The Tigers then scored six straight points in less than a minute in building a 45-33 lead that the Gators never overcame the rest of the way. Florida came as close as eight points at 47-39 after a layup from Williams, but the Tigers then

Game 17: Florida 67, South Carolina 57 Jan. 16, 2005 • Columbia, S.C. • Colonial Center

Florida began a 24-2 rally with under 15 minutes remaining in the game to overcome a 12-point deficit to earn a 67-57 victory over South Carolina. The victory was the 499th in the 31st year of the program.

Tamia Williams, who made 5-of-8 from the three-point arc, scored 15 of her game-high 21 points in the second half, when Florida (12-5, 3-1 SEC) committed just three turnovers and shot 44.8 percent (13-29) from the floor, while outscoring the Gamecocks 40-22. USC shot just 25.8 percent (8-31) in the second half after sizzling from the floor during the opening 20 minutes.

The Gamecocks (6-11, 1-3 SEC) entered the game shooting an SEC-low 25.5 percent from the three-point arc, but came out sizzling during the first half, hitting 6-of-13 and building a 35-27 halftime lead. UF also shot well from deep, canning 5-of-10, but committed 13 turnovers that USC turned into 10 points.

Bernice Mosby netted her sixth double-double of the year and the 16th of her career with a 17-point, 12-rebound effort. Tashia Morehead was instrumental during the comeback run and finished the game with 16 points on 5-of-8 shooting, including 4-of-6 from the three-point line.

USC continued its hot shooting during the opening two minutes of the second half, extending its eight-point halftime lead to 42-30. But Morehead scored the next four points of the game bringing the deficit to eight, before USC countered with the next four points with 15:23 remaining. That's when Mosby, Morehead and Williams rallied UF with a 10-0 run and were within two, 46-44, with 13:04 remaining. Just before Williams ended the spree with a trey, Morehead collected her fourth personal foul with 13:10 on the clock and went to the bench after leading UF with 16 points, but that didn't slow the Gator offense.

Ilona Burgrova ended UF's run with a jumper in the lane, but Dalila Esha answered with a strong post move for two points and Mosby followed with a tough fade-away in the paint over a double-team to tie the score with 9:30 remaining. Williams then connected on a pair of free throws before throwing up an off-balanced three-pointer that banked in from the left corner as the shot clock expired, giving UF a 53-48 advantage. She followed that with another trey and Brittany Davis capped the 14-0 run with two free throws, as the Gators built a 58-48 lead. After one USC free throw, Williams stole a pass at the top of the key and sank the lay-up with just over four minutes remaining that sparked a 8-2 spree that extended the advantage to 15 points, 66-52, with 1:32 remaining.

Morehead nailed two three-pointers during UF's game-opening 9-2 run, as the Gators raced out to the early lead. USC struck back thanks to a trey from Olga Gritsaeva and a pair of offensive rebound put-backs by Melanie Johnson to tie the game at 9-all. Williams canned her second three-pointer of the game to stop the Gamecock run, but USC countered with five straight points, extending their run to 12-3 and taking a two-point lead.

The scored was knotted at 17-all after Mosby converted a fast break layup after a steal by Tishona Gregory, but USC went on a 9-2 run to take a 26-19 lead with just over six minutes remaining. The teams essentially traded baskets for the rest of the half, as USC's final three field goals were from the 3-point line, with Lea Fabbri hitting the Cocks sixth three-pointer of the period with one minute left to end the scoring.

Game 18: Ole Miss 82, Florida 70 Jan. 23, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Florida almost staged the second largest comeback victory in program history, but fell short in an 82-70 loss to Ole Miss Sunday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

After the Gators (12-6, 3-2 SEC) scored the first five points of the game, the Rebels (13-5, 3-2 SEC) rattled off a 23-1 run to take a 23-6 lead with 10:41 remaining in the first half. But UF rallied and cut the deficit to seven by halftime and even took a 41-38 lead with 16:20 left in the contest. Ole Miss then countered with a game-breaking 20-4 spree over the next eight minutes en route to its first SEC road win of the season.

