Depree Bowden is a quick, athletic guard who can play any spot on the perimeter ... excellent court vision ... high school teammates with current Gator sophomore Briana Phillips ... named to the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll.

Freshman Year (2004-05)

Appeared in 27 of UF's 29 games while averaging 7.4 minutes per outing ... scored in 13 games, netting a season-high eight points on 4-of-6 shooting against Delaware State (Dec. 6) ... totaled 49 points and 33 rebounds ... played a season-long 17 minutes in the victory over Temple (Dec. 4), scoring five points with three rebounds ... played an SEC-long 12 minutes at LSU (Feb. 27), when she canned a pair of free throws, while collecting two rebounds and two assists ... hit 11-of-14 free throws for a 78.6 percentage ... canned a three-pointer at Alabama (Feb. 6) to score her first points in an SEC game ... did not travel with the team to its January 30 game at Vanderbilt due to strep throat and did not play in UF's ensuing game versus Tennessee ... during UF's first win of the season (vs. Akron, Nov. 27), scored her first collegiate points, putting back an offensive rebound with 17:03 remaining in the game ... her performance versus Akron was her most complete game of the season, putting up nine points, five rebounds, three assists, three steals and one block in 15 minutes of play ... cited by Coach Carolyn Peck for jump-starting the defense on numerous occasions, stating after the Akron game, "We really picked up our defensive pressure and again Depree Bowden had a lot to do with our run."

High School

Graduated in June of 2004 from Bradenton Southeast High School, where she was coached by John Harder ... a two-year captain and four-year starter for the Seminoles ... completed her career netting a school-record 1,919 points along with 976 rebounds and 477 assists ... produced the best four-year record in program history, 118-14, by any Southeast girls basketball player, winning four district championships, two region titles and advancing to the final four twice ... Class 4A state runner-up her junior season, while helping the team to the semifinals in 2004 and the Elite 8 her first two years ... team was 58-8 her final two seasons ... her senior year she averaged 15.5 points, 7.7 rebounds and 5.0 assists, helping Southeast to a 27-4 record ... averaged 14.6 points, 6 rebounds and 6.4 assists per game her junior season, when she guided Southeast to the state Class 4A championship game ... *Herald-Tribune* named her their 2004 Female Player of the Year ... 2003 and 2004 Florida Sports Writers Association 4A All-State First Team selection, as well as a three-time Street & Smith All-America Honorable Mention honoree ... recognized as a 2001 adidas Top Ten Camp, an adidas Top Ten Camp Upperclass All-Star and a 4A All-State honorable mention selection in 2001 and 2002 ... also an accomplished volleyball player, Bowden broke Southeast record for kills, previously held by current Gator teammate Briana Phillips (614).

Brittany Davis is a physical post player who doesn't shy away from contact ... can comfortably score within the 15-foot range ... 2004 & 2005 Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll member ... became the first player from Gainesville to sign scholarship papers

with the Gators since Tammy Jackson did so in 1981 (Jackson later played for the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team and was a member of the WNBA's Houston Comets from the team's inception in 1997 until retiring in 2002) ... 12 double-figure scoring games during her career.

Junior Year (2004-05)

Completed the season having started 59 consecutive games, which was tied for the longest active streak with Tishona Gregory ... one of only two players (with Gregory) who started every game ... named to the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll ... led UF in field goal percentage (54.1%) ... UF's third-leading rebounder (131), averaging 4.5 boards a game ... had almost as many offensive boards (61) as defensive (70) ... fourth on the team with 11 blocks ... was or tied as UF's leading scorer four times this season, including her 16-point performance against Alabama in the first round of the SEC Tournament (March 3), when she grabbed a career-high nine rebounds while hitting 7-of-10 shots from the field ... contributed 11.5 points with 7.3 rebounds while shooting 57.1 percent from the floor over the last four games ... recorded nine points with six rebounds in 36 minutes of action at LSU (Feb. 27) ... broke out of a mini scoring slump (totaling just six points in the previous three games) on Feb. 24 versus Georgia, when she tallied 13 points with six rebounds ... collected a career-high eight rebounds versus USF (Jan. 2) ... made a strong run during the State Farm Classic, as she totaled 25 points with 12 rebounds helping UF win the title ... 17 points and seven rebounds in the SFC championship game against Charlotte (Dec. 30) ... team-high 16 points with six rebounds and three steals in the loss at No. 6 Baylor (Dec. 19) ... tallied a career-high 20 points against Oregon State (Dec. 12), hitting 8-of-11 from the field ... recorded eight double figure scoring games.

