## Game 1: Florida 77, UCF 67

**Nov. 13, 2010 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center**

Three Florida players recorded double-figure point totals and the Gators tied the school's single-game record for blocks with 14 Saturday, as the Gators held off UCF for a 77-67 victory in the opening round of the 2010 Preseason Women's National Invitation Tournament in front of 3,124 fans at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Gators (1-0) led by as many as 22 points with 9:27 remaining in the game before UCF began chipping away at its deficit. Trailing 61-39, the Knights used a 14-2 run over the next 4:12 to cut within 10 points, 63-53. Three consecutive UCF layups brought the Knights as close as five points, 67-62, on a Gevenia Carter basket with 2:25 left on the clock. Florida made key free-throws down the stretch to secure the victory.

The Gators' 14 blocks as a team vs. UCF tied the school single-game record. Florida also recorded 14 rejections against Harvard on Dec. 20, 1983.

Freshman guard Jatterra Bonds recorded a team-high 15 points in her Gator debut, tying for the eighth-most points scored by a Florida player in her first game. Bonds added four rebounds in three assists in 29 minutes of action. Three previous Gators tallied 15 points in their UF debuts, including Brandi McCain's 15 points in a Preseason WNIT First Round game against Arkansas State on Nov. 14, 1998.

Fellow newcomer Lanita Bartley followed with 12 points and a game-high four steals in just 18 minutes of play. Junior Ndid Madu was the third Gator to reach double-figures with 12 points, including a perfect 4-for-4 from the free-throw stripe, and four rebounds.

Freshman Kayla Lewis became the first Florida freshman to start the opening game of her career since Sha Brooks did so against St. Francis (N.Y.) on Nov. 18, 2005, as well as the first freshman to start a season-opener at home since Brittany Davis and Sarah Lowe on Nov. 24, 2002. Lewis and junior Azania Stewart each added nine points in the game, while Stewart swatted a game-high four blocks and Lewis added three rejections. Sophomore Jennifer George and freshman Deandra Young each brought down a game-high eight rebounds.

The Gators shot 41.0 (25-of-61) percent from the floor in the game, including a 40.0 (6-of-15) clip from beyond the arc. Florida also connected on 21-of-28 free throws and won the rebound battle 54-41. The Gators were tenacious on the glass, scoring 24 second-chance points and 34 points in the paint.

UCF shot 33.8 (26-of-77) percent from the floor and connected on just 52.6 (10-of-19) percent from the line. The Knights forced UF into 24 turnovers, which resulted in 28 UCF points.

UCF raced out to an early 9-1 lead at the 16:57 mark backed by five points by Chelsie Wiley. The Gators attempted just one shot from the floor during that span and committed four turnovers. Stewart answered with a jumper and Bonds added two free throws to bring the Gators within four, 9-5, with 15:21 remaining in the half. The two teams traded baskets before a three-pointer by Bonds from the right wing allowed Florida to cut within two, 13-11, with 12:20 left. Just more than a minute later, Bonds connected on a three-pointer that bounced in to give the Gators their first lead of the game at 14-13.

Back-to-back baskets by UCF allowed the Knights to extend their advantage back to three, 17-14, with 10:16 remaining. UCF kept rolling to a 21-16 lead at the 8:55 mark after consecutive hoops. The teams then began again trading baskets before the Gators got a basket from Bonds and a three-pointer from redshirt freshman Lily Svete (Granger, Ind.) at the top of the key on back-to-back possessions to pull ahead 28-26 with 4:23 left on the clock. That was the start of a 9-0 run that allowed Florida to go up 32-26 with 3:41 remaining until intermission. That run included, Florida finished the half on a 16-3 run to take a 39-29 advantage into the locker room.

## Game 2: Florida 76, Charlotte 70

**Nov. 15, 2010 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center**

Jordan Jones scored 19 points and Azania Stewart tallied the second double-double of her career as the co-captains of the Florida women's basketball team led the Gators into the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT after a hard-fought 76-70 victory against Charlotte Monday.

The win marked the 100th career coaching victory for Florida's Amanda Butler, who began her coaching tenure at Charlotte, where she won 40 games in two seasons before returning to her alma mater for the start of the 2007-08 season.

Freshman Brittany Shine, who finished with 11 points in 11 minutes of playing time, scored nine consecutive points early and gave Florida a 14-point lead midway through the first half, but the 49ers (1-1) fought their way back into the contest and took their first lead of the second half, 49-48, with just over 13 minutes remaining.

The lead changed hands on four straight possessions, before Jones nailed a three-pointer with 11:22 on the clock and the Gators were able to stave off every charge the rest of the game, as the 49ers drew within one point four more times after Jones' trey but would never retake the lead.

"There weren't a whole lot of pretty moments and when you can win ugly, and grind it out like that, you feel really good and confident. That's how we feel right now," Butler said. "What's special about this team is that there are so many different ways we can make plays. We need our consistency to get better and that's what we'll continue to challenge, but as long as we keep fighting like that, I feel good about our chances."

Florida shot 40.9 percent (27-66) from the floor and held a slight 39-38 rebound edge over Charlotte, which hit 47.6 percent during the game, with 40 points coming in the paint. Epiphany Woodson led all scorers with 23 points, as she hit 9-of-17 for the 49ers, who also got 13 points from Kendria Holmes and nine points and 13 rebounds from Jennifer Hailey.

Stewart contributed 11 of her 13 points in the second half, while collecting 10 rebounds for the Gators, who had another well-rounded scoring show, as 10 of the 11 Gators who played, scored during Monday's victory.

Charlotte opened the second-half scoring and the teams traded scores eight times until Jatterra Bonds came up with a steal and Lily Svete knocked down a 16-footer that ended the streak and gave the Gators a 47-42 lead. Bonds finished with three steals and a game-high six assists.

Epiphany Woodson nailed a three-pointer that cut UF's lead to one and followed shortly afterward with a pair of free throws that gave the 49ers a 49-48 lead, their first of the game since the opening bucket that came with 13:07 remaining.

The deficit was short-lived, as freshman Kayla Lewis hit a layup and put Florida back on top, 50-49, with 12:43 to play. The 49ers continued to pound the ball inside, as Jennifer Hailey converted a short bucket and the lead swung hands again. Coming out of a timeout, Florida ran the floor and Bonds found a streaking Jones, who squared up for a three-pointer and gave the Gators a 53-51 lead. After one free throw for the visitors, Stewart hit a short jumper and gave Florida a three-point cushion. The scoring trend continued for two more possessions, as Deandra Young converted a reverse layup, but the 49ers countered with a shot in the lane. Stewart put back an offensive rebound and after a Charlotte miss, Bonds collected the loose rebound and dished to Brittany Shine, who converted the layup and gave UF a five-point lead, 61-56, as the 49ers called a timeout with 7:50 to go, as UF answered every bucket with one of its own the rest of the way.

## Game 3: #RV/RV DePaul 74, Florida 73

Nov. 18, 2010 \* Chicago, Ill. \* McGrath Arena \* Preseason WNIT Semifinals  
 Florida was less than a second away from upsetting DePaul, but dropped a hard-fought 74-73 decision in the semifinals of the Preseason Women's NIT at McGrath Arena in front of 2,520.

Kayla Lewis' tip-in at the buzzer was ruled to have come after the horn sounded and since there wasn't an official monitor for the referees to review, the game ended and the Gators (2-1) came up short of snapping the Blue Demon's 58-game home-winning streak against non-conference opponents.

DePaul star Keisha Hampton made one free throw with 1:21 and tied the game at 73. Florida didn't help itself on the ensuing offensive possession and turned the ball over. The Blue Demons then had two offensive rebounds with its next chance and didn't convert a field goal, but Hampton found her way to the line, where she made one of two and gave the hosts a 74-73 lead with six seconds remaining.

Florida's Lanita Bartley dribbled the length of the court and was fouled within six feet of the basket. Unfortunately for the Gators, the officials didn't rule that she was shooting when she was fouled and since that was just DePaul's fifth foul of the half, Bartley wouldn't get a chance at the free throw line with 0.6 on the clock. Jordan Jones' toss from the baseline to Lewis was perfect, but the shot took just a hair too long and the bucket was waved off.

Florida (2-1) was its own worst enemy to begin the second half, committing three quick turnovers, as DePaul went on a 8-2 run and take its first lead of the game. The Gators called a timeout, but racked up more miscues - seven within the first 4:31 of the second half.

Jones gave the Gators some life with a three-pointer from the left corner that tied the game at 50-all, but Maureen Mulchrone canned one for the hosts and UF trailed again by three.

The Gators refused to let down, and put together a 6-0 swing that gave them a 56-53 lead, as Azania Stewart, Brittany Shine and Jennifer George each tallied scores. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes and with UF holding a one-point lead, put together another 6-0 run and held a 66-59 lead with 8:27 remaining.

DePaul then staged what proved to be a game-changing march, scoring eight straight points during the next minute and a half to take a 70-69 advantage with 5:13 on the clock.

Bartley hit a jumper to put the Gators back in the lead, before Felicia Chester hit one of two free throws and the game was tied for the fourth time.

Lewis calmed nailed a three-pointer with 3:14 remaining that gave UF another lead, but a DePaul jumper and one free throw by Hampton with 1:21 on the clock set up the final game series.

Jones led four Gators in double-figures with 14 points, as she converted 4-of-9 three-pointers. Stewart was one rebound shy of her second consecutive double-double, adding 10 points and nine rebounds. Lewis tallied 10 points and seven rebounds, while Bartley added 10 points and a game-high six assists with a pair of steals for Florida, which shot 46.8 percent from the floor and held a 40-31 rebound advantage, but committed 24 turnovers.

Hampton finished with a game-high 19 points, converting 8-of-10 from the free throw line, while Sam Quigley and Anna Martin both tallied 16 points for DePaul, which won its last 119 games at home by an average of 20.2 points.

## Game 4: Florida 54, North Florida 51

Nov. 23, 2009 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center  
 Jennifer George and Azania Stewart recorded double-doubles and Florida rallied from late deficit to earn a 54-51 victory against North Florida Tuesday evening in the O'Connell Center.

The Gators (3-1) found themselves trailing 47-42 with 6:32 remaining after the Ospreys (1-3) had scored five consecutive points after tying the game at 42-all.

Jordan Jones halted the run with a three-pointer and freshman Kayla Lewis stepped up with one of her own that sparked an eight-point swing, capped by a bucket from Stewart and the Gators took a 50-47 lead, of which they never relinquished.

All four of Florida's games have been decided by 10 points or less, with three decided by six points or fewer, including Tuesday's outing that featured five tied scores and eight lead changes. UF began the second half on a 12-2 run that erased a five-point halftime deficit and gave the Gators a 32-27 lead. Lanita Bartley began the swing with a pair of free throws, Stewart hit a short jumper inside, George stole the ball at the top of the key and dribbled the length of the court and sank the layup and Jones nailed a three-pointer in front of the Gator bench to complete the spree.

After the teams traded scores, North Florida found its footing and scored the next seven points, capped by Juliemay Syquie's three-point play, as the Ospreys held a 34-33 lead with 12:41 remaining. Jones finally ended the run by canning her second trey of the game and lead turned hands again. Four consecutive free throws from Brittany Kirkland swung the lead back to the visitors, 40-37, as Florida began to accumulate fouls that placed the Ospreys in the one-and-one situation with just under nine minutes left.

George converted a pair from the stripe and Bartley one to tie the game. UF's defense held on the next possession, but the Gators were careless with the ball and the Ospreys forced a turnover and made Florida pay by hitting an inside bucket. George struck again by floating in a driving layup, but was whistled for a foul on the other end of the floor, as Raneisha Lamar hit the bucket but missed the free throw, as North Florida held a 44-42 lead with 8:04 remaining.

Florida's defense faltered and continued to allow multiple offensive rebounds that eventually led to a foul and the Ospreys added to their lead from the free throw line. Jones stepped up and drained a three-pointer with 6:19 on the clock that cut the Gator deficit to two, 47-45, ending a field goal drought that lasted over five minutes. The teams traded turnovers three consecutive possessions, before Lewis drained a three pointer from the right side. George collected an errant shot on the other end and later found Stewart underneath the basket, as she hit the short jumper and gave Florida a 50-47 lead with 3:28 remaining.

Stewart then wrestled away a rebound on the defensive end and outlet to Bartley, as the Gators moved to the offensive end of the court but weren't able to convert. That rebound marked her 10th of the game, securing Stewart's third double-doubles of the season and the fourth of her career. UNF missed again and Stewart corralled her 11th rebound of the game. The Gators missed on their next shot, but Stewart dove on the floor to get the loose ball and keep the possession. Florida didn't convert and Stewart was whistled for a foul, sending to the line Jadhken Kerr, who hit both free throws and brought the Ospreys within one, 50-49, with 48 seconds remaining. UNF then fouled Bartley with 12 seconds remaining, stopping the clock and sending the Gator junior newcomer to the line, where she missed the front end of a one-and-one. Stewart was there again, crashing the offensive board and putting back the miss that gave Florida a 52-49 edge with eight seconds remaining.

## Game 5: Florida 61, South Alabama 51 (Dead River Co. Classic, 1st Round) Nov. 26, 2009 \* Orono, ME \* Alford Arena

Azania Stewart, Kayla Lewis and Jordan Jones each tallied 10 points and the Florida women's basketball team overcame a poor shooting night to defeat South Alabama, 61-51, at Alford Arena Friday evening in the first round of the Dead River Company Classic.

The Gators (4-1) used a 20-4 run during a six-minute span midway through the second half to blow open a tight game and then held on as the Jaguars (2-3) made a late rally. All five of Florida's games this season have been decided by 10 points or less.

Florida tied a season-low 33.3 percent shooting effort, hitting just 26-of-78 from the floor, including 2-of-11 three-pointers and sank only 7-of-16 free throws, but dominated the boards, with a 57-42 advantage that the Gators turned into 20 points thanks to 29 offensive rebounds. Florida did hit 40 percent during the deciding second half.

Stewart, who hit 5-of-8 from the field while charting three blocked shots, corralled 10 rebounds to net her second consecutive double-double and third of the year, while point guard Lanita Bartley also grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds.

In addition to her third double-figure scoring effort of the year, Jones dished a team-best four assists and hit 5-of-6 free throws in the final 32 seconds to secure the victory. She also hit one three-pointer, extending her streak to eight consecutive games dating back to last season of sinking at least one from long range.

