### Game 27: Florida 95, No. 5 Tennessee 93 (overtime)

February 26, 2006 • Knoxville, Tenn. • Thompson-Boling Arena

Brittany Davis scored a career-high 29 points in leading a balanced offensive attack that produced a stunning 95-93 overtime victory against No. 5 Tennessee in Thompson-Boling Arena.

Freshman Sha Brooks played 40 minutes and equaled her career-high with 25 points, while seniors Sarah Lowe, Dalila Eshe and Danielle Santos accounted for the rest of Florida's scoring.

Lowe tallied 15 points along with a season-high seven rebounds, a career-tying six steals and six assists with zero turnovers while playing all 45 minutes. Eshe hit for 13 points with four steals in 40 minutes, while Santos tallied 13 points, five rebounds, four steals and three assists in 38 minutes.

The Gators snapped a 12-game losing streak against the Lady Vols and collected its first win ever on Tennessee's home court in 16 tries did so in front of 20,790 fans (turnstile 17,595), the largest crowd ever to watch the Gators play.

Davis scored six of her 29 points in the overtime frame, while Lowe added three points and Brooks tallied four, including two free throws with 10.2 seconds remaining to give the Gators a four-point lead. Florida's defense forced UT into a season-high 28 turnovers, which the Gators converted into 30 points. UF also collected a season-high 20 steals and shot a steady 25-of-32 from the free throw line, including 4-of-8 in overtime. UT superior height advantage helped the Lady Vols to a 54-38 rebounding difference, but Florida held its own in the paint where UT outscored the Gators just 40-34.

UF shot 39.5 percent (32-81) in the game, but hit 48.5 percent (16-33) in the second half and 57.1 percent (4-7) in overtime. UT canned 48.6 percent overall.

Davis scored the first points in overtime, but the Gators turned the ball over on their next two offensive possessions and UT took advantage, as Candace Parker scored the next five points of the game to give UT an 87-84 lead with three minutes remaining. Davis countered with a three-pointer from the left side of the arc to even the score. On UF's next possession, Davis went to the free throw line where she hit one of two to swing the lead back to UF, 88-87. Brooks then hit a short jumper and Lowe sank a driving layup to give UF a 92-87 advantage with 1:12 remaining.

Zolman answered with two free throws and Parker added one, as UT closed within two, 92-90, with 56 seconds left. Lowe then hit one free throw and lifted the Gators to a three-point advantage, 93-90. UF's defensive star Santos fouled out with 28 seconds left, as Alex Fuller when to the line and made one. Lowe collected the miss and drove to UF's end of the floor and dribbled around forcing the Vols to foul Brooks, who coolly dropped in two from the free throw line and gave the Gators a 95-91 lead with 10.2 seconds remaining. Tye'sha Fluker powered up an inside jumper to get the Vols within two, 95-93. UT sent Brooks to the free throw line with 1.1 seconds. She missed both attempts, but the Vols were unable to get off a shot as the Gators pulled off the upset.

Florida scored the first four points of the second half to tie the game at 34-all, but Fluker canned two straight inside hoops to give UT the lead. Florida chipped away, never giving in and after falling behind 48-43 with 14:48 left, the Gators ripped off 18-2 run to take a 61-50 lead with 10:45 remaining. Brooks came alive during the stretch, scoring eight points. After the teams traded buckets, the Vols roared the wave of a raucous crowd and stormed back with a 12-2 run that cut UF's lead to one, 65-64, with 6:44 left in the game. UF however, refused to relinquish the lead, as Santos calmly hit two free throws, as UF answered UT's buckets on consecutive trips before Eshe converted a three-point play to take a 72-68 lead with 4:47 left. The Vols countered with a 4-1 run and again got within one, 73-72, with 3:04 on the clock, before Davis hit a tough inside jumper and again the teams began to traded buckets and free throws. After two more free throw from Parker, the Gators seemed a little out of sync in their next offensive possession. But Davis nailed an eight-footer in traffic and gave the Gators a 79-76 lead with 1:09 remaining. UT had several shots on its trip down the floor, but missed all of them and fouled Eshe, who finally collected a miss. Eshe canned two free throws with 34 seconds remaining, before Zolman hit a deep three-pointer with 22.0 seconds on the clock to narrow UF's lead to two, 81-79. UF in-bounded the ball and UT fouled Lowe with 15.6 seconds remaining. Lowe missed the first, but hit the second to extend the Gator lead to three, 82-79, as UT called its final timeout. The Lady Vols worked the ball to Zolman, who responded by nailed a 3-pointer with 8.4 seconds left to tie the game. Brooks got off a shot in the final second, but it bounced off the rim and the game headed into overtime.