Sophomore Year (2003-04)

Started all 30 games at the '4' position, averaging 16.2 minutes of action ... member of the 2004 Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll ... scored in all but eight games and grabbed at least one rebound in every outing ... scored her 200th career point in the Feb. 29 game at Auburn ... collected six rebounds - one shy of her career high - in her NCAA debut, a win at New Mexico (March 20) ... scored seven points with four rebounds in UF's home final (vs. Arkansas, Feb. 26) ... during a four-game stretch from January 8-18 (Ole Miss, Vanderbilt, LSU and Georgia), she went 11-for-14 from the field and 5-for-6 from the line ... best offensive game of the season was at Ole Miss (Jan. 8), where she was 7-of-8 from the field and 2-of-2 on free throws for a career-high 16 points, in addition to recording six rebounds, one assist and one block ... bumped heads with LaSalle's Crista Ricketts during the Nov. 23 game, with both players having to leave the floor with open head wounds, but returned to the court shortly afterwards; required five stitches above her right eye following the game ... one double-figure scoring game.

Freshman Year (2002-03)

Played in 27 of 28 games, sidelined at N.C. State (Dec. 7) for precautionary reasons after injuring her knee the previous evening in the game

against Houston ... earned six starting assignments, including the season finale in the SEC Tournament ... third-highest field goal percentage on the team, 41.9% (44-105) ... grabbed at least one rebound in 23 of the 27 games she played ... scored at least two points in 21 of the 27 games she played ... scored six straight points for UF during a 6-2 run against Ole Miss (Feb. 27), that helped cut a five-point deficit to one early in the game which ended with a Gator victory ... played a season-high 31 minutes against Vanderbilt (Feb. 23) ... scored a team-high 10 points with a season-high six rebounds at Tennessee (Feb. 9), the first time and only time she led the team in scoring ... versus LSU (Jan. 23) scored nine points on 4-of-6 shooting in 19 minutes of action and followed that with an eight-point, five rebound performance at George Washington (Jan. 26) ... collected five rebounds versus Georgia (Jan. 12) against a much taller frontcourt, as she saw a season-high 24 minutes of action ... scored a season-high 13 points in the win over Miami (Dec. 3), as she sparked a 10-1 run in the second half with a three-point play ... hit two clutch free throws with 7:39 remaining against FSU (Nov. 26), that gave UF a 56-55 advantage after the Seminoles had taken their first lead of the game ... started the season-opener against Lamar (Nov. 22) and responded by scoring 10 points with four rebounds in 13 minutes of work ... her first collegiate point came from the free throw line, when she hit her first attempt with 18:04 on the first-half clock against Lamar ... three double-figure scoring games.