"Tonight they outrebounded us 58-37," head coach **Carolyn Peck** said. "They did a great job of going after the loose balls and grabbing the boards, which eliminated a lot of our opportunities."

In addition to the 21-rebound differential, UF shot just 35.8 percent (24-67) from the floor. Ole Miss hit 39.4 percent (28-71) during the contest which included a 9-of-24 effort from the three-point arc.

Junior **Sarah Lowe** came off the bench to score a season-high 18 points for UF, while **Bernice Mosby** chipped in 17 points and eight rebounds. **Tamia Williams** netted 12 points, five assists and four steals and **Brittany Davis** added 11 points for the Gators who next travel to Athens, Ga., to play No. 21 Georgia on Thur., January 27. Game time is scheduled for 7 p.m.

With 8:22 remaining until halftime, Ole Miss held a 19-point lead thanks to three consecutive three-point baskets by the Rebels, however the resilient Gators would respond. Florida bounced back with a 14-3 run behind a smothering team defense and the offensive spark from the duo of Lowe and Williams, as they scored 12 of UF's 14 points during the run.

By closing the half on a 7-4 spurt, Florida continued to chip away at the Ole Miss lead and trailed by a score of 36-29 at halftime.

In the second half, the Gators would come out strong and start the deciding half on a 12-2 run, highlighted by a three-point shot by **Tashia Morehead**, erasing the 19-point deficit and giving Florida a 41-38 lead with 16:20 to go in the game.

For nearly three minutes both teams would battle back and forth through three ties and three lead changes, trying to gain some momentum to push ahead of the other. After overcoming its second-largest deficit in school history, the hot-shooting Gators cooled down and the Rebels would take advantage.

Ole Miss regained its momentum and reeled off a 13-0 run to give the Rebels a 58-45 lead with 8:20 remaining in the contest. After the Gators added a basket by Mosby and an open lay up for two of Brittany Davis' 11 points, Ole Miss would go on a back-breaking 12-5 run to put the game out of reach with 2:45 remaining.

Game 19: No. 19/20 Georgia 81, Florida 61 Jan. 27, 2005 • Athens, Ga. • Stegeman Coliseum

Bernice Mosby scored a game-high 25 points, including the 1,000th of her career, but it wasn't enough for Florida to upset No. 19 Georgia, as the Gators fell 81-61 Thursday evening at Stegeman Coliseum.

Florida (12-7, 3-3 SEC) was within five points, 54-49, with 8:19 remaining in the game before Georgia (13-5, 5-2) finished on a 27-12 run to end the game and collect its eighth consecutive home victory.

Humphrey led four Bulldogs with 21 points and nine rebounds, as UF shot 56.7 percent during the decisive second half and held a 41-25 rebounding edge during the game.

Mosby became the 18th different Gator to score 1,000 career points when she nailed an eight-foot jumper giving her 10 points with 5:28 remaining in the first half put her over the plateau. Mosby tied as the eighth fastest Gator to reach the scoring milestone, as Thursday's game against Georgia was her 77th wearing the Orange and Blue.

Tamia Williams was the only other Gator to score in double-figures, netting 14 for UF which shot just 33.3 percent during the second half and 38.5 percent for the game.

After Dalila Eshe hit two free throws to tie the game six seconds into the second half, Georgia went on an 8-0 run to take a 39-31 lead with 17:03 remaining. But Tamia Williams nailed her second three-pointer of the game and Sarah Lowe followed with a jumper in the lane to cut the deficit to three, 39-36.

The teams traded buckets over the next three minutes and Mosby's jumper with 12:33 remaining had the Gators within two, 45-43. However UF started to slowly pull away, first using a 5-0 run. UF stayed within five points with just over eight minutes left, before the Lady Bulldogs capitalized on a hot-shooting 11-2 spree to take a 65-51 lead with under five minutes to play and the Gators just couldn't recover.