### Today's Story Lines

The Gators play their Southeastern Conference home opener tonight, playing host to No. 4 Tennessee.

Florida aims to halt its three-game losing streak and collect its second straight win against the Lady Vols, who have won eight consecutive games since a 70-57 loss at North Carolina on December 3rd.

### UF in SEC HOME Openers

Florida has won its last three SEC home openers, including last year's 59-44 victory over Alabama.

### Nine is Just Fine!

A new year brought a new Florida team to the court. With departures over the holiday break, the Gator roster was trimmed to nine players, but those nine are ready for the tough challenges ahead on the 2006-07 schedule.

### Challenging Way to Start 2007

Florida begins its SEC schedule playing three ranked teams. The Gators opened at No. 15 Georgia on January 4th, play host to No. 4 Tennessee tonight before playing No. 11/10 Vanderbilt in Nashville (Jan. 14).

### Sure, They're Tall, But Watch the Perimeter

Tennessee's 11-player roster features six Lady Vols who stand at least 6-feet tall. But the Gators can't be fooled by UT's height, as the Lady Vols are the nation's second-best three-point shooting team, hitting 41.7 percent from long range. Sidney Spencer leads the Lady Vols' long-range barrage, leading the country with a 52.4 percent (33-63) mark from behind the arc (in the most recent NCAA stats).

In UF's last game, the Gators hung with the taller players from Georgia, but it was the Lady Bulldogs' three-point shooting that doomed the Gators, who allowed 12 from long range, including nine in the decisive first half.

### Gators vs. Lady Vols

While Tennessee has owned the 36-game series versus the Gators, the last three contests have been decided by single digits, with the last two needing overtime. Florida captured last year's 95-93 thriller in Knoxville, earning its first-ever win in Thompson-Boling in the regular-season finale for both teams.

### About Tennessee

Redshirt sophomore Candace Parker has been all-world for Tennessee this season, leading the Lady Vols with 20.4 points, 8.9 rebounds and 41 blocks while shooting 55.7 percent from the floor, collecting 33 steals and dishing 30 assists. In the team's most recent victory - a 70-64 win at No. 5 Connecticut - the 6-4 Parker tallied 30 points, 12 rebounds, 6 blocks and one dunk in 40 minutes of action.

Senior Sidney Spencer has been keeping defenses honest with her three-point shooting, as the 6-3 forward hits 52.4 percent (33-63) from long range while contributing 12.1 points per game.

Freshman Shannon Bobbit also adds strength to the perimeter, hitting 46.2 percent (24-52) from the arc, while Alexis Hornbuckle hits at a 37.8 percent (14-37) clip, as UT cans 41.7 percent as a team en route to scoring 77.3 points per game.

### Team Ties

Gator senior **Kim Dye** is a native of Fayetteville, Tenn., located approximately one hour outside of Nashville. She attended Shelbyville High School, where she was teammates with Tennessee's **Alex Fuller**, who is a redshirt sophomore.

### Team Ties, Part 2

UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** was an assistant coach at UT during the 1994 and 1995 seasons, helping the team to a 65-6 record and an NCAA runner-up finish.

### Team Ties, Part 3

UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** and her brother **Michael**, an assistant with the Gators, are natives of Jefferson City, Tenn., located a mere 28 miles east-northeast of Knoxville.

