**Christal Caldwell** played one year at UF (2009-10) ... announced intentions to transfer prior to the start of the 2010 Postseason WNIT and left the team, but remained enrolled at UF to complete the academic semester.

Announced intentions to transfer prior to the start of the 2010 Postseason WNIT and left the team, but remained enrolled at UF to complete the academic semester ... appeared in 18 games, averaged 5.6 minutes ... scored in 11 games, including in three of the last four she played ... against LSU (Feb. 11), played a season-long 15 minutes and took a season-high six shot attempts from the field, while blocking two shots and collecting one steal ... saw six minutes of action against Alabama (Jan. 21), scoring in an SEC game for the first time in her career, contributing four points, while collecting a career-high two steals ... played less than one minute at Georgia (Jan. 10) in her SEC debut ... eight of her 17 total rebounds were on the offensive end ... tied her career-high of five points when she went 2-for-2 from the floor and 1-of-3 from the line against Southern (Dec. 20) in eight minutes of action ... made an immediate impact in the win at Old Dominion (Dec. 11), when she came up with a steal and an offensive rebound in less than one minute, while getting to the free throw line four times in three minutes ... collected a huge offensive rebound in the final minute of the first half at FIU (Nov. 29), that allowed UF to set up a final play that worked to perfection and gave the Gators the momentum heading into halftime ... played a solid 11 minutes against UAB, scoring five points and grabbing a pair of rebounds ... in the season-opener (Nov. 14 vs. Stetson), scored four points, hitting 2-of-3 field goal attempts while grabbing a pair of rebounds in six minutes of action ... scored her first collegiate points on an offensive put-back with 1:11 remaining in the game against Stetson (Nov. 14)

### High School

Graduated from West Charlotte High School on June 15, 2009 ... leading vote-getter for the 2008 and 2009 Associated Press North Carolina All-State teams ... led WCHS to the 2009 4A state championship, the program's first-ever state title ... averaged 17.1 points, 8.0 rebounds, three assists and three steals per game her final season ... named 2009 Ms. North Carolina Basketball ... voted 2009 Western Regional and State Finals MVP ... the Charlotte Observer's 2008 and 2009 ME-CA 7 4A Player of the Year ... the Lions' leading scorer and rebounder all four years, compiling a 103-18 record ... played in the 35th North Carolina Coaches Association East-West All-Star Game held in the Greensboro Coliseum on July 20, 2009, when she scored 13 points and guided the West squad to the 87-77 win ... 2008 Western Regional MVP ... 2009 McDonald's All-American Game Nominee ... led WCHS to the 2008 NCHSAA 4A State Championship game – its first-ever trip to the final - before falling to Westover, 58-53, as Caldwell scored 22 points ... Lions posted a 30-3 overall record in 2008, including a 12-0 mark in league play, when she averaged 19.1 points, seven rebounds and three assists per game ... eclipsed the 1,000-point career milestone during her junior year ... her 39-point performance is a WCHS single-game record for boys and girls ... 2008 EA Sports Second Team All-American ... coached at WCHS by Reginald Mobley ... also played for Lady Star Elite coached by Andre Green and for Peach State Elite coached by Brandon Clay and Tony Gore ... also considered Miami (Fla.), Kentucky and Clemson in the recruiting process.

**Jennifer George** made an immediate impact her rookie season, being voted to the 2010 Southeastern Conference All-Freshman Team by the league's coaches ... gives the Gators a tremendous presence in the paint, as she is a solid rebounder and shot blocker ... first enrolled at UF for the 2009 Summer B semester that began on June 22, 2009.

