GATORS SET FOR SEMINOLES IN REGULAR SEASON CLOSER...

THE MATCH-UP

■ The two Sunshine State schools first met on the gridiron in 1958 in a series that has become one of the nation's most spirited rivalries. Florida posted a 21-7 victory in the first showdown in 1958 and the two have met every year since that initial contest, with Florida holding an overall 27-18-2 lead in the series. Since 1979, this game has been scheduled as the regular season finale for both universities. Since 1990, the team which has rushed for more yardage has posted a 13-1-1 record. The team with fewer or even turnovers in a game has posted a 10-4-1 record. Florida enters the contest with an 8-3 overall record and an 6-2 mark in SEC play after winning at South Carolina two weeks ago, 24-22. Florida State was also idle last Saturday. The Seminoles own a 9-2 overall record and went 7-1 in the ACC after outlasting North Carolina State in a double overtime, 50-44, win on Saturday, Nov. 15 in Tallahassee.

A MEETING OF CHAMPIONS

■ With Florida's win over South Carolina on Nov. 15, the Gators clinched at least a share of the SEC East title for the eighth time in school history. Meanwhile, Florida State's double overtime win over North Carolina State gave the Seminoles their 11th ACC title in the past 12 years. With the wins, both teams have slid up in the polls and this year's game marks the 22nd time in the history of the series that at least one team enters the meeting ranked inside the top 10 nationally.

A TOUGH SCHEDULE

■ UF is facing its school-record tying sixth ranked opponent this season in No. 9 FSU (No. 3 Miami, No. 4 Georgia, No. 6 LSU, No. 11 Arkansas and No. 12 Tennessee). The school record for most ranked teams played in the regular season is six by the 1987 and 1991 teams. The 1987 team faced five teams in the top 10 in the regular season, while the 1986, 1997 and 2002 teams faced three opponents in the top five of the polls during the regular season. In addition, the Gators also played Ole Miss earlier this season. The Rebels were not ranked at the time, however, the Rebels are ranked No. 17 in the latest AP poll.

■ Florida is the only school in the BCS rankings (as of Nov. 17) to own wins over two of the top six teams in the BCS poll. Including the FSU game, Florida has faced three of the top seven teams in the BCS and five of the top 12.

THE SENIOR CLASS

■ Today's game will mark the final regular season and home game for the 22-member 2003 senior class. The group has posted a record of 36-13 (.734), and are 26-6 (.812) in SEC action. The 2003 senior class holds an 19-5 (.791) record in The Swamp and 16-9 (.640) against ranked opponents. The senior class has appeared in three straight January bowl games and has never lost to Georgia, Vanderbilt, Kentucky, South Carolina and Arkansas during their Florida careers. The senior class has won one SEC title game as Florida defeated Auburn, 28-6, on Dec. 2, 2000. The class includes four all-SEC honorees (Keiwan Ratliff, Guss Scott, Shannon Snell and Max Starks). Combined three athletes in the 2003 senior class have been named the SEC Player of the Week on four occasions. There have been three members of the 2003 senior class who have been named to the SEC Academic Honor Roll on four occasions.

SUNSHINE STATE PLAYERS

■ Today's game features 121 players who hail from the state of Florida. UF has 76 players from the Sunshine State and FSU has 45. Florida's Gavin Dickey is the only Gator from Tallahassee as he attended Lincoln High School with Florida State's Andrew Henry-Kennon, Pat Watkins, Antonio Cromartie and Crophonso Thorpe (see page 11 of this release for a complete list of athletes from the same high school in today's game).

FLORIDA VS. THE STATE OF FLORIDA

■ Florida is 113-51-5 all-time against teams from the state of Florida. UF has defeated Florida State more times (27) than any other in state opponent. Miami ranks second on the list, as the Gators have defeated the Hurricanes on 25 occasions.

GATOR STORYLINES

- The 2003 Florida roster features 52 freshmen, including 34 who have seen their first career game action this year.
- Overall, 45 players have seen their first action in a Gator uniform this fall.
- According to the NCAA, UF's strength of schedule ranks as the sixth toughest in the country.
- Gators bring regular season to a close looking to win nine games in a season for the 13th time in the last 14 years.

TELEVISION

The game will be broadcast on CBS. Verne Lundquist (play-by-play), Todd Blackledge (color) and Jill Arrington (sideline) comprise the broadcast team. Prior to the game, Terry Norvelle and Frank Frangie will be on site for the Bubba Burger College Kickoff Show from 9:30 a.m. - 10:30 a.m. Live extended postgame coverage with James Bates and Tom Block airs on the Sunshine Network immediately following the game.

DELAYED TELEVISION

Sunshine Network with David Steele (play-by-play) Nat Moore and Keith Jones (analysts), Steve Babik and Tom Block (sideline) will show the game at 8:30 a.m. on Sunday, Nov. 30 on Sunshine's "Breakfast with the Gators." The show will also air on Tuesday, Dec. 2, at 10:30 p.m.

THE GATOR RADIO NETWORK

Mick Hubert (play-by-play), Scot Brantley (color) and Steve Babik (sideline) will team to broadcast the contest. WFXJ radio (930-AM in Jacksonville) serves as UF's flagship station. The pre-game show begins two hours before kickoff. 90-minute show following the conclusion of the game.

DID YOU KNOW?

Since 1990, the Gators are 19-6 following a bye week. UF head coach Ron Zook is 2-1 following a bye week with a pair of wins over Georgia (20-13 in 2002 and 16-13 in 2003) and a 31-14 setback at Florida State a season ago.

A LOOK AT THE SERIES AND WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

FLORIDA VS. RANKED FSU TEAMS

■ This game will mark the 26th time in the history of the series Florida has faced a ranked Florida State squad. The Gators are 9-15-1 all-time in those contests, and 7-9-1 when Florida and Florida State are both ranked.

ESPN GAMEDAY

■ ESPN's College Gameday will be on site for the Florida-Florida State contest. Gameday has been on site to cover 19 Florida games, which is the most of any school in the history of the show. Its eight appearances in Gainesville also are the most appearances on a college campus.

CONNECTIONS

■ From 1981-1982 FSU Associate Head Coach and Defensive Coordinator Mickey Andrews was defensive backs coach at the University Of Florida. UF Assistant Head Coach/Inside Receivers Coach Dwayne Dixon was on the squad at the time as he was four-year letterwinner for the Gators (1980-1983).

■ FSU defensive ends coach Jody Allen was Receivers Coach at Ole Miss from 1987 until 1989, during which time UF Offensive Line and Running Game Coordinator Joe Wickline was the Rebel's Offensive Line coach. Allen was also Ole Miss' running backs coach in 1990, when UF defensive coordinator Charlie Strong coached the Rebel's Wide Receivers.

■ FSU Linebackers Coach Kevin Steele coached outside linebackers and tight ends at Oklahoma State University in 1986, which was UF Director of Strength and Conditioning Rob Glass' first year as a Football Graduate Assistant for the Cowboys.

SERIES NOTES

■ The first six contests in the series were held in Gainesville. Since 1964, the series has alternated between the two campuses, with Florida hosting in odd-numbered years and Florida State in even-numbered years. Florida State's first win in the series came in 1964, 16-7, in what was the first meeting between the two squads in Tallahassee.

■ Since 1979, this game has been the scheduled regular season finale for both universities. In the 1990s, this series went beyond the regular season as the two schools faced off in the Sugar Bowl in a rematch of the regular season twice (1994 and 1996 seasons).

■ Following the 1996 season at the 1997 Sugar Bowl the Gators downed the Seminoles, 52-20, in New Orleans to claim their first national championship. UF has defeated the Seminoles twice (1997 Sugar Bowl and 1997 regular season finale) in the last four meetings when Florida State was ranked number one in the nation.

■ Prior to the last few years, this series was marked by streaks for one school. Florida won nine straight from 1968-76. Florida State then won four consecutive games from 1977-80, Florida responded with six straight from 1981-86, and the Seminoles then put together a 6-1 record from 1987-93. FSU holds a 6-4-1 edge in the last 11 meetings.

■ Florida and Florida State are the only two schools in the nation to rank in the Top 15 in the final polls in 12 seasons since 1990. In addition, the two programs are the only in the country to appear in a January bowl game in each of the last 10 seasons.

THE TEAM

■ Florida has a 9-1 record vs. the SEC East during the last two years, the best divisional record in the conference during that time frame.

■ Florida's five-game winning streak is the longest in the Ron Zook era. Only eight teams in the nation have current win streaks of more than five games. Only six other teams have won more than five straight games in their conference.