Three Gator players also hail from the state of Tennessee. Gator senior **Kim Dye** is a native of Fayetteville, Tenn., located 158 miles from Knoxville. Sophomore **Sha Brooks** is from Jackson, about 275 miles from Knoxville. Sophomore **Kim Critton** is from Memphis - 347 miles from Knoxville.

### She Can Do It

**Carolyn Peck** is one of only two former Tennessee assistant coaches (the other is former UF head coach and current Kentucky head coach **Mickie DeMoss**) who have collected a regular-season victory against the Lady Vols. On Feb. 26, 2006, Peck's unranked

Gators marched into to Knoxville and upset the fifth-ranked Lady Vols 95-93 in overtime, becoming the second unranked team ever to defeat Tennessee at home. During Purdue's national championship season with Peck at the helm, the Boilermakers ended UT's 46-game winning streak with a 78-68 decision on Nov. 15, 1998.

### UF vs. Ranked Teams

Since the 1990-91 season, Florida is 48-96 against teams ranked in the Associated Press top-25 poll (at the time of tip-off), including an 0-4 record this season.

In four-plus years under Carolyn Peck, the Gators are 10-30 versus nationally ranked foes. Among those 10 wins were two of the biggest in program history: defeated No. 2 LSU (79-78 in overtime) on Feb. 16, 2006 and defeated No. 5 Tennessee in Knoxville (95-93 in overtime) on Feb. 26, 2006).

### Who's Hot?

**Marshae Dotson** is coming off a 22-point, nine rebound effort versus Georgia, while she helped contain All-American Tasha Humphrey, who finished with just eight points and four rebounds before fouling out.

**Sha Brooks** has reached double-figures in 10 consecutive games, while averaging 17.8 points over the last four games.

### Gator Watch

With Preseason First Team All-SEC performer **Sha Brooks** receiving significant attention from opposing defenses, **Depre Bowden** and **Marshae Dotson** have stepped

up their games, contributing 12.3 and 12.1 points per game, respectively, to join Brooks' 14.9 per game average.

**Bowden** has taken her game to another level, battling for the rebounding lead with 6.5 per game, while adding team-bests of 37 steals, 39 assists and 15 blocks. She has reset her career-high scoring total three times this season (most recently 25 points versus Temple on Jan. 2) and equalled her then-high of 19 points at TCU when she also recorded her second career double-double.

**Dotson** holds an edge in the team rebounding lead, collecting 7.1 per game while shooting a team-best 50.7 percent from the floor.

### Bumps & Bruises

Aside from the usual bumps and bruises of a physical season, the Gators are healthy entering today's game.

### Numbers Watch

\***Sha Brooks** has hit 23 of her last 24 free throws, having her team-high streak of 22 consecutive end during the Jan. 4 game at Georgia;

\***Sha Brooks** has tallied 10 consecutive double-figure scoring games entering Thursday's game ... she has 89 3-pointers and ranks seventh all-time at UF. She needs 17 more to tie Bridget Pettis' 106 for sixth place;

\***Depre Bowden** and **Marshae Dotson** have scored in every game this season;

### Doubling her Pleasure

Junior **Depre Bowden** has more than doubled - in some cases tripled - every offensive career category she had established

entering the 2006-07 season. Last year, she averaged 3.7 points and 2.8 rebounds while playing 13.8 minutes per game. This season, Bowden is contributing 12.3 points and 6.5 rebounds while seeing 28.6 minutes of court time.

### Tough Enough?

In the January 2nd Associated Press and USA Today/ESPN Coaches national polls, **SEVEN** different UF foes are ranked among the top-25, with a several others receiving votes!

A total of 18 teams on UF's schedule competed in the postseason last year, with 13 earning a trip to the NCAA Tournament.

### Six-Foot Under

Florida's nine-player roster features just one player (Briana Phillips) standing at least 6-feet tall.

Tennessee's 11-player roster features **six** 6-footers.

