Did You Know...

- UCF is Florida's most frequent opponent in NCAA play, as the two teams have met in five previous brackets (2001, 2003, 2004, 2007 and 2008). Florida owns a 3-1-1 record versus the Knights in NCAA play.
 - A league-record eight Southeastern Conference teams received 2011 NCAA bids - Florida, Alabama, Auburn, Georgia, Kentucky, LSU, Tennessee and South Carolina. That number is second only to the nine berths awarded to Atlantic Coast Conference.
- Florida, Auburn, Georgia, and South Carolina all advance to NCAA Second Round play.
- A pair of UCF freshmen are sisters with a pair of Gators. Spayne Avant is the younger sister of Gator senior **Jazmyne Avant** and Madison Barney is the younger sister of red-shirt junior **McKenzie Barney**.

What's Happening?

No. 2 region seed Florida faces UCF (12-4-5, 6-2-3 C-USA) in NCAA Championship Second Round action Friday at 7 p.m. at the James G. Pressly Stadium. No. 3 region seed North Carolina faces Baylor at 4:30 p.m. in Friday's other NCAA Second Round match at Pressly Stadium.

UF is one of eight programs playing host to 2011 NCAA Second and Third Round action this weekend. Format for the NCAA Soccer Championship is altered this year as the field plays a 1-2-1-2 schedule over the course of the four week competition schedule instead of a 2-1-1-2 as in years past. 2011 first round action was played on 32 campus sites last weekend. NCAA Quarterfinal action will be held Nov. 25, 26 or 27 on four campus sites with the Women's College Cup set for Dec. 2 and 4 in Kennesaw, Ga.

In 2011, Florida is making its 15th NCAA appearance in the program's 17-year history and this is the Gators' ninth consecutive NCAA bid. Last year, Florida played host to NCAA First and Second Round action, defeating Mercer 3-0 and falling 4-2 in penalty kicks to Duke after playing to a scoreless tie.

Friday's match is the first meeting this season versus the Knights. The two teams last met in the opening weekend of the 2010 season, with **Tahnai Annis** providing two second-half goals in UF's 2-0 win in Orlando. All five of the UF-UCF matches in NCAA action have come at Pressly Stadium and this is the third consecutive NCAA Second Round meeting in that series (2007 and 2008).

Florida used goals off the heads of a pair of seniors to open 2011 NCAA play on Nov. 12 with a 3-0 win versus Florida Gulf Coast. Annis headed in goals in the 16th and 68th minutes for her eighth double goal match of her career and the third of 2011. Fellow senior **Lindsay Thompson** headed in the cross from Annis in the 80th minute for her fourth score of the season.

UCF is appearing in its fifth consecutive NCAA field, advancing to the second round each of the last five years. UCF leads all state schools with 16 overall NCAA berths. UCF used a goal in each half last Friday to take a 2-0 win over Florida International in NCAA Opening round play in Orlando. Junior Tishia Jewell pushed her team leading points total to 23 after scoring the first goal and assisting on redshirt freshman Emily Grider's second-half goal. Senior goalkeeper Aline Reis was credited with the assist on Jewell's goal Friday. Reis, a 2008 National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) second-team All-American, owns a 2011 goals against average of 0.77, which stands No. 40 in the nation. She also has nine shutouts, including seven in the last nine matches.

Florida is now 12-6 against teams in the 2011 tournament field, including Saturday's 2-0 win versus Florida Gulf Coast. The Gators have also registered wins against No. 3 region seed Texas A&M, Alabama (Oct. 9 and Nov. 4), Auburn (Oct. 7), Florida Gulf Coast, Florida International, Georgia (Sept. 23 and Nov. 2), Kansas, Kentucky and Miami. UF has losses versus No. 1 region seed Florida State, No. 2 region seed UCLA, Auburn (Nov. 6), LSU, South Carolina and Tennessee.

Florida placed four on 2011 All-Southeastern Conference teams, the league office announced on Oct. 31. A pair of Gator juniors are repeat selections for the 11-member All-SEC first team - midfielder **Erika Tymrak** and defender **Kathryn Williamson**. Senior outside back **Jazmyne Avant** and junior midfielder **Holly King** are All-SEC second team selections. Florida also placed a pair of midfielders on the 13-member SEC All-Freshman team - **Havana Solau** and **Annie Speese**. Three UF juniors appear on the SEC All-Tournament team - **Jo Dragotta**, King and Williamson.