■ Florida went undefeated in the SEC away from Gainesville for the eighth time in school history (1999, 1996, 1995, 1994, 1991, 1984 and 1960).

■ Forty-five players have seen their first action in a Gator uniform this fall. In all, Florida has used 90 different players. Last year, only 69 players saw action the entire year.

■ Fourteen true freshmen have played for Florida this season. This amount is tied for second with 2000 for the most number of true freshmen to ever play for Florida in a single season. The true freshmen that have played for the Gators this season are Richard Brown, Andre Caldwell, Joe Cohen,

GATORS IN THE RED ZONE

■ UF has scored 55 of its last 67 times in the red zone.

■ Opponents have scored TDs in just 36 of their last 56 trips inside the red zone.

■ There have been two times in the Ron Zook era that Florida has scored 20-or-more points in the red zone in back-to-back games and both those times it has happened in the Vanderbilt and South Carolina games. A season ago, UF scored 21 against each opponent. This year, UF scored 28 points against the Commodores and 24 against the Gamecocks.

■ At LSU, the Tiger offense did not enter the red zone. This is the second time this has happened in the Ron Zook era (San Jose State). There have been six times in the Zook era that an opposing team got into the red zone one or less times during a game.

■ Florida's red zone offense has scored 32 rushing touchdowns under Zook, more than any other fashion of scoring. UF has been picked off eight times in the area under Zook, which has halted 50 percent of the squad's missed opportunities.

■ Under Zook, the Gators have scored 35-of-39 times inside the red zone against non-conference opponents (89.7 percent).

■ Miami, Arkansas and Vanderbilt are the only programs to score more than one passing touchdown against the Gators under Ron Zook in the red zone.

■ Overall, seven freshmen have started games for the Gators this season, including five true freshmen. In addition to true freshmen Chris Leak, Channing Crowder, Steve Rissler, Earl Everett and Marcus Thomas, who started for the first time against Ole Miss, redshirt freshmen Gavin Dickey and Ray McDonald have also started games for UF this season.

■ Of the 52 freshmen on Florida's roster this year, 34 have seen action.

■ A school record 24 freshmen (true and redshirt) played in the season opener. The previous record of freshmen playing in a season opener was 19 in 1999.

■ 45 of 90 players on the dress roster against San Jose State in the season opener, including 33 scholarship student-athletes, had never played a down of college football.

■ Of the 70 players that dressed for the Miami game, 33 had never played in a road game before. Twenty-six of those Gators saw time against the Hurricanes.

■ Freshmen have accounted for 13 of UF's 42 touchdowns this season (30 percent). Three true freshmen have scored touchdowns (Chris Leak, Chad Jackson and Skyler Thornton). In addition, a freshman leads UF in passing (Chris Leak (1,894yards), kick returns (Andre Caldwell, 307) and punting (Eric Wilbur, 45.0 avg.).

■ Florida has continued to dominate the second quarter as they have outscored opponents 103-34 thus far in 2003. During the Ron Zook era Florida has outscored opponents 267-103 in the second quarter. Florida has outscored opponents 35-14 on the road in the second quarter this season.

■ Florida has not been scored on in the third quarter since the loss to Ole Miss. UF has not given up a touchdown in the quarter since the Kentucky game and has not allowed a passing touchdown in the period since the Miami game.

■ Florida has scored 100 points off turnovers through 11 games, while opponents have scored only 21 points.

■ Florida is one of only five schools in the nation to have multiple 60-point scoring games this year (Oklahoma, Boise State, Texas, Bowling Green).

■ This year, Florida has shown it can score points in bunches. The chart below ranks UF's unanswered points this year:

■ Earlier this season, Florida's 18-point come-from-behind win at Kentucky tied the largest deficit ever overcome by a Gator squad on the road in school history. The chart below shows other times UF has fought its way back to a victory from 17 or more points down:

■ In addition to Florida's record setting 18-point come-from-behind win at Kentucky, Florida trailed 7-0 against LSU, Arkansas and Vanderbilt and was down 16-7 at USC.

■ This season, six of Florida's 11 games have been decided in the final two minutes of the contest. UF defeated South Carolina, Georgia, Arkansas and Kentucky and lost to Ole Miss and Miami in the closing minutes of the contests.

A HISTORIC STRETCH

■ This season, Florida completed one of the most historic stretches in the history of the program. Head Coach Ron Zook became the first coach at UF to lead the Gators to three consecutive wins over ranked teams in three consecutive games. On Oct. 11, the Gators defeated then-No. 6 LSU, 19-7, in Baton Rouge before going on to hold on against then-No. 11 Arkansas, 33-28, in Fayetteville.

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS...

UF defeated Georgia for the 13th time in the last 14 years when Matt Leach connected on a 33-yard field goal in the final minute of the game to lift Florida to a 16-13 win over then-No. 4 Georgia.

■ UF's three consecutive wins over ranked teams in three consecutive games is something the Gators had never done until the season. However, Florida has been in position to do so 12 other times. Six times the Gators have won two of the three, two times Florida has won one of the three, once UF has won one, lost one and tied one and there have been three times UF has lost all three.

■ This period marks only the second time in UF history that the Gators have played three consecutive ranked opponents on the road. In 1997 UF faced No. 14 LSU on Oct. 11 and lost, 28-21, and then defeated No. 6 Auburn, 14-10, the following week before losing to No. 6 Georgia, 37-17, in Jacksonville after a bye week.

■ Head Coach Ron Zook is 5-1 (.800) against teams in the Top 11 away from home. Prior to Zook's arrival, Florida was 22-50-2 (.310) against such teams in games at road and neutral sites.

■ Florida's five wins over teams ranked in the Top 11 away from home since the beginning of the 2002 season is more than any other school in the nation:

THE OFFENSE

■ Florida ranks fourth in the SEC and 43rd nationally in passing offense as the Gators are averaging 238.1 yards per game. In addition, UF is fourth in the league and 44th in the country in total offense with an average of 361.7 yards a contest.

■ Florida is averaging 6.0 yards per play in 2003. Here is a look at the top 10 averages in school history:

■ This season, UF has averaged 5.3 big offensive plays per game (20-or-more yards). A season ago, the Gators averaged 4.6 per outing. This season, the Gators have had 17 runs of 20-or-more yards. In 2002, Florida had nine all season.

■ After scoring two touchdowns in 11 trips inside the red zone during a three game stretch (LSU, Arkansas and Georgia), UF has scored seven TDs in its last 10 trips inside the red zone and added a field goal.

■ The Florida offense only went three and out twice on 12 possessions against South Carolina. Those two three and outs came on the first and last drives of the game. The Gator offense was 3-of-6 on third down chances in the second half and were 3-of-5 on third downs of four yards or less.

■ At South Carolina, Florida had its longest drive of the season in terms of yards with a 90-yard march. The drive was accomplished on seven plays for an average of 12.8 yards per play.

QUARTERBACKS

■ At South Carolina, Chris Leak passed Rex Grossman's redshirt freshman total of 1,866 passing yards. Leak has 1,894 passing yards on the season along with 12 TD passes. Danny Wuerffel has the Florida freshman record with 2,230 yards passing in 1993.

■ At South Carolina, Chris Leak scored the second rushing touchdown of his career as he has rushed for a TD each of the past two weeks. Leak's nine-yard rushing touchdown against the Gamecocks was the longest by a Florida quarterback since Jesse Palmer had a 13-yard run against Kentucky in 2000.

■ Against the Gamecocks, Chris Leak had 12 completions and seven of those went for first downs while he also ran for two. Overall, Leak accounted for half of Florida's first downs (9-of-18). In the second half, Leak was 6-of-9 for 73 yards (12.2 yards per completion).

■ Born May 3, 1985, Florida's Chris Leak is an 18-year-old true freshman who has a 6-1 career

■ Chris Leak has all of the top five passing games by a true freshman starter at UF after only seven career starts.

■ Chris Leak's start at quarterback against South Carolina marked the 117th time a freshman has played the position for the Gators. Florida has used a freshman quarterback in 102 games. A freshman (true or redshirt) has now started 53 games for the Gators all-time. UF is 37-15-1 when its starting signal caller is a freshman.

■ Chris Leak is the only freshman (true or redshirt) quarterback in school history to defeat three ranked opponents in consecutive games, picking up three wins away from home against top 11 ranked teams (Kerwin Bell also defeated three ranked teams in 1984 as a redshirt freshman, however, the wins did not come in consecutive games).

■ Prior to the first three games of the 2003 season, the last time Florida used three quarterbacks in a game was against UL-Monroe, Sept. 8, 2001. Brock Berlin, Jeff Creveling and Rex Grossman each played in that game.