### Tall Authority

The Gators feature one of the tallest coaching staffs in the country, with Michael Peck standing 6-7, Carolyn Peck 6-4 (without heels!), Jose Mori 6-3 and Shell Dailey 6-2.

### Fine from the Line

The Gators' have been a solid free throw-shooting team under Carolyn Peck, with the team percentage increasing every year, resetting the program record each of the last two seasons. This year's squad is hitting 71.2 percent from the charity stripe (but a puzzling 68.1 percent at home compared with 74.7 percent on the road).

### Everyone Feels Better at Home

All nine Gators average double-figure minutes during UF's seven home games this season.

Florida shoots much better on its home court (42.1%) than away (35.8%), but has struggled from the free throw stripe, where the team this just 68.1 percent compared to 74.7 percent on the road.

### Court-ing Success

New in the O'Connell Center this season is the actual floor that the Gator men's basketball team won the 2006 NCAA championship on in Indianapolis. The University Athletic Association purchased the court and had it refinished and Gatorized for the teams to play on this season.

### Larger than Life!

Also new in the O'Connell Center this season are four 12' x 16' video boards, which made their debut on Dec. 8 for the NCAA Volleyball Regionals UF hosted.

Women's basketball fans got their first taste of the new video boards on December 18th versus Stetson.

### No. 125 for Coach Peck

UF's 72-55 victory over Stetson on December 18th was the 125th career win for head coach Carolyn Peck, who has spent seven years on the sidelines, including five with the Gators with whom she guided to 68 of those victories.

### Orange Debut

The Gators donned orange uniforms for their December 1st game at South Alabama, marking the first time Florida has worn those jerseys since the 2003-04 season, when the Gators posted a 3-2 record (2-1 on away courts and 1-1 on neutral sites).

The Gators did wear black road uniforms eight times during the 2004-05 season, but went with just blue for all of 2005-06 away from Gainesville.

### All About TEAM

Aside from the orange uniforms the Gators donned against South Alabama on December 1st, none of the jerseys had the players' last names stitched on the back. It is the first time since the 1990-91 season that the Gators have worn jerseys that have not had their individual names on the back.

### Tale of Two Halves

In UF's first four losses this season, the Gators played one solid half and one not-so-solid half of basketball.

Against Xavier, UF outscored the Musketeers 45-39 in the second half but it wasn't enough to overcome its slow start.

Versus No. 18 California, UF again played a better second-half, but wasn't able to chip away at its first-half deficit.

Against No. 14 Rutgers, the first half belonged to the Gators, who held a 40-37 halftime lead, but couldn't maintain that play in the decisive second period when they were outscored 51-31.

During the in-state game at rival Florida State, the Gators outscored the Seminoles 41-37 in the second half, but again were playing catch-up after a tough opening half.

### 15 at Home... but it doesn't seem like it

The Gators will play 15 regular-season home games this year, but begin their schedule playing seven of the first 10 games on the road.

### Five in a Row at Home

The January 2nd game against Temple was the final game in a five-game home stand for the Gators, which capped the run with a 2-3 record.

UF entered the quintet fresh off a three-game road trip, also playing seven of its first 10 games away from Gainesville.

### David Eckstein's our Hero!

Former Florida All-American and current St. Louis Cardinals' shortstop David Eckstein (1994-97) was named the Most Valuable Player of the 2006 World Series after helping the Cardinals to a five-game triumph over the Detroit Tigers. Much ado was made about Eckstein's 5-7 stature, something to which the 2006-07 Gators can relate.

The average height of UF's nine-member roster is a mere 69.44 inches - or a shade under five-8. A national research project revealed that only Nicholls State (1) has the same number of 6-footers as the Gators.

### Who Will Emerge?

The Gators returned less than 40 percent of last year's minutes played, points, rebounds, field goals, assists and blocks.

### Carolyn's Crew

The 2006-07 Gator squad is the first where every member of the team was recruited and signed under head coach Carolyn Peck, who enters her fifth year at UF.

