### 2010-11 Season Review

The 2010-11 Gator women's basketball team was a young, inexperienced group, with just five actual letterwinners returning from last year's squad that earned the Southeastern Conference's automatic berth into the Postseason WNIT.

Juniors **Jordan Jones** and **Azania Stewart** started the majority of games last season, with Jones UF's leading returning scorer with 9.1 points per game and Stewart the SEC's field goal percentage leader in 2009-10, when she hit 61.9 percent.

Forward **Jennifer George**, named to the 2010 All-SEC Freshman Team, was the Gators' leading returning rebounder, as she collected 5.2 per game, while contributing 6.6 points.

Six newcomers filled the roster, with four true freshmen who rated as the nation's 21st-best signing class by ESPN HoopGurlz.

Having lost the majority of its starters and scorers from the 2009-10 campaign didn't stop Florida from digging deep and earning the program's 18th postseason appearance.

The Gators, whose roster featured just one senior, won six of its final eight games of the 2010-11 season and built momentum toward the future.

#### Fans Got their Money's Worth!

Twenty-three of UF's program-record 35 games were decided by 10 points or fewer, with **16 being six-point differences** - including the final two of the season.

The Gators were 14-9 in games decided by 10 points or less.

#### Not Again!

During the 2009-10 season, the Gators played 15 games decided by fewer than 10 points and posted an 8-7 in those outings.

#### Postseason Run

Florida defeated UMBC (59-47) and Florida Gulf Coast (74-69) to advance the WNIT round of 16, where the Gators dropped a difficult 81-77 overtime decision at Charlotte.

#### Florida in the Postseason

Florida's inclusion in the 2011 WNIT marked the 17th time in the last 19 years the

Gators earned a berth in a postseason tournament. Florida has a total of 18 postseason appearances.

#### Postseason Victories

The Gators' two wins in the 2011 WNIT was just the **fifth time** the program has won a pair of games in a postseason event.

The 2000 club won four games en route to reaching the WNIT championship game, but lost at Wisconsin, 75-74.

The 1997 NCAA squad won three games and marched into the Elite Eight before it fell to Old Dominion, 53-51.

#### Tenth Time for 20 Wins

Florida's 74-69 win at FGCU marked the team's 20th victory of the year. It was the 10th 20-win season in program history. The Gators' last 20-win season was in 2008-09, when the squad tied a program record with 24 wins.

Two of those 20-win campaigns have come under Amanda Butler.

#### UF's Regular-Season Resume

In the NCAA's final report, Florida's RPI was No. 41 with a strength of schedule rated No. 11.

#### Tough Teams

Of the 25 different teams on UF's regular-season schedule this year, 13 played in the postseason. The Gators posted a 4-9 record against nine teams in NCAA Tournament and a 6-3 record versus six teams in the WNIT ... for a combined regular-season record of 10-12 versus 2011 postseason teams.

UF's NCAA Tournament opponents included: Tennessee, Vanderbilt, Georgia, Kentucky, DePaul, Florida State, Hampton, UCF and Navy.

The teams in the WNIT field included: Alabama, Arkansas, Auburn, South Carolina, Old Dominion and Charlotte.

#### Every Year Under Butler

Florida's inclusion in the WNIT field was the program's fourth consecutive postseason appearance - every year under head coach **Amanda Butler**.

Butler became the **FIRST** coach in program history to guide the Gators to a postseason berth in each of her first three years ... and now in each of her first four seasons; in 2007-08, Butler became the **FIRST** to lead the Gators to a postseason bid in their first year at UF.

In Butler's 16 years on the sidelines (including stints as an assistant coach), her team has competed in the postseason 11 times.

#### Florida's WNIT History

The 2011 event was Florida's fifth appearances in the postseason WNIT since the event's inception in 1998. The Gator's best showing came in 2000 when they reached the final, falling to Wisconsin, 75-74, in the title game.

#### Strong Final Stretch

Florida ended its regular season winning three consecutive SEC games, as the squad earned victories against Mississippi State (78-63 - its largest margin of victory in an SEC game this year), at Vanderbilt (74-69 - in Nashville, where the Gators last won on Feb. 1, 2004) and at home against No. 22-ranked Georgia (74-71 - stretching its home win streak vs. Georgia to a program-record three).