Florida jumped out to a quick 12-3 lead, hitting five of its first seven shots from the field, including both from the three-point line, with Bernice Mosby, Tashia Morehead and Brittany Davis all contributing. After a short jumper from Tasha Humphrey ended a 10-0 Gator spree, Mosby sank one free throw and Morehead added a bucket underneath to extend UF's lead to 15-5 with just under 15 minutes remaining in the first half.

However, Georgia struck back with a 10-0 run of its own to tie the game with 10:23 on the clock. Sarah Lowe answered for UF with a trey from the left side of the arc to give the Gators an 18-15 lead. The teams traded baskets for the next six minutes before the Lady Bulldogs used a 7-0 spurt to assume a 29-24 lead with just under two minutes remaining in the period. Morehead hit two from the charity stripe to stop UF's scoring drought, but Sherill Baker stripped Tamia Williams and raced the length of the court for a layup with 32 ticks on the clock that extended UF's lead to five. Williams redeemed herself on UF's next possession, canning a three-pointer with 12 seconds remaining to close the gap to 31-29 at halftime.

Game 20: No. 23/21 Vanderbilt 84, Florida 73 Jan. 30, 2005 • Nashville, Tenn. • Memorial Gym

Florida shot a solid 48.4 percent from the floor and held the rebounding advantage, but couldn't stave off a late rally in an 84-73 loss at No. 23/21 Vanderbilt Sunday at Memorial Gym.

The Gators held a 59-51 lead with 13:30 remaining in the game, before Vanderbilt road the three-point shooting prowess of Abi Ramsey to break the game open with a devastating 21-4 run, handing the Gators their third consecutive loss.

Ramsey scorched the Gators for a career-high 30 points that included eight three-pointers, as she hit 9-of-14 from the floor and 8-of-13 from behind the arc.

Florida managed its second-best field goal percentage of the season, but allowed the Commodores to hit 59.2 percent (29-49), a season-high for Gator opponents this year. VU also managed 13-of-23 from the three-point arc, while UF hit 7-of-15 from long range.

Florida scored on its first two possessions of the second half, as Bernice Mosby canned a deep jumper before Tamia Williams collected a steal and raced the length of the court for the layin, as the Gators took a 46-43 lead. Abi Ramsey nailed a three-pointer for Vanderbilt to tie the game and the teams then matched each other bucket for bucket, as the score was even at 51 with 16:21 remaining.

Tishona Gregory then nailed a jumper that sparked a 8-0 Gator run, as Sarah Lowe capped the spree with a two-footer after a steal under the basket to give UF a 59-51 lead that forced Vanderbilt to call a timeout with 13:25 on the clock. The Commodores responded as Ramsey nailed consecutive three-pointers and then two more fueling a 21-4 run and giving Vandy a 72-63 advantage with 4:23 left.

Mosby led UF with 15 points and six rebounds, while Gregory added 14 points and Williams 10 in the losing effort.

The Gators were without services of freshman Depree Bowden, who did not accompany the team to Nashville because of strep throat. Bowden's absence left UF with just nine players, one of whom was Danielle Santos who had not played since an injury on December 19. Santos entered Sunday's game at the 10:24 mark of the first half.

The first half was an offensive shootout, as Vanderbilt shot 58.6 percent (17-29) from the floor, including 7-of-14 from the three-point arc, while UF was 54.8 percent (17-31), hitting 5-of-9 from long range. The Gators held a convincing 19-9 rebounding edge, collecting 11 on the offensive end, alone.

The teams traded baskets for nearly the entire first half, with both teams scoring on consecutive possessions only twice during the opening 20 minutes. The Commodores led by as many as eight points, 20-12, with just under 14 minutes remaining, before the Gators chipped away the deficit thanks to three-pointers from Tamia Williams, Gregory, Tashia Morehead and Sarah Lowe.