RUNNING BACKS

■ Florida's 243 rushing yards against South Carolina was the most against an SEC opponent in the Ron Zook era and the second highest total for the Gators in the time span (309 vs. Florida A&M). UF averaged 6.1 yards per rush against the Gamecocks, which is two yards higher than UF's average of 4.1 entering the game. The 243 rushing yards were the most against an SEC opponent since Florida ran for 308 yards against LSU in 1996.

■ Ciatrick Fason turned in a career-high performance with 190 rushing yards at South Carolina. He became the first Florida running back this season to have three or more rushes of 20-or-more yards in a single game with four of those runs of 20, 25, 30 and 40 yards and eight of Fason's 20 carries went for first downs. It was the most rushing yards for a Gator back since Errict Rhett had 196 against Auburn in 1993 and the 10th highest total in school history. Only Emmitt Smith and Neal Anderson have ran for more yards in a game before the completion of their sophomore seasons.

WHAT'S NEW WITH THE GATORS..

- In the first six games of the season, Ciatrick Fason had 93 yards and averaged 15.5 yards per game. Since then, Fason has ran for 452 yards, which is an average of 89.2 yards per outing. Fason has averaged 8.3 yards per carry in Florida's five-game winning streak.
- Seven different Gators have rushed for a touchdown this season, which is the most since the 1997 season.
- In the Arkansas game, Ciatrick Fason scored on a career-long 75-yard run, which was Florida's longest play from scrimmage since Emmitt Smith's 96-yard run against Mississippi State in 1988. Fason also had a pair of catches, including a 33-yard touchdown reception.
- Ciatrick Fason's career-long 75-yard touchdown run against Arkansas marked the third time this season a UF back has broke off a run of 60-yards or more (DeShawn Wynn, 65 yards, at Miami and Fason, 62 yards, at LSU). The last time three different Gators had a run of 60-yards-or-more in a season was in 1982. That year John L. Williams had an 86-yard carry against West Texas State, Lorenzo Hampton took one 76-yards in the same game. Three games later, Neal Anderson had a 63-yard run against Kentucky.
- Prior to the season, the UF coaching staff said one of the strengths of the team would be Florida's run game. A look at Florida's five backs shows the group has carried the ball 304 times for 1,746 yards and are averaging 5.7 yards per carry.
- The Gators are averaging 4.3 yards per carry this season. In 2002, UF averaged 3.8.
- Eleven games into the 2002 season, Florida's top two runners averaged better than 45.0 yards per game. This year, Ran Carthon, and DeShawn Wynn and Ciatrick Fason are averaging better than 48.9 yards per contest.
- This season, the Gators have rushed for 21 touchdowns. The Gators had 18 through 11 games last season. Florida went on to average 1.5 rushing touchdowns per game last season. This year, the Gators are averaging 1.9 per outing.
- Eleven games into the season Ran Carthon, DeShawn Wynn and Ciatrick Fason have had games in which they have scored multiple touchdowns. Last season, Earnest Graham was the only back to do so when he scored two touchdowns in a game on three occasions.
- DeShawn Wynn became the fourth back in Gator history to have a 100-yard rushing game by his second contest as a freshman. Tony Green and Emmitt Smith did so in the second games of their careers in 1974 and 1987, respectively. Earnest Graham did it in the first game of his freshman year (1999).
- DeShawn Wynn's 24 points scored against Florida A&M are the second most by any athlete at an SEC school in a single game this season. The total ties a school record for points by a single player in a game. He is the first freshman to score that many points in a game. He is also the seventh player in school history to achieve the feat. Wynn's 24 points is tied for the most scored in a single-game by a freshman this season.

WIDE RECEIVERS AND TIGHT ENDS

- Through ten games three UF receivers have caught 30-or-more passes (Ben Troupe and Kelvin Kight and O.J. Small), while Carlos Perez needs only six more to reach 30. There have been only three times in the history of the program that four-or-more receivers have had 30-or-more receptions in the same season (1993, 1994 and 2001).
- Of those on the Mackey Award List, which is presented to the nation's top tight end, Ben Troupe's 35 catches are the fifth highest total in the country. However, his 517 receiving yards are the second highest total among those listed. His receiving yard total is 27-yards more than Miami's Kellen Winslow despite having 13 less catches than the Hurricane TE. Only five tight ends on the watch list have 500- or-more receiving yards.
- Tight end Ben Troupe leads the Gators with 35 catches this season. He entered the year with 25 total catches in his career. Troupe has had a reception of 20-or-more yards in four straight games and has had a total of six over the span.
- Kelvin Kight, O.J. Small and Ben Troupe all caught at least one pass at South Carolina, while Kight had a team best four receptions for 52 yards. All three have caught a pass in every game this season while Kight and Small have made a reception in 17 straight contests dating back to last season.
- UF has spread the ball around plenty this season. Six times this year, UF has had eight-or-more

FRESHMAN NOTES

- Since the NCAA allowed true freshmen to begin play in 1972, the University of Florida has had 190 different student-athletes do so. In addition, 18 players have achieved All-America status as a true freshman with the Gators.
- The nine true freshmen who played against San Jose State were the second-most in school history in a season opener. The most was 12 in 2000.
- A school record 24 freshmen (true and redshirt) played in the season opener. The previous record of freshmen playing in a season opener was 19 in 1999.

players catch the ball in a game. UF is averaging 13.2 yards per catch this year after averaging 11.4 in 2002.

■ Carlos Perez leads the Gator receivers with four touchdowns. The total matches his production for the entire 2002 season. Against Kentucky, he had the second multiple TD game of his career. The first came at Ole Miss a season ago.

■ This season, Carlos Perez has 24 catches and four of those are for touchdowns. He leads all receivers with his 17.8 yards per reception.

■ Two true freshmen receivers (Andre Caldwell and Chad Jackson) have caught a total 19 passes for 190 yards and a touchdown. Andre Caldwell led the Gators against Miami with four catches for 29 yards. Caldwell's 16 catches ranks as the third highest total by a true freshman in school history:

■ With his 10-yard touchdown catch in the fourth quarter of the Kentucky game, Carlos Perez reached 1,000 career receiving yards. Perez's 11 touchdowns have come on only 95 catches, or one touchdown per every 8.6 receptions.

OFFENSIVE LINE

■ Against South Carolina, the starting offensive line was Max Starks at left tackle, Shannon Snell at left guard, Mike Degory at center, Lance Butler at right guard and Randy Hand at right tackle. This marked the fifth time this season UF used that lineup to start a game (Miami, Tennessee, Ole Miss and Vanderbilt).

■ After missing the LSU trip due to an abscessed tooth, Max Starks was back in as a starter against Arkansas and Georgia at right guard and he started the Vanderbilt and South Carolina games at left tackle. The LSU game was the first in his career that he did not play in snapping a string of 37 consecutive appearances. He was a backup in every game as a freshman in 2000.

■ Randy Hand has started 12 of the last 13 games at right tackle (all but the Tennessee game) after starting against South Carolina, Florida State and Michigan last year for the then-injured Jonathan Colon.

■ Shannon Snell has started every game this year for Florida at left guard, while Mike Degory has done the same at center. Snell and Max Starks have combined to start 66 games in the past three years. Furthermore, Max Starks, Shannon Snell and Mike Degory have a combined total 91 starts between them in their collegiate careers. Degory has started each of the first 24 games of his career.

■ Through 11 games, the UF defense is ahead of or tied with itself in nearly every major statistical category as compared to a season ago through 10 games:

■ South Carolina had just 132 yards passing and averaged less than five yards per attempt. After allowing 100 yards in the first quarter, Florida gave up just 231 yards in the final three quarters on 55 plays (4.2 yards per play). From South Carolina's final possession of the first quarter through late in the third quarter, the Gamecocks managed just 96 yards on 31 plays (3.10 per play).

■ USC had 12 possessions in the game and crossed the Florida 35-yard line just twice. Of the 12 possessions, nine lasted less than four minutes and seven lasted five plays or less.

■ South Carolina failed to convert on five straight third down conversion attempts in the second and third quarters.

UNIT NOTEBOOKS...

■ South Carolina had 199 yards rushing on 49 carries (4.06 avg.), but 19 of those carries went for 1-3 yards (19-37) and four went for zero or negative yards (4-minus-5).

■ Florida gave up 140 of South Carolina's yards on just eight plays. On the other 68 plays, South Carolina gained just 191 yards (2.81 per play).

■ In records dating back to 1952, UF has established the single season mark for interceptions returned for touchdowns with four this season. Overall, the Gator defense has scored five times this season marking the first time the unit has done so since 1996 when Florida returned four interceptions and two fumbles.