The Gators then added one more win to its late-season win streak, defeating Arkansas, 68-59, in the first round of the SEC Tournament.

#### Three Straight vs. Regular-Season Champs

The March 21st game was UF's third consecutive outing against a team that won its respective conference's regular-season championship: Tennessee won the SEC, UMBC won the America East and FGCU won the Atlantic Sun.

#### In All Kinds of Weather ...

For what is believed to be the first time in program history, the Gators had a regular-season game postponed because of weather. Vanderbilt officials heeded the advice of local police and emergency agencies in Nashville, which was experiencing severe watches and warnings on Thu., Feb. 24. The game was played on Friday when Florida emerged with a 74-69 win for its first win in Nashville since Feb. 1, 2004.

## Senior Example

**Ebonie Crawford**, the lone senior on the 2010-11 team, graduated on Sat., Dec. 18 with a Bachelor of Arts in Criminology. Former Gator letterwinner **Sharielle Smith** (2006-10) also completed her undergraduate requirements and received on Saturday a Bachelor of Science in Telecommunication - Production.

## Leading the Way

**Jordan Jones** led the balanced Gator scoring effort, recording 10.2 points per game, hitting a team-leading 72 three-pointers at a 38.7 percent clip and playing 32.6 minutes per outing.

**Azania Stewart** was Florida's leading rebounder with 6.1 per game and hit 52.7 percent of her shots from the floor. Her 62 blocked shots also was tops for the Gators and ranked second in the SEC.

**Lanita Bartley** dished a team-leading 3.4 assists and collected a team-high 1.77 steals, while finding her way to the free throw a team-best 132 times.

## Jones Heated Up

**Jordan Jones**, the Gators' leader from long range, hit 15-of-30 three-pointers (50.0%) during the final six games.

Overall, Jones was 72-of-186 from long range for 38.7%, the second-highest accuracy mark in a season in UF history. Her 72 treys tied for the **seventh-most in a season**.

During her two-year tenure at UF, Jones has drained 127 three-pointers, the sixth most in a career.

## Who Finished Hot

During the **last FIVE games**, **Jaterra Bonds** averaged a team-leading 15.6 points, hitting 36.4 percent from the three-point arc (12-33) with eight assists.

Also during the final five games, **Deana Allen** averaged 10.4 points and 3.8 rebounds, while dishing 13 assists with six steals.

## Just Fine From the Line

**Lanita Bartley**, who solidified the Gators' win at Vanderbilt (Feb. 25) with four free throws in the final 13.6 seconds, stepped to the line and hit one of two against No. 22 Georgia (27) with 9.4 seconds remaining that gave the Gators a three-point lead, 74-71, and ended the game's scoring as the Bulldogs failed to get off a shot in their final possession.

## That's Balance!

Nine different Gators contribute at least 5.0 points per game, with 10 of the 12 reptiles averaging at least 12.5 minutes of playing time per contest.

## Nine Hit Century Scoring Mark

Nine of the 12 Gators have scored at least 100 points during the year, with **Kayla Lewis** - who missed 19 games with an injury - closed with **90 points**.

## Game Leaders

Nine different Gators emerged as the team's leading game scorer - or tied as the leading scorer: **Jordan Jones** (9), **Jaterra Bonds**

(7), **Brittany Shine** (5), **Jennifer George** (5), **Ndidi Madu** (4), **Deana Allen** (4), **Kayla Lewis** (2), **Azania Stewart** (2) and **Lanita Bartley** (2).

## Home-Sweet-O'Dome

The Gators had compiled a modest nine-game home winning streak that included an 8-0 mark this year and ended with the loss to Tennessee. It was tied for the fourth-longest home winning streak in program history.

## One to Go

With the Gators' 74-69 win against the Commodores on Feb. 25, Vanderbilt became the 10th of the 11 other SEC programs UF's fourth-year head coach Amanda Butler has defeated during her Gator tenure. LSU is the only school remaining that Butler has yet to defeat in four outings.

## Twice as Nice

With the expanded 16-game SEC schedule that began last season, the Gators played a home-and-home series against **Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi State, Tennessee** and **Vanderbilt**.

