CAREER NOTES

Became the 20th Gator to score 1,000 career points, reaching the milestone versus Mississippi State on February 10, 2008 ... in the Gator record book has the sixth-most made free throws in a season (110 in 2007-08), most free throws attempted in a season (162 in 2007-08), most free throws made in a season by a Gator junior (110 in 2007-08) and most free throws attempted in a season by a Gator junior (162 in 2007-08) ... 51 double-figure scoring games ... 17 double-figure rebounding games ... 16 double-doubles ... 15 20-point scoring games.

JUNIOR YEAR (2007-08)

Voted First-Team All-SEC (eight-player team) by the league's coaches and Second-Team All-SEC (five-player teams) by the league's media ... selected by her teammates as one of the 2007-08 tri-captains ... earned a spot on the SEC Academic Honor Roll ... one of five Gators who played in all 33 games ... started all except one game, coming off the bench against South Carolina (Feb. 24) after missing two practices leading up to the game because of illness, but still managed to score a team-high 17 points on 6-of-7 shooting along with seven rebounds, despite having her consecutive games-started streak halted at 57 games ... had been UF's leading scorer and rebounder all season until March 8 following the two games at the SEC Tournament, when she totaled just nine points and eight rebounds, while averaging 13 minutes per game due to foul trouble and injury ... UF's leading rebounder (262, 7.9 rpg), while ranking second for scoring (432, 13.1 ppg) ... also led UF in field goal percentage (53.1%), free throws made (110) and free throws attempted (162), while ranking third in assists (54) and steals (57) ... in the SEC statistics for all games, ranked No. 1 for offensive rebounding (3.42 pg), No. 10 for scoring, No. 8 for rebounding and No. 8 for free throw percentage ... was the SEC's sixth-leading rebounder for league games, collecting 8.0 per outing; also ranked No. 3 in SEC games for field goal percentage (53.8%), No. 8 in scoring (13.6 ppg), No. 2 in offensive rebounds (3.43 pg), No. 8 for free throw percentage (70.0%) and tied for No. 9 for defensive rebounds (4.57 pg) ... with 6:24 remaining in the game against Mississippi State (Feb. 10), eclipsed the 1,000-point plateau for her career, becoming the 20th Gator to reach the scoring milestone ... exploded with a 20-point, 14-rebound effort against LSU (Feb. 3), netting her eighth double-double of the season ... collected her ninth double-double at Ole Miss (March 2) in the regular-season finale, when she tallied 11 points and 13 rebounds with a career-high five steals helping the Gators rally for the 17-point comeback win ... named the MVP of the State Farm Classic (Dec. 29) after tagging Alabama A&M for a career-tying 26 points and 10 rebounds in the title game ... also scored a career-tying 26 points in the tough road loss at Kentucky (Jan. 10), when she also collected 12 rebounds and hit 10-of-17 from the floor ... broke the tip of her nose during the season-opener against Xavier (Nov. 9), but three days later led the Gators with 25 points

and 16 rebounds in the win over Robert Morris (Nov. 12) ... broke a front lower tooth during the game against Stetson (Nov. 26), needing a root canal and a crown to repair the damage and played at Jacksonville (Nov. 28) less than 24 hours later ... 23 double-figure scoring games ... 10 double-figure rebounding games ... five 20-point games ... nine double-doubles.

SOPHOMORE YEAR (2006-07)

Selected by the league's coaches as a Second-Team All-SEC performer ... Associated Press All-SEC Honorable Mention team selection ... earned SEC Academic Honor Roll status ... starting forward in all 31 games ... one of four Gators who played in every game (Sha Brooks, Kim Dye and Briana Phillips) ... only Gator who scored in every game ... led UF in rebounding (7.6 pg) and field goal percentage (53.2%), while ranking second for scoring (14.4 ppg) and free throw attempts (138) ... in the SEC standings for league games, ranked No. 4 for scoring (16.4 ppg), No. 7 for rebounding (8.1 rpg), No. 4 for field goal percentage (55.5%) and No. 13 for steals (1.79 pg) ... nearly doubled her productivity in every statistical category from the 2005-06 season, when she recorded: 6.8 ppg, 4.5 rpg, collected 18 steals, played 14.7 minutes and shot 58.2 percent from the free throw line - compared with 2006-07 when she contributed 14.4 points, 7.6 rebounds, 48 steals, 28.8 minutes and hitting 71.7 percent from the charity stripe ... re-set every personal career statistical game category during the year, including her scoring total four times ... UF's leading scorer in 10 games and leading rebounder in 14 ... tallied 10 20-point games, including in each of the final three of the season and in four of the last five contests ... in the last three games of the year, averaged 22.3 points and 9.7 rebounds while hitting 56.5 percent (26-46) from the floor: scored 20 points versus No. 13 Vanderbilt in the SEC Tournament quarterfinal after contributing 25 against Mississippi State (March 1) in the SEC Tournament first round game and 22 vs. Kentucky (Feb. 25), when she hit 10-of-14 from the floor ... tallied a 24-point, nine-rebound effort against Alabama (Feb. 18), when she hit 9-of-10 shots from the floor, including the game-winning bucket with 54 seconds remaining ... went for a career-high 26 points with eight rebounds against Auburn (Jan. 18), hitting 11-of-19 from the floor ... played all 40 minutes against Ole Miss (Feb. 1), the first time she has gone the distance during her career ... had a career-long streak of 11 made free throws ... tallied a then-career and game-high 20 points with five rebounds at Xavier (Nov. 12), playing in front of a large group of friends and family who made the trip from Columbus ... 21 double-figure scoring games ... six double-figure rebounding games ... five double-doubles ... 10 20-point scoring games.

