**JASON BAISDEN**  
*Football Equipment Manager*

Jason Baisden was named UF's Football Equipment Manager in January of 2005 after joining the Gator program in June of 2004 as Assistant Equipment Manager. Baisden's main responsibilities center around ordering and accounting for Florida football equipment, while also directing actual game-day equipment efforts for the team.

Prior to coming to Florida, Baisden was the Assistant Equipment Manager for the Atlanta Falcons from 2001 until June of 2005. He attended Florida State University where he began working in the equipment room as a student manager in 1995 and served as a Graduate Assistant from 1999-00. Baisden also volunteered from 1998-2000 at spring mini camps held by the Jacksonville Jaguars.

A native of Lake City, Fla., Baisden earned his B.A. in Physical Education in 1999 from Florida State and received his M.S. in Sports Administration in 2000 from FSU.

## **JON CLARK**

### *Administrative Assistant*

Jon Clark, who will be Florida's Administrative Assistant for Football, comes to Gainesville after serving in the same role at the University of Utah since 2003. He first worked with Florida head football coach Urban Meyer at Bowling Green, where Clark was an undergraduate student manager prior to earning his B.S. in Secondary Education in May of 2002. After completing his education, Clark accepted a position as an administrative graduate assistant at BGSU.



**RYAN DAY**  
*Graduate Assistant Coach (Offense)*

Ryan Day is in his first season as a graduate assistant coach after serving in the same capacity at Boston College for the last two seasons. At Florida, Day will assist with the offense.

While at BC, Day worked with the wide receivers where he helped the Eagles to a 9-3 overall record in 2004 and a No. 21 ranking in the final edition of the Associated Press and ESPN/USA Today polls. Boston College was the only Big East team ranked in the final Top 25 in the ESPN/USA Today poll. The ranking was the highest for the school since 1993.

Day was tight ends coach at the University of New Hampshire in 2002 and also served as assistant quarterback coach at UNH. He is a 2002 graduate of UNH and was captain of the school's football team in 2001. He was a three-year starter and holds four UNH passing records, including best passing percentage in a career (59.9, 1997-2001) and touch-down passes in a career (53).

Prior to attending UNH, Day was a record-setting quarterback at Manchester Central where he passed for more than 4,000 career yards and was named New Hampshire's Gatorade Player in 1996. He guided the Little Green to the 1995 Division I title.



**JOHN DEAN**  
*Athletic Trainer*

John Dean is in his second season as an athletic trainer at the University of Florida, working primarily with the football team.

Dean, a 2000 graduate of San Diego State University, assists in the treatment, prevention, rehabilitation and evaluation of injuries to UF football players.

Dean earned his Master's degree from The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in physical therapy in 2002 and spent last season as an assistant trainer with the University of Southern California football and baseball teams. He also has an Associate of Science degree from Utah Valley State College.

While at San Diego State, Dean acted as primary supervisor of practices and competitions for men's soccer, men's tennis, and women's volleyball. At USC, in addition to his trainer responsibilities, Dean lectured classes in spinal cord and injury management, concussion evaluation, and prophylactic and post injury protective taping and bracing.

## **ADAM HARTLE**

### *Game Analysis Coordinator*

Adam Hartle is entering his sixth year with the University of Florida football team and his first as Game Analysis Coordinator.

Hartle, who served as an Assistant Football Video Coordinator as an undergraduate at Florida from 1997 through 2001, rejoined the Gator program as a Football Intern prior to the 2004 season.

After completing his education at Florida, Hartle joined the Atlanta Falcons in the summer of 2001 as a Video Coordinator Intern prior to coaching at Jacksonville's Mandarin High School from the fall of 2001 through the spring of 2004. While at Mandarin, Hartle was the junior varsity head coach in 2002 before assisting with the squad and coaching the varsity team running backs in 2003. During that time, Hartle helped send numerous players to the collegiate level including current Florida defensive tackle Marcus Thomas and Georgia Tech wide receiver Pat Clark.

In the spring and summer of 2004, Hartle moved to Jacksonville's Nease High School as an assistant varsity coach before returning to Gainesville.

Hartle earned his B.S. in Exercise and Sports Sciences at the University of Florida in 2001 after attending Jacksonville's Bishop Kenny High School.





**DAVE HOUTS**  
*Director of Video Services*

Dave Houts, who has been associated with the Gator football team since 1977, has worked for the UAA as Director of Video Services since 1989 and worked for the University of Florida since 1983. Houts' duties include taping games and practices for the UF football, basketball, baseball, track, gymnastics and swimming teams. He is involved with computer and video cutups, as well as making opponent exchange tapes.

The Pontiac, Mich., native also is involved in making scouting reports for the offensive and defensive coaches. Houts also has worked with the National Football League, Major League Baseball, NASCAR, 1996 Summer Olympics, as well as on such movies as "Parenthood" and "Just Cause."

Houts was in the United States Peace Corps in Brazil before getting his bachelor of arts degree in anthropology from Western Michigan and his bachelor of science degree in journalism from Florida, where he received academic honors. Houts then worked for two television stations before joining the university's staff. Houts also is a Vietnam-era veteran with U.S. Army engineers. Houts was honored with the Alachua County United Way Volunteer of the Year Award in 1986.

Houts and his wife, Beth, have two children, Matthew and Sara.

**PETER A. INDELICATO, MD**  
*Head Team Physician*



Dr. Peter A. Indelicato, UF's head team physician since 1977, is one of the nation's leading orthopedic surgeons in the field of Sports Medicine as he was recently honored by his peers as the first-ever recipient of the National College Team Physician of the Year Award.