With Vanderbilt holding a 35-28 lead with 5:40 left in the first half, Florida staged a 10-0 run - capped by a trey from Lowe - over the next two-plus minutes to take its first lead of the game, 38-35. After the teams traded scores, Vandy's Sherish Stringfield canned a trey with 44 seconds left to tie the score at 40-40. Briana Phillips then muscled down an offensive rebound and was fouled on the putback. She nailed both free throws and then helped UF's seemingly smothering defense on the other end, but Ramsey threw up a long three-pointer that found the bottom of the net as the halftime buzzer sounded, giving Vanderbilt a 43-42 lead.

Game 23: Florida 70, Kentucky 59 February 10, 2005 • Lexington, Ky. • Memorial Coliseum

Tamia Williams led a balanced scoring attack that helped the Gators defeat Kentucky 70-59 at Memorial Coliseum. The victory, which snapped a five-game losing streak, was the 500th win in the 31-year history of the Florida program. Florida (13-10, 4-6 SEC) used a 10-0 run in the late stages of the game to secure the victory after Kentucky had taken its first lead of the contest with 11:07 remaining. But UF's defense buckled down and held the Wildcats (14-10, 3-6 SEC) scoreless for the next eight minutes during its game-breaking run. Williams finished with a game-high 19 points, while **Tashia Morehead** added 15 points with six rebounds and **Bernice Mosby** tallied 12 with a game-high nine rebounds in the win for Florida which shot 45 percent (27-60) from the floor. The Gator defense also stepped up, holding UK to just 38.8 percent shooting, including a 27.6 mark in the second half, while forcing 17 turnovers. Kentucky opened the second half with a three-pointer, but **Morehead** answered with a give-and-go bucket and **Williams** followed with a trey as UF built its lead to eight, 48-40. The Wildcats then turned around with a 7-0 run and were within one with 14:28 remaining. Morehead stopped the UK run with two free throws and then teams went back and forth for the next two minutes until **Nastassia Alcius** converted her second three-point play of the half to give UK its first lead of the game, 54-52, with 11:07 left. Morehead came right back and put in an offensive rebound to tie the game, before Williams collected a steal and dished a no-look assist to Morehead into the basket who converted the layin that gave the Gators a 56-54 lead with under 10 minutes remaining. Both teams went cold from the floor for the next few minutes until Williams sank an acrobatic driving jumper with 5:27 on the clock to extend UF's advantage. UK missed on its next possession and the Gators made them pay as **Sarah Lowe** and **Dalila Eshe** worked a perfect screen and switch and the 6-foot-3 Eshe took advantage of a mismatch in the paint and sank a two-footer. UK missed another shot and **Mosby** answered with an athletic jumper in the paint that increased UF's lead to eight, 62-54, with 3:38 remaining. Samantha Mahoney halted UF's 10-0 run with a three-point play, but Williams and Briana Phillips worked the give-and-go to perfection, as Williams sank the driving layin with 2:25 on the clock. UF's rebounding continued to limit UK to just one shot on the offensive end and was forced to foul to stop the clock. Lowe coolly canned both ends of two one-and-ones in the final minute to secure the victory. UF began the game on a 10-2 run thanks to a pair of three-pointers by **Williams** and buckets from **Morehead** and **Mosby**. UF's defense also held Kentucky without a field goal for the first four minutes to open strong. Florida continued to hit from the floor, while the Wildcats pounded the ball inside where the Gators began accumulating fouls and UK kept the score close with six free throws. The Wildcats didn't hit their second field goal until Samantha Mahoney canned the first of two three-pointers that dropped UF's lead to three, 19-16, with 10:42 remaining in the period. **Briana Phillips** sank one free throw for the Gators before Mahoney hit another bucket that cut the lead to 20-18. The teams then traded buckets before Briana Phillips' short jumper sparked a 6-0 spree and UF regained an eight-point advantage, 28-20, with under seven minutes left. But UK came right back with a trey from Angela Phillips that started a 9-2 run and had the Wildcats within one.