[TopDrawer Soccer](#) posted its list of the top 20 players in the Southeastern Conference. Topping that list is Gator junior **Erika Tymrak**. She leads the Gators with 12 goals and 29 points. She is tied for third in the league in goals. Two other Gators appear on the list - junior All-American **Kathryn Williamson** (No. 6) and **McKenzie Barney** (No. 13).

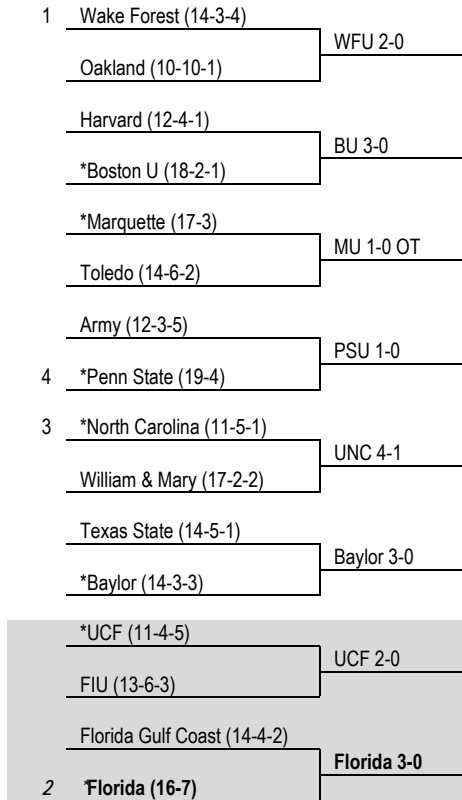

An Assist for the Keeper

Taylor Burke became the second goalkeeper in the 17-year of the Florida soccer program to earn an assist, which she earned in the opening round of the Southeastern Conference Tournament on Nov. 2. She sent the ball from the Florida half to **Lindsay Thompson**, who flicked it for **Tahnai Annis** to finish for UF's first goal in the Gators' 2-0 win over Georgia.

The first Gator goalkeeper to record an assist was **Brittini Goodwin**, which she did on two occasions. Goodwin turned in her first assist versus Vanderbilt in the 2003 season and her second versus Jacksonville on Sept. 10, 2006.

Florida Season Points Leaders

Florida's season scoring leader has traditionally been an upperclassman, with a senior leading UF in six of the program's 17 seasons. In 2011, **Erika Tymrak** leads UF with 12 goals and 31 points, making her the seventh junior overall to top UF's scoring.

At 5-1, senior **Tahnai Annis** is often the player of least stature on the field, but it doesn't impact her ability to score. Of her 37 career goals, which stands No. 6 on the Gators Career Goals list, 11 have come from headers. Most recently, she headed in both of her goals in the 3-0 win over Florida Gulf Coast in the NCAA Opening Round.

300 wins for Florida Soccer

The Gator soccer program earned its 300th win Nov. 12 in the NCAA Opening Round versus Florida Gulf Coast. The UF program, now in its 17th season, owns an all-time record of 300-79-26. The win total leads the Southeastern Conference as Vanderbilt is next with a 261-235-35 record in the program's 28-year history.

Assists Come in Pairs

Five Gators have turned in a pair of assists on six occasions this season. The most recent Gator to turn in a pair of assists is Florida season assist leader, freshman **Annie Speese**. She upped her season total to nine with her assists on the final two goals in Florida's 3-0 win versus Florida Gulf Coast in the NCAA Opening Round. Speese also had a pair of assists the first time UF faced FGCU on Sept. 11.

Others with a pair of assists in a match include **Erika Tymrak** (Aug. 19 at Miami), **Jo Dragotta** (Sept. 16 at Missouri), **Maggie Rodgers** (Sept. 18 at Kansas) and **Havana Solaun** (Oct. 2 versus Kentucky).

A goal in each half gave the No. 9 University of Florida soccer team (1-0-0, 0-0 Southeastern Conference) a 2-0 season-opening win Friday versus Miami (0-1-0, 0-0-0 Atlantic Coast Conference). The match was held at UM's Cobb Stadium in front of a crowd of 1,850.

It was the Gators' sixth shot on goal in the opening half that finally rewarded UF with its first score of the season. Sophomore **Taylor Travis**, who had earlier hit the crossbar on a shot, put the Gators on the scoreboard from eight yards out in the 37th minute.

It was Travis' second consecutive season with a goal in the season opener, as she provided the Gators with the golden winner in the 107th minute of the 2010 meeting with Miami.