The Gators were assigned and played consecutive SEC home games just once during the season - Feb. 3 and Feb. 6 against Ole Miss and Vanderbilt, respectively.

She is the first to reach the milestone since **Aneika Henry** in 2007-09.

## By George, That's Defense!

**Jennifer George** blocked a career-high nine shots in the win against Alabama State (Dec. 20). The 6-foot-0 forward tied for the second-most rejections in a single game in school history. Vanessa Hayden holds the school record with 10 blocked shots against Kent State on Dec. 29, 2001. George became just the second different player in school history to chart nine or more blocks in a single game.

## Generous Bonds

Freshman guard **Jaterra Bonds** dished out a career-high nine assists during the win against Alabama State (Dec. 20), marking the most charted by any Gator player since Sha Brooks dished out 10 assists against Arkansas on Feb. 1, 2009. Bonds also scored 13 points in the game.

### Logging the Mileage

The Gators logged 5,880 travel miles during a 16-day span during their non-conference slate - without ever leaving the Eastern time zone or the continental United States!

Florida traveled 2,072 miles round trip to compete at the Brown BEAR Basketball Classic, Dec. 3-5, in Providence, R.I., after having spent the Thanksgiving weekend in Maine, where the team traveled 2,574 miles round trip to compete in and win the Dead River Company Classic hosted by the University of Maine, Nov. 26-27. The team then zipped the 1,234 round-trip miles to Hampton, Va., to play at Hampton Dec. 10.

### Long Range Reset

Florida did not connect on any of its 11 three-point attempts during its Nov. 30th game against Old Dominion, snapping a streak of 96 consecutive games with at least one. The last time the Gators missed everything from beyond the arc was Nov. 28, 2007 at Jacksonville.

Individually, **Jordan Jones** had hit a trey in nine straight games until the contest against ODU.

### It's Not About Who Starts...

Last year, Coach Butler drew up a total of 11 different starting lineups, including a new one in nine of the last 11 games.

Florida has used **EIGHT different line-ups in 2010-11.**

### Quite a Start

The Gators played their first 11 games over a 27-day span, logging 5,880 miles while traveling to the states of Maine, Rhode Island and Virginia.

Florida's hectic run ended on Fri., Dec. 10,

when the team dropped a tough 69-54 decision at Hampton.

The Gators then hit the books for a 10-day period for final exams before returning to the court for the Gator Holiday Classic, Dec. 20-21.

### Tournament Tested

Florida won two of the four regular-season tournaments it played during 2010-11.

The team ended the quartet of multi-game events winning its own Gator Holiday Classic.

Florida advanced the semifinals of the Preseason WNIT, before dropping a tough 74-73 decision at DePaul.

The Gators then won the Dead River Company Classic hosted by the University of Maine, with wins over South Alabama and Navy.

Florida went 1-1 at the three-team Brown BEAR Basketball Classic, Dec. 4-5, defeating Providence and losing to Brown.

## UF vs. Ranked Teams

Florida was 2-5 during the season against nationally-ranked teams.

Florida defeated No. 22 Georgia, 74-71, on Feb. 27 and earned a 64-53 win against No. 22/24 Arkansas on Jan. 2, but dropped a 59-58 heartbreaker to No. 19 Kentucky (Jan. 20), three decisions to Tennessee (Jan. 13, Feb. 10 & March 4) and a 74-72 decision at No. 25/23 Florida State (Dec. 28).

Florida, which was 1-6 during the 2009-10 season, is 60-163 all-time versus teams ranked in the AP Top-25, including a 30-65 record at home, a 20-77 record on an away court and a 10-25 mark on a neutral court.

The Gators have earned 44 upset victories over higher-ranked opponents, with the last coming on Feb. 27, 2011, against No. 22 Georgia in Gainesville, 74-71.

## Amanda Butler vs. Ranked Teams

In her six years as a head coach, Amanda Butler is 7-22 all-time against nationally ranked teams, including a 7-20 record with UF (2-5 in 2010-11), with her first-ever win coming on Nov. 23, 2008, on the road against in-state rival Florida State, 72-57.

In her two seasons as Charlotte's head coach, the 49ers were 0-2 versus top-25 teams (AP rank first/ESPN-Coaches).