Nididi Madu provided a huge spark off the bench with eight points and nine rebounds, as did the play of senior Ebonie Crawford and Lily Svete. The Gator bench accounted for 25 points.

Florida roared out of the locker room with a 6-0 run to build on its 24-23 halftime lead. Stewart hit a jumper in the paint, before Bartley converted a layup on a dish from Jones and Madu capped the spree with a 16-footer from the top of the key. The Jaguars chipped away at the Gator lead, and staged an 8-2 run to close within one, 32-31. After another bucket from Stewart, the Jags scored the next four points and held a 35-34 lead with 14:04 remaining.

That's when the Gators dug deep and ripped off the game-changing run, as Jones started it with a driving layup, followed by an inside jumper from Deandra Young and one from Bartley on an assist from Deana Allen.

During Florida's next possession, the Gators went cold from all over the court, but collected six offensive rebounds between one missed USA attempt, before Svete drove hard to the hoop, made the bucket and was fouled, earning a standing ovation from her teammates on the bench.

The teams traded scores for the next couple of minutes, before Stewart's offensive put-back sparked a 10-0 run and the Gator lead swelled to 15 points, 54-39, with 6:10 remaining in the game. Madu and Lewis also chipped in during the spree. The Jaguars refused to fold and staged a 12-2 run of their own and closed within five points, 56-51, with 56 seconds remaining. Bartley had a chance to extend UF's lead from the free throw line, but missed the front end of a one-and-one. Stewart, however, was there to collect the miss and keep the possession with the Gators.

South Alabama was forced to foul and Jones stepped up to secure the victory, as she hit 5-of-6 from the line in the final 32 seconds to polish off the win.

## Game 7: Florida 63, Old Dominion 55

Nov. 30, 2009 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Kayla Lewis scored a career-high 13 points, Jennifer George collected a career-high 12 rebounds and point guards Lanita Bartley and Jatterra Bonds led the final 16-4 run that helped Florida earn a hard-fought 63-55 victory over Old Dominion Tuesday evening in the O'Connell Center.

After ODU scored the first points of the second half to take a four-point lead, the Gators used a 14-3 run to build a 39-32 advantage. The Monarchs (3-2) regrouped with an 8-1 run of their own and tied the game at 40-40 with 9:32 remaining.

The teams then traded scores with six lead changes over the next three and half minutes, before ODU marched off a 6-1 spree and held a 51-47 advantage with 5:13 to play.

That's when the Gators (6-1) ripped off a game-ending 16-4 run, fueled by Lanita Bartley and timely free throws to earn their fourth consecutive win.

The Gators hit 10-of-16 free throws in the final 5:03 of the game and received scoring during that final stretch from Jatterra Bonds, who tallied six points, including a 4-of-4 effort from the line, Bartley, who contributed six points that included a pair of field goals, as well as three points from Jennifer George and two from Jordan Jones.

"It just felt like Lanita took over the game. She wasn't going to accept anything except us winning," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "When you have two point guards that have the competitive spirit that ours do, then you've got a chance every night."

In addition to her career rebounding night, George came off the bench to score seven points, including 5-of-7 from the free throw line. Lewis, who also came off the bench for the first time this year, responded with a career scoring effort, hitting 6-of-10 from the floor and was a bright spot during the first half when the Gators struggled overall with their shot, connecting on just 31.3 percent (10-32).

Florida finished by hitting 38.2 percent (21-55) from the floor and made 21 free throws, but converted just 58.3 percent from the line, as it made a season-high 36 trips. Florida also missed all 11 of its three-point attempts ending a streak of 96 games of having at least one.

Bonds recorded 10 points for her third career double-figure scoring game for Florida, which posted the 595th win in the program's 37th season of varsity action.

Freshman Deandra Young contributed six of her seven points during the second half, when Florida outscored Old Dominion, 38-28. Azania Stewart tied a season-high of four blocked shots, while grabbing four rebounds.

The teams both recorded 38 rebounds, as Florida has not allowed an opponent to hold the edge on the glass this season, as every decision by the Gators has been by 10 points or less.

Shadisia Green led all scorers with 14 points and four assists, while Tia Lewis added 11 points and Jasmine Parker tallied 10 with four assists, six rebounds and three steals for the Lady Monarchs, who shot 40.7 percent from the floor and hit 8-of-13 from the free throw line, but had 25 turnovers that Florida converted into 25 points.

"I'm really, really proud of the way we played, battled and fought. It was a tremendous team win. Azania (Stewart) sustained us for a while. (Jennifer) George's rebounds, especially down the stretch were huge," Butler said. "I thought Deandra Young gave us a spark off the bench. The plays were divided among everyone and I think that's what makes us really hard to play against."

## Game 8: Florida 73, Providence 56 (Brown Univ. BEAR Basketball Classic)

Dec. 4, 2010 \* Providence, R.I. \* Pizzitola Sports Center

Junior Ndiri Madu powered up her first career double-double, Jordan Jones scored a game-high 19 points and Florida defeated Providence 73-56 in the second game of the Brown BEAR Basketball Classic hosted by Brown University at the Pizzitola Sports Center Saturday afternoon.

All 11 Gators who dressed for the game played, 10 of whom scored, as Florida improved to 7-1 overall and won its first game by more than 10 points.

"I'm really, really proud of the overall team effort," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "There were some spurts of energy that Ndiri gave us and everyone fed off that. There were just a couple of fans in the stands so we had to generate our own energy and did a great job. We had different people at different parts of the ball game step up and make a difference."

After Providence (5-5) closed within six points late in the first half, Florida ripped off an 11-4 run in the final 4:20 of the period to take a 39-26 halftime lead and was able to keep its advantage at double-figures for the remainder of the contest.

Florida shot a season-high 53.6 percent from the floor, hitting 28-of-57 shots, including a 6-of-15 effort from the three-point arc and an 11-of-14 mark from the free throw line.

Madu, who grabbed a career-high 10 rebounds and tied her season-high of 12 points, shot 5-of-8 from the floor in 22 minutes of action. Jones nailed 7-of-13 shots from the floor, connecting on a pair of 3-pointers, while freshman Deandra Young added a career-best nine points with five rebounds, as the Gators won the rebounding battle 39-30.

Junior Deana Allen contributed four points with a career-high six rebounds, while Lily Svete, Jennifer George and Kayla Lewis chipped in six points apiece. Lanita Bartley dished a game-high six assists along with five points.

Miranda Tate scored a team-high 11 points for Providence, which shot 37 percent for the game (20-54), including 6-of-16 from the three-point arc.

Lanita Bartley scored the first points of the second half and gave Florida a 15-point lead, before the teams traded offensive scores, with the Gators' using theirs to start a 7-0 run and push their lead to 48-28 with 13:45 remaining.

Providence called a timeout, settled down and scored the next six points of the game to cut the deficit to 14 points. Jennifer George stopped the run with a short jumper inside, but the Friars answered with a three-pointer and closed to within 13 points with 10:09 on the clock.

Bartley followed with a driving layup and the defensive tandem of Jatterra Bonds and Deana Allen stepped and forced a turnover under in the ensuing inbound, as Bonds snared the steal and dumped the ball off to Allen, who sank the easy layin. Madu then nailed a 12-foot jumper and had the Gators in front, 56-38, with 7:31 to play.

Tate stopped Florida's 6-0 spurt with a trey, Bonds converted a driving layup, but Tate came right back with another from long range and reduced the Gator lead to 15 points with just over six minutes remaining. Chandler McCabe then added another 3-pointer and the Friars inched closer, just as the Gators field goal percentage dropped under 50 percent for the first time in the game.

The Friars were able to whittle the Gator lead down to 11 with 3:18 to go, but Jones converted a pair of free throws and Madu followed with a layup inside and Florida was never really threatened again, scoring the final four points of the game, capped by a three-point play from Svete with 30 seconds remaining.

## Game 9: Brown 56, Florida 50 (Brown Univ. BEAR Basketball Classic) Dec. 5, 2010 \* Providence, R.I. \* Pizzitola Sports Center

Less than 24 hours after having its best shooting percentage performance of the season, Florida charted its worst accuracy mark of the year in a 56-50 loss to Brown in the final game of the Brown BEAR Basketball Classic hosted by Brown University at the Pizzitola Sports Center.

The Gators (7-2) shot only 30.6 percent during the game and had their five-game winning streak come to an abrupt halt, as Brown (3-6) snapped a four-game skid. Florida defeated Providence on Saturday behind a 49.1 percent shooting effort.

"Brown beat us in every aspect of the game," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "They shot better than we did. They defended better than we did. We were out-coached and out-hustled. The only reason they didn't out-rebound us was because we missed so many shots. Brown played a fantastic game and we didn't come to play. We're just not very mature and don't bring our own intensity on a consistent level and it's really disappointing on every level. You have to give Brown a lot of credit for their effort and preparation and the intensity that their team brought today."

Brown ripped off a 13-7 run behind a trio of three-pointers to begin the second half and extended their one-point halftime lead to seven, 35-28, with 15:19 remaining in the game and never trailed again.

Deandra Young (Titusville, Fla.) began to assert herself in the paint and put back two offensive rebounds to cut the deficit to three, 35-32 with just under 13 minutes left.

Lauren Clarke prevented Florida from getting three consecutive scores and knocked down a jumper, before Brown collected a free throw and built its lead back to six, 38-32 with 9:14 to play.

Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) tried to get Florida rolling by completing a three-point play, but Sheila Dixon equaled the points by nailing her third three-pointer of the half. One more free throw extended Brown's lead to seven, 42-35.

Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) drove hard for a layup and Ndimi Madu (Antioch, Tenn.) followed with a four-footer from the side and cut the deficit to three, 42-39, with 7:13 remaining.

The Bears had their confidence flowing from beyond the arc and Lindsay Nickel stepped up and nailed the team's seventh trey of the game. Two free throws lift BU's lead to eight points, its largest of the contest.

Madu traded points with Brown on the next two trips, with Young stepping up for her 10th point of the game with 3:09 remaining.

Every time Florida scored, Brown answered and the trend continued for the remainder of the game.

Madu charted her second consecutive double-double, collecting 14 points with a career-high 11 rebounds, while Young tallied the first double-dip of her career with 10 points and 10 rebounds along with three blocked shots for Florida, which held a 50-34 rebounding advantage.

Florida, which actually made three more field goals in the game, sank just 4-of-28 three-pointers (14.3%) and found its way to the free throw line only three times.

Brown hit 39.6 percent overall, hitting seven three-pointers and connecting on 11-of-18 free throws. Sheila Dixon led all scorers with 15 points with seven rebounds, while Lindsay Nickel contributed 14 points and seven rebounds.

## Game 10: Florida 86, Harvard 65

Four Florida players scored in double-figures, led by freshman guard Brittany Shine's (Sacramento, Calif.) career-high 16 points, to get back on the winning track with an 86-65 victory against Harvard on Tuesday evening in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Gators (8-2) shot a season-best 49.2 percent from the floor, while holding Harvard to just a 39.3 (22-of-56) percent from the floor in the game. Florida's 86 points were its most in a game since scoring 92 points against Alabama on Feb. 5, 2009, giving the Gators their biggest win of the 2010-11 season to date.

"We had such a great response and showed so much resilience in the face of a big, disappointing loss," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "I thought we had a champion's response yesterday in practice and certainly that carried over into our efforts tonight. We put together a really complete ball game and I thought we played very well at both ends. We certainly did not play perfectly at times, but we played very hard, with a lot of effort and for most of the ball game, with a lot of discipline. I think we saw a lot of growth in a lot of different areas and determination and things that make us a really good ball team. We just have to strive to have that same hunger, that same edge, that same feeling and that same confidence going forward."

Shine's 16 points came on 6-of-10 shooting from the floor and included two three-pointers in 22 minutes of action. Sophomore forward Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.) scored a season-high 13 points and added eight rebounds, while freshman guard Kayla Lewis (Decatur, Ga.) finished with 11 points and three assists in 21 minutes of play.

Freshman guard Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville, Fla.), who made her first career start for the Gators, tallied 11 points and added two rebounds, while freshman forward Deandra Young (Titusville, Fla.) tied for the game high in rebounds with eight, while also adding six points.

The two teams battled evenly to begin the game until a three-pointer by Shine and a basket by Young gave Florida a 16-12 advantage at the 12:01 mark of the opening period. From there, the two squads again began trading baskets until back-to-back treys by Shine and junior guard Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.) extended Florida's advantage to seven, 24-17, with 9:01 left in the half.

The Gators kept building their lead up to 11, 31-20, after a pair of free-throws by junior center Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) at the 5:43 mark of the first period. Florida went ahead by its largest lead of the half at 16, 43-27, with 22 seconds remaining until intermission after three consecutive free throws by George.

The Gators took a 43-27 advantage into the locker room at intermission after shooting an impressive 48.4 (15-of-31) percent from the floor in the opening period. Harvard shot 47.6 (10-of-21) percent from the floor and Florida held a 19-15 rebounding advantage in the first half.

The Gators quickly opened the second half with back-to-back baskets by junior forward Ndimi Madu (Antioch, Tenn.) and Bonds to jump to a 20-point lead at 47-27. Florida kept building and went ahead by 21, 52-31, with 16:27 remaining in the game on a Bartley basket. The Crimson clawed back to cut within 15 points at 54-39 on a three-point play by Brogan Berry, but that would be as close as they would come. Florida led by as many as 33 points, 78-45, with 7:40 left in the game after a pair of Bartley free throws.

Harvard (4-3) was led by Berry's 15 points as one of four players in double-figure scoring.

## Game 11: Hampton 69, Florida 54

**Dec. 10, 2010 \* Hampton, Va. \* HU Convocation Center**

Hampton dominated the second half and Florida wasn't able to capture an elusive road win, as the Lady Pirates earned a 69-54 victory at the HU Convocation Center Friday evening.

Hampton, which won its fourth consecutive game, scored the last six points of the first half and carried that momentum into the second, when the Pirates outscored the Gators, 42-22.

"Hampton played a lot tougher than we did," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "Whenever you get out-rebounded like we did, giving up 18 offensive rebounds, it's just toughness. At a certain point, our physical toughness lacked and then our mental toughness didn't sustain us at all. It's really, really disappointing that we didn't have our heart tonight."

Florida (8-3) was out-rebounded for the first time this season, as Hampton (5-4) fought for the 38-30 advantage inside, also out-scoring the Gators 28-16 in the paint.