Graduated in 2002 from Buchholz High School, where she was coached by Chris Gardner ... completed her four-year stellar Bobcats career with 1,739 points, 970 rebounds and 155 assists ... finalist for the 2002 McDonalds All-American team ... *The Gainesville Sun* 2001 & 2002 Class 4A-6A Player of the Year ... 2001 adidas Top Ten Camp ... 2001 Street & Smith All-America Honorable Mention ... 2001 & 2002 5A All-State First Team ... her junior year averaged 22 points, 10 rebounds, two blocks and one steal per game ... 2001 National Nominee for Wendy's High School Heisman ... two-time Alachua County Athlete of the Week ... BHS posted a school-best 27-4 record in 2000-01, earning a No. 1 state ranking during the year ... team won three district championships during her last three years; and was undefeated versus area teams all four seasons ... BHS reached the state semifinals in 2000 ... attended the 2000 and 2001 adidas Exposure Camp, where she played in the adidas Camp All-Star game ... played in the North-South All-State game held at Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University during the Spring of 2002 ... 2002 Alachua County All-Star Team ... competed in the 2000 Junior National Invitational Tournament in Washington, DC ... 2000 and 2001 Florida All-Star AAU team member ... two-time member of the Who's Who in American Sports ... three-year National Honor Society member ... 2002 Scholar Athlete of the Year for North Central Florida ... 2002 Academic Achievement Award at BHS ... three year member of the Spanish Club, maintaining a 4.3 grade point average ... four-year ball-girl for the Bobcat's football team ... graduated in the top 10 of her BHS class.

Kim Dye is a solid outside scoring threat ... sports a shooter's mentality and a high basketball IQ ... trained and conditioned in Gainesville in addition to completing classes during the 2004 Summer B session ... named to the 2005 Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll ... named to the 2004 SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll.

Sophomore Year (2004-05)

Suffered a season-ending injury to her **left** knee during the team's shoot-around prior to the January 9 game against Auburn, tearing the anterior cruciate ligament (ACL) and partially tearing the medial collateral ligament ... underwent successful surgery on her knee February 7 ... named to the SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll ... appeared in 13 of 14 games prior to the injury, logging 92 minutes of action ... totaled 15 points, with 12 of those coming from three-point field goals ... came off the bench and drew a crucial charge at Arkansas (January 6) late in the second half when the Razorbacks were attempting a comeback ... contributed career-highs of four points and three rebounds against UCF (November 30).

Freshman Year (2003-04)

Played in a total of 10 games - two in Southeastern Conference action - totaling 39 minutes of action ... scored in three games, hitting one three-pointer in each ... overall was 3-for-10 from the field and 3-for-9 from three-point range ... last saw action on Feb. 22 against Arkansas ... versus Kentucky (Feb. 8), scored three points on 1-of-2 shooting (both 3-point attempts), with one assist and one rebound in five minutes ... her appearance versus Kentucky marked her Southeastern Conference debut ... scored first collegiate points on December 19 against Bethune-Cookman, finishing 1-of-2 from behind the arc with one assist and one rebound in nine minutes ... named to the SEC Freshmen Academic Honor Roll.

High School

Graduated in 2003 from Shelbyville (TN) High School, where she was coached by Rick Insell ... played for the Eaglettes her final three years after beginning her prep career at Fayetteville High ... three-year starter and letterwinner at Shelbyville HS, serving as team captain her final season ... one of two seniors on the 2002-03 Shelbyville HS team that captured its second Class AAA title in the last three years, also winning the crown Dye's sophomore campaign ... as a senior, contributed approximately eight points, three rebounds and two steals per game, but her value to the squad was incalculable ... named to the 2003 All-District 8 team following her senior season ... selected to play in the 2003 Tennessee East-West All-Star game, but was unable to participate because she was in Gainesville for UF orientation ... helped Golden Eaglettes compile a 37-1 record in 2003, ending the year 10th in the national Super 25 Girls' Basketball Rankings produced by *USA Today* ... Shelbyville HS, which in 2003 captured its 11th state title since 1964, has produced dozens of talented players who have earned college scholarships, most notably Vanderbilt's Abi Ramsey, as well as former Auburn Tiger Consweila Sparrow and former Tennessee Lady Vol Tiffany Woosley ... played on a Nike AAU team that finished fourth nationally ... torn the MCL in her left knee in 2002 ... earned several swimming awards in backstroke, freestyle, breast stroke and relays ... pitched a no-hitter in Little League baseball when she was 12 years old ... member of several dance team championships ... also when she was 12 years old, named to the all-tournament team after helping her softball squad win the state title.