### Freshman Year (2009-10)

Voted to the seven-member SEC All-Freshman Team by the league's coaches ... appeared in all 32 games, with five starts, averaging 19.3 minutes ... scored in 30 games, including each of the last 14 ... leading scorer off the bench and fifth overall (6.6 ppg) ... team leader with 88 trips to the free throw line ... UF's second-most efficient shooter (53.7%) and third-leading rebounder (5.2 rpg) ... ranked No. 2 among SEC freshmen rebounders (6.0 pg) and shot blockers (1.0 pg) in conference games ... in SEC games was UF's second-leading rebounder, shot blocker and stealer ... in UF record book, tied for third most blocks in a season (36) by a freshman ... versus Alabama (Feb. 28), recorded her first career double-double with 16 points and 10 rebounds ... contributed a team-high 13 points at Vanderbilt (Feb. 24), while plagued with foul trouble ... scored nine points and pulled down a team-high nine rebounds in the upset of #20 Georgia (Feb. 21), the final one coming on the defensive end with four seconds remaining and UF up by five - was fouled and hit both free throws to help secure the seven-point win ... played a career-long 32 minutes at Tennessee (Feb. 14), grabbing nine rebounds and scoring four points against a much taller UT frontcourt ... both of her points in the three-point win at Ole Miss (Jan. 31) came from the free throw line, as she extended UF's lead to three points midway through the second half ... swatted a career-high six blocks (also most by a Gator this season) in the game against South Carolina (Jan. 24), one of which came with nine seconds remaining and prevented South Carolina from making the go-ahead basket and another block came with three seconds left in the first half that allowed UF to enter halftime tied ... pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds at Georgia (Jan. 10) and followed with a team-high seven boards (five on the offensive end) against Tennessee (Jan. 14) ... collected a career-high five steals against Tennessee (Jan. 14), also scoring 10 points and hitting 4-of-9 from the floor ... impressive SEC debut at Arkansas (Jan. 3), tying for the game-high with nine rebounds, while scoring five points, with three steals, one block and hitting 3-of-6 from the free throw line ... had one of the most well-rounded debuts in a Gator uniform in program history, as her 21 points tied for the third-most ever (junior Bridget Pettis had 30 at West Virginia on Nov. 24, 1991; freshman Bernice Mosby has 25 vs. Lamar on Nov. 24, 2002; freshman Terry Whitehead had 21 at Virginia on Nov. 21, 1981), as well as tied for the second-most ever by a true freshman; her seven field goals tied for the fourth most, while her field-goal percentage of 77.8 (7-9) was second only to Murriel Page's 81.8 percent (9-11) effort against Arizona on Nov. 25, 1994; her 11 free throw attempts tied for the most-ever in a Gator debut, while her seven made from the line were the second most and her five offensive rebounds tied for the third-most ... scored first collegiate points on an offensive put-back at the 13:43 mark of the first half against Stetson (Nov. 14), finishing strong after while fouled ... received at the season-end banquet the Gameday Brickhouse Award (team award) ... five double-figure scoring games ... one double-double

**Lonnika (luh-KNEE-kuh) Thompson** is a quick guard who made an immediate impact in 2007-08, her first season with the Gators, and followed that two more solid years when she was named the team's Most Improved Player in 2008-09 and was the recipient of the Miss Elliott Unsung Hero Award in 2009-10 by the coaching staff ... paid her own way to attend "Point Guard College" from Aug. 5-8, 2008, in Greenwood, S.C., where she participated in the "Think the Game" session ... officially announced her intentions to attend UF on May 16, 2007 ... her family was forced to evacuate New Orleans due to Hurricane Katrina and Thompson began her senior year at Jonesboro High School near Atlanta, Ga., before returning to McDonogh 35 High to complete her studies and receive her diploma ... on target to earn her bachelor's degree in sociology at the end of the 2010 Fall semester

#### Career Notes

Records upon the end of her eligibility: tied for most steals in a game (7 vs. Ohio, Dec. 28, 2009) by a senior ... tied for third-most steals in a home game (7) ... tied for eighth-most steals in a game (7) ... 10 double-figure scoring games

#### Senior Year (2009-10)

Appeared in all 32 games and averaged 22.4 minutes ... presented at the postseason banquet with the Miss Elliott Unsung Hero Award (team award) ... started the last 27 games - and 27 overall - first being inserted into the starting line-up at FIU (Nov. 29) ... scored in 27 games, including each of the last five ... contributed seven assists and six steals while playing a career-long 37 minutes during her collegiate finale at Miami (March 21) in the second round of the WNIT ... all six double-figure scoring games came during SEC regular-season action ... played a then-career-long 34 minutes in a 40-minute game in the SEC Tournament first round vs. Auburn (March 4) ... tallied her sixth double-figure scoring game in SEC action at Kentucky (Feb. 18), netting 10 points on 3-of-6 shooting ... contributed all 11 of her points in 10 minutes of overtime of a thrilling two-point double-overtime victory vs. Mississippi St. (Feb. 7), scoring all nine of UF's points in the first overtime stanza and the first two points of the second overtime ... scored her 100th point of the season in the win at Mississippi St. (Jan. 17) ... held of streak of 12 consecutive games with at least one steal ... recorded back-to-back 12-point games (at Arkansas & vs. Auburn), her first two double-figure scoring games of the season ... clutch 12-point performance in the win against Auburn (Jan. 7), when she hit 3-of-4 free throws in the final 1:12 of the second overtime period, the last conversion coming with 22 seconds remaining that gave UF a five-point lead, shortly before the Tigers hit a three-pointer ... scored a season-high 12 points and tied for UF's leading scorer in the game at Arkansas (Jan. 3), hitting one free throw with 19 seconds remaining to seal the six-point win ... tied her career-high with eight assists in 22 minutes played against Jacksonville (Dec. 30), also collecting three steals and scoring five points with only two turnovers ... in the game versus Ohio (Dec. 28), scored nine points with five assists to accompany her career-high seven steals, a mark that tied for the eighth-most steals in a game in UF history, as well as tied for the third-most steals in a home game and tied for most steals in a game (7) by a senior ... dished a career-high eight assists and scored eight points in 22 minutes of action in the win at Old Dominion (Dec. 11); converted 3-of-4 free throws in the final 53 seconds to help preserve the victory ... six double-figure scoring games