"Hampton did a great job of getting the ball in the paint," Butler said. "We didn't defend dribble penetration at all. That's personal. That's pride on the defensive side and it's disappointing. The two areas that really are a reflection of how tough you are we failed in tonight."

The Pirates quickly erased the Gators' 32-27 halftime lead, using a 15-0 run that spanned the final 58 seconds of the opening period into the first five minutes of the second and taking a 36-32 lead. Deandra Young finally halted the spree with an inside jumper and after one Pirate free throw, Jennifer George made a strong move in the paint the cut the deficit to one, 37-36, with 14:13 remaining. Hampton, however, wasn't done scoring in waves and ripped off an 11-0 run and claimed a 48-36 advantage.

Jatterra Bonds nailed a three-pointer and had Florida within single digits and the teams traded scores for the next minute, as the Pirates continued to find their way to the free throw line, moving into the bonus phase with 9:49 remaining. After one free throw from Jordan Jones brought UF within nine, 52-43, with 7:55 left, the Gators played great defense for 29 seconds on its next possession, but Bernadette Fortune jacked up a long shot and banked in a three-pointer as the shot clock expired, fitting for the way the game was going for the Gators.

The trey ignited an 8-0 spurt and Hampton was able to weather a late push by the Gators, who cut the deficit to 10, last coming with 3:58 to play, but UF went cold from the floor, as Lanita Bartley's layup that brought her team within 62-52 was the last field goal for the Gators.

Jones was the only Florida player who scored in double-figures and scored 16 points, with 13 of those coming in the first half for the Gators, who have yet to earn a true road win in three tries this season. Florida shot 41.7 percent overall (20-48) from the floor, including a 44.4 percent (8-18) effort from the three-point arc. The Gators, however, connected on just 1-of-8 long range attempts in the deciding second half.

Melanie Warner led four Pirates in double-figures, scoring 16 with a game-high 10 rebounds, as Hampton hit 43.1 percent from the floor and scored 22 points off UF's 19 turnovers.

Florida began the second half committing consecutive turnovers, but held Hampton to one missed shot on both of its initial offensive tries. After the Gators' third miscue in as many offensive possessions, the Lady Pirates crashed the boards and Melanie Warner rewarded the home team with a three-pointer and continued the run the cut finished the first half to 9-0. Two more buckets by Hampton extended the spree to 13-0 and gave the Pirates a 34-32 lead, which forced the Gators to call a timeout. Hampton tacked on one more bucket and continued its scoring spree that ballooned to a 27-4 run and never looked back.

## Game 12: Florida 95, Alabama State 38 (Gator Holiday Classic)

**Dec. 20, 2010 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center**

Making her first career start, UF freshman Brittany Shine scored a career-high 28 points to direct the Gators to a 95-38 win against Alabama State in the Gator Holiday Classic.

The Gators (9-3), playing their first game since Dec. 10 due to final exams, used a balanced offensive output that placed four players in double-figure scoring. It marked the seventh time this season that Florida has placed three or more players in double figures in a single game and the third time that four or more players have tallied double-figures in points.

Shine became the first Gator this season to eclipse the 20-point plateau this season, besting her previous career high of 16 points set against Harvard on Dec. 7. Her 28 points were the most scored by a Gator since Sha Brooks poured in 29 points against Tennessee on Feb. 8, 2009. She connected on 4-of-9 three-pointers, tying for the most by a Gator in a single game this season. Shine reached her career high by halftime with 19 points in the opening period.

Sophomore Jennifer George was impressive on the defensive end, blocking a career-high nine shots, which ties for the second-most rejections in a single game in school history. Vanessa Hayden holds the school record with 10 blocked shots against Kent State on Dec. 29, 2001. George becomes just the second different player in school history to chart nine or more blocks in a single game. George added six rebounds and five points in 16 minutes of action.

Freshman Jatterra Bonds scored 13 points in the game, marking her fifth double-figure scoring effort this season. She also dished out a career-high nine assists, marking the most charted by any Gator player since Sha Brooks dished out 10 assists against Arkansas on Feb. 1, 2009. Junior Lanita Bartley came up with a career-high five steals – the most of any Florida player this season. She also tied her Florida career high with 12 points, matching her best of 12 scored against UCF in the season opener on Nov. 13. Junior Deana Allen also tallied a career-high 13 points, hitting 2-of-3 three-pointers, as well as 5-of-6 from the free throw line, while tying her career-highs of three assists and three steals. Junior Azania Stewart brought down a team-high eight rebounds. The Gators won the rebound battle 50-44, marking the 11th time in 12 games this season that Florida has won the battle of the boards.

Florida shot 46.2 percent (36-of-78) from the floor, connecting on 10 three-pointers in the game. The Gators limited the Hornets to 26.3 percent (15-of-57) shooting in the game. It was Florida's lowest shooting percentage defense of the season. Alabama State's 17 points in the second half marked the fewest allowed by the Gators in a single half this season. The Gators raced out to an early 9-0 lead at the 15:29 mark of the opening period, holding the Hornets without a basket for nearly five minutes to start the game. Florida extended its advantage to 14-3 after a three-point play by Bartley and a basket by Nndi Madu at the 13:45 mark of the first half. A basket by Bonds and a three-pointer by Shine on back-to-back plays widened UF's lead to 14, 19-5, with 12:33 remaining until intermission. The two teams traded baskets, as Alabama State cut within 12

## Game 13: Florida 70, Robert Morris 50 (Gator Holiday Classic) Dec. 21 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Brittany Shine scored a game-high 19 points and helped Florida defeat Robert Morris 70-50 in the championship game of its own Gator Holiday Classic on Tuesday in the O'Connell Center.

Shine was voted the tournament's Most Valuable Performer after totaling 47 points and 10 assists during the two games and leading Florida to its 10th consecutive non-conference home win. Shine, who is the third freshman in the Gator Classic's 20-year history to earn the tournament's top individual honor, also hit 6-of-14 three-pointers.

Freshman Jaterra Bonds earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team, as she produced 26 points and 12 assists in the two-game event, including 13 points in Tuesday's title game. Bonds just missed a double-double in the first round when she dished nine assists.

Had Shine and Bonds not produced the kind of impressive numbers they did, several other Gators made a case for a spot on the All-Tournament team.

Junior newcomer Lanita Bartley scored 13 points with a team-high seven rebounds and four assists against Robert Morris, while sophomore Jennifer George collected six boards and blocked a shot, one night after swatting nine shots in the victory against Alabama State.

Florida (10-3) led Tuesday's game wire-to-wire, as the Gators raced out to a 6-1 lead less than two minutes into the game thanks to field goals by Ndidi Madu, Azania Stewart and Shine.

Robert Morris traded scores with Florida for the next two minutes, as Madu added another bucket and Bartley added her name to the score sheet.

With the Gators holding a 10-7 advantage, Madu converted an inside jumper and Stewart sank and started a 9-2 run, as George put back an offensive rebound before Bonds and Shine combine for three free throws to give UF a 19-9 cushion.

The Colonials clawed back with the next five points, but Florida responded with a 12-3 run, as Shine scored seven, Bonds two, freshman Deandra Young two and red-shirt freshman Lily Svete one point during the spree that extended the Gator lead to 14 points, 31-17, with 5:30 left in the half.

The teams traded buckets for the rest of the way and RMU whittled the margin to nine with 34 seconds remaining, but Bonds nailed a jumper with 11 ticks on the clock and Florida entered intermission with an 11-point lead.

Kristine Silaraja, who represented Robert Morris on the All-Tournament Team, scored the first points of the second half and cut the Gator's lead to single-digits. Madu answered with a six-foot floater and Bartley put back an offensive rebound for UF which was building momentum. Silaraja struck back with a three-pointer and had the Colonials back within 10 points at 43-33 with less than 17 minutes remaining.

Florida then staged a deciding 17-4 run that spanned the next seven-plus minutes to take a 60-37 lead with 7:46 remaining and never looked back en route to its second straight decisive victory and post the 599th win in the 37-year history of the program.

UF shot 45.8 percent (27-of-59) from the field in the game, marking the fourth consecutive game and the fifth time in the last six contests that the Gators have shot better than 40 percent from the field.

The Gators won the rebound battle 39-33 on Tuesday and have won the battle of the boards in 12 of the team's 13 contests this season. Florida has won its home tournament 16 times in the 20 years of its existence.

## Game 14: #25/23 Florida State 74, Florida 72

Dec. 28, 2010 \* Tallahassee, Fla. \* Donald L. Tucker Center

In another classic battle between the two intrastate women's basketball rivals, Florida made more field goals and outrebounded its taller foe but 25th/23rd-ranked Florida State escaped with the 74-72 decision at the Donald L. Tucker Center in front of 3,368 Seminole fans.

The Gators (10-4) took a 70-68 lead with 2:38 remaining when Jordan Jones nailed her fourth three-pointer of the game. Florida came up with a defensive stop on the other end, but Lanita Bartley couldn't add to the lead, as Cierra Bravard converted a three-point play for the Seminoles (10-3) and gave the home team a 71-70 lead with 1:24 on the clock.

Freshman Jaterra Bonds converted a slashing layup with 59 seconds remaining, but Bravard stepped up at the free throw line again and knocked down two that swung the lead for the 11th time in the game, this time with 30.8 seconds left, 73-72.

Florida had one final possession and Bonds missed the first attempt. Deana Allen collected the rebound in traffic and tried to put up a shot, but couldn't get a good look, as Courtney Ward was fouled and made one free throw with 00.1 second remaining to provide the final scoring.

"We had a couple of ways that we wanted to score, but we forced up a bad shot," UF head coach Amanda Butler said of the team's final possession. "We were fortunate enough to come up with the rebound and we tried to call a timeout, but it didn't work out so we forced up another bad shot. I'm really proud of our team's fight and effort. It was a great basketball game for the basketball fans in this state. They got to see two teams play hard. I feel bad for our kids because they played so hard and battled. A lot of the statistical categories went in our favor, but we have to give Florida State a lot of credit for their composure at the end of the game."

Jones, who had missed the last two games because of injury, scored a team-high 14 points with four assists and two steals for Florida, which hit 30-of-62 from the floor, including 8-of-15 from the three-point arc. The Gators also held a 39-31 rebound advantage against the taller Seminoles, who made 15-of-20 free throws compared with Florida's 4-of-6 effort.

Bonds finished the game with 11 points and a game-high seven assists, while Allen added 10 points on 5-of-8 shooting in 15 minutes of action. Azania Stewart (Wood Green, England) collected a team-high nine rebounds, while holding FSU's leading scorer and rebounder Bravard in check for the majority of the contest.

"We got some great individual efforts from players like Deana Allen, who gave us a great spark," Butler praised. "Jaterra Bonds stepped up and hit some tough shots. Jennifer George (8 points, 7 rebounds) played fantastic minutes and just made plays when we needed them the most." Ward scored a game-high 20 points with four assists and four steals to lead FSU, which hit 28-of-63 overall and 3-of-13 from long range.

Florida State ripped out of the halftime locker room with a 12-4 run and built a 51-41 lead with 17:12 remaining. The Gators, meanwhile, turned the ball over three times during those opening minutes of the second period Florida regrouped and scored nine straight points to spark a 20-5 run that saw scoring from six different players and took a 61-56 lead with 9:04 remaining.

The Gators were able to maintain the advantage for the next few minutes, still carrying a five-point edge with 6:01 on the clock, 65-60. That's when the Noles scored five consecutive points to take a 68-67 lead with 3:05 remaining after the Gators turned the ball over twice during the mini spree. Florida ended the game with 18 turnovers that FSU converted into 21 points. In all, there were 11 lead changes and 11 tied scores.

## Game 15: Florida 64, #22/24 Arkansas 53

January 2, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Deana Allen scored 12 points and led another balanced offensive effort for Florida that handed No. 22/24 Arkansas its first loss of the season and opened Southeastern Conference action with a 64-53 victory Sunday at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

The Gators (11-4, 1-0 SEC) earned their first win this season against a nationally ranked opponent and notched the program's 43rd upset over a higher-ranked team. Sunday's outcome also marked the 600th varsity win in the 37-year history of the program.

"I am especially proud of the win and starting the SEC season this way," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "But at the same time, I am not surprised at the outcome because we had a great few days of preparation leading up to this. We were really focused and really intense. We saw a really resilient effort in practice, where I think we felt really confident."

Florida extended its 16-point halftime lead to 19 after Jaterra Bonds's three-pointer with 17:36 remaining gave the Gators a 43-24 advantage. The teams then traded scores and the Razorbacks (12-1, 0-1 SEC) slowly whittled their deficit down to nine points, 58-49, with 4:25 left thanks to back-to-back treys from Lyndsay Harris. Bonds countered with a bucket for the Gators with 3:21 on the clock and that would be the last field goal for Florida, which committed five of its 21 turnovers during the final 2:38 of the game and missed the front end of two one-and-ones as part of four missed free throw attempts after Harris' two free throws cut UF's lead to nine, 60-51 with 2:32 remaining.

Jordan Jones and Allen both stepped up and connected on a pair from the line in the final 41 seconds, however, to help Florida score its last points from the charity stripe and hold on for its ninth consecutive home victory. Jennifer George contributed 10 points along with seven rebounds, three assists and three steals in 28 minutes of action, while Ndidi Madu added 10 points, hitting 5-of-7 shots in 16 minutes of work. Bonds brought down a game and career-high eight rebounds, in addition to scoring nine points.

Arkansas, which had entered Sunday's game as one of only four undefeated NCAA Division I Women's Basketball teams, shot a season-low 31.7 percent from the floor, including a 3-of-18 effort from the three-point arc. Florida won the rebounding battle, 45-38, but the Razorbacks rallied in the second half, when they pulled down five more boards and scored five more points. The Gators shot 45.5 percent overall, marking the sixth consecutive game Florida has shot better than 40 percent from the field.

Arkansas missed its first four shots of the game, as well as a pair of free throw attempts, while Florida built a 4-0 lead behind buckets from Madu and Lanita Bartley. Sarah Watkins finally got the Razorbacks on the scoreboard with an inside jumper, but Madu and Bonds, who dropped in a nifty lay-in after running the length of the court and dribbling around her back in traffic, tallied the next four points of the game and lifted the Gators to a six-point spread, 8-2.