Game 24: Florida 67, Mississippi State 56 February 13, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Behind senior **Tashia Morehead's** game-high 19 points and clutch shooting performance, the University of Florida women's basketball team topped Mississippi State, 67-56, Sunday afternoon in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center. With a 35-17 halftime advantage, the Gators (14-10, 5-6 SEC) seemed to have an insurmountable lead before the Lady Bulldogs (14-9, 3-7 SEC) rallied throughout the second half, applying a half-court press that frustrated the Gators into committing 21 turnovers for the game and propelling the Bulldogs to two separate 11-0 runs. Mississippi State got to within 50-49 with 6:30 remaining in the game before Morehead hit a three-point shot in the middle of a personal seven-minute run in which she scored 13 of the Gators' 15 points. "Tashia down the stretch really took the team on her back," said UF head coach **Carolyn Peck**, who recorded her 99th career victory. "Big players hit the big shots in the game and that's what Tashia did." Junior **Bernice Mosby** tallied 17 points and 16 rebounds, six of them coming on the offensive side, as she was the driving force behind Florida's first half explosion, while recording her seventh double-double of the season and the 17th of her career. After Morehead's key three-pointer, the Gators ran off an 8-0 run capitalized by junior **Sarah Lowe's** fast-break lay up with just under a minute remaining in the game. Junior **Dalila Eshe's** 4-of-4 free throw shooting late in the game clinched the win for the Gators. It was all Florida in the first half, scoring the first 11 points of the game while shooting 48.4 percent from the field and limiting Mississippi State to 24.1 percent (21-6). Very early in the second half a pair of field goals by Mosby and Morehead extended the Florida lead to a game-high 22 points, before the Bulldogs woke up from their slumber as six players contributed to their two 11-0 runs. "We had lost our concentration a little bit and we were watching the score," Peck said. "Mississippi State came out with a lot of energy and a lot of determination." The Gators held the nation's leading scorer, Mississippi State's Tan White, to 14 points, well below her season average of 23.6. UF pressured White all day, limiting her to 5-of-17 shooting, also below her season average of 42.8 percent heading into the game. White managed to finish as the Bulldogs' leading scorer while junior Doceide Warren scored 10 points and grabbed a team-high six rebounds. With the win, UF snapped a four-game losing streak to Mississippi State and now has a two-game winning streak in the SEC heading into next week's rematch versus Vanderbilt. Mississippi State dropped its sixth game in a row. Florida's presence in the paint was the big difference as Eshe grabbed eight boards to complement Mosby's 16 and all but one of Florida's players recorded a rebound to hold a 47-29 team advantage for the game.

Game 25: No. 22/20 Vanderbilt 76, Florida 69 February 20, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Tamia Williams led the Gators with 22 points, one point shy of her career high, but it wasn't enough for Florida to upset No. 22/20 Vanderbilt, falling 76-69 Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida (14-11, 5-7 SEC) trailed for all except the first three minutes of the game, having to play catch-up for nearly the entire ballgame. After Vanderbilt (19-6, 8-4 SEC) slowly built a largest lead of game, 14 points with 12:47 remaining in the contest, the Gators rallied with an 18-7 run over the next seven-plus minutes. The spree was capped by a mid-court steal from Danielle Santos (Marietta, Ga.) who dished the ball to Sarah Lowe (Wynnewood, Pa.), who drove hard to the basket and picked up a foul after sinking her lay-up which cut Vandy's lead to three at 62-59 with 5:11 left to play.

That would be the closest the Gators could until Lowe sank another pair of free throws to leave it 69-72 with 58 seconds to play. From there, the Commodores were perfect from the free throw line, hitting 10-of-10 in the final 2:39 to secure the win.

Bernice Mosby (Brooksville, Fla.) added 12 points while Tashia Morehead (Panama City, Fla.) contributed 11 points for Florida, which shot 44.6 percent (25-56) from the floor, but committed 16 turnovers that led to 23 Commodore points.

"We didn't take care of business inside," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "We were looking for answers to stop their players from scoring in the paint."

Vanderbilt's frontcourt of Carla Thomas and Ashley Earley combined for 44 points and 17 rebounds, helping the Commodores shoot 50.9 percent (28-55) from the floor. Dee Davis added 12 points, hitting 10-of-10 from the free throw line for VU which shot 18-of-20 as a team. Early also grabbed a game-high 10 rebounds to go along with her 21 points, while Earley blocked four shots with her game-high 23 points.