#### Junior Year (2008-09)

Appeared in all 32 games ... started two games - the season opener and the Jan. 11 contest at Auburn, earning the nod to replace injured guard Jennifer Mossor ... first guard off the bench ... scored in every game except two ... team leader with 57 steals (1.8 per game) ... tied for-No. 2 in SEC games among league players for steals (2.07 pg) ... hits 35.4 percent (28-79) from the three-point arc ... appeared in both NCAA Tournament games, which included an 11-point performance in the second round against Connecticut (March 24) on 3-of-6 shooting from beyond the arc along with three assists ... all four career double-figure scoring games came this season ... shot a steady 36.5 percent from the three-point arc (31-85), the second-highest among Gators who made at least 30 ... ranked third with 56 assists and fifth for minutes played (21.4 pg) ... sixth-leading scorer (6.1 pg), tops off the bench ... in the regular-season finale at Georgia (March 1), scored eight points and collected a career-high six rebounds ... had huge plays in the win against Tennessee (Feb. 8), as she collected two steals, grabbed three defensive rebounds (one with 19 seconds to go) and knocked down two free throws with 16 seconds remaining to stretch UF's lead from seven to nine points ... matched her career-high of 16 points in the win at Arkansas (Feb. 1), hitting 3-of-5 from the three-point arc ... scored a career-high 16 points in the upset over No. 16/19 Pittsburgh (Dec. 21), hitting 5-of-6 from the floor, including 4-of-4 from behind the arc and both free throw attempts ... tallied a then-career-high 13 points against Coppin State (Dec. 10), hitting 3-of-6 from the three-point arc ... four double-figure scoring games.

### Sophomore Year (2007-08)

Played in 32 of 33 games, earning 21 starting assignments, including the last six of the season ... averaged 16.1 minutes per game ... her 50 assists and 41 steals ranked fourth on the team ... hit 32.0 percent (16-50) from the three-point arc ... suffered a separated shoulder against Auburn (Feb. 7) and missed the game at Mississippi State (Feb. 10) as a result ... played just two minutes against Georgia (Feb. 14) and seven versus Arkansas (Feb. 17) in the next two contests following the injury ... ended a streak of three straight scoreless games at the end of the season with eight points against Tennessee (March 7) in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament ... scored a career-high nine points in the victory over Saint Louis (Dec. 22) ... credited with a career-high five assists against Alabama A&M (Dec. 29), after collecting a career-high six rebounds in a win over Holy Cross (Dec. 28).

### Freshman Year (2006-07)

An academic qualifier out of high school, Thompson's unusual circumstances during her final high school season due to Hurricane Katrina led her to Trinity Valley Community College in Athens, Texas, where she was recruited to replace Shannon Bobbitt, who left and became the starting point guard for Tennessee's 2007 and 2008 national championship teams ... Thompson spent one season with the Lady Cards, helping TVCC win its sixth consecutive Region XIV Conference championship ... earned a spot on the 2007 Women's All-Region XIV and All-Conference teams after averaging 12 points and 6.2 assists per game and helping TVCC to a 24-7 record, including a 15-3 mark in conference play ... despite being hampered with an ankle injury, still managed seven points along with eight assists in TVCC's final game, a 63-60 loss to Blinn College in the regional semifinal.

### High School

Graduated from McDonogh 35 High School in 2006 after helping the Roneagles basketball team to the Louisiana state 5A championship game her senior year ... collected 2005 Class 5A All-State first-team honors ... her prep career, however, was anything but usual, as Thompson and her family were forced to evacuate New Orleans due to Hurricane Katrina and she began her senior year at Jonesboro High School near Atlanta, Ga. ... played for the Lady Cardinals hoops team until she was able to return home to New Orleans in February of 2006 to complete her prep playing career and earn her diploma from McDonogh 35, where she also played her sophomore and junior years.