The Gators extended their lead to seven after a 4-1 march with inside buckets from George and Deaundra Young. Watkins nailed a three-pointer from the top of the key, but Florida responded with a 13-2 spree over the next 3:49 and assumed a 27-11 lead. Harris connected on a pair of free throws with 7:24 on the clock to stop the run that featured scoring from Young, George, Bartley, Allen and Madu, who nailed a 17-footer 20 seconds after Harris' charity tosses. Florida had built the 18-point lead with scoring from six different players, while three of the Gators top five scorers were among those contributing to that stage. That didn't last long, as Jordan Jones nailed her first points of the game, a three-pointer, on the heels of four consecutive Razorback points and gave Florida a 34-17 advantage with 2:31 remaining in the first half. Florida was able to maintain the double-figure spread, entering the locker room with a 38-22 lead.

## Game 16: Auburn 73, Florida 56

January 6, 2011 \* Auburn, Ala. \* Auburn Arena

Auburn used a 22-9 run in the final 6:43 of the game and blew open a close game to post a 73-56 decision against Florida Thursday evening at the new Auburn Arena.

The Gators held a 33-28 halftime lead, but the Tigers roared out of the locker room and started the second half scoring the first four points and whittled the deficit to one. Azania Stewart and Jordan Jones followed with buckets and returned the Gator advantage to five, 37-32. Auburn, however, tallied six consecutive points and sparked a 13-2 run and assumed a six-point lead with 11:15 to go in the game.

Jennifer George, who finished with a team-high 10 points, scored the lone field goal during the stretch, as Stewart hit an inside jumper to stop the spree. The teams then traded scores for the next seven opportunities, as the Gators could get no closer than four points, including 51-47 with 7:19 remaining. That's when the Tigers (9-6, 2-0 SEC) went on their game-ending run to earn their fifth consecutive victory and deny Florida (11-5, 1-1 SEC) its first true road win in five tries.

Auburn also won the rebounding battle, 34-25, handing the Gators their worse deficit margin this year, including a seven rebound differential in the deciding second half, when the Tigers shot 57.7 percent and made 16 of their 24 trips to the free throw line. AU shot 50 percent overall during the game, the best by a UF opponent this season.

Florida shot 41.5 percent overall (22-53), including 5-of-11 from the three-point arc, but found their way to the free throw line only 10 times, all in the first 20 minutes of play.

"They won the paint, there's not any question," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "They dominated us on the boards, did a great job of getting to the rim and posting us up and scoring. It's really disappointing because that was our emphasis. We didn't come in with the determination and fight that it's going to take to win on the road in this league. I thought we played a real soft game. When we're at our best, we're playing with toughness and we didn't bring that toughness tonight."

Stewart, who was plagued with foul trouble and whistled for her fourth with 10 minutes remaining, pulled down a team-high five rebounds along with seven points in 19 minutes of action.

Nine of the 10 Gators who played scored during the game. Chantel Hilliard scored a career and game-high 17 points for Auburn, leading four Tigers in double-figure scoring.

Ndidi Madu opened the game's scoring 12 seconds after the initial ball went into the air, but Auburn sharp-shooter Blanche Alverson came back with a three-pointer and Parrisha Simmons followed with a pair of free throws and gave the Tigers the early 5-2 lead. Jones nailed a trey for the Gators to even things up, but Alli Smalley hit a bucket and Alverson went deep again to give Auburn a 10-5 advantage with 16:38 remaining in the opening half.

Florida settled after a pair of turnovers and marched off a 12-4 run, with scoring from Deana Allen, Madu, Deaundra Young, Lanita Bartley and Jaterra Bonds and took a 17-14 lead with 9:21 remaining, as Bonds capped the spree with a three-pointer en route to a team-best seven first-half points. The teams traded buckets for the next few minutes before Auburn came right back with two consecutive scores and held a 20-19 edge with 5:17 on the clock. That started a trend of six lead changes and one tied score over the next three minutes. With Auburn holding a 28-27 advantage and 2:39 on the clock, Bonds hit two free throws, Azania Stewart converted a three-point play and Bartley capped the first-half scoring with one from the charity stripe and gave Florida a 33-28 halftime lead.

## Game 17: Florida 65, South Carolina 63

January 9, 2011 \* Columbia, S.C. \* Colonial Life Arena

Lanita Bartley stole the inbound pass underneath Florida's basket and converted a three-point play with 16.7 seconds remaining and the Gator defense did the rest as Florida earned a 65-63 victory at South Carolina Sunday afternoon at Colonial Life Arena in front of 3,071.

In a tight game that featured 13 lead changes and nine tied scores, Florida collected its first true road win of the season and improved to 12-5 overall and 2-1 in the Southeastern Conference.

With UF holding its largest lead of 56-52 with 5:46 remaining, Valerie Nainima nailed back-to-back three-pointers and gave South Carolina (9-7, 1-2) a two-point edge with 3:08 to play.

Azania Stewart came back and hit a tough inside jumper and tied the score at 59-all, before a pair of Gamecock free throws swung the advantage back to the hosts with 2:16 on the clock.

Jordan Jones, who began her career at South Carolina, stepped up and worked for a three-pointer from the right side with 1:31 remaining and gave the Gators a 62-61 lead. La'Keisha Sutton followed with a driving layup and swung the lead again at 1:11 on the clock. Florida turned the ball over on its ensuing offensive possession and South Carolina missed its shot attempt at the other end, giving the Gators the ball with 36 seconds remaining. Florida missed its attempt and South Carolina got the ball on the side of the court, setting up Bartley's heroics.

SC raced down the court to try and tie the game, but Ndidi Madu collected Walker's miss and tipped the ball to Stewart, who was fouled. The Gator junior missed the front end of the one-and-one from the free throw line with six seconds remaining, giving the Gamecocks a little hope.

South Carolina's final attempt resulted in its 10th turnover of the game and Florida emerged with the thrilling victory.

Madu led Florida with a career-high 17 points, hitting 7-of-9 from the floor and 3-of-3 free throws in 22 minutes of action. Jaterra Bonds added 11 points, as eight different Gators contributed offensively. Florida shot a season-high 56.5 percent (26-46) in the game, including 3-of-9 from the three-point arc and 10-of-16 from the free throw line. The Gators won the rebounding battle, 33-24, led by 10 from Jennifer George, who contributed six points, three assists and a pair of steals.

Walker finished with a game-high 22 points, while Ashley Bruner added 16 points and La'Keisha Sutton dropped in 13 with eight assists for South Carolina which hit 42.9 percent (24-56) from the field, including a 7-of-22 effort from the three-point arc.

The first half featured several runs by both teams, five lead changes and three tied scores, including the 31-all halftime time score that marked the first time this year the Gators were even at the break. South Carolina jumped out to a 7-2 lead to start the game, before Deana Allen hit a pair of free throws that started a 6-0 swing and tied the game with 16:34 after Stewart's short jumper connected. The hosts then mounted an 8-0 march sparked by a pair of three-pointers and held a 15-7 lead with 14:53 on the clock. Deaundra Young's bucket inside at 13:27 began a 7-0 run that included scoring from Bartley, Allen and George, as Florida cut the deficit to one, 15-14, with 9:42 remaining in the opening half. The teams traded buckets before Young hit another bucket and George followed with an offensive putback with 8:17 left that gave the Gators their first lead of the game. Again the teams traded scorers, as Ndidi Madu 13-footer gave Florida a 20-19 edge with 7:11 to go. South Carolina regrouped and scored the next nine points for a 28-20 lead, tied for its largest of the contest so far, with 4:01 on the clock. That run forced Butler to call a timeout and the Gators responded, as Jones connected on her first field goal attempt of the game, a three-pointer. Bonds followed with a driving layup and Madu dropped in another short-range shot and UF was within one point. SC halted the run with an inside score with 1:40 remaining, but Bartley hit a driving bucket of her own and Madu canned another to give the Gators a 31-30 lead with 37 seconds until halftime. Walker converted one of two free throws with 13 seconds left and Jones' 3-point attempt at the buzzer wouldn't fall as the teams entered the break even at 31.

## Game 18: #5/6 Tennessee 83, Florida 40

January 13, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

No. 5/6 Tennessee used a potent three-point attack and placed four players in double-figure scoring to snap Florida's nine-game home winning streak with an 83-40 win on Thursday in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Freshman guard Brittany Shine (Sacramento, Calif.) who reached the 100-point plateau for her collegiate career in the game led the Gators (12-6, 2-2 Southeastern Conference) for the fourth time this season with seven points in 21 minutes of play.

The Gators shot 21.4 percent (15-of-70) from the floor for the game, marking the third-lowest shooting percentage in a single game in school history. Tennessee shot 47.8 percent (32-of-67) from the field, connecting on nine three-pointers and winning the rebound-battle 57-37. It marked just the third time this season that Florida has been out-rebounded.

"We are very disappointed, obviously, of the outcome, but (also) just the way the whole game went," Florida head coach Amanda Butler said. "Tennessee is tremendous, there isn't any question. I think they are great. They deserve their ranking; they are certainly the best team in the league. I knew we were going to have to play well to beat them, but we are really just disappointed with our toughness. We have to give Tennessee credit for setting the tone right from the beginning offensively. Defensively, the tempo, the rebounding battle--they just really took all of that away from us right from the tip. We never adjusted or responded with the toughness that I know that this team possesses."

Junior guard Deana Allen (Houma, La.) scored six points and brought down a career-high and team-high eight rebounds, while freshman guard Jaterra Bonds (Gainesville, Fla.) added six points. Junior guard Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) chipped in five points.

The Lady Vols raced out to an early 11-3 lead, holding the Gators to just 1-of-6 shooting from the field to open the game. After an Allen basket stopped the Florida scoring drought, Bjorklund drained a three-pointer from the left wing at the 16:02 mark of the opening period, to give her eight points in the first four-plus minutes of the game and extend Tennessee's edge to 14-5. The Lady Vols continued their three-point shooting barrage, widening their margin to 13, 22-9, with 12:31 left in the half. Tennessee held Florida without a basket for nearly nine minutes late in the opening period to widen its margin to 22 points, 34-12, before a Shine three-pointer at the 2:42 mark ended the drought.

Tennessee took a 47-15 edge into the locker room at intermission, using seven three pointers to highlight its offensive performance. The Gators shot 20.0 percent (6-of-30) from the floor in the opening period, while the Lady Vols connected on 47.5 percent (19-of-40) of its shots. Tennessee held a 30-16 advantage on the boards at intermission, and a 14-2 edge in points-in-the-paint.

The Lady Vols came out of the locker room in the second half to quickly build up to a 39-point advantage at 57-18 with 15:58 remaining in the game. Tennessee would never trail by fewer than 30 points for the remainder of the game, and led by as many as 45 points, 83-38, with 1:19 left on the clock.

Tennessee (16-2, 4-0 SEC) was led by Bjorklund's game-high 16 points, while junior forward Shekinna Stricklen poured in a double-double with 11 points and 12 rebounds as one of four Lady Vol players to score in double-figures.

### Game 19: Georgia 70, Florida 64

January 16, 2011 \* Athens, Ga. \* Stegeman Coliseum

Deana Allen had the best night of her young Florida career, but as Georgia ruined the day as the Lady Bulldogs rallied for an improbable 70-64 win at Stegeman Coliseum in front of 4,995.

Florida led by 16 points with 14:17 remaining in the game, but the Lady Bulldogs dug deep and began their comeback. From that point forward, Georgia sank six three-pointers and Florida turned the ball over nine times that resulted in 16 Lady Bulldog points. Toward the start of at final 14:17, the Gators held a 56-44 lead when Jordan Jones nailed her third three-pointer of the game. Georgia ripped off an ensuing 13-0 run and took a 57-56 lead with 4:31 remaining.

Lanita Bartley's two free throws halted the 13-point spree and swung the lead back in UF's favor, but Jasmine James stepped up with a trey and had the host back on top, 60-58. Jaterra Bonds answered with a driving layup and tied the score at 60 with 2:54 remaining. Florida's defense held, but its offense turned the ball over again and Georgia made the Gators pay as Meredith Mitchell nailed a three-pointer with 1:59 on the clock and gave the Dawgs a 63-60 lead. Again the Gators turned the ball over before attempting a shot and James again nailed a three-pointer for a six-point advantage. Jennifer George dropped in a tough inside bucket and had the Gators within four, 66-52, with 62 seconds left. After one free throw from James, Bonds hit another bucket and brought Florida within three points with 35 seconds remaining. Georgia was then able to seal the win at the free throw line, where it scored its final four points.

Allen notched the first double-double of her career with 14 points and 13 rebounds and helped Florida win the rebounding battle, 47-31. The Gators even shot a steady 44.8 percent from the floor during the game, including 5-of-11 three-pointers, but their undoing came with their miscues, as their 23 turnovers resulted in 23 Georgia Points. Jones finished with 13 points and Azania Stewart added 11 points with a pair of blocks, the first one being the 100th of her career as she became the seventh Gator in history to swat as many.

James scored 14 of her game-high 18 points during the final 14:28 of the game, while Mitchell added nine of her 15 in that final stretch, when Georgia converted 13-of-26 from the field, including 5-of-9 three-pointers. Overall, Georgia shot 39.7 percent from the floor and outscored Florida 46-27 in the second half.

Florida began the second half on a 5-2 run and extended its 37-24 halftime lead to 16 points after two free throws from Allen. Georgia began chipping away at the Gator lead, dropping it to 11 with 15:45 on the clock. Stewart hit a short jumper and Jones connected on a 3-pointer after a mad scramble for a loose ball and Florida reclaimed a 16-point advantage, 49-33, with 14:17 remaining. Georgia then staged an 8-2 run over the next three minutes and cut its deficit to nine, 51-42, with 11:17 to play.

Florida opened the game with great intensity and focus, hitting four of their first eight shots, including 2-of-3 from the three-point arc to take an 11-5 lead. The Gators dominated the boards during those first four minutes, 8-1, with four coming on the offensive end that resulted in five second-chance points. The Gators got scoring from Jaterra Bonds, Azania, Ndidi Madu and Jones, while Allen collected a trio of boards during the opening minutes. Stewart also became the seventh Gator in program history to block 100 shots in a career, as she swatted Jasmine Hassell's shot with 16:21 on the clock, as UF's defense continued to frustrate the Bulldogs. UF answered with buckets a couple of times and cut UF's lead to three points and later to four, 19-15, with 11:59 remaining in the first half. That's when the Gators marched off six consecutive points during the next four-plus minutes with scoring from Brittany Shine, Lily Svete and Stewart and took a 25-15 lead with 7:35 to play. UF returned with the next four points of the game and the teams traded scores for the next few minutes with Florida holding a 31-24 lead with 2:29 remaining until halftime. Stewart put back an offensive rebound and Allen followed with another bucket. She then banked in an offensive rebound at the buzzer and gave Florida a 37-24 halftime lead.