In the first half, the scored was locked at eight points a piece, before Vanderbilt established its lead and would slowly extend upon it. The Gators survived a drawn-out 19-6 run by Vanderbilt that lasted over eight minutes, finishing off the period with three-pointers from Williams and Morehead to get within eight, 39-31, at halftime.

Game 26: No. 18 Georgia 63, Florida 38 February 24, 2005 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center

Despite Florida's duo of Tashia Morehead and Brittany Davis combining to net 27 points, the 18th-ranked Georgia Lady Bulldogs used a strong second half and came from behind to defeat the Gators, 63-38, at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center Thursday evening.

Playing their final game in the O'Connell Center, Florida seniors Tishona Gregory, Morehead and Tamia Williams were recognized for their contributions to the Gator basketball program. Despite the warm reception by the Florida faithful, Georgia's send off for UF's senior class was not as friendly.

Florida (14-12, 5-8 SEC) held a 25-22 halftime lead, but Georgia (21-6, 9-4 SEC) responded by hitting 59.3 percent (16-27) of its shots from the field in the decisive second half, exploding for 41 points. The Lady Bulldogs made some defensive adjustments at the half and managed to hold the Gators to 13 second half points, their lowest point total in a half in program history. Florida's 38 points was the third-lowest game total in program history and marked the first time since 1985-86 that UF has been held under 40 points in a contest.

"In the second half when Georgia went to a zone, which is something that we normally like to see, we just couldn't get our shots to fall," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "That affected our defense on the other end and as a result did not defend penetration well."

Georgia opened the second half on a 13-0 run to grab a 33-25 advantage and would never look back. The Lady Bulldogs held the Gators' offense in check for much of the second half, as UF was held without a field goal until 8:26 remaining in the contest.

Morehead's 14-point, five-rebound effort led the Gators, who shot just 13.6 percent (3-22) in the second half and 30.3 percent (14-46) during the game. Davis contributed 13 points and six rebounds with four steals, while Dalila Eshe collected a game-high eight rebounds.

The Lady Bulldogs enjoyed a game-high 19 points, six rebounds, four assists and two steals from Sherill Baker. Cori Chambers came off the bench for 15 points, hitting 5-of-9 from the three-point arc.

In the first half, the Gators grabbed a 7-6 lead at the 12:59 mark and traded baskets with the Lady Bulldogs before snagging a 9-8 advantage with 12:05 remaining in the opening frame.

With 9:05 remaining in the first half, the Gators had muscled their way into the bonus and were having their way underneath the basket. UF maintained a narrow lead most of the first half, while overcoming a brief 19-19 tie with 4:58 remaining in the half.

Behind a tenacious defense and a lot of hustle, Florida made seven steals and forced 11 first half Lady Bulldog turnovers to carry a 25-22 lead into the locker room.

"Our defense in the first half was probably the best we've played this season," Peck said. "We changed up our defenses and rotations frequently and our team handled that very well."

Game 27: No. 1 LSU 76, Florida 52 February 27, 2005 • Baton Rouge, La. • Maravich Center

Florida lost to top-ranked LSU 76-52 at the Maravich Center in front of 10,185 in the regular season finale for both teams.

The Gators (14-13, 5-9 SEC) missed their first eight shots to begin the second half, when the Lady Tigers (27-1, 14-0) scored the initial 12 points to extend their lead to 51-26 and blow the game open.

Morehead finished with a team-high 17 points and four assists, Dalila Eshe added eight points with a team-high seven rebounds.

The Gators missed their first eight shots from the floor to start the second half, as LSU scored 12 straight points and extended its 13-point halftime lead to a 51-26 advantage with 13:54 remaining. Danielle Santos hit two free throws with 13:28 on the clock to get the Gators' offense started in the second half, with Brittany Davis providing the first field goal with 12:26 remaining, as she converted a three-point play and cut the deficit to 51-31.