■ A season ago, the Gators had seven interceptions. UF has 20 interceptions through ten games this season. Florida's 20 interceptions this year are tied for the seventh highest total in school history (1981, 1994). UF's 20 interceptions rank as the third highest total in the country this season.

■ Through eleven games the Gators are +8 in turnover margin, which is the 19th best total in the country. UF finished the 2002 season -9 in the category. Florida's 30 takeaways lead the SEC and are tied for the seventh best total in the nation.

■ Florida has intercepted a pass in each of the eleven games this season. This is the longest streak since UF picked off at least one in 12 straight games. That streak started against Florida State on Nov. 20, 1999 and went through the first nine games of the 2000 season.

■ This season, the Florida defense has kept opponents without a touchdown in a half six times and twice this has happened against SEC foes (second half against LSU and the first half of the Georgia game).

■ Florida has not allowed a passing touchdown in five of the last seven games and against seven of eleven opponents this season.

■ The Gators returned seven interceptions for 187 yards a season ago. This year, the Gators have taken their 21 interceptions back 409 yards and Keiwan Ratliff has accounted for 182 of those yards.

■ The UF defense has not allowed five SEC quarterbacks who started against them to throw for a touchdown (Kentucky's Jared Lorenzen, Ole Miss' Eli Manning, LSU's Matt Mauck, Georgia's David Greene and South Carolina's Dondrial Pinkins). Manning has never thrown for a touchdown pass against the Gators and it was the first time in 10 games Mauck did not throw for a TD.

■ There have been three times this season the Florida defense has not allowed an opposing offense to score a touchdown. This has happened five times in the Head Coach Ron Zook era.

■ In ten of 11 games this season, the opponent's starting quarterback has thrown at least one interception. In eight of 11 games, the starting quarterback had had a lower efficiency rating against UF than their regular season rating.

■ The Florida defense has held opponents without an offensive touchdown in 26 of 44 quarters this season.

■ Between Ron Zook (eight), Charlie Strong (five) and Bill Miller (17), the Gator coaching staff has 30 years of experience at the defensive coordinator position.

LINEBACKERS

■ Florida opened the South Carolina game with two true freshmen linebackers for the second time in school history. Earlier this season, Earl Everett and Channing Crowder lined up at the position to open the Kentucky game as well.

■ Channing Crowder ranks first among freshman nationally in terms of tackles per game as he makes 10.2 stops per outing.

■ Channing Crowder, who underwent arthroscopic knee surgery on Oct. 1, missed only the Ole Miss game as he returned to play against LSU. Crowder finished the contest with seven tackles. He has led the defensive unit in tackles in each of the last four outings.

■ Channing Crowder started the South Carolina game, which marked the eighth of his career. The total is the highest for any true freshman linebacker in Florida history.

■ Of the LBs on the two-deep (Channing Crowder, Matt Farrior, Howard Lingard, Reid Fleming, Taurean Charles and Earl Everett) there were a combined 14 tackles in 2002 and no statistics in any other category. This group had five starts between them entering the year and 1,049 plays between

Miami native Carlos Alvarez returning home with the Gators to catch 15 catches for 237 yards in the game to lead UF to a 35-13 win. Today the 15 catches stand as the most ever by a Gator in a single game. Alvarez's 237 receiving yards were also a school record until Taylor Jacobs had 246 yards against UAB in the first game of Ron Zook's career.

In a driving rain storm and on a muddy field, Florida registered a comeback at Doak Campbell Stadium.

The victory was keyed by the fourth quarter heroics of the Kerwin Bell to Ricky Nattiel combination. Trailing 13-10 late in the fourth quarter, Bell and Nattiel took control of the game to lead UF to its third fourth-quarter come-from-behind win in four games. Nattiel concluded his career by hauling in an 18-yard touchdown pass to climax the comeback. FSU was nursing a 13-10 lead late in the fourth when kicker Derek Schmidt's 46-yard field goal was blocked by UF's Louis Oliver. Wayne Williams, the Gator's leading rusher, picked up 39 on the winning drive in which he had six carries. From the 18-yard line, Bell found Nattiel in the end zone for the winning score with 3:50 left in the game.

DEFENSIVE LINE

■ After having no sacks in the first three games of the season, Bobby McCray has recorded 8.5 in the last seven games he has played in. McCray needs half a sack to tie Mike Dupree (1978) for 10th on UF's single season chart. The school record, which was set by Alex Brown in 1999, is 13.

■ Bobby McCray and Ray McDonald lead the team with 8.5 and four sacks this year, respectively. Florida's leaders in the department a season ago (Clint Mitchell and Bobby McCray) finished the year with 2 1/3 sacks each.

■ Bobby McCray leads the team with 9.5 tackles for a loss. He is one of 22 different Gators to have recorded a tackle behind the line this season. Eighteen Gators had tackles for a loss eleven games into the year in 2002.

■ Bobby McCray's 8.5 sacks is tied for the highest total in the SEC along with Vanderbilt's Jovan Hays. McCray's total ranks 18th nationally. (as of 11/17/03).

■ Ray McDonald's eight tackles for loss and four quarterback sacks this season rank in a tie for fifth and sixth, respectively, among freshman nationally.

■ With his start against Ole Miss Marcus Thomas became the first true freshman to start on the defensive line since David Barnard and Johnnie Church did so in 1992.

SECONDARY

■ With an interception against South Carolina, Keiwan Ratliff added to his single-season record for interceptions with nine. He has intercepted at least one pass in each of the last five games and became the fourth player in school history to return two interceptions for a touchdown in the same year with his 52-yard run back in the closing minutes of the game against Vanderbilt.

■ Keiwan Ratliff's 12 career interceptions rank as the fifth highest total in school history (Fred Weary owns the school record with 15 between 1994-1997). Ratliff needs one more interception to enter the SEC single season chart. There are five players tied for second with 10 interceptions in a season, and Georgia's Terry Hoage established the single season mark with 12 in 1982.

■ Keiwan Ratliff's nine interceptions this season lead the SEC and rank as the second highest total in the country. He has 182 return yards this year, which rank as the fifth highest single season total in SEC history and the second highest total in the Florida record books (Joe Brodsky holds the SEC and school record with 244 yards on five interceptions returns in 1956).

■ Eight of Keiwan Ratliff's interceptions this season have come in the last five games (at LSU, at Arkansas, vs. Georgia, vs. Vanderbilt and at South Carolina). In his last five outings, Ratliff has surpassed his career total of four entering the LSU game.

■ With an interception in each of the last five games, Keiwan Ratliff is one away from Florida's school record for interceptions in consecutive games. Randy Talbot recorded six straight in 1974 against (Maryland, Mississippi State, LSU, Vanderbilt, Florida State and Duke).

■ Guss Scott's fumble recovery in the third quarter was his first of the season and the first for Scott since his two recoveries in his freshman year (2000). Scott ranks tied for 12th nationally with three forced fumbles this season.

■ Keiwan Ratliff tied a school record against Arkansas as he picked off three passes. Ratliff matched the efforts of Joe Brodsky (Mississippi State, 1956), John Clifford (NC State, 1970) and Will White (Alabama, 1990). With three interceptions, Ratliff became the 40th player in SEC history to have three or more interceptions in a single game (38 players have had three and Mississippi State's Jack Nix had four against Arkansas in 1939).

■ Three of Florida top four tacklers are from the secondary. Free safety Daryl Dixon leads the Gators with 101 stops to date. Strong safety Guss Scott is third with 79, while cornerback Johnny Lamar is fourth with 73.

■ The three senior starters (Daryl Dixon, Guss Scott and Keiwan Ratliff) have each played in 118 of a possible 118 games over their careers. Ratliff and Scott have played in 47 over the last four years, while Dixon's came during his first three years (1999, 2000, 2001) and a start the last eleven games.

SPECIAL TEAMS

■Andre Caldwell set two freshman records for kick returns in the South Carolina game. His 13 returns and 307 yards are both the best in school history for a freshman in a single season. Monty Duncan held the previous record of 12 kick returns in 1990 and Bo Carroll had 287 return yards in 1997. Caldwell had a 36-yard kickoff return at South Carolina. He has had a return of 20-or-more yards in seven of 11 games this season. Caldwell ranks fifth nationally among freshmen in kick return yardage.

■Keiwan Ratliff's blocked field goal at Kentucky marked the fourth kick the Gators have blocked this season. In 2002, UF finished the year with only four total blocks (field goals and punts).