### Game 20: #19 Kentucky 59, Florida 58

January 20, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Kentucky's Victoria Dunlap made two free throws with 10.4 seconds remaining to lead the No. 19 Wildcats to a 59-58 victory against upset-minded Florida on Thursday evening.

The Gators (12-8, 2-4 SEC), who led by as many as 10 points with just better than five minutes remaining in the game, found themselves down 57-55 after a reverse lay-up by Dunlap with 43.5 seconds left. UF junior Deana Allen responded with a three-pointer from the top of the key with 23.3 seconds left and brought the crowd to its feet. UK got the ball looking to reclaim the lead on the final possession and Azania Stewart was whistled for a foul against a driving Dunlap with 10.4 seconds remaining. Dunlap connected on both free throws and the Gators were unable to connect on its final possession, as Ndidi Madu's final shot hit the back of the iron and bounced out as the horn sounded.

Allen led the Gators for the third time this season, scoring a team-high 13 points to complement four rebounds in 22 minutes of action. She was the only player to reach double-figures for Florida, which played its 12th game this season decided by 10 or fewer points and its eighth contest decided by six or less. Freshman Jaterra Bonds and junior Jordan Jones each added nine points, while Jones was a squad-best 4-of-6 from the charity stripe. Deandra Young chipped in seven points and a game-high nine rebounds. Madu had eight rebounds and Stewart blocked four shots.

Florida shot 38.0 percent (19-of-50) from the floor in the game, but connected on just 15-of-22 free throws (68.2 pct.), leaving seven points at the stripe. Kentucky shot 37.5 percent (21-of-56) from the field and made 12-of-17 free throws (70.6 pct.). The Gators dominated the battle of the boards 45-27, but the Wildcats held the edge in points in the paint at 26-16. Kentucky also scored 25 points off of 24 Florida turnovers.

The Wildcats were led by freshman Jennifer O'Neill, who scored a career-high 15 points as one of three UK players in double-figure scoring. Dunlap added 12 points and eight rebounds.

Kentucky raced to a quick 6-0 lead before the Gators even attempted a shot from the field and committed four turnovers, but Florida responded with back-to-back baskets by Allen and Madu to cut within 6-4 at the 17:09 mark of the opening half. The two teams then began trading hoops before the Gators whittled their deficit down to one, 10-9, with 12:43 left in the half after a Bartley basket and a free throw by Young. From there, Kentucky employed an 11-2 run to jump in front by 10, 21-11, with 7:31 left until intermission. Florida answered with a 7-0 run of its own that was capped off by a three-point play from Jones at the 5:02 mark that brought the Gators within three, 21-18. After the teams traded baskets, Bonds drained a three to cut Kentucky's lead down to one, 24-23, at the 2:59 mark. Freshman Brittany Shine connected on the front end of a 1-and-1 to knot the score at 24-24.

The Gators entered the locker room with a 25-24 advantage after a Jones free throw with 19.2 seconds left in the period. Florida shot 38.5 percent (10-of-26) from the floor in the opening period, while Kentucky shot 33.3 percent (10-of-30) from the field. The Gators held the rebounding edge 20-17 in the first half, while the Wildcats forced 12 Florida turnovers.

The Gators easily extended their advantage to four, 30-26, after a Bonds three-pointer early in the second half, but Kentucky fought its way back to reclaim the lead at 31-30 on a basket by Kastine Evans at the 16:53 mark that capped a 5-0 run for the Wildcats. From there, the Gators scored five consecutive points, including three from Allen, to go up 35-31 with 14:45 left. UK responded with five quick points in transition to reclaim the lead at 36-35 with 13:44 remaining in the game. With the Gators down 39-38, Jones hit a pair of free throws and then knocked down a three-pointer just a minute later to give UF a 43-39 edge with 10:08 remaining. UF 43-41, the Gators got a pair of free throws and a basket by Allen to extend their lead to seven, 48-41, at the 8:49 mark. After UF took its largest lead of the game at 54-44, the Wildcats began making their comeback. UK ran off 11 consecutive points to go up 55-54 with 1:13 left on a free-throw by A'dia Mathies.

## Game 21: LSU 72, Florida 58

January 23, 2011 \* Baton Rouge, La. \* Pete Maravich Assembly Center

Jordan Jones scored 15 points and led a balanced scoring effort but it wasn't enough as Florida lost to LSU 72-58 on Sunday at the Maravich Center in front of 5,373.  
Jones hit 4-of-7 three-pointers and 5-of-10 overall for Florida, which shot 41.5 percent (22-53) overall from the field, but was out rebounded 41-24, managing only four offensive boards en route to its fourth consecutive loss. Florida was within seven points early in the second half before LSU used a 14-3 run and the Gators never quite recovered and fell to 1-7 in true road games this season. UF did rally and got within nine points with just over two minutes remaining, but wouldn't score again and the Tigers tallied the final eight points of the game and won for the fourth time in their last five outings.  
Jones also dished a team-high three assists for Florida which hit 9-of-19 from the three-point arc. Junior newcomer Deana Allen, who was playing less than an hour from her hometown of Houma, La., pulled down a team-high four rebounds along with nine points.  
LSU's Adrienne Webb led all scorers with 18 points, while LaSondra Barrett just missed a triple-double as she contributed 14 points, 12 rebounds and eight assists in 35 minutes of action. The Lady Tigers converted 50.9 percent from the field, the highest by a Florida opponent this season, drained 7-of-16 from the three-point arc, with six coming in the first half alone.

LSU hit one free throw to start the second-half scoring and took a nine-point lead before Jennifer George hit a tough inside jumper and had UF within seven points, 39-32, with 17:25 on the clock. That's when the Tigers exploded with a 14-3 game-changing run that swelled the hosts lead with 18 with 8:11 remaining. Jones halted the final part of the run with a three-pointer from the left corner, but LSU netted the next two field goals and assumed a 57-38 lead with 6:49 to go.

The teams exchanged scores over the next minute before the Gators staged an 8-0 run and cut the deficit to 11 with 5:08 to go. LSU scored the next four points, but Jatterra Bonds nailed a step-back three-pointer and George powered up an inside field goal and Florida was within 10 points, 63-53. After one LSU free throw, Allen hit an outside jumper off an in-bounds play and the Gators closed the gap to nine, 64-55, with 2:08 remaining. Unfortunately for the Gators, those were the final points they would score, as LSU scored the final eight points of the game that began when it hit one free throw, missed the second, collected the loose ball and converted a deep jumper. The Tigers followed with a 3-pointer with 51 seconds left and added one final field goal to cap the game's scoring.

LSU used two spurts to build a 38-30 halftime lead, the largest one was an 11-0 run in two and half minutes that turned an 11-10 Florida lead into a 21-11 Gator deficit with 9:21 remaining. The Lady Tigers had one of their six first-half treys during that span, but began after Deaundra Young sank an eight footer from the side as the shot clock horn sounded. Ndiri Madu halted the march when she hit a six-footer after dribbling and creating her own shot at the top of the arc. Allen followed Madu's bucket with one of her own and brought Florida within six points, 21-15, with 8:12 on the clock. But the Lady Tigers struck again from long range, as Jeanne Kenney nailed one. Jones answered with a three-pointer for Florida and had the Gators back within five, 26-21, with 5:52 remaining in the period. Again LSU turned to its outside game and LaSondra Barrett canned one and started a 7-0 run for the Tigers, who took a 33-21 lead with 4:07 to play. UF committed three of their eight first-half turnovers during the span, never getting off a shot. Lily Svete got into the long range act and added one for Florida at the 3:45 mark and had UF within single digits. Katherine Graham stepped inside the arc for a bucket for the hosts with 3:08 on the clock, as the teams went cold from the floor for the next two minutes before Jones connected on her second trey of the half. LSU again followed a three and took a 38-27 lead with 44 seconds to go. Both teams missed on their next offensive possessions, before Jones found Lanita Bartley on the wing, where she spotted up for a 3-pointer with two seconds remaining and cut the deficit to eight entering the halftime locker room.

## Game 22: Florida 70, Alabama 64

January 27, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Jatterra Bonds and Jennifer George each scored a team-high 12 points and the Gators returned to their winning ways by holding off Alabama, 70-64, in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.  
The Gators led by three, 56-53, late in the tightly-contested game before a three-pointer by Bonds widened the team's edge to six, 59-53, with 2:25 left on the clock. After a pair of free throws by Alabama's Kaneisha Horn brought the tide within four, 59-55, George was fouled in the process of making a put-back. She completed the three-point play to extend the Gators' lead to seven, 62-55, with 1:43 remaining in the game. The Crimson Tide got as close as four, 68-64, with 11 seconds left, but Azania Stewart iced the game with a pair of free throws with 10 seconds remaining.  
Florida, which trailed by two points at halftime and was down by as many as six points in the game, rallied for its third win this season when trailing at intermission.

Bonds scored 12 points and brought down a team-high eight rebounds, which tied her career high on the boards. George added 12 points and brought down five rebounds in the winning effort. Florida used a balanced offensive output that featured seven players who scored seven or more points apiece in the game. The Gators shot 39.7 percent (25-of-63) from the floor in the game, including an impressive 50 percent (13-of-26) shooting performance from the field in the final period. Alabama shot 33.3 percent (24-of-72), but was limited to just 28.6 percent (10-of-35) from the floor in the second half. The Gators held the rebounding advantage 52-41, improving to 12-4 this season when winning the battle of the boards. Florida was relentless on the offensive glass, outscoring the Tide 22-9 in second-chance points. Stewart scored seven points and brought down seven rebounds, while adding a game-high and career-tying five blocks. Ndiri Madu tallied nine points and seven rebounds, while Lanita Bartley scored nine and dished out a game-high five assists. Deana Allen also added nine points to go along with seven boards in 20 minutes of play.

In a first half that featured 13 lead changes, Alabama took a 32-30 advantage into the locker room at intermission. Florida shot just 32.4 percent (12-of-37) from the floor in the opening period, while the Crimson Tide made 37.8 percent (14-of-37) of its shots from the field. The Gators held a 28-22 advantage on the boards in the opening period, but the Gators committed seven turnovers that resulted in 12 Alabama points. The Tide jumped to an early 11-5 lead to begin the game, following seven consecutive points from Celiscia Farmer that broke a closely contested first few minutes of the game. Florida slowly began chipping away at its deficit to cut within two, 13-11, with 9:41 remaining until intermission, after Jordan Jones nailed a three-pointer from the left corner. The two teams began trading points until back-to-back baskets by George and Bonds gave the Gators the lead, 20-19, at the 7:16 mark to force an Alabama timeout. Those consecutive hoops capped a 7-2 run by Florida over a 56-second span. The lead then changed seven more times before Alabama took a 30-26 advantage at the 3:14 mark after a three-pointer by Jasmine Robinson and a pair of free throws from Horn. The Crimson Tide then went more than three minutes without a basket late in the second half, allowing the Gators to know the score at 30-all with 18.6 seconds left on a pair of charity shots by freshman guard Brittany Shine. Alabama's Ericka Russell connected on a lay-up with 2.3 seconds remaining to give the Crimson Tide a two-point halftime advantage.

Florida opened the second half on a 6-0 run that put it in front 36-32 with 17:20 left in the game, sparking a larger 11-2 run over the game's first 4:32 that gave the Gators a 41-34 advantage. UF opened the second half, making five of its first 10 shots from the field. Alabama's Tierney Jenkins canned back-to-back baskets to spark a 6-2 Tide run that brought them within three, 43-40, at the 12:56 mark of the second half. Alabama cut within one, 46-45, after a three-pointer by Russell and a basket from Robinson with 10:59 left. From there, the Gators engineered an 8-2 run that was capped by five consecutive Bartley points at the 6:04 mark to extend UF's advantage to 54-47.

## Game 23: Florida 67, Mississippi State 60 January 30, 2011 \* Starkville, Miss. \* Humphrey Coliseum

Junior co-captains Azania Stewart and Jordan Jones combined for 37 points and led the Florida women's basketball team to a 67-60 victory against Mississippi State on Sunday afternoon. The Gators earned their second true road win of the year, while keeping the Lady Bulldogs searching for their first Southeastern Conference victory of the season. Stewart scored a season-high 19 points on 9-of-11 shooting from the floor, while grabbing six rebounds, all in the second half. Jones finished with 18 points, nailing 4-of-7 from the three-point arc and more importantly 6-of-6 from the free throw line, all of which came in the final 6:41 of the game. Jones' final field goal came with 1:48 remaining after MSU was within five and seemed to answer every Gator score. With Florida (14-9, 4-5 SEC) holding a 63-57 lead with 56 seconds to go, Lanita Bartley came up with a huge offensive rebound off a missed free throw. She was able to work the clock and eventually was fouled with 37.1 seconds to go. She missed those two free throws, but connected on two with 21.7 seconds remaining that made it a two-possession game. Jones then followed with two more from the line with 15.1 ticks on the clock to seal the victory. Nididi Madu added 10 points on 5-of-6 shooting for the Gators, who hit 48.9 percent (23-47) from the floor overall, including a 6-of-13 effort from the three-point arc, as Bartley and Jaterria Bonds also connected from deep. Bonds collected six rebounds to share team honors with Stewart, as Florida held a 37-27 advantage on the boards. Mary Kathryn Govero scored a game-high 22 points, as she nailed 6-of-8 three-pointers for MSU, which converted 10-of-19 overall from long range. Porsha Porter finished with 18 points and a team-high seven rebounds for the Lady Bulldogs, who shot 38.6 percent overall and 28.1 percent in the second half when the Gators outscored their hosts 31-27. MSU scored the first points of the second half and cut UF's lead to one, 35-34, before Nididi Madu hit a deep jumper and Stewart ripped off the next five points and gave the Gators a 41-35 lead. Porsha Porter came right back with a 3-point play, before Stewart added another inside jumper. Govero nailed her fourth trey and brought MSU within two, 43-41, with 16:15 to play. Florida slowly extended its lead again with the next four points, as Brittany Shine added a bucket and Jennifer George converted 2-of-4 from the free throw line. After Porter canned a jumper, Stewart followed her own miss and putback a four-footer, before Madu out-jumped everyone for an offensive rebound and hit the soft 5-footer that gave the Gators a 51-43 advantage with 7:35 on the clock. Porter's next two points came from the charity stripe with 7:07 remaining in the game, as did Jones' points. Govero stepped up with another trey and Diamber Johnson followed with a bucket inside the arc and cut UF's lead to three, 53-50, with 5:41 remaining. Deana Allen came off the bench and converted a pair of free throws, before Bartley nailed a huge 3-pointer in front of the Gator bench and gave UF a 58-50 lead with 4:26 on the clock. The teams traded scores for the next couple of minutes, before Johnson hit two free throws and had MSU within 63-57 with 56.2 seconds remaining. Allen was then fouled, but missed the front end of a one-and-one. Bartley scrapped for the loose rebound and came away with it and was fouled. Bartley, however, missed both of her bonus tries and the Lady Bulldogs made the Gators pay, as Danielle Rector nailed a 3-point from the top of the key and brought hope to the home fans with 28 seconds remaining as MSU trailed by just three. Bartley redeemed herself, though, by converting two free throws on her next trip to the line with 21.7 seconds on the clock and gave Florida a 65-60 cushion. MSU sailed on airball on its next offensive possession and was forced to foul Jones, who received the in-bounds pass. Jones calmly nailed both free throws with 15.1 seconds remaining to ice the victory.