The current sophomore class ranked as high as the nation's fifth-best class, while the 2006-07 freshmen combine as the 23rd-best despite not featuring one post player.

### Early Honors

Sophomore **Sha Brooks** was selected as a Preseason First Team All-SEC performer by both the league's coaches and media.

Brooks is coming off a stellar freshman season when she helped the Gators to a 21-9 record and berth in the NCAA Championship. The 5-7 guard was named Second Team All-SEC by the conference's coaches and media last year, as she emerged as UF's second-leading scorer (13.7 ppg), while leading the Gators with 65 steals and 61 three-pointers.

### UF vs. The Sunshine State

The Gators sport a 197-57 all-time record against other teams from the state of Florida. The Gators were 2-1 this season versus Sunshine State opponents, earning wins against North Florida and Stetson, while falling to Florida State.

### Gators Sign Nation's 11th-Rated Class During Early Period

The Gators more than met their needs with the signing of five players to join the team beginning in the 2007-08 season. Aside from their individual quickness, will boast height to UF's frontcourt. The five players are:

### Team Ties

UF head coach **Carolyn Peck** is a 1988 alumni of Vanderbilt, where she was a four-year letterwinner for the Commodores.

During her four-year career as a 6-foot-4 center, Peck averaged 10.6 points and 5.8 rebounds. She totaled 1,240 points, 679 rebounds and 180 blocks helping the Commodores to a 77-42 record and appearances in the 1986 and 1987 NCAA Tournament. Peck, who played all four years under head coach Phil Lee, was named team captain in her final two years and she earned Second Team All-SEC honors her senior season. Peck earned her B.A. degree in communications in 1988, after which she was a marketing consultant for a television station in Nashville.

### Last Game vs. Vanderbilt

**Game 18: Florida 73, No. 19 Vanderbilt 59**  
**January 22, 2006 • Gainesville, Fla. • O'Connell Center**  
Marshae Dotson and junior Kim Dye posted career high scoring efforts helping the University of Florida women's basketball team upset 19th-ranked Vanderbilt, 73-59, Sunday afternoon at the O'Connell Center in front of 2,813.

Senior Danielle Santos (Marietta, Ga.), who finished the game with 10 points, scored five points during the Gators' 9-0 run to start the second half and erase an eight-point halftime deficit and take a 35-34 lead with 17:49 remaining.

Vanderbilt (13-6, 2-3 SEC) answered the run with jumpers from Carla Thomas and Liz Sherwood, but Sha Brooks (Jackson, Tenn.) nailed a three-pointer to tie the game, which would see three more tied scores over the next four minutes.

With the Commodores holding a 45-43 lead with 11:31 left, Dotson powered in a layup to spark a 19-5 run that lifted Florida (15-3, 3-2 SEC) to a 62-49 advantage with 4:45 remaining in the game and maintained a double-figure lead the rest of the way en route to the victory.

"My team gave me a great birthday present," said UF coach Carolyn Peck, who was celebrating her 40th birthday facing her alma mater. "They are a special group. They came out with a lot of heart. We knew it was a game we would have to battle in, defensively. Marshae (Dotson) and Kim (Dye) really helped swing the momentum our way in the second half."

Dotson finished with 17 points on 5-of-5 shooting from the floor and 7-of-9 from the free throw line in 17 minutes of action, while Dye hit for 15 points, canning 5-of-7 from the three-point arc. Senior Brittany Davis (Gainesville, Fla.) had nine points and a team-high seven rebounds for Florida, which outscored Vanderbilt 47-25 in the second half when the Gators shot 57.7 percent and held the usually accurate Commodores to a 37 percent mark.

In the first half, the Gators shot a dreadful 25 percent (6-24) from the floor, but were within eight points at halftime despite Vanderbilt's 62.5 percent (15-24) shooting efforts.

Vanderbilt was led by junior Caroline Williams, who totaled 17 points and six rebounds on the afternoon. Carla Thomas and Nicole Jules also reached double figures with 14 and 13, respectively.