■With 21 punt return yards at Arkansas, Keiwan Ratliff established a school record for punt return yards as he has returned 70 punts for 817 yards during his career. Ratliff passed Jacques Green who held the record with 766 yards. This season Keiwan Ratliff has returned 28 punts for 322 yards as he is averaging 11.5 yards per return. Ratliff returned 32 punts for 341 yards in 2002 for a 10.7 yard per return average. Ratliff's 322 punt return yards ranks as the sixth highest single season total in Florida history.

■This year, Florida is averaging 44.4 yards per punt. This ranks as the third highest total in school history:

■Eric Wilbur has had punts of 50-yards-or-more in nine of eleven games this year and has had 16 punts of 50-plus yards this season. Wilbur has had four punts of 60-or-more yards this season.

■Against LSU, Eric Wilbur averaged 50.7 yards per punt marking the third best single-game average in school history. Earlier this season against Tennessee, Wilbur averaged 50.8 yards per punt against the Vols, the second best single-game average. Each of Wilbur's first four punts traveled 50-yards-or -more.

■Florida's 11.7 yard average per punt return is fifth in the SEC and 27th in the nation. UF's Keiwan Ratliff ranks fifth in the SEC and 29th nationally as he averages 11.5 yards per punt return. UF's punt return average is 11.7 after 10.4 per return in 2002. UF has had 408 yards on 35 punt returns after eleven games. UF finished the 2002 season with 396 yards on 38 returns. Florida's 24.0 yards per kick return this season ranks as the 10th best in the country.

■Florida's Matt Leach has connected on 44 straight extra point attempts dating back to Nov. 2, 2002 against Georgia. UF went 8-of-8 against San Jose State, 3-of-3 vs. Miami, at Arkansas and at South Carolina, 9-of-9 against Florida A&M, 1-of-1 against Tennessee, Kentucky, LSU and Georgia, 2-of-2 against Ole Miss and 5-of-5 against Vanderbilt.

■Matt Leach has made 53 of 58 kicks this season (extra points and field goals). Leach has made 18 of his last 21 field goals from inside 40 yards.

■Matt Leach nailed a 50-yard field goal vs. LSU, the longest in his career. His previous best was a 48-yarder against Auburn in 2002. The last time a UF kicker connected on a field goal that was 50-yards or longer was when Jeff Chandler hit a 52-yarder against Tennessee on Dec. 1, 2000 against Tennessee. Leach's kick is tied for the sixth-longest in school history on the road (Robert McGinty at LSU, 1987).

■Eric Wilbur's 75-yard punt against Tennessee was the fourth longest in school history and best by a freshman. It was the longest punt for Florida since Shayne Edge boomed a 76-yarder against Vanderbilt in 1992.

ATTENDANCE NOTES

■The attendance for the game against Tennessee on Sept. 20, 2003 of 90,332 established a new school record and was the largest crowd ever to watch a football game in the state of Florida. The previous school record stood at 90,087 and was set against Florida A&M on Sept. 13, 2003.

■The attendance for the season opener against San Jose State (90,011) was the largest opening day crowd in Florida history. The previous record was 85,575 against UAB in last year's opener

■In 2002, the Gators sold all available season tickets (72,000). That figure continues to rank as the second highest in the state of Florida history for any team - collegiate or professional.

■The Gators have ranked among the nation's top 15 schools in average home attendance in each of the last 21 years (1982-2002) and ranked among the nation's top eight schools in each of the last 12 years (1991-2002). UF's average of 85,493 fans per home game in 1999 ranked as the best single-season mark in school history. UF averaged 85,432 in 2001 and 85,185 during the 2002 season.

■Florida has a current streak of 89 consecutive home sellouts dating back to the 1989 season. Here is where UF ranks nationally for current consecutive sellouts:

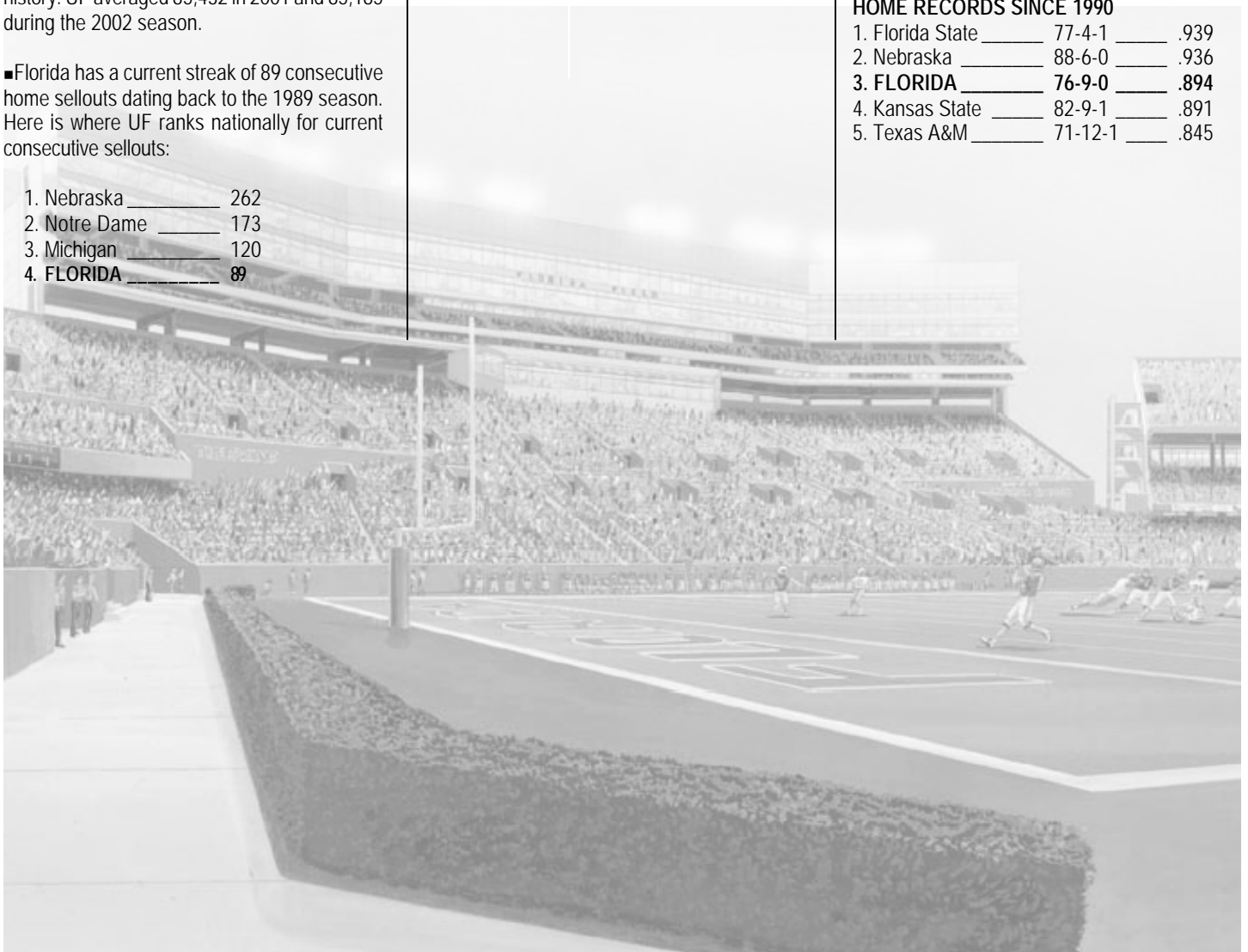

THE DREAM JOB

■ On the way to work early one morning this fall, Florida Athletic Director Jeremy Foley pulled up next to a car at a light. Since it was so early, Foley looked to see who was on the road that early in the car next to him. Inside, head coach Ron Zook sat shaving while waiting for the green light. Later in the day, Foley asked Zook about it, and Zook responded "it's an extra 10 minutes I can spend doing something else."

■ Zook has been known to time his ball boys, making sure practices moves fast. "He times them (the equipment managers). He wants the ball placed within 10 seconds of the play. If the ball's thrown 60 yards downfield, he wants that ball set and ready to go within 10 seconds after that play is over," said assistant coach Larry Fedora

ZOOK AND HIS PLAYERS

■ While an assistant at Tennessee from 1984-86, Zook once called a defensive backs meeting in the hotel room of one of his players, Charles Davis. When he realized he had forgotten to bring a pad of paper, Zook ripped off Davis' bedsheet and scrawled plays on them. "I went to bed with two- and three-deep coverages underneath me," Davis said.

■ As the Pittsburgh Steelers' Special Teams Coach from 1996-98, Zook and his unit had an interesting pregame ritual. Before each game, the players would surround Zook, work themselves into a frenzy and push him around like a pinball. According to former Steeler running back Fred McAfee, Zook didn't always emerge unscathed. "A couple of times, Zook got black eyes in there," McAfee said. "I don't even come to the kickoff huddle unless I have my chinstrap buckled up."