Dalila Eshe (da-LEE-la ES-shay) is a solid rebounder with good shooting range ... began playing basketball in

the ninth grade and scored a mere 81 points during her freshman year, before concluding her prep career with 1,539 points, 851 rebounds and 391 blocks ... helped her Florida HS team reached the state regional championship game while overcoming a severely sprained ankle she suffered during the game ... trained and conditioned in Gainesville in addition to completing classes during the 2004 Summer B session ... six double-figure scoring games ... three double-figure rebounding games ... one double-double.

Junior Year (2004-05)

Starting forward each of the last three games ... appeared in all 29 games, averaging 17.6 minutes per outing ... first post player off the bench in the first 26 games of the season ... earned first start of the year at LSU on February 27, when she contributed eight points with a team-high seven rebounds ... led team with 26 blocked shots ... leading rebounder among primary non-starters, second overall on the team with 4.6 per game ... third-highest field goal percentage, 43.9 (50-114) ... averaged 7.3 rebounds in the last four games, with 13 of the 29 coming on the offensive end ... UF's leading rebounder in four of the final five games ... tallied eight points with eight rebounds in the win against Mississippi State (Feb. 13), hitting 4-of-4 from the free throw line in the final 41 seconds to preserve the victory ... tied her career-high with three assists at Vanderbilt (Jan. 30) ... snatched a career-high three steals in the win at South Carolina (Jan. 16) ... in the win over Auburn (Jan. 9), grabbed five consecutive defensive rebounds late in the second half to help stave off the Tiger's rally and secure the victory ... most complete game came against Akron (Nov. 27) with season-highs in points (13) and rebounds (9) in 18 minutes of play while matching a then-career-high with two assists ... eight of nine rebounds versus Akron were offensive boards ... three double-figure scoring games.

Sophomore Year (2003-04)

Saw action in every game except one, the regular season finale at Auburn (Feb. 29) ... averaged 10.3 minutes ... the second post player off the bench behind Bernice Mosby ... scored in 21 games and grabbed at least one rebound in 22 contests ... scored the 200th point of her career against Georgia (March 5) ... tallied a season-high nine points with two rebounds against LSU (Feb. 15), hitting 2-of-3 from the floor and 5-of-6 from the free throw line ... UF's leading rebounder against Miami (Dec. 12) and Bethune-Cookman (Dec. 19), grabbing a season-high nine boards versus BCC.

Freshman Year (2002-03)

Appeared in all 28 games, earning nine starts ... first post player off the bench in the games she did not start ... one of four Gators who played in

every game ... UF's leading scorer in two games and leading rebounder four times ... scored in 23 of the 28 games she played and grabbed at least one rebound in all except one game (at Alabama, Feb. 16) ... exploded for a season- and team-high 17 points with 11 rebounds leading UF to a win over Ole Miss (Feb. 27) and snapping its 13-game losing streak ... had scored nine points in the six previous games (6 vs. Vanderbilt) before her 17-point performance against Ole Miss (Feb. 28) ... recorded her first double-figure scoring effort in the Southeastern Conference, netting 11 with nine rebounds against LSU (Jan. 23) while playing a season-high 32 minutes ... played a then season-high 30 minutes against Tennessee (Jan. 19), contributing four points and a team-high eight rebounds ... played a then-season-high 24 minutes in the loss at Arkansas (Jan. 16), scoring seven points with five rebounds ... netted nine points with four rebounds against a taller Georgia frontcourt (Jan. 12) ... wore a plastic face mask in five games to protect her broken nose, which was injured just 1:11 into the game at Oregon State (Dec. 14) but did not miss any games due to the injury, even returning to the court during the first half against the Beavers ... sparked UF's comeback victory at Long Beach State (Dec. 1) where she scored nine of her team-high 13 points in the first-half when UF missed its first 11 shots from the floor and trailed 16-2 in the first six minutes of the game before rallying for the win ... three double-figure scoring games ... three double-figure rebounding games ... one double-double.