**Susan Yenser** was a 3-point shooting specialist with strong leadership qualities ... team co-captain in 2007-08 and 2009-10 ... sat out the 2007-08 season per NCAA rules for transfers and had two years of eligibility remaining beginning in 2008-09, her first with the Gators ... earned a spot on the 2009 & 2010 Southeastern Conference Academic Honor Roll ... signed scholarship papers to attend the University of Florida in May of 2007 under head coach Amanda Butler ... spent her first two collegiate years at Clemson University, where she signed to play under Jim Davis - a former Gator assistant coach (1986-87) - who resigned before Yenser had the opportunity to suit up for him ... spent the 2009 summer performing an internship at Sears in Gainesville ... earned a bachelor's degree in marketing from UF in December of 2009 and took master's degree classes during the 2010 Spring semester

### Senior Year (2009-10)

Appeared in the first 19 games and 29 of 32 overall ... averaged 10.4 minutes ... started seven games, including start time at the "4" spot in the final three regular-season games and the SEC Tournament first round contest ... scored in six of the last nine games ... against Vanderbilt (Feb. 24), tied her entire point total from the previous year, when she scored 70 points in 31 games, while only needing 25 games as a senior to match the mark ... played a SEC-season-long 19 minutes at Kentucky (Feb. 18), as she was on the floor at the '4' position for the first time in her career ... had a streak of sinking at least one three-point field goal in seven straight games ... had been held scoreless in three consecutive games, shooting 0-10 from the floor, before nailing a big three-pointer on her only attempt in the win at Arkansas (Jan. 3) ... scored the 100th point of her Gator career during the game at FIU (Nov. 29) ... started the game Nov. 24 against UAB, her first start since Feb. 19, 2009, when she got the call against Arkansas; it marked her 11th career start in a Gator uniform ... played a solid 25 minutes in the win over UAB (Nov. 24), scoring nine points, with six rebounds and four assists ... scored her 400th career point during her 11-point performance at Pittsburgh (Nov. 20) ... had UF's only blocked shot through its first two games ... connected on the team's first three-pointer of the 2009-10 season, nailing one from the right side of the arc with 12:44 to go in the first half against Stetson (Nov. 14) ... earned her bachelor's degree in Management on Dec. 19, 2009, and took Master's degree courses during the 2010 spring semester ... earned a place on the 2010 SEC Academic Honor Roll ... team co-captain ... one double-figure scoring game

### Junior Year (2008-09)

Appeared in 31 of 32 games, earning 10 starting assignments ... earned first start at Florida (seventh overall) at South Carolina (Jan. 15) ... scored in 15 games ... 16 games playing double-figure minutes, including nine of the last 15 contests ... totaled 23 assists with just 13 turnovers ... converted 18-of-53 shots from the three-point arc (34.0%) ... scored a UF-career-high 10 points against Coppin State (Dec. 10), hitting 3-of-3 from the floor, including 3-of-4 from the 3-point arc and collecting a season-high four rebounds ... played a season-long 21 minutes in the road win at N.C. State (Dec. 7), scoring nine points and hitting 4-of-5 from the floor ... made her offensive debut against Jacksonville, nailing her first of three 3-pointers at the 13:17 mark of the first half ... waited 624 days to suit up between collegiate games, last playing on March 1, 2007, for Clemson University and was required to sit out the 2007-08 season after transferring to UF, which opened its 2008-09 campaign on Nov. 14, 2008, when she logged five minutes against FGCU ... one double-figure scoring game (11 in her career)

Junior transfer from Clemson University who was required to sit out the 2007-08 season per NCAA rules ... voted by her Gator teammates as one of the squad's tri-captains despite not being able to play or travel with the team during the season ... made the journey to Nashville with her parents to cheer on the Gators at the SEC Tournament

### Freshman & Sophomore Years (2005-07)

In two seasons at Clemson University, appeared in 58 of a possible 59 games, averaging 5.4 points and 2.3 rebounds while playing 18.3 minutes per outing ... during her sophomore season, emerged as the Tigers' fifth-leading scorer, contributing 5.7 points with 2.5 rebounds while connecting on 35.6 percent (32-90) of her 3-point shots, ranking eighth among all Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) players ... in her final game with the Lady Tigers, scored 21 points, hitting 8-of-9 from the floor, including 4-of-4 from the 3-point arc, in a tough, 89-82, loss to Virginia in the first round of the ACC Tournament ... those four treys tied the Tigers' record for most 3-pointers in an ACC Tournament game ... received Clemson's 2005-06 Newcomer of the Year Award at the team's postseason banquet, as she played in 28 of 29 games, earning four starts and contributing 5.1 points and 2.0 rebounds while hitting 22-of-63 (34.9%) from the 3-point arc ... stellar in the classroom, becoming one of 16 student-athletes in the league selected to the 2006-07 All-ACC Academic Basketball Team, in addition to earning 2006-07 ACC Academic Honor Roll honors after compiling a 3.6 grade point average ... recognized at Clemson's 2006-07 postseason banquet with the team's Academic Award in