FRESHMAN YEAR (2005-06)

Played in all 30 games ... first post off the bench, averaged 14.7 minutes per game ... scored in all but one game ... voted to the All-SEC Freshmen Team by the league's coaches ... UF's

fourth-leading rebounder (4.5 rpg) and sixth-leading scorer (6.8 ppg) ... in SEC games averaged 7.0 points and 4.9 rebounds while shooting 54.9 percent from the floor ... shot a team-high 55.7 percent (83-149) from the floor, becoming the sixth freshman to lead the Gators in field goal percentage, joining UF greats Quientella Bonner, Tammy Jackson, Merlakia Jones, Murriel Page and Vanessa Hayden ... scored eight points in both of UF's final two games, including the NCAA first-round contest when she hit 4-of-6 from the floor ... went 8-for-8 from the free throw line en route to eight points with five rebounds in the win against No. 2 LSU (Feb. 16) ... ignited the Gators' win at Mississippi State (Feb. 9), scoring 10 points with nine rebounds in 23 minutes ... named SEC Freshman of the Week for Jan. 16-22 after helping UF to wins over Ole Miss and No. 19 Vanderbilt by averaging a team-best 15 points with 7 rebounds while shooting 91.7 percent (11-12) from the floor ... UF's leading scorer with a then-career-high 17 points in 17 minutes in the win against No. 19 Vanderbilt (Jan. 22) ... collected her second double-double with 13 points and 10 rebounds in 15 minutes during the win at Ole Miss (Jan. 19) ... posted her first career double-double, recording 11 points with a career-high 10 rebounds at Georgia (Jan. 8) in 21 minutes ... career night during the comeback against Florida State (Jan. 2), scoring 14 points on 7-of-7 shooting with seven rebounds in 24 minutes of play ... had a huge bucket with 1:40 remaining against Illinois (Dec. 9) to give UF a six-point lead ... instrumental during UF's 16-point second-half comeback at Charlotte when on one series grabbed three consecutive offensive rebounds, getting the last one to fall and bringing the Gators within one point, 69-68, with 6:56 remaining ... seven double-figure scoring games ... two double-figure rebounding games ... two double-doubles.

HIGH SCHOOL

Graduated in June of 2005 from Mifflin High School, where she was coached by Troy Taylor ... finalist for the 2005 McDonald's All-American game ... received Honorable Mention notice for the 2005 WBCA High School All-America Game ... rated No. 30 in Blue Star's listing of the Top 100 seniors ... selected first-team 2005 Associated Press Division I Girls All-Ohio ... averaged 18.9 points per game her senior year ... 2005 District 10 Player of the Year for Division I ... directed Mifflin High School to a 23-1 record her junior season, averaging 18.3 points and 13.4 rebounds while shooting 74 percent from the free throw line ... the Punchers captured the Division II state title her sophomore year and was runner up her freshman season ... helped the 2004 USA Youth Development Festival North Team to the silver medal as the squad's third leading scorer and second leading rebounder, with 10.2 points and 7.0 rebounds ... one of just 31 players in the country invited to the 2004 U.S. Junior National Team Trials ... named to the 2003-2004 Associated Press Division I Girls All-Ohio high school basketball second team.

"I feel that Marshae is going to have a great senior year. It's going to be very challenging for her, though, since there will be a lot more focus and attention paid to her because she steadily dominated in so many ball games last year. It's tough when you're under 6-foot to be winning rebounding battles in the low block, but she did. She's so powerful and strong. Marshae worked a lot in the off-season improving her range and her game facing the basket."