Those points actually began a 11-1 Gator run that reduced LSU's lead to 15 points, 52-37, with 9:42 on the clock. LSU regrouped and tallied the next five points during a 11-3 run, with Tishona Gregory's banked three-pointer the lone Florida score, to quell any chances of a Gator comeback.

The Gators shot 32.7 percent during the game, including 31.8 percent during the second half, while LSU hit 53.7 of its shots tonight. Florida, which held a 31-30 rebounding edge, committed 23 turnovers during the contest, which LSU converted into 32 points.

The Gators came out battling and hung with the top-ranked Tigers, who threatened to pull away early with an 8-2 run and built a 12-6 lead with 12:28 remaining in the opening period. Florida answered with a pair of free throws from Depree Bowden and a baseline jumper from Sarah Lowe to close within two, 12-10, one minute later.

LSU responded with a 12-3 spree thanks to a pair of three-pointers from Quianna Chaney and extended its advantage to 11 points, 24-13, with just over eight minutes remaining. The teams traded baskets over the next five minutes before Dalila Eshe hit a jumper and Tashia Morehead canned a deep trey to cut the deficit to six, 32-26, with 2:03 on the clock. However Morehead's bucket was the last offense for the Gators, as the Tigers scored the final seven points of the period to take a 39-26 halftime lead.

Morehead led all scorers in the first half, netting 14 points on 5-of-10 shooting for UF which shot 33.3 percent (9-27) from the floor during the opening 20 minutes. LSU shot a steady 55.6 percent (15-27), which included a 5-of-6 effort from the three-point arc.

Game 28: No. 9-seed Alabama 62, No. 8-seed Florida 58 March 3, 2005 • Greenville, S.C. • Bi-Lo Center • SEC Tournament First Round

Florida jumped out to a 14-point lead but could fend off an emotional Alabama team that downed the Gators 62-58 in the first round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament held at the Bi-Lo Center.

Florida (14-14) lost its fourth consecutive game, while the Crimson Tide (14-14) ended a six-game losing streak and extended the career of head coach Rick Moody, who announced he will retire at the conclusion of this season.

Junior Brittany Davis led Florida with 16 points and a career-high nine rebounds, while drawing three defensive charges during the game. Tamia Williams added 15 points for the Gators, who shot a woeful 23.1 percent (6-26) during the deciding second half. Florida hit 32.8 percent (20-61) during the game, while Alabama hit a similar 32.1 percent (17-53), but canned 10-of-17 from the three-point line. The Tide also held a 41-39 rebounding edge and hit 18-of-27 from the free throw line, while the Gators managed 13-of-16.

Monique Bivins netted 25 points that included six during Alabama's game-ending 12-2 run in the final 4:30 of the contest. Navonda Moore tallied 13 points for the Tide, sparking UA's final run with a trey from near the top of the arc.

Bivins canned a pair of three-pointers in the opening stages of the second half to give Alabama a 38-33 lead after the game was locked at 32-all at halftime. The Gators chipped away at the deficit, tying it after Tishona Gregory nailed a trey before Tashia Morehead gave Florida a 42-40 advantage with a deep jumper from just inside the arc.

Neither team scored for the next two-plus minutes until Lateefah Joye sank two from the charity stripe to tie the game at 42 with 12:13 remaining. Dalila Eshe then answered with a pair of free throws to recapture the lead for the Gators, 44-42. Alabama responded with a 6-0 spree, as Florida's shot wouldn't fall, taking a 48-44 lead with under 10 minutes left.

The Gators finally broke a five-plus minute spell without a field goal when Sarah Lowe found a streaking Brittany Davis for a break-away layup with 8:17 on the clock that had UF within two, 48-46. But Dee Merrweather came right back with a give-and-go for the Tide to keep the four-point advantage.