## #100 in the Book

**Amanda Butler** earned her 100th career coaching victory with Florida's 76-70 win against Charlotte on Nov. 15, 2010. Her record at the time of the milestone mark was 100-61 in her six years on the sideline. Ironically, Butler earned the first 40 of those wins during her two seasons as head coach at Charlotte.

## Gator Debuts

Florida's six newcomers combined to score 40 points, collect 25 rebounds, block six shots and dish eight assists in the Gators' season-opening win against UCF.

## Gator Debut, Part Duex

**Kayla Lewis** became the first true freshman to start a season-opener since **Sha Brooks** vs. St. Francis (NY) on Nov. 18, 2005. **Brittany Davis** and **Sarah Lowe** were the last true freshmen to start a home season-opener, as both were in the lineup on Nov. 24, 2002 against Lamar.

Junior transfer **Lanita Bartley** also was in the starting lineup for the season-opener. The last newcomer who was not a freshman to start their Gator debut was **Jordan Jones** last year against Stetson. Prior to that it was junior transfer **Aneika Henry** in 2007.

## Captains

In a vote by their teammates, juniors **Jordan Jones** and **Azania Stewart** were elected as captains for the 2010-11 season.

## Iron Gator Challenge

**Lanita Bartley** won the inaugural Iron Gator Challenge, a program developed by strength and conditioning coordinator Steve Orris and implemented at the end of the team's pre-season strength and conditioning workouts. The eight-event competition illuminated speed, strength, endurance and toughness, with the winner accumulated the highest combined score from the eight events.

Bartley's competitiveness propelled her to event wins in the Ramp Run and the Plate Walk and second-place finishes in the Towel Hang, Football Stadium Steps Sprint and the Bench Press.

The Eight Iron Gator Challenge Events: Ramp run (fastest time wins), Towel Hang (longest duration (time) wins), Belt Squat (each player will lift 2.5X their body weight; most reps wins), Plate Push (push a weight plate for a specified distance; fastest time wins), Bench Press (each player will bench 75% of their body weight; most reps wins), Football Stadium steps Sprint (bottom to the top along the stairs; fastest time wins), Plate Walk (Using 45lb plate, each player will grip the weight and walk down the hall; fastest time to completion) and 3/4 court sprint (fastest time wins).

She was the inaugural pick by the WNBA's Washington Mystics franchise in 1998 and enjoyed an 11-year WNBA career.

At 6-foot-4, junior **Azania Stewart** was the tallest of all 210 women on 2010-11 Florida Gator rosters (the smallest is cross country's Ali Crabb, who stands 4-foot-11).

**Azania Stewart** spent the 2009 & 2010 summers in Europe, where she was a member of her native Great Britain's 2009 Under-20 World University Games Team that competed in Belgrade, Serbia, and on the 2010 Standard of Life Team that participated in the EuroBasket Championships. She attended the 2008 Olympic Games in China, serving as an ambassador to her native country of England, which plays host to the 2012 Games.

## Jaterra Bonds Named to SEC All-Freshman Team

Bonds is UF's second-leading scorer overall and in SEC games, averaging 8.9 points per game in both, while also ranking second for assists (77) and three-pointers (41).

"What I love most about coaching Jaterra has nothing to do with ball handling, or her defense or her ability to score and all those things are great, but it's how she competes," UF head coach Amanda Butler said. ## Trio Sign a National Letter of Intent to Join Gators in 2011-12

### Viktorija Dimaite (Victoria Dee-uh-MON-tae), 6-4, Center, Lithuania / The Rock School (Gainesville, Fla.)

Dimaite (pronounced Victoria Dee-uh-MON-tae) is a 6-foot-4 center originally from Lithuania and led The Rock School in Gainesville, Fla., to the 2010 Class 1A girl's basketball state championship over Hollywood Christian, 51-48. In the championship game, Dimaite scored 15 points to cap off a 30-2 season for the Lady Lion's. During her junior season, Dimaite averaged 14.5 points and 9.3 rebounds for head coach Fabian Chapov. Dimaite was a member of the Lithuanian Under-16 team national team that competed in the 2008 European Championships and on the Under-18 team in the 2009 European Championships.