Graduated in 2002 from Florida High School, where she was coached by Gary Rady and Lisa Kelley ... scored 1,539 career points for the Noles, while collecting 851 rebounds and 391 blocks ... Tishona (tish-SHAWN-uh) Gregory is a quick, scrappy guard who excels on the defensive end ... member of the 2004 SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll ... nickname is "T" ... 21 double-figure scoring games ... started the final 59

games of her career ... on pace to earn her bachelor's degree in Sociology in December 2005.

Senior Year (2004-05)

Completed the season and her career having started 59 consecutive games, which was tied for the longest active streak with Brittany Davis ... one of only two players (with Davis) who started every game ... led team in assists (81), ranked second for steals (44) and third for three-pointers (23) ... ranked third on the team for average minutes played (25.7) ... broke out of a scoring drought with 10 points in the SEC Tournament against Alabama (March 3), after totaling just eight points in UF's prior six games, shooting 3-for-25 from the field ... busted out of an earlier scoring slump by contributing 14 against Vanderbilt (Jan. 30) after totaling just one point in UF's previous three outings ... scored a career-high 17 points versus Temple (Dec. 4), when she hit 4-of-7 from the three-point arc ... seven double-figure scoring games.

Junior Year (2003-04)

UF's starting point guard every game, averaging 23.2 minutes ... member of the 2004 Southeastern Conference Winter Academic Honor Roll ... UF's fifth-leading scorer (5.8 per game) with third most assists ... was 39-of-42 (92.9 percent) from the free throw line ... began the year hitting her first 18 attempts from the free throw line ... hit 18 straight from the charity stripe entering the NCAA second round game and season finale against Baylor (March 22), but missed her first two during the contest and ended the game 2-of-4 from the line ... scored seven points in the first round of the NCAA Championship against New Mexico (March 20), netting five in the final 1:41 of the game that included a steal resulting in a break away layup and a three-point play when UF held a 58-56 lead and the Lobos were staging a furious rally ... led UF in scoring once (vs. BCC) and in assists six times ... solid defensively against Kentucky (Feb. 8), helping the Wildcats commit 19 turnovers ... produced a stellar defensive effort against Vanderbilt (Jan. 11), when she collected a career-high seven steals, setting the Gator record for steals in an SEC game ... scored a season-high 14 points twice (Alabama and Bethune-Cookman) ... suffered a broken nose during the Dec. 14 game versus UCSB ... four double-figure scoring games.

Sophomore Year (2002-03)

Played in 23 of the 28 games, earning seven starting assignments ... ranked fifth on the team in scoring, assists per game and steals per game ... UF's leading scorer in three games ... played a solid 20 minutes in the win over Ole Miss (Feb. 27), when she tallied nine points on 2-of-4 shooting from the field and 4-of-4 from the free throw line ... tallied nine points at Alabama (Feb. 16), which included a 3-pointer with 1:25 remaining to tie the game and a driving layup with eight seconds left to bring UF within one point ... UF's leading scorer with 11 points in the loss at Arkansas (Jan. 16) ... tallied 13 points in the loss against Georgia (Jan. 12) ... played a season-high 39 minutes against Virginia (Dec. 29),

scoring 12 points with five rebounds in the final of the State Farm Classic, helping UF overcome a 12-point, second-half deficit in the win ... tied her career-high of 15 points for the second time during the season, helping UF defeat UMass (Dec. 28) in a double-overtime thriller ... against UCF (Dec. 11) tied her career-high with 15 points, igniting a 31-7 run in the second-half with back-to-back three-pointers with just under 15 minutes remaining ... saw her first action of the season against Miami (Dec. 3), playing five minutes in the win over the Hurricanes ... six double-figure scoring games.

Freshman Year (2001-02)

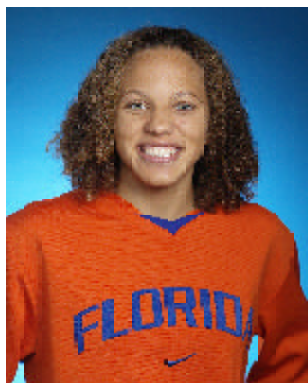