Florida then pounded the ball inside to Davis, who hit two free throws. Gregory stole Alabama's in-bounds ensuing pass and was fouled and hit a pair from the stripe, as the Gators were in the midst of a 10-0 run with the first eight point coming from a perfect effort from the line. Gregory found Morehead, who sank a power driving layup to end the spree with the Gators holding a 56-50 lead with 5:30 remaining. But that would be Florida's last field goal of the game, as Alabama ended the game with a 12-2 run that was sparked by Navonda Moore's three-pointer. Bivins tallied six points during the Tide's final game-deciding run, hitting 4-of-4 from the free throw line.

Florida jumped out to a 23-9 lead over the opening 10:36 of the game, thanks to the sharp shooting of Williams, who broke out of a mini scoring drought to net 12 points. Davis provided the inside spark with 10 points and six rebounds during the first half.

However, Alabama refused to fold and staged a 15-0 run over the next six-plus minutes to take a 24-23 lead with 4:10 left in the period. Tishona Gregory finally ended the Gator's cold spell by hitting a three-pointer and Davis followed with a 12-footer from the top of the key. After one Alabama free throw, Davis scored again to extend UF's lead to five, 30-25, with 2:05 on the clock. The Tide then ended the period on a 7-2 run, as Bivins scored all seven points for Alabama that included a trey at the buzzer to tie the score at 32-all entering the locker room.

Game 29: South Florida 61, Florida 56

March 17, 2005 • Tampa, Fla. • Sun Dome • WNIT First Round

Florida lost a tough 61-56 decision to South Florida in the first round of the Sportsview.tv WNIT played at the Sun Dome in front of 1,269.

Seniors Tashia Morehead and Tamia Williams along with sophomore Briana Phillips each scored 11 points for the Gators (14-15), who ended the season losing their final five games. The Bulls (21-10) snapped a 14-game drought against Florida, defeating the Gators for the first time since a 65-54 decision back on Dec. 5, 1987.

"This was a great game and a battle between two very good teams," UF head coach Carolyn Peck said. "South Florida was able to get shots to fall in the second half and we didn't. We had some turnovers, some crucial turnovers."

Dalila Eshe hit a short turn-around with 8:46 remaining in the game to give Florida a 53-46 lead. But the Gators scored just three points the rest of the way, as USF ended the contest on a 15-3 run to earn the first postseason victory in program history.

Florida shot 42.3 percent (22-52) during the game, including a 37.5 percent clip in the second half, when USF outscored the Gators 35-25. The Bulls hit 44.4 percent in each half.

USF quickly cut UF's 31-26 halftime lead to one, but the Gators answered every Bulls bucket with one of their own to hold the lead and slowly build a seven point advantage, 46-39, with 11:46 remaining in the game. The teams continued to trade points for the next two minutes and with Florida holding a 53-46 lead, USF ripped off a 10-1 run during the next four-plus minutes to take a 56-54 lead with 4:40 remaining.

Tamia Williams ended Florida's field goal drought with a driving layup with 3:35 on the clock to tie the score, but Anedra Gilmore countered with one of her own to keep the Bulls in the lead. Neither team was able to score and the Gators grabbed a defensive rebound with under one minute remaining and called a timeout with 33 seconds on the clock to set up a play.

Tishona Gregory's floating jumper with 23 seconds rolled around the basket and fell out and USF snatched the miss and the Gators were forced to foul with 16 seconds remaining. Rachael Sheets made the first free throw, but missed the second and Tashia Morehead came up with rebound giving Florida had a chance to tie the game, down 59-56. However the Gators committed a backcourt violation on their ensuing possession and Anedra Gilmore sealed the game with two free throws with six seconds remaining to close the scoring.

Runs by both teams characterized the first half, as the Bulls struck early with a 6-0 spree that the Gators immediately matched. The teams then traded buckets for the next few minutes, before Briana Phillips sparked a 14-2 Florida run during which Tamia Williams tallied seven straight points to give the Gators a 24-12 lead with just under seven minutes remaining in the first half.

The Bulls struck right back with a 12-2 run and closed within two points, 26-24, with 3:48 on the clock. However, the Gators ended the period on a 5-2 run to take a 31-26 halftime lead.