A native of New York, Dr. Indelicato attended New York Medical College and received his medical degree in 1969. He successfully completed his orthopedic residency training at NYU and spent two years in the US Navy serving as a staff orthopedic surgeon at NAS Corpus Christi, Texas. Following this, he served as a sports medicine fellow at the well-known Kerlan-Jobe Orthopedic Clinic participating in the care of the Los Angeles Rams, Lakers, Dodgers, and Kings. In 1977, he was appointed as assistant professor in Orthopedics Surgery and Director of Sports Medicine at UF. In 1993, he was named Medical Director of the Shands Sports Medicine Center at Hampton Oaks.

In 1994, 1996, 1997, 1998, 1999, and 2002 his name was published in "The Best Doctors in America." He has been an honorary member of the National Athletics Trainer Association since 1984 and received its "Outstanding Services" Recognition Award in 1991. Indelicato also has also been elected a member-at-large to the American Orthopedic Society for Sports Medicine's Board of Directors and also serves as chairman for the Council of Delegates. He currently is a member of the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, the American Orthopedics Society of Sports Medicine, the Florida Orthopedic Society, the American College of Surgeons, the Florida Medical Association, and is a founding member of the Southeastern Conference Sports Medicine Committee.

He has lectured extensively around the country on the recognition and management of athletic knee and shoulder injuries. Over the past 18 years, he has been invited to speak in 19 countries outside the United States regarding similar topics. He has made a total of 35 lectures internationally. Currently he is chairing a multi-center study looking at ligament injuries in the knee.

In 1989, he was appointed as Associate Team Physician for the Miami Dolphins and served in that capacity until 1996 when he became an orthopedic consultant for the Dolphins. Since 1999, he has been chosen as the NFL neutral team physician.

Dr. Indelicato also serves as the medical director of the clinical research are of Gainesville's newly built state-of-the-art Orthopedic and Sports Medicine Institute.



**BOB LACIVITA**  
*Director of Football Operations*

Bob LaCivita joins UF as Director of Football Operations after handling the same position at North Carolina State the past five seasons. He has worked with three other Division I-A football programs in the past 26 years, including Akron, Auburn and Pittsburgh. He graduated from Indiana University of Pennsylvania in 1971 with a B.A. in Psychology. In 1977, he earned a Master's of Public Health from the University of Pittsburgh and in 1984, he received his doctorate of philosophy in higher education from the University of Pittsburgh.

**BETTY LING**  
*Senior Administrative Assistant*



A member of the University of Florida football family for 27 years, Betty Ling enters her 15th year as Senior Administrative Assistant. A Tampa native, Ling serves as the Administrative Assistant for football recruiting. Ling's responsibilities include: assisting with the arrangements of official and unofficial visits by recruits and assisting with high school relations. She also helps coordinate UF's High School Coaches Clinic. Ling also assists recruiting coaches travel and correspondence and all prospect student-athlete's game day activities.



**ART LINK**  
*Graduate Assistant Coach*

Art Link is in his second season as a graduate assistant coach. Link works with the Gator defense and special teams. A two-year letterwinner from 1997-98, Link contributed to the line-backer rotation and also saw action on the special teams. A graduate of Jacksonville's The Bolles School, Link walked on to the 1996 National Championship team.

In his career, Link saw action in nine games for 49 plays recording two career pass deflections and one tackle. At the end of the 1998 season, he received the team's 5th Year Senior Award.

After graduating in May 1999 from Florida with a bachelor of science in Sport Management, Link was hired as a restricted earnings linebacker coach at Missouri Western State College. While working in Missouri, Link earned credits toward a master's degree in Education at Northwest Missouri State University.

In 2002, he moved back to Florida to serve as a graduate assistant at Florida Atlantic University. In his time at FAU, Link assisted with video operations and the team's strength and conditioning programs.

Link went to coach under head coach Rick Swain in 2003. He was hired as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Spanish River High School in February 2003. In May, Link followed Coach Swain to Boca Raton Community High School where he served as defensive line coach and video coordinator.



**ANTHONY PASS**  
*Head Athletic Trainer, Football*

Anthony Pass enters his first season at the University of Florida as the Head Athletic Trainer for the football team. He also serves as the South Endzone Athletic Training facility manager. Pass came to Gainesville after two years on the Indiana

State University Athletic Training Service's staff where he directed the athletic training services for the Sycamore football program. The Broomfield, Colo., native is a licensed athletic trainer, nationally certified athletic trainer as well as a certified strength and condition specialist.

Pass moved to Indiana State University after spending two years in the National Football League.

Pass spent a year as an assistant athletic trainer and strength & conditioning assistant with the Houston Texans. While with the Texans, Pass was a sideline specialist for the Gatorade Sports Science Institute implementing hydration protocols and monitoring dehydration of players.

During the 2001 season, he worked with the Buffalo Bills as a season-long athletic training intern. Prior to that, Pass worked at the University of Houston for three years as a graduate assistant athletic trainer. Pass has also worked at the 2003 Senior Bowl, and the 2000 Texas High School All-Star Football game.

A graduate in 1999 from the University of Colorado with a bachelor's of arts degree in Kinesiology, he later earned his master's in sports administration from the University of Houston in 2001. He is a member of the Golden Key National Honors Society.

Pass is married to the former Gena Lewis.

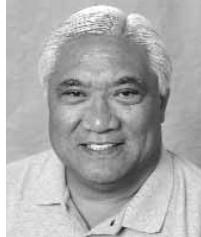