■ The UF players describe Zook as a players' coach. He's active, available and pays attention to what they're doing. "He expects a lot from us and he gives a lot of himself," RB Ran Carthon says. Zook has given his cell phone number to all the players—and he has all of theirs. He lifts weights with them, spends time in the lockerroom with them, eats in the dining hall with them. During two-a-days he stayed in the hotel with them.

ROOTS AND FAMILY

■ Zook grew up in the small town of Loudonville, Ohio. The town's population is a mere 3,000, and a canoe livery was its biggest industry.

■ As devoted as he is to football, Zook is still a family man. During his hectic first spring as Florida's head coach, Zook found the time to make a 90-mile drive from Daytona Beach to Jacksonville to watch his daughter, Casey, run the 100-meter hurdles in the district championships. Casey was ecstatic that her father would drive two hours for a 17-second race.

■ Zook's father, a traveling salesman, was over 400 miles away in Chicago at a trade show during senior night at Ron's final high school home football game. His father drove straight in from a meeting, wheeled into the parking lot just before kickoff and immediately left after the game to get back to Chicago in time for his Saturday appointments.

■ Zook started flying planes when he was 13 and had his first solo flight when he was 16.

■ Zook's grandfather, Peter, came to America from Russia. When he arrived at Ellis Island, immigration officials looked at his 26-letter last name and shortened it to simply Zook.

■ Zook's wife, Denise, tells about her husband's meticulous scrutiny of life on, and off, the football field. "When he's making a decision on anything, I don't care if it's insurance, buying a house, getting a loan, getting a dog, whatever, he's going to check out everything," says Denise. "You should ask the car salesman how he is about buying a car. It's hilarious. It's just how Ron is. Every single thing we buy has to be researched."

ZOOK AS A PLAYER

■ Zook's brother Bob would stand at the top of a hill behind their childhood home and roll an old tire down to Ron, who was standing at the bottom of the hill in shoulder pads and a helmet. Zook was small growing up but the drill taught him toughness. He either made a great stop or got knocked to the ground and afterwards he would get up and push the tire back up the hill and prepare for another shot. "It was a toughness drill, teaching me to run through things when I tackled. You had to hit it hard, because it was a moving object, and it'd roll right over you."

HEAD COACH RON ZOOK...

■ There was also a variation where the ball was tossed to 80-pound Ron, whose objective was to run through Bob and his 120-pound neighbor. "He either cried or bled," Bob Zook said. "Most of the time it was both." Ron wore glasses at the time and before long "there was more electrical tape on his glasses than there were glasses."

■ As a freshman, Zook became a star quarter back and defensive back at Loudonville HS, due to his drive and preparation for the game. "We had four touchdowns called back because he had faked the ball so well, and the officials blew the whistle. We're losing 14-6 to Ontario just before halftime, and we ran a belly play. Ron faked the ball to the fullback and handed it to the tailback. The ref blew the ball dead because he thought the fullback had it, but the tailback was in the end zone with it 52 yards away." Said John Burkhart, mayor of Loudonville and high school teammate.

■ As a member of the freshman basketball team, Zook's team was down 20-0 at the half vs. Fredricktown. After his coach walked out at half time, Zook took over and they ended up winning 43-42.

IN THE "CRADLE" OF COACHING

■ In perhaps the highlight of his college playing career, Zook's Miami took on Florida in the 1973 Tangerine Bowl. The game was played in Gainesville due to renovations to the stadium in Orlando, and Miami upset the Gators 16-7 in what was the first of three consecutive Tangerine Bowl victories. On the game's opening kickoff, Zook tackled Gator great and current Sunshine Network commentator Nat Moore to set the game's tone. According to ex-teammate John McVay, Zook had a great game and "must've made every tackle on the punt coverage and kick coverage."

■ While at Miami, Zook lived in Hepburn Hall with a group of men that went on to very successful athletic careers. Zook's fellow residents of Hepburn Hall included Northwestern football coach Randy Walker, former Ohio State basketball coach and current 76ers assistant Randy Ayers, Reds first base coach Billy Doran, current Georgia Tech baseball coach Danny Hall, former NFL running backs Rob Carpenter and Sherman Smith and former Braves pitcher Charlie Lebrandt.

THE ROAD TO FLORIDA

■ Zook first began teaching science and coaching at Orville (Ohio) High School in 1976-1977 in the hometown of college basketball legend Bobby Knight. Zook coached defense for head coach Mo Tipton, who initially placed him in the pressbox to see the field better. That lasted all of a half because Zook almost fell out three times. "They had to take him out because he almost fell out three times in the first half," Zook's brother Bob recalls. "They had to grab him so he wouldn't fall out."

FLORIDA AND THE NFL...

THE SEC LEADS THE NATION

■ The Southeastern Conference led the nation with 263 former players on 2003 National Football League opening day rosters. The Big Ten was second with 207 followed by the Pac-10 with 191, Big 12 with 187 and the Atlantic Coast Conference with 144. The SEC also had nine of its 12 schools rank in the top 40 among all NCAA institutions with former players on NFL opening day rosters.

GATORS AND THE 2003 NFL DRAFT

■ Rex Grossman's selection in the first round kept Florida's streak intact of having a first-round pick in each of the last seven years and 16 of the last 20. Florida's 26 first-round draft choices since 1983 is the second best total in the nation. Since the first NFL Draft in 1936, a Florida player has been selected in the first round 35 times covering 26 separate seasons, which ties Alabama for the fourth highest total in the country.

■ One of only two schools to have had at least one first-round draft selection in 17 of the last 21 drafts.

■ One of only two schools to have had multiple first-round draft selections in six of the past nine drafts.

■ Eight former members of the University of Florida football team were selected in the 2003 NFL Draft, which was held in New York City. The total tied for the highest from any school in the nation, while also tying for the third highest total in program history. In addition, for the first time since 1957 four Gators went to the same organization.

■ Set a NFL record for the most consecutive years (nine, 1983-91) represented in the first-round of the draft.

FLORIDA NFL NOTES

■ Florida had 40 players on 2003 NFL opening day rosters, which tied with Notre Dame for the most from any school in the country.

■ Florida's seven wide receivers on 2003 NFL rosters ranked as the top total in the nation for any school (Tennessee is second with five).

■ Florida's six offensive linemen in 2003 is tied for the third highest total in the nation (Notre Dame has nine, Willie Colorado, Boston College and Texas A&M all have seven).

■ Florida's eight defensive linemen in 2003 is the second highest total of any school in the nation. Tennessee leads the country with nine.

■ Florida has four QBs on NFL rosters in 2003, a total that was the second best in the nation (Washington is first with five).

Former Gator Emmitt Smith became the NFL's all-time leading rusher on Sunday, Oct. 27, 2002 with an 11-yard run against the Seattle Seahawks in Dallas. Smith surpassed the long-time record held by Walter Payton, who rushed for 16,726 yards in his 13-year.



On April 12, 2003 Florida fans got the opportunity to recognize one of their own as Emmitt Smith was honored at halftime of the 2003 Orange and Blue Spring game.

Smith was a three-time All-American at the University of

Florida from 1987-89. He established 58 school records in three seasons, including a career rushing mark of 3,928 yards. Following his junior season with the Gators, Smith was a first-round selection in the 1990 NFL Draft by the Dallas Cowboys. Smith finished the 2002 season with 17,162 career yards on 4,052 attempts, eclipsing Walter Payton's 18 year-old NFL rushing mark against Seattle on Oct. 27. On Wednesday, March 26, Smith agreed to terms with the Arizona Cardinals.

GAME ONE - SAN JOSE STATE

Senior running back Ran Carthon and junior wide receiver Kelvin Right scored two touchdowns each as the University of Florida football team opened its 2003 season with a 65-3 win against San Jose State University in front of a record-breaking 90,011 fans at the newly renovated Ben Hill Griffin Stadium at Florida Field.

After San Jose State scored the game's first points on a 46-yard field goal by Jeff Carr, the Gators reeled off 65 unanswered points to put the game out of reach. Starter Ingle Martin, true freshman Chris Leak and redshirt-freshman Gavin Dickey all took snaps and threw touchdowns for the Gators. Martin (14-24) and Leak (10-14) rotated throughout most of the game and combined for 307 passing yards. The defense, under new coordinator Charlie Strong, allowed only 185 yards and 11 first downs.