## Game 24: Florida 61, Ole Miss 59

February 3, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center  
Florida trailed by 12 points with 6:12 remaining, but rallied and tied the score with 63 seconds left, however, it wasn't enough as Ole Miss hung on for the 61-59 win in the O'Connell Center Thursday evening. The Rebels converted 3-of-4 free throws in the final 10.1 seconds to secure the victory and snap their two-game losing streak, while halting the Gators' two-game winning run. The Gators led the rebounding battle for only the fifth time this season and it has cost them every time, as the Rebels held the 40-32 advantage. Ole Miss, which collected 16 offensive boards, was led by freshman Valencia McFarland, who scored a game-high 20 points, hitting 5-of-5 from the free throw line. Fellow freshman Pa'Sonna Hope collected a game-high 10 rebounds along with 14 points, the final three coming in the last 37 seconds of the game. Brittany Shine led Florida with 12 points, as she hit 5-of-9 from the floor. Jennifer George added 11 points on 5-of-5 shooting with a team-best nine rebounds for the Gators, who committed a season-low nine turnovers but shot just 37.0 percent from the floor, including a 7-of-22 effort from the 3-point arc. Lanita Bartley chipped in 10 points for Florida. Jaterria Bonds stole the in-bounds pass, dribbled the length of the court and converted the layup to begin the second half, as she cut Florida's halftime deficit to four, 30-26. UM hit one free throw before the Gator's seventh turnover of the game resulted in another field goal for the guests, who took a 33-26 lead. George put back an offensive rebound for the Gators, before Shine knocked down her second three-pointer of the contest and had Florida within two points, 33-31, with 15:24 remaining. Ole Miss crashed the offensive boards and eventually cashed with a pair of free throws and another short bucket to take a six-point lead with 13:12 on the clock. Bartley came right back by hitting UF's fifth trey of the contest and had the Gators within three, 37-34. UF had a few more chances to cut into the deficit, but couldn't connect from a couple of long range attempts and as the Gators crashed the offensive boards hard, UM collected a miss and tossed the ball down the court for an easy two. The Rebels extended their lead to six with a driving layup from Shae Nelson, but George came back with a bucket. After another field goal from Valencia McFarland, Jordan Jones sank a three-pointer and had UF back within three, 43-40, with 9:30 to play. Nelson answered with a trey for UM and Pa'Sonna Hope sank the next two field goals that put the Gators in a 10-point hole with 7:12 remaining. McFarland made it a 9-0 run after her 5-footer and gave UM a 52-40 lead with 6:12 on the clock. George finally ended the spree with an athletic bucket inside, but McFarland struck again. Bartley hit one free throw, Stewart connected on one from inside and George hit another move for a bucket giving UF consecutive scores for only the second time in the half, and brought the Gators within seven, 54-47, with 4:06. Bartley drove the lane and missed the bucket, but connected on two free throws with 3:02 on the clock and UF crept closer, 54-49. After a defensive stop, Stewart put back a tough offensive rebound and the Gators were within three, 54-51 with 2:24 to go. McFarland then added two free throws to stop UF's 9-0 run, but Bartley hit one from the charity stripe and the Gators cut the deficit to four, 56-52 with 1:33 remaining. Jones then came up with a steal on the inbounds and fed George, who completed the 3-point play with 1:19 on the clock and had the Gators within one, 56-55. Bartley then picked Shae Nelson's pocket and dribbled the length of the court and put up a short shot, which she missed but made one of two free throws and tied the game with 63 seconds remaining. UM came back and Hope found herself open under the basket for a two-footer with 37 seconds remaining and gave UM a 58-56 lead. The Gators worked their next possession and Bonds' three-point attempt was off the mark. Nelson collected the rebound and was immediately fouled. Nelson calmly hit both ends of the one-and-one with 10.1 seconds on the clock to give the Rebels a 60-56 lead. Deana Allen stepped up and nailed a three-pointer that brought the Gators back within one, 60-59, with 4.5 seconds remaining. The Gators immediately fouled on the in-bounds and Hope hit the first, missed the second and George came up with the rebound, but Bartley's shot from three-quarter's of the court length was short.

## Game 25: Vanderbilt 103, Florida 97 (OT)

February 6, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

On a day when Florida honored its alumnae, the Gators turned in one of head coach Amanda Butler's trademark gritty, relentless and never-give-up performances, but fell just short in a 103-97 double-overtime loss to Vanderbilt on Sunday in the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Sophomore forward Jennifer George turned in her third career double-double with a team-high 20 points and a career-high 14 rebounds in 34 minutes of action to lead four Gators scoring in double figures. Florida placed four players in double-figure scoring for the fourth time this season.

Vanderbilt shot a blistering 55.4 percent (36-of-65) from the field – the best by a UF opponent this year – and connected on 28-of-41 free throws.

With Florida trailing by six, 80-74, after a pair of free throws by Vandy's Stephanie Holzer with 2:17 remaining in regulation, the Gators began to engineer a late-game comeback. George connected on a basket at the 1:57 mark to narrow her team's deficit to four. After a Vanderbilt free throw, junior forward Ndidi Madu knocked down a jumper to cut within three, 81-78, with 1:14 left.

Jasmine Lister drained a jumper for Vanderbilt with 47.3 seconds remaining, putting the Commodores up 83-78. George connected on a basket in deep leading into a Florida timeout. Trailing by three, 83-80, freshman guard Jaterra Bonds forced a steal in the backcourt and junior guard Deana Allen drilled a three-pointer with 22.4 seconds left to knot the score at 83-81.

With Vanderbilt setting up its last possession in regulation, Allen fouled Lister and the freshman nailed both of her free throws to put the Commodores ahead by two with 20 ticks on the clock. Junior Lanita Bartley drove the lane at the other end, missing a lay-up, before George connected on the put-back to tie the score at 85-85 with 12 seconds remaining. Vanderbilt could not convert on its final possession as a Jence Rhoads three-pointer went just off the mark as time expired.

The first overtime period was a back-and-forth five-minute span when neither team had more than a two-point advantage. With the score tied at 90-all and 37 seconds remaining in the initial extra frame, Madu missed the front end of a 1-and-1 situation with 37 seconds, but the Commodores turned the ball over on their final possession, sending the game into a second overtime.

Vanderbilt's Hannah Tuomi put the Commodores on the board in the second overtime with a put-back off a missed free throw by Tiffany Clarke at the 3:38 mark of the second overtime. A floater from the right wing by Rhoads widened Vanderbilt's lead to four, 94-90, with 3:17 left. The Gators knocked down three free throws before Angela Puleo drained a three-pointer from the right wing falling down to give the Doers the 97-93 edge with 2:08 remaining. A basket in deep by George with 1:38 left allowed Florida to cut within two, 97-95, but Tuomi knocked down two free throws with 1:28 left in the game to seal the victory.

Freshman guard Brittany Shine scored 19 points – her most in an SEC game in her career – in 23 minutes of action, while Allen added a career-high 18 points. Bartley charted a career-high 16 points in a career-high 37 minutes of action.

The Gators shot 39.2 percent (38-of-97) from the floor in the game. The Commodores won the battle of the boards 51-50. Vanderbilt's post presence was dominant as nearly half (52 of 103) of its points came in the paint.

Vanderbilt took a 41-30 advantage into the locker room at intermission after shooting a blistering 55.2 percent (16-of-29) from the field in the opening period. The Gators shot 31.6 percent (12-of-38) from the floor in the first half, but stayed in the game thanks to four three-pointers in the opening half. The Commodores held a 23-20 advantage on the boards at intermission and controlled points in the paint 24-16.

## Game 26: #4 Tennessee 61, Florida 39

February 10, 2011 \* Knoxville, Tenn. \* Thompson-Boling Arena

Fourth-ranked Tennessee opened the second half against Florida scoring the first 12 points and blew open a single-digit game en route to a 61-39 decision at Thompson-Boling Arena.

Florida trailed by nine points at halftime and showed marked improvements from its 43-point loss in January to the Lady Vols, who won the rebounding battle by two on Thursday compared with the +20 dominance they showed in the Gainesville meeting.

Jaterra Bonds scored a Gator-high 10 points, while collecting a team-best six rebounds for Florida, which had nine different players score.

Shekinna Stricklen led all scorers with 17 points, while Glory Johnson added 16 points, hitting 8-of-10 from the free throw line. Florida went 5-of-6 from the charity stripe and shot just 25 percent overall (15-60), while the Vols hit 38.5 percent from the floor and 16-of-24 from the line.

The Gators scored the final points of the first half and were within nine points at halftime, but couldn't have begun the second half much worse, allowing a three-point play, committing two fouls and turning the ball over twice in less than a minute. Tennessee continued its intensity, as Shekinna Stricklen nailed a three-pointer and converted a layup after another UF miscue. Glory Johnson followed with the next four points and the Vols lead swelled to 21 points, 39-18, with 16:37 left.

Lanita Bartley stopped the run and got the Gators on the second half scoreboard with her slashing layup and completed the three-point play with 15:53 to play. UT scored the next three points, before Bonds knocked down a three-pointer and sparked a 9-2 run and Florida cut the deficit to 14 points, 44-30, with 9:51 remaining.

The Gators had a few other opportunities to move even closer, but couldn't take advantage as their shots to rattle and fall out of the hole. Bartley dribbled in the lane, but was stripped for UF's ninth turnover of the half and Johnson again converted the layup and stopped the Gator run.

The teams traded scores for the next two-plus minutes and Florida had trouble cutting into its deficit. The hosts then tallied six consecutive points and capped the mini run with 3:37 to play and the Gators would never recover.

## Game 27: Alabama 64, Florida 59 February 13, 2011 \* Tuscaloosa, Ala. \* Foster Auditorium

Florida committed a season-high 28 turnovers that Alabama converted into 24 points in handing the Gators a 64-59 loss in the historic and newly renovated 3,800-seat Foster Auditorium Sunday afternoon in front of 2,536.

The Gators led 34-24 at halftime, but committed 11 turnovers before making their first field goal in the second half, with seven consecutive miscues fueling the Crimson Tide's 13-1 run, as they took the lead and never relinquished it.

Post players Nndidi Madu, Azania Stewart and Jennifer George accounted for 36 of Florida's points, with 16, 10 and 10, respectively. Madu also led UF's rebounding efforts with 10 to net her third career double-double. George grabbed nine rebounds, while Deana Allen added seven, as the Gators held a commanding 44-27 rebounding advantage and scored 30 points in the paint.

Alabama's Tierney Jenkins led all scorers with 19 points and nine steals, while Kaneisha Horn and Ericka Russell both added 12 points for the Crimson Tide.

Alabama scored the first four points of the second half, while Florida committed a turnover on its first three possessions and had its 10-point halftime lead reduced to six points. Lanita Bartley connected on one free throw, but the Gators turned the ball over twice more before even attempting a shot. The Tide didn't help themselves while the Gators had trouble maintaining possession, committing three miscues themselves. UF's sixth turnover three and a half minutes into the second half, however, did result in two Alabama points, as Kaneisha Horn stole the ball and completed the layup that cut UF's lead to four and forced the Gator to call a timeout. Another possession and another turnover ended with Ericka Russell hitting a deep jumper and cut Florida's lead to two, 35-33, with 15:52 on the clock. Stunningly, the Gator's next offensive stint produced similar results, with a turnover that became two more points for the Tide, who tied the game at 35 with 15:29 remaining. The Gators again turned the ball over and Russell nailed a deep jumper that gave Alabama the 37-35 lead. Alabama was unable to capitalize on UF's 10th miscue of the half and Madu finally ended the Gator scoring drought with a 15-footer at the 14:02 mark.

Horn then nailed a bucket inside, before Madu tied the game with a pair of free throws with 13:10 remaining, as Horn was whistled for her fourth personal. Varisia Raffington then sparked a 7-0 Alabama run, with Jasmine Robinson knocking down a trey as the shot clock expired and Stewart getting called for her fourth personal foul with 11:41 to play. George ended the spurt with a bucket, but Russell hit a three-pointer and Alabama led by eight, 49-41, with 10:29 remaining. Madu stepped up with another 15-footer, but Alabama countered with the next four points and extended its lead to 10 points with 8:51 to play. UF's season-high 25th turnover occurred with 5:51 remaining and Alabama managed to score off the record miscue and kept the Gators at a nine-point distance.

In spite of their turnover woes, the Gators wouldn't go quietly and used a 7-0 run with three-pointers from Allen and Jatterra Bonds and closed within two points, 57-55, with 4:03 remaining and Alabama called a timeout. The Tide settled down and Horn came back onto the court and sank an acrobatic hook shot. The turnover bug again bit the Gators, who committed two more on their next two possessions, as Alabama was able to convert on the last one and extended its lead back to six, 61-55, with 2:23 to play. Madu hit an inside bucket and had the Gators back within four with 1:52 remaining and had a chance to cut the deficit even more, but turned the ball over again on an in-bounds play. Bartley was able to sink a driving layup in the waning seconds, but it wasn't enough as the Gator lost their fourth consecutive game.

## Game 28: Florida 78, Mississippi State 63 February 20, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Lanita Bartley and Jennifer George both eclipsed the 20-point plateau Sunday and the Gators snapped a four-game losing streak with a 78-63 victory against Mississippi State.