### Carlie Needles, 5-7, Guard, Highlands Ranch, Co. / ThunderRidge High School

Needles is a 5-foot-7 point guard and attends ThunderRidge High School, the same program that produced former Duke All-American Abby Waner, as well as Emily Waner, who also played at Duke, and Emily Fox, who starred at Minnesota and was a third-round WNBA selection in 2009. Needles enters her final prep season with 1,102 career points and 373 assists, both ranking fourth on the school's all-time chart behind the aforementioned Grizzlies alum, in addition to 220 steals that ranks sixth in the schools record book. Needles, who set the school-record with 18 assists in one game, averaged 14.1 points, 4.2 assists, 2.9 steals and 1.5 rebounds as a junior for the Grizzlies last season and has been a starter since her freshman year at ThunderRidge, where she is coached by Bill Bradley. Needles was selected for and played in the 2010 The Show high school all-star game on April 3, 2010, which included the top prep talent in the state of Colorado. Held at the Pepsi Center, home of the NBA's Denver Nuggets, Needles led the White Team to victory, as she converted the game-winning free throws, hit the 5-of-6 from beyond the arc and earned MVP honors. She has been a three-time All-State honorable mention awardee and was named First Team all-league each of the last two years.

### Andrea Vilaro-Aragones (on-DREY-uh vil-R-oh air-uh-GO-ness), 5-10, Guard/Forward, Barcelona, Spain/IES Joaquin Blume (Spain)

Vilaro Aragones is a 5-foot-10 guard/forward with an abundance of international playing experience, competing in the U16 and U18 European Championships and the U17 FIBA World Championships. As a member of Spain's U17 women's national team, Vilaro Aragones led her squad during the 2010 FIBA U 17 World Championships with 10.9 points per game. During the 2009 U16 European Championships held in Naples, Italy, Vilaro Aragones was the team captain of the gold-medal-winning Spanish squad and earned a spot on the All-Tournament Team.

## Head Coach Amanda Butler



**Four Years as UF Head Coach \*  
Six Years Overall as a Head Coach**

Combine passion, pride, toughness, intensity, humor, wittiness, competitiveness, leadership and mix in a healthy dose of a swagger and you have Amanda Butler, who in 2010-11 completed her fourth year as head coach of the University of Florida women's basketball team.

Every step along her career path to date has seemingly resulted in another record, milestone or accomplishment.

Take the 2008-09 season for example. The mere fact that Florida was even mentioned as a possible NCAA Tournament team by season's end was remarkable

when such an accomplishment seemed nearly impossible just two years prior to her arrival in Gainesville.

In fact, the 2008-09 season will go down as one of the most successful campaigns in program history.

In addition to tying the school record with 24 victories during the year, Florida marched into the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the seventh time in history. In the team's first trip to the round of 32 since 2004, the 2008-09 squad had its season close on the road at top-ranked and eventual NCAA champion Connecticut. Florida ended the year rated among the top-25 in both national polls for the first time since 2002.

In spite of losing to graduation two of the most statistically impressive players in program history, the 2009-10 Gators marched along and found a way to earn an appearance in their third consecutive postseason tournament.

The 2009-10 season marked the 10th time in Butler's 15 years on the sidelines her team has competed in the postseason, including five NCAA Tournament appearances.

Florida has had eight different full-time women's basketball head coaches and Butler is the first to lead the Gators to a postseason berth in each of her first three years with the program.

In her six years as a collegiate head coach, Butler's teams have posted a 76-21 record at home, including a 50-17 mark (a 74.6 winning percentage) during her four years at her alma mater.

During her initial four years at Florida, Butler has compiled 78 wins, seven more than her college coach Carol Ross, whose 247 victories in 12 years are the most in UF program history.

Butler is coaching her alma mater, where she was a four-year starter for the Gators from 1990-94. She earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Exercise and Sport Sciences with honors on May 6, 1995 and was awarded a Master of Exercise and Sport Sciences on August 9, 1997.

Florida has had eight different full-time women's basketball head coaches and Amanda Butler became one of only two Gator coaches who have won at least 20 games in their second season. In 2008-09, Butler joined Debbie Yow, whose second Gator team went 22-9 in 1984-85; Carol Ross (the winningest Gator coach with 247 victories) posted seven 20-win seasons, but didn't net her first until her fourth year, when Butler was the Gators' senior captain.