Florida's quarterbacks were successful on spreading the ball around as 11 different players caught passes. Wide receiver Kelvin Right led UF's receiving corps with six catches for 75 yards and two touchdowns. Florida kicker Matt Leach, perfect on the night, scored the Gators first six points and connected on a total of three field goals and eight extra points.

With the Gators leading 6-3, Jermaine McCollum blocked SJSU Bryce Partridge's punt. In the next play, Carthon scampered in on first down to put Florida up 13-3. After Martin led the Gators on a 71-yard scoring drive which culminated in a 21-yard touchdown strike to Right, Florida safety Guss Scott intercepted Spartans quarterback Scott Rislov at the 38 yard line and returned it for the score to put Florida up 27-3.

Florida took a 30-3 lead into the half, but did not let up, scoring 35 in the second half. Scott continued his stellar performance as he forced a Spartan fumble in the third quarter. Reid Fleming recovered the ball and set up Carthon's second rushing touchdown of the game.

Leak's first career touchdown came in the third quarter as he threw a screen pass to Right for a 16-yard score. In a bit of luck, Reggie Lewis recovered a DeShawn Wynn fumble and went 21 yards giving the Gators a 51-3 lead. Dickey (3-4) saw his first action as a Gator in the fourth quarter. After one interception, the redshirt freshman completed a pass to Chad Jackson for a 29-yard touchdown.

The final score of the game came when junior walk-on Tre Orr intercepted a Beau Pierce pass and returned it for 73 yards. The 90,011 in attendance at the game set a state of Florida record.

After building a 23-point lead midway through the third quarter, No. 18 Florida couldn't hold on as No. 3 Miami scored 28 unanswered points to escape with a 38-33 victory at the Orange Bowl before a crowd of 79,932.

The Hurricanes took their first lead since the early stages of the second quarter when Frank Gore scored on a 12-yard run with 1:44 remaining to propel Miami to a 38-33 advantage. The Gators had a chance to reclaim the lead as quarterback Chris Leak, who finished 9-for-15 with 93 yards, drove Florida into Miami territory before Hurricane cornerback Alfonso Marshall intercepted Leak at the Miami 14-yard line with 10 seconds remaining to seal the game.

DeShawn Wynn led the Gators offensively with 100 yards rushing on just eight carries, one of which went for 65 yards and a touchdown in the third quarter. Ingle Martin paced Florida with 114 yards through the air on 7-for-10 passing with one touchdown toss.

The Hurricanes took an early 7-0 lead when freshman Devin Hester ran the game's opening kickoff back 97 yards for a touchdown. The Gators responded when Matt Leach connected on a 26-yard field goal on Florida's first possession.

After a Miami field goal bumped the Hurricanes' lead back to seven, Florida tied the contest when Martin threw a 50-yard touchdown pass to Carlos Perez with 4:15 left in the first quarter. The Gators took the lead when Keiwan Ratliff returned a Miami fumble 34 yards for a score to give Florida a 16-10 lead with 11:36 remaining in the second. Leach then added his second field goal of the night from 30 yards with 11 seconds left in the half to give Florida a 19-10 advantage heading into the locker room.

On the first play from scrimmage in the third quarter, Wynn scampered around the right side for 65 yards and his first collegiate touchdown to extend the Gators' lead to 26-10. Johnny Lamar picked off Miami quarterback Brock Berlin to set up a Ran Carthon four-yard touchdown run up the middle to give Florida a 23-point lead at 33-10 with 9:20 left in the third. Miami then scored on its next four possessions to regain the lead.

Led by a powerful ground game, the University of Florida football team defeated Florida A&M 63-3 at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Five different Gator running backs scored a total of seven touchdowns and rushed for 309 yards.

Redshirt freshman DeShawn Wynn led Florida's running game with three rushing touchdowns and 95 yards. Wynn scored a fourth touchdown off an eight-yard pass from Ingle Martin in the second quarter. The four touchdowns by Wynn marks the first time in Gator history that a freshman has scored four times in a single game. Sophomore Ciattrick Fason turned in a solid game as well by rushing 11 times for 65 yards and a touchdown.

With Florida leading 14-3 on Wynn and Fason touchdowns, freshman quarterback Chris Leak found senior tight end Ben Troupe in the end zone at 7:56 of the second quarter for a seven-yard score. In the next Florida drive, after a Keiwan Ratliff interception, senior back Ran Carthon rushed up the middle for a four-yard score giving the Gators the 28-3 lead. Before the half the Wynn reception brought the score to 35-3 at intermission.

Florida tacked on 28 more points in the second half, while not allowing the Rattlers to score. Wynn's two additional rushing touchdowns came in the second half, along with a 50 yard rushing touchdown by Jimtavis Walker with 5:13 to go in the game. Skyler Thorton was the fifth back to score in the game on a rush of 21 yards.

Leak rotated with starter Ingle Martin throughout most of the game, with Gavin Dickey seeing action. Leak and Martin went 16-of-20 and combined to throw for 218 yards and two touchdowns. Kicker Matt Leach went 9-for-9 in PATs.

By not allowing a touchdown in the game, the Gator defense has not allowed a touchdown at home in eight quarters.

Despite controlling the entire first half, No. 17 Florida (2-2) had a few untimely lapses that No. 12 Tennessee (3-0) took advantage of to defeat the Gators 24-10 in front of a record crowd of 90,332 Saturday afternoon at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium.

Matt Leach's 47-yard field goal at 9:26 of the first quarter gave the Gators a 3-0 lead. Florida would hold that lead until the closing seconds of the first half when Casey Clausen connected with James Banks in the end zone on a 46-yard Hail Mary pass. The Gators defense appeared to break up the play in the right corner of the end zone, but the deflected pass fell into the hands of Banks to give the Volunteers' a 7-3 lead at the half.

Tennessee stretched its lead to seven when James Wilhoit took advantage of the stiff wind at his back to drill a 51-yard field goal at 9:27 of the third quarter to put the Vols up 10-3. Two drives later, Tennessee went up 17-3 as Clausen led the Volunteers on a seven-play, 80-yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard Jubari Davis score.

The Gators quickly responded, however, with a touchdown of their own. DeShawn Wynn scored on a five-yard run to end a 77-yard drive and bring the Gator within seven, 17-10.

But the Volunteers put the game out of reach when they drove 76 yards and took a 24-10 advantage off a nine-yard rush from Davis at 8:38 in the fourth quarter.

GAME FIVE - KENTUCKY

GAME SIX - OLE MISS

Ran Carthon's one-yard touchdown run with 3:15 remaining in the contest completed a Florida comeback as the No. 25 Gators, who trailed by 18 points in the fourth quarter, rebounded to claim a 24-21 victory against Kentucky on Saturday afternoon at Commonwealth Stadium before a crowd of 70,579. The 18-point deficit was the largest the Gators have overcome on the road in school history.

Florida's Chris Leak, just the fourth true freshman quarterback in school history to start a game, spearheaded the Gator offense by completing 20-of-35 passes for 268 yards with two touchdown passes. His yardage total was nearly three times more than the previous best by a true freshman quarterback making their first start. Wide receiver Carlos Perez also had a stellar day by hauling in five passes for 102 yards and two touchdowns.

The Wildcats (2-3 overall, 0-2 SEC), who have now lost 17 straight to the Gators (3-2, 1-1), amassed a 21-3 lead after Arliss Beach scored his third touchdown of the day on a two-yard run with 3:23 left in the third quarter.

Florida responded with its first touchdown of the afternoon when Leak led a nine-play, 83-yard drive, which culminated in a three-yard TD pass to Perez with 14:55 remaining in the game.

After the two teams traded possessions, Keiwan Ratliff gave the Gators their best field position of the day when he returned a punt 25 yards to the Kentucky 28-yard line with 6:11 remaining. On fourth and three from the Wildcat 10, Leak again found Perez in the end zone with 4:46 left in the contest. The extra point from kicker Matt Leach made the score 21-16 Kentucky.

On Kentucky's ensuing possession, Florida cornerback Johnny Lamar picked off Wildcat quarterback Jared Lorenzen and returned the ball 36 yards to the Kentucky 1. The interception was the eighth for the Gators this season after Florida intercepted seven in all of 2002. Carthon then scored the go-ahead touchdown two plays later with 3:15 left in the contest.

Kentucky then drove down to the Florida 31, but Wildcat kicker Taylor Begley missed a 49-yard field goal that would have tied the game with 44 seconds remaining.

Leach provided the only scoring in the first half for Florida when he connected on a 42-yard field goal to cut Kentucky's lead to 14-3 with 5:49 left in the second.