The Gators swept the season series with the Lady Bulldogs after posting a 67-60 win in Starkville on Jan. 30. Florida, which has demonstrated an affinity for close games this season, posted its biggest SEC victory of the year, winning by a 14-point margin on Sunday.

Florida shot 49.1 percent (28-of-57) from the floor in the game, marking its second-highest shooting percentage in an SEC game this season and its third-highest percentage overall. Florida shot a sizzling 64.0 percent (16-of-25) from the field in the second half.

Bartley scored a career-high and game-high 23 points on 9-of-12 shooting from the field, becoming the third different Gator this season to score 20 or more points in a single game. Bartley shattered her previous-best scoring total of 16 points set against Vanderbilt Feb. 6. She also brought down eight rebounds, which tied for the team high, and dished a game-high five assists.

George scored 21 points, which tied her career high. She eclipsed the 20-point plateau for the second time this season and tied her career high with seven made free throws. George also added three blocked shots in the game. Freshman Jatterra Bonds tallied 11 points in the game, marking the 11th time this season she has tallied double-figure point totals.

The Gators characteristically used a balanced offensive performance that saw six players score six or more points in the game. Florida's 50 points marked the team's most points in a second half this season, and were its second-most points scored in a single half this season. The Gators had 53 points in the first half against Alabama State on Dec. 20.

UF won the rebound battle 43-37, limiting MSU to 38.2 percent (26-of-68) shooting from the field. The Gators were dominant in the paint, out-scoring the Bulldogs 40-24 in points-in-the-paint.

Florida jumped out to an early 12-6 advantage at the 12:37 mark of the opening half with six of those points coming from Bartley. Mississippi State then went on a 13-0 run, capped off by a Diamber Johnson lay-up, to take a 19-12 advantage with 9:56 remaining in the first half. The Gators then began chipping away at the lead to cut within one, 19-18, at the 6:47 after four consecutive points by junior Jordan Jones. The two teams then traded baskets before the Bulldogs built their lead back up to five, 29-24, on a jumper by Mary Kathryn Govero. Florida cut to within one, 29-28, after a pair of free throws by George and a tip-in by Bartley. Mississippi State's Danielle Rector connected on a lay-up with 45 seconds left in the period to send the Bulldogs into the locker room with a 31-28 advantage.

MSU quickly built its lead back to five, 36-31, in the second half after a three-pointer by Porsha Porter. The two teams continued to trade points before Florida rallied to knot the score at 42-42 on a three-pointer by Allen with 15:14 remaining. That sparked a 6-0 run by the Gators that put Florida up by three, 45-42, as Allen fed Nndidi Madu for a basket at the 14:32 mark. With the Gators leading by one, 45-44, with 14:23 left, Florida engineered a deciding 16-1 run over the next 6:22 to take a 61-45 advantage after a pair of free throws by Bartley. Florida widened its lead to 20 points, its largest advantage of the game, at 68-48 with 5:54 remaining on a three-pointer by Bonds. The Bulldogs began chipping away at their deficit, using an 11-1 run to cut within 10, 69-59, on a three-pointer by Johnson with 3:36 remaining. That was as close as MSU would come, as the Gators led by double digits the remainder of the contest.

## Game 29: Florida 74, Vanderbilt 69

February 25, 2011 \* Nashville, Tenn. \* Memorial Gym

Florida received total team effort and upset Vanderbilt, 74-69, at Memorial Gym Friday evening. In a game that was scheduled to be played on Thursday, but severe weather in the Nashville area forced officials to postpone the game until Friday evening, the Gators shot 60 percent in the second half when they outscored the Commodores 51-45 to earn their first victory against Vanderbilt in Nashville since Feb. 1, 2004.

UF used a 7-0 spurt to take a 58-47 lead with 8:08 remaining after Antioch, Tenn., native Ndidi Madu knocked down a 10-footer from straight away. VU rallied with a 13-4 run and closed the Gator lead to two points with 5:33 remaining. UF remained composed and got back-to-back driving layups from Lanita Bartley and Jaterra Bonds. Following a pair of Vandy free throws, Bartley recognized a mismatch inside and fed Azania Stewart, who dumped in the short shot with 1:59 on the clock and gave UF a 68-62 lead. Neither team could score for the next minute-plus, before VU's Christina Foggie nailed a pointer with 28 seconds remaining and the hosts called a timeout, down three. Stewart stepped to the line and hit both ends of the one-and-one with 24.2 ticks on the clock, but fouled out 10 seconds later and UF's inside game was at a loss since George had already fouled out of the game. Tiffany Clarke converted both free throws after drawing the foul on Stewart and brought Vanderbilt within three again, 70-67, with 14.6 on the clock. Bartley was clutch from the line, as she coolly nailed four straight, two with 13.6 seconds and the others with 5.4 remaining. VU senior Jence Rhoads hit a bucket as the final hour sounded to end the scoring, but it was too late as Florida captured its third true road victory of the year.

Jordan Jones led all scorers with 16 points, as the Gator junior hit 4-of-7 three-pointers and tied her career-high of six rebounds. Stewart netted her fifth career double-double with 14 points and 11 rebounds and Bartley recorded 15 points with six rebounds and seven assists. Madu chipped in all of her six points in the second half, while Bonds added eight points as all nine Gators who suited up for the game scored.

UF struggled with its shot in the first half, sinking a woeful 20.5 percent, but came out sizzling in the second half, when the team hit 77 percent in during the first eight-plus minutes en route to taking a 51-43 lead with 11:17 on the clock.

Vanderbilt took a 24-23 halftime lead, but Deana Allen found a wide open Madu in the paint where she gave the Gators a one-point lead. The Commodores tied the score with one free throw before the teams matched each other's scoring for the next minute-plus. With the score knotted at 30, Bartley, Jennifer George and Brittany Shine mounted a 5-0 Gator run and had the visitors ahead 35-30 with 16:44 on the clock. The next three buckets of the game were 3-pointers, two from Vandy and the other from Jones. Stewart and George followed with the next three points, before two more Commodore free throws cut UF's lead to three, 41-38.

Stewart scored Florida's first eight points of the game, as Vanderbilt countered with similar buckets and the opening minutes featured three tied scores. Bonds sank the first three-pointer of the game at the 14:06 mark and Bartley followed with an inside jumper and gave the Gators a 13-8 lead. Vanderbilt came back with a trey from Jasmine Lister, but Jones knocked one down on the other end to keep Florida's advantage at five with a little more than 10 minutes into the contest. Lister hit her second bucket of the game and Tiffany Clarke sank one free throw and the hosts cut the Gator lead to two. After one free throw from Allen, Vanderbilt continued its run by scoring the next four points and took its first lead of the game when Clarke capped a transition with a layup at the 6:04 mark. Jones ended the Commodores' 7-1 run with a three-pointer and Lily Svete followed with another from the top of the arc and had Florida back up by five, 23-18, with 4:37 left in the opening half. That bucket forced a Vanderbilt timeout and the Commodores responded with a 6-0 run over the final 4:24 of the period, as neither team was able to find a rhythm and Vanderbilt took a 24-23 lead into the locker room.

## Game 30: Florida 74, #22 Georgia 71

February 27, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Led by a career-high 22 points from freshman Jaterra Bonds, Florida upset No. 22 Georgia on Senior Day Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Just like their SEC-opening win on Jan. 2, the Gators closed their regular season at home with an upset of the nation's 22nd-ranked team, defeating then-No. 22 Arkansas, 74-53. Sunday's win for the Orange and Blue was the first time in the long series history against Georgia that Florida won three consecutive at home versus the Lady Bulldogs. The win also marked the 45th upset win over a higher-ranked team in program history, as well as the 26th time Florida has earned a win against a ranked opponent when UF entered the match-up unranked.

With Georgia holding a slim 71-70 lead sophomore Jennifer George put in a layup with 48 seconds remaining and gave the Gators a one-point lead. Georgia's Khaalidah Miller missed a jumper with 24 seconds remaining and Azania Stewart wrestled for the defensive block that she tossed to Bonds, who was fouled and made the front end of the one-and-one and gave UF a 73-71 lead with 22.6 seconds on the clock.

On Georgia's next possession, Jordan Jones took a charge from a driving Meredith Mitchell with 10.3 seconds left, forcing Georgia to foul again when UF in-bounded the ball.

Lanita Bartley, who solidified the Gators' win at Vanderbilt with four free throws in the final 13.6 seconds, stepped to the line and hit one of two on Sunday with 9.4 seconds remaining that gave the Gators a three-point lead, 74-71, and ended the game's scoring as Georgia failed to get off a shot in its final possession.

The game featured eight ties and seven lead changes, with neither team leading by more than eight points. Florida's bench came up big, outscoring the Lady Bulldogs', 36-7. Florida's defense clamped down from long-range, holding UGA to just 21.4 percent shooting from beyond the three-point line (3-of-14 3FG). The Gators finished the day shooting 39.1 percent from long range (9-of-23), including 5-of-10 from Bonds and 3-of-6 from Jones, who finished second with 18 points. Nine of UF's 10 players that saw game action scored.

Georgia stayed in the game thanks in part to its post presence, which doubled-up UF's production in the paint (36-18) and outscored the Gators in second-chance points, 24-13. The Bulldogs' frontcourt also outrebounded UF, 43-38, including a 22-13 margin on the offensive glass.

With Georgia owning its biggest lead of the game at eight (31-23) with 2:55 remaining in the first frame, the Gators went on a 19-4 run over the last three minutes of the first half and the first three minutes of the second to swing the lead in UF's favor by a game-high seven points (42-35).

Four of Georgia's starting five scored double figures, including guard Jasmine James, who poured in a game-high 23 points of 10-of-13 shooting. Forward Porsha Phillips collected the game's only double-double with 15 points and 17 rebounds, while fellow forward Anne Marie Armstrong and Miller tallied 12 and 11 points, respectively.

The first half ended with a 12-4 run by UF over the last three minutes, as Bonds caught fire with two consecutive three-point shots. Trailing 35-29 with a minute and a half left in the first period, redshirt junior Ndidi Madu and freshman Brittany Shine knocked down jumpers, and senior Ebonie Crawford sank two free throws on her own Senior Day to tie the game at 35-all going into halftime.

Florida was led by a balanced attack from Bonds and Jones, who finished the first half with eight points and seven points, each. The Gators outshot the Lady Bulldogs in the first half, 46.2 percent to 40 percent, while holding Georgia to just 16.7 percent from beyond the three-point arc.

### Game 31: Florida 68, Arkansas 59 \*\*SEC Tournament First Round\*\* March 3, 2011 \* Nashville, Tenn. \* Bridgestone Arena

Five Gators scored in double-figures for the first time since 2006 and helped Florida earn a 68-59 victory against Arkansas in the first round of the SEC Tournament at Bridgestone Arena. In a game intertwined with big runs by both teams, it was the Gators (18-13) who ended the contest scoring the final nine points in the last 2:45 to earn their first SEC Tournament win since 2008 and collect their fourth consecutive overall victory.

Florida raced out to a 17-point lead, before Arkansas rallied and tied the game. The Gators then closed the first period on a 15-5 run and took a 43-33 halftime lead, tacking on two more points before the Razorbacks erased the 12-point Gator advantage and assumed a two-point lead themselves. Florida, however, dug deep and mounted one final run en route to the win.

Ndidu Madu, a native of Antioch, Tenn., located just 10 miles from Nashville, hit a jumper from the free throw line and gave Florida a 45-33 lead to begin the second half's scoring.

Arkansas (18-11) came right back with the next four points, before Jennifer George added a bucket inside that put the Gators back up by 10 points, 47-37, with 14:04 remaining in the game. That's when the Razorbacks ripped off a 9-0 run and were within one with 12:20 on the clock. George again halted the spree, but C'eira Ricketts nailed a trey and tied the game with 10:33 left. Jaterra Bonds, who finished the game with 11 points, traded buckets with Sarah Watkins, before Lanita Bartley converted a driving layup and Azania Stewart followed with a bucket inside and gave UF a four-point margin with 7:16 to play. Ricketts again sparked the Razorbacks after coming up with a steal and converting a layup, before Christasia Walter and Watkins scored and had Arkansas in the lead, 57-55, with 4:27 remaining. Deana Allen answered for Florida with a 16-foot pull-up jumper and Bonds sank a driving acrobatic layup for a two-point Gator lead with 3:30 to play. Ricketts canned a pair of free throws on UA's next possession and tied the game at 59 with three minutes remaining. That's when the Gators put together a game-ending 9-0 march en route to the win, as George tallied five points during the stretch, Allen two and Bonds two from the free throw line. Also during the final scoring spree, Jordan Jones drew a charge on Ricketts with 2:31 remaining that energized the Gators down the stretch.

Jones finished the game with 11 points which including the 1,000th of her career that came on a three-pointer late in the first half when the Gators hit a sizzling 60.7 percent from the floor to build a 43-33 halftime lead. Jones also tied her career with six rebounds, while Madu earned her fourth double-double of her career with 12 points and 10 rebounds, hitting 6-of-10 from the floor.

Allen finished with 12 points and six rebounds, while Bartley dished a game-high five assists for Florida which out-rebounded Arkansas 43-30, turning 17 offensive boards into 13 points. George scored nine of her 12 points in the second half, when Florida shot just 32.3 percent from the floor, but also held the Razorbacks to a similar mark.

Florida ripped out of the gate and nailed its first eight field goals of Thursday's game, including a pair of three-pointers from Jones, and took an 18-7 start in the first 4:39 of the contest. The teams exchanged buckets to begin the game, with Arkansas getting on the board first, before Madu followed with the first of her three jumpers during that opening spurt. Deana Allen nailed a deep shot and gave UF its first lead, before Sarah Watkins tied the score but an inside bucket. Madu then nailed her second 15-footer and ignited a 12-0 run that included four points from Madu, six from Jones and a pair from Allen. Christasia Walter stopped the Gator's spree with a three-pointer, but Florida came right back with the next seven points, as Jennifer George tallied three, Jones two and Madu two off an offensive put back after UF's inevitable first missed shot of the game came with 13:25, as the Gators assumed a 23-7 lead. The teams traded buckets for the next three-plus minutes and with Florida holding a 28-11 advantage, Arkansas ripped off a 17-0 run and tied the score at 28-all with 6:07 remaining, the final points coming when Bartley tweaked her left knee, went down and Walter scooped up the loose ball and converted the layin. Florida regrouped and staged an 8-0 run with four points from Azania Stewart and four from Allen. Ashley Daniels stopped UF's spurt, before Jones nailed her third three-pointer of the half, which fitting was the sharp-shooting junior's 1,000th career point. That milestone bucket gave the Gators a 41-30 lead with 1:47 to play in the period. Arkansas sank its sixth trey of the half, before Bonds ended the half's scoring with a bucket and gave Florida a 43-33 halftime advantage. Jones recorded 11 points during the first 20 minutes of action, while Madu contributed 10 with seven rebounds, helping Florida to a 17-13 edge of the boards and shoot a sizzling 60.7 percent (17-28) from the floor.