The previous largest come-from-behind win on the road for Florida came in 1993 when the Gators overcame a 17-point deficit to defeat South Carolina 37-26

No. 24 Florida (3-3, 1-2), unable to withstand a late Ole Miss (3-2, 2-0) comeback, was defeated by the Rebels 17-10 Saturday at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. An Eric Oliver interception at the Rebel's 33-yard line with less than two minutes remaining in the game stopped the final Gator drive and solidified the win for Ole Miss.

True freshman quarterback Chris Leak threw for 234 yards and 2 touchdowns. Tight end Ben Troupe and senior receiver O.J. Small led the Gators offense in the first half. Troupe caught four passes for 63 yards and one touchdown, while Small had 57 yards and a touchdown.

Trailing 3-0 in the first quarter, Leak engineered a 12-play, 74-yards scoring drive to give Florida a 7-3 lead. The athletic Ben Troupe pulled away from several Ole Miss defenders for the 18-yard touchdown reception with 5:57 left in the first.

Small's 5-yard diving touchdown reception in the back-left corner of the endzone gave Florida a 14-3 lead halfway through the second quarter. Small set up the score by hauling in a 50-yard reception from Leak two plays earlier.

Ronald McClendon broke away from several Gators on a draw play during Ole Miss' next drive and scampered 52 yards for the score to bring the Rebels within four, 14-10.

Junior kicker Matt Leach's 36-yards field goal with just more than a minute remaining in the first half allowed Florida to take a 17-10 lead into the locker room.

A 48-yard run by senior Ran Carthon, who finished the day with 108 yards, early in the third quarter brought the Gators to Ole Miss' 7-yard line and put them in position to extend their lead. Ole Miss pushed the Gators back to their 19, and Leach was unsuccessful on a 39-yard field goal attempt.

Eli Manning, who finished the game with 262 yards, drove the Rebels 78 yards to the Florida 19 before senior safety Guss Scott stripped the ball from receiver Mike Espy on Florida's 2-yard line. Junior safety Corey Bailey recovered the ball to temporarily preserve Florida's seven-point lead.

With three seconds left in the third, Manning's 59-yard pass completion to Bill Flowers set the Rebels up for Jonathan Nichols' 23-yard field goal to put Ole Miss within four, 17-13.

Ole Miss put together a four-minute, 8-play, 50-yard drive in the fourth that ended with Vashon Pearson rush up the middle for the 20-17 lead with 1:16 remaining in the game.

Florida returns to action when it travels to Baton Rouge, La., to take on the 6th ranked Louisiana State Tigers. Kick-off is at 3:30 p.m. ET and will be nationally televised on CBS.

The Florida defense held the LSU offense scoreless, while Chris Leak threw for 229 yards and two touchdowns as the Gators defeated No. 6 LSU, 19-7, before a crowd of 92,077 on Saturday at Tiger Stadium.

After allowing the Tigers (5-1 overall, 2-1 SEC) to score on an 80-yard punt return by Skyler Green early in the first quarter, the Gators (4-3, 2-2) shut down the LSU offense, allowing the Tigers just 287 yards of total offense on the afternoon.

Ciatrick Fason rushed for 92 yards on just seven carries and also hauled in a 35-yard touchdown pass in leading Florida to the victory.

After the Tigers jumped on the scoreboard first, the Gators answered when Ran Carthon capped a 13-play, 80-yard drive with a 22-yard touchdown reception from Leak to tie the game at 7-7 with 6:51 left in the first quarter. The touchdown was the first the LSU defense had allowed in the first half all season, while the number of plays and the length of the drive were season bests for Florida.

The Gators took the lead when Matt Leach booted a 29-yard field goal through the uprights with 3:17 left in the first to put the Gators on top 10-7.

Florida added three more points when Leach connected on a 50-yard field goal — the longest of his career — with 5:37 left in the second to give the Gators a 13-7 lead. The field goal was the sixth longest on the road in Gator history.

The Gators added an insurance touchdown when Fason scored on a 35-yard pass from Leak with 5:21 remaining in the third quarter to cap the scoring in the game and give Florida a 19-7 advantage.

The Tigers had chances to get back into the game, but the Florida defense forced three turnovers, including a pair of interceptions from LSU quarterback Matt Mauck. After the Tigers had driven into Florida territory late in the fourth quarter, Johnny Lamar forced a fumble from LSU's Devery Henderson with 2:20 left in the game. The Gators then ran out the clock to seal the victory.

Freshman Chris Leak threw for a career high 269 yards and senior Keiwan Ratliff intercepted three passes and returned one for a touchdown as Florida fended off a late rally by No. 11 Arkansas to defeat the Razorbacks, 33-28, before a crowd of 73,934 at Razorback Stadium.

Florida (5-3 overall, 3-2 Southeastern Conference) won its second straight contest on the road against a top 15 opponent after disposing of LSU last week and has won three of its last four games.

Arkansas (4-2,1-2) scored 21 fourth quarter points to make the game close late, but after the Razorbacks scored with 3:11 left to narrow the gap to 33-28, Florida recovered an onside kick and was able to run the clock out to seal the victory.

Less than two minutes later, Leach hit a 39-yard field goal to give Florida a 13-7 advantage at the half. The Gators then scored just 19 seconds into the third quarter when Fason broke off a 75-yard touchdown run.

DeShawn Wynn gave Florida a 26-7 lead when he scored on a 17-yard run with 2:30 left in the third before Ratliff capped the Gators' scoring when he returned an interception 44 yards for a touchdown with 8:46 left in the game to put Florida up 33-7 before Arkansas' failed comeback bid.

The No. 23 University of Florida football team (6-3, 4-2 SEC) extended its string of success against No. 4 Georgia (7-2, 4-2) with a 16-13 victory Saturday at Alltel Stadium in Jacksonville, Fla.

A Matt Leach field goal with 33 seconds in the game gave the Gators the victory. The Gators have won 13 of 14 meetings with the Bulldogs.

With the scored tied with 3:49 remaining in the game, the Gators put together a 10 play, 66-yard drive that was capped off with the Leach field goal. Consecutive passes of 15 and 21 yards to Carlos Perez and Ben Troupe put the Gators in Bulldogs territory and set up the score.

The No. 17 University of Florida football team won its fourth straight SEC game by defeating Vanderbilt 35-17 Saturday at Ben Hill Griffin Stadium. Ratliff returned the interception 52 yards for a touchdown, assuring the Gators a win in the Swamp.

Ciatrick Fason rushed for a career-high 190 yards, while No. 15 Florida used a 17-point third quarter to overcome an early deficit and defeat South Carolina for the 13th consecutive time by a score of 24-22 Saturday afternoon at Williams-Brice Stadium before a crowd of 81,523.

The Gators (8-3 overall, 6-2 Southeastern Conference) scored 10 points in a span of one minute late in the third quarter on a 20-yard field goal from Matt Leach and a 10-yard touchdown run by DeShawn Wynn to go ahead 24-16 before the defense stopped South Carolina (5-6, 2-6) on a two-point conversion attempt early in the fourth quarter and held the Gamecocks scoreless on two possessions preserve the victory.

Florida's defense held South Carolina to just 323 yards of total offense on 74 plays, including a mere 131 yards passing, en route to winning the Gators' fifth straight game. Florida also piled up 243 yards rushing -- the second most for Florida this season. Fason's 190 yards rank as the 10th-most in a game in Florida history, while he became the first Gator to hit the 190-yard mark since Errict Rhett ran for 193 in 1992 against Kentucky.

The Gamecocks took an early lead when Florida quarterback Chris Leak was sacked in the end zone on the Gators' opening possession of the game. South Carolina scored on the next possession on a one-yard run by Cory Boyd to give the Gamecocks a 9-0 lead with 5:18 left in the first quarter.

Florida narrowed the gap to 9-7 when Leak notched the second rushing touchdown of his career on a nine-yard run with 3:08 left in the second.

South Carolina answered when Chavez Donnings returned a punt 73 yards for a touchdown as time expired in the half to extend the Gamecocks' lead to 16-7 at the break.

Florida pulled within two on its opening possession of the second half as Leak found Ben Troupe on a seven-yard pass to cap an eight-play, 80-yard drive and bring the score to 16-14 with 10:53 remaining in the third.

Leach then connected on a 20-yard field goal with 2:01 left in the third to give Florida its first lead of the game. The Gators recovered a Donnings fumble on South Carolina's next possession before Wynn scored to bring Florida's advantage to 24-16.

The Gamecocks added a touchdown with 10:04 left in the fourth on a four-yard run by Dondrial Pinkins, but Florida's defense stopped Pinkins on the two-point conversion attempt and held South Carolina in check on its final two possessions of the game to preserve the victory.