### Game 32: #4 Tennessee 92, Florida 75 \*\* SEC Tournament Quarterfinals \*\* March 4, 2011 \* Nashville, Tenn. \* Bridgestone Arena

Florida fought until the final minute of the game, but it wasn't enough as the Gators fell to top-seeded and fourth-ranked Tennessee, 92-75, in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament.

The Gators, who notched consecutively four impressive victories entering the game, showed marked improvements in Friday's contest compared with the two regular-season meetings against the Lady Vols, who won 83-40 decision in Gainesville on January 13 and the 61-39 outing in Knoxville on February 10. Florida's 75 points and its 43.9 percent field goal effort were the second-most points and second-highest field goal percentage by a Lady Vols' opponent this season.

The Gators were within nine points with 2:37 remaining, but the Lady Vols converted 7-of-8 free throws the rest of the way to quell Florida's comeback efforts.

Florida had five players record a double-figure scoring effort for the second consecutive night, as Lanita Bartley scored 14 points, Ndidi Madu and Deana Allen accounted for 13 each, Jaterra Bonds added 12 and Jordan Jones tallied 10 points. After not having five players hit double-figures in a game since Feb. 26, 2006, the Gators have done it in back-to-back games.

The Gators (18-14) trailed by just two points at halftime, but the Lady Vols began the second half on one of their patented runs that began when Glory Johnson, who ended the game with a career-high 25 points, scored six consecutive points in less than a minute and a half and forced Florida to call a timeout. Jones ended the run with a three-pointer from the left side and the Gators traded buckets for the next three minutes, before the Lady Vols staged a 7-0 spurt and extended its lead to 56-42. Both teams again exchanged scores before UT knocked down consecutive ones and took a 17-point advantage with 10:51 on the clock.

Florida continued to battle and responded with a jumper from Madu and another trey from Jones and cut the deficit to 63-51 with 9:56 to play. Between those Gator buckets, however, junior center Azania Stewart was whistled for her fifth personal foul. Eight seconds after Jones' bucket, forward Jennifer George fouled out and Florida's inside game became extremely lean, as Madu was already playing with three personals.

Despite the inside troubles, the Gators continued to trade baskets and were within 74-62 with 5:26 left in regulation, before Tennessee scored the next five points and assumed their largest lead of the game, 80-62, with 4:18 to play. The Gators had one last surge in them, as Bonds nailed a three-pointer and Allen accounted for five of the game's next six points and cut the deficit to 14 points. Bonds then hit a pair of free throws and Bartley completed a three-point play with 2:37 remaining and had Florida within nine points, 83-74. The Gators then had the shots they wanted, but missed a handful of short-range buckets and were forced to foul to get the ball back. Tennessee (29-2) stepped up and made 7-of-8 from the free throw line the rest of the way en route to its 20th consecutive win.

## Game 33: Florida 59, UMBC 47 \*\* WNIT First Round \*\*

March 18, 2011 \* Gainesville, Fla. \* Stephen C. O'Connell Center

Jordan Jones scored a game-high 18 points and Florida's defense held UMBC to four field goals in the second half as the Gators defeated the Retrievers, 59-47, in the WNIT first round.

Florida used a 20-3 run early in the second half to turn an eight-point deficit into a 51-42 lead with 11:43 remaining and never trailed again, as UMBC (20-12) managed only one field goal in the final 18:02 of the game, connecting on 4-of-26 in the second frame.

Florida found itself on the short end of a 32-31 halftime score, as UMBC shot a healthy 53.8 percent (14-26) from the floor in the first half. It was the 14th time this season the Gators found themselves trailing after the first 20 minutes of action and it was the sixth time they were able to overcome the deficit and rally for the win.

The Retrievers scored the first seven points of the second half and built upon their one-point halftime lead for a 39-31 advantage with 18:02 remaining. Deana Allen finally got Florida on the board in the second half and opened the scoring for the home team, as Allen's bucket sparked a 12-0 run that featured a three-pointer from Jatterra Bonds and seven consecutive points from Jones, all from inside the arc, and Florida regained the lead, 43-39, with 14:08 to play.

Erin Brown ended the Gator spree with a three-pointer that ripped the nets as the shot clock horn sounded, but UF came right back with a 3-point play from Ndidi Madu and Jones' third three-pointer of the game and the Gators' lead swelled to seven points. After Lanita Bartley chased down a long defensive rebound on the other end, she found Jones who nailed a deep jumper with her toe on the arc and Florida had a 51-42 lead with 11:43 remaining. UMBC came back with four straight points from the free throw line and cut UF's lead to four. The teams traded one from the charity stripe before Jennifer George connected on both ends of a one-and-one with 5:18 on the clock.

Bartley then converted an acrobatic driving layup and gave the Gators a 56-47 lead with 4:41 to play. Bonds followed with her third trey of the game and Florida held its largest advantage, 59-47, with 3:02 remaining. Those were the final points scored by either team, as the Gators emerged with the victory and won their 11th consecutive non-conference home game.

Jones hit 6-of-8 from the floor, including 3-of-4 three pointers to lead Florida, which sank 8-of-18 from beyond the arc during the game. Bonds added 13 points, while Bartley chipped in nine points with five rebounds and four assists. Madu and George both collected seven rebounds to lead the Gators, which held a 39-31 rebounding edge.

Neither team showed any signs of a nearly two-week break since its last game, as both hit 4-of-6 from the floor to start, the lone difference in scoring was a Jordan Jones three-pointer and Florida held a 9-8 lead. The Gators also tried pushing the tempo and committed five quick turnovers during the opening minutes of the game. The teams cooled off a bit, but Azania Stewart put in a driving layup and grabbed UMBC's ensuing missed shot on the other end, before Jones knocked down her second trey of the half and gave Florida a 14-8 edge and forced UMBC to call a timeout. The Retrievers settled and came back with the next two buckets and cut the Gator lead to two, 14-12. UF's ninth turnover of the half resulted in a three-pointer from Michelle Kurowski and UMBC had its first lead of the game, 15-14, with 10:47 on the clock. That trey began a streak of six straight from deep, three from each team, as Bartley had two and Bonds one during the shoot-out and helped Florida to a 23-21 edge with 7:19 remaining in the half. Obajolu halted the trend of long-range baskets and tied the game inside with 6:49 on the clock. Erin Brown followed with her third three-pointer of the game and UMBC took a 26-23 lead. George put back her own miss on UF's end of the floor, before Bonds dropped in a transition layup and Madu nailed a 17-footer to cap a 6-0 spurt and UMBC called its third timeout of the half to quell the Gators' momentum. It worked as Meghan Colabella hit a 10-foot jumper and the teams traded baskets for the next minute and the Retrievers slowed the game to a half-court display and closed the half on a 6-2 run and took a 32-31 lead entering the locker room, as Obajolu floated in a turnaround jumper off an in-bounds play with two seconds remaining for the final difference.

## Game 34: Florida 74, Florida Gulf Coast 69 \*\* WNIT Second Round \*\*

March 21, 2011 \* Fort Myers, Fla. \* Alico Arena

Jatterra Bonds led Florida's comeback with 19 points and the Gators knocked off Florida Gulf Coast, 74-69, on Monday in the second round of the Women's National Invitation Tournament in front of an Alico Arena record-crowd of 4,543. The Gator win snapped the Eagles' 42 game home-winning streak, which stood as the third longest active streak in the country, and gave Florida its 10th 20-win season in program history, as the team improved to 20-14 overall.

Bonds converted two free throws with 16.9 second remaining and gave Florida a 73-69 lead. The Gator defense then held and Bonds returned to the charity stripe where she sank one more with 6.7 seconds left to secure the victory.

Jennifer George finished the game with 10 points and a game-high 11 rebounds, with seven of her boards coming in the second half when Florida out-rebounded the Eagles (29-3) by 14. The double-double was her third this year and the fourth of her career.

After FGCU took a 51-42 lead with 14:57 remaining that forced Florida to call a timeout, the Gators responded with a 11-0 run, seven points from Bonds, and took a 53-51 lead with 11:39 left. The last of those points came from an offensive put-back from George, who collected Bonds' missed free throw attempt. The teams traded scores for the next minute before the Eagles scored four straight points and held a 58-54 lead with 9:43 on the clock. Deana Allen, who finished with 17 points, one shy of her career high, then knocked down a driving jumper and Ndidi Madu canned a 10-footer from the left corner and tied the game. After a pair of Eagle free throws, Allen and Madu, who finished with 11 points, struck again and gave the Gators a 62-60 lead.

Courtney Chihil converted a three-point play and the lead swung back in favor of the hosts, but Azania Stewart hit a turn-around jumper in the paint, before she found George inside for a short jumper and Stewart capped a 6-0 spurt with another short shot and gave Florida a 68-63 lead with 3:07 remaining. Nicoya Jackson hit both ends of a one-and-one for FGCU, before Bonds got one of the points back at the line, helping Florida maintain a four-point edge with 1:48 on the clock.

Chihil tried to lead one last Eagle run by nailing the team's 11th three-pointer of the contest with 1:34 and had record-crowd on its feet as its team was within one. Lanita Bartley quieted the fans with her driving layup 22 seconds later and gave UF a 71-68 lead with 68 seconds remaining.

Chihil, who ended with 19 points, reduced UF's lead by one from the free throw line. Florida missed its next shot on the ensuing possession, but Stewart corralled the miss and kept the ball in the Gators' hands, as FGCU eventually fouled Bonds with 16.9 seconds remaining when she calmly converted both charity tosses and iced the game, earning a win at Alico Arena where the Eagles hadn't lost since Jan. 8, 2009. Since that time, FGCU built a winning-streak that trailed only Connecticut (81) and Stanford (61).

Florida hit 53.7 percent (29-54) from the floor during the game, while sinking a clutch 13-of-18 from the free throw line. FGCU shot 41.4 percent (24-58) overall, including 11-of-27 from the three-point arc, meeting its average number of treys per game, a mark that leads the country.

The game was even for the first five-plus minutes as the teams basically traded buckets before FGCU caught fire with a 10-0 run capped by a pair of three-pointers from Shannon Murphy and the Eagles took a 20-12 lead with 11:58 remaining in the first half. George halted the spree with an inside jumper and Allen followed with a 3-pointer and brought the deficit to three. Chihil fired one from deep, but Bonds answered with one for Florida and George put back an offensive rebound and the Gators were within one point, 23-22, with 9:37 remaining in the opening frame. Again the hosts let it rip from long range and had a four-point spread after their next possession. Madu was able to knock down a 17-footer and after one FGCU free throw, Madu canned another and had Florida back within one, 27-2

## Game 35: Charlotte 81, Florida 77 (WNIT Third Round)

March 24, 2011 \* Charlotte, N.C. \* Halton Arena

Freshman Jatterra Bonds scored a career-high 23 points but it wasn't enough as Charlotte overcame a 17-point deficit and stormed back to hand the Gators a season-ending 81-77 overtime loss in the third round of the Postseason WNIT Thursday at Halton Arena.

Florida (20-15) scored the first five points of the second half and took a 48-31 lead after scores from Lanita Bartley (Jacksonville, Fla.) and Jordan Jones (Suwanee, Ga.), but Charlotte settled down after a timeout and ripped off a 27-6 run and took a 58-53 lead with 9:42 remaining.

The Gators battled back with six straight points from the free throw line to regain the lead, which switched hands six consecutive trips down the floor, with the 49ers (26-9) ending the trend with a three-pointer for a two-point edge with 5:40 to play.

Bonds tied the score with a jumper just inside the arc, but Charlotte came right back with a pair of free throws to keep the lead.

Jennifer George (Orlando, Fla.) put in a tough shot inside and Bonds sank another layup and Florida took a 69-67 lead with 1:51 to play.

Shannon McCallum nailed a three-pointer and then collected a defensive rebound and dribbled the length of the court for the layin that gave the 49ers a 72-69 lead with 63 seconds remaining. Bonds drilled her career-best fifth three-pointer with 51 seconds left and neither team would score again as the game entered overtime.

Azania Stewart put the first points of the extra frame on the board, but Charlotte answered with a duce. Jones stepped up and nailed her third trey of the game, this one with 1:18 on the overtime clock, but McCallum's confidence was oozing and she came right back with one for the hosts with 59 seconds remaining and Charlotte called a timeout to set up its defense.

Florida committed a turnover on its ensuing offensive possession and the 49ers made it costly as Jennifer Hailey came up with a steal and dished to Jai Forney, who hit the layup and gave Charlotte a 79-77 lead with 53 seconds left.

The Gators' 22nd and final turnover of the game resulted in a layup by Kendria Holmes with 17.1 seconds remaining and Florida couldn't find the bottom of the net, as Charlotte completed the impressive comeback to advance to the WNIT quarterfinals where it will play Virginia.

"Our turnovers were the story of the game," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. "We certainly scored enough points. Our second-half defense was good for 25 seconds in a possession and then we would give up the big play in the last five seconds. We fought hard and looked really, really good in some stretches and then we would give it right back to them. We just coughed the ball up way too much to beat a good team on its home court."

Charlotte converted Florida's 22 turnovers into 27 points, while outscoring the visitors, 41-29, in the second half.

Jones finished the game with 15 points, hitting 3-of-7 three-pointers and all four of her free throw attempts, while Stewart added 12 points, six rebounds and three blocked shots for Florida, which hit 42.9 percent from the floor during the game, but connected on just 2-of-8 during overtime.

George pulled down 10 rebounds to accompany nine points and four blocks, as she helped the Gators edge the 49ers on the boards, 43-40.

McCallum led all scorers with 25 points, with 21 coming after the first 20 minutes of play.

Florida led throughout the first half, leading by as many as 15 points with just under six minutes to play after Stewart and George combine for a 6-0 run.

Bonds had the hot hand during the opening 20 minutes, when she scored 16 points, nailing 6-of-10 from the floor, including 4-of-7 three-pointers and guided the Gators to a 43-31 lead.