Freshman **Havana Solaun**, a product of Gainesville's Buchholz High School, turned in her first collegiate goal to provide the second half scoring. Tymrak, from just above the top of the box, touched the ball to her left. Solaun's left-footed 16-yard shot ripped into the far post corner in the 51st minute.

Scoring for the Gators in her first outing wearing a Florida uniform made the match extra special for Solaun.

"We kind of built up from the back. Erika slid it across and I took a touch and a shot," Solaun said. "I was really excited. It felt really good to represent the Gators. I just wanted to do my best to represent the team well."

Nineteen players appeared in the match for Florida on Friday and Gator head coach **Becky Burleigh** liked that the level of play continued to be high when new players checked in.

"Our depth is going to be a big asset this season. I thought it made a big difference in the first half when we had the second wave of players come in. They not only kept the momentum going, but lifted it a little bit. That is what we expect from those players because there is so much parity on this team"

Senior **Brooke Chancey** recorded five saves Friday, including a point-blank stop on Shannon Caspar's shot in the 65th minute. Vikki Alonzo turned in nine saves in goal for the Hurricanes.

The No. 9 University of Florida soccer team (2-0-0, 0-0 Southeastern Conference) finished its opening weekend of play with a 2-0 win Sunday evening at Florida International (0-2-0, 0-0-0 Sun Belt Conference).

It was the exact same score as Friday's season opening win at Miami, where the Gators also scored in each half off of a goal from a freshman and a returner.

Jazmyne Avant's cross into the box in the 40th minute led to the Gators' first goal. The cross found three Gators moving toward the goal and the ball deflected around the box. It was freshman **Tessa Andujar** who placed it past the keeper for her first goal as a Gator.

"I was happy when I scored and I was really happy to help the team. To get in there and score a goal was really exciting," said Andujar. "The ball was getting pinged everywhere. I saw it and just turned. It was reactionary – I just turned and shot it."

She joins fellow freshman **Havana Solaun** as first-time goal scorers this weekend, as Solaun provided UF with its second-half goal Friday at Miami.

The Gators continued pressing the FIU goal in the second half and were finally rewarded in the 63rd minute. At the top of the box, freshman **Annie Speese** slid the ball to her right and **Tahnai Annis** placed the ball into the far post corner from 12 yards

Annis said her original thought was to play the ball to a teammate also in the box, but the opportunity became hers.

"We were running up the backline and Annie was running with the ball. There were a few people making runs at the backline I kind of pulled up and Annie found me in the seams there," Annis said. "Actually, I was trying to play a one-two with **Taylor (Travis)** because she was in front of me. But when I played the ball in, the defender actually ran into the ball and it came back to my feet. From there, I had a straight look at the goal so I just kept going with it and put it in."

With the goal, Annis moved into sixth on the Gators Career Points Chart, as the goal moved her past All-American Erin Baxter (1995-98) on the chart. She now owns 72 points off of 29 goals and 14 assists.

Freshman **Taylor Burke** made her first start in goal, recording three saves. Among her saves Sunday was a diving save to her left to deny a hard shot off a corner kick in the 85th minute. Kaitlyn Savage had five saves in goal for the Golden Panthers.

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** liked, and didn't like, some of the Gators' stretches of play Sunday.

"It was what we expected. Sunday games are never easy and on the road kind of doubles that," Burleigh said. "I thought we had some good stretches of possession and dictating what we wanted to do, but probably too many stretches of us just being a little bit sloppy. But you know it's early in the season so we'll work on it this week before we play again."

A goal with just 15 seconds remaining in regulation gave the No. 8 University of Florida soccer team (3-0-0, 0-0 SEC) a 3-2 win over No. 18 Texas A&M (1-2-0, 0-0-0 Big 12) Friday evening in the opening round of play at the First Tennessee Lady Vol Classic held at the Regal Soccer Stadium.

The game-winning goal by junior **McKenzie Barney** came after some key decisions and plays by her teammates when they were deep in the Aggie final third.

"We just capitalized on an amazing opportunity. My goal started because **Erika Tymrak** switched an awesome ball over to **Jazmyne (Avant)**. Jazmyne beat her defender with that speed that everyone knows Jazmyne has. She played a great ball. I told her it is impossible to miss a ball like that. She literally put it on my feet – I could choose which foot I wanted to play it with. **Jo (Dragotta)** was in the box pulling defenders off of me," Barney said. "It was an awesome ball."

The Gators didn't always execute the style of play they wanted Friday, but Barney liked the way the team found a way to get the win.

"At the end of the day, we walk out of here with a "W" versus a team we really respect. Texas A&M is a great athletic team," she said. "It might not have been the way we like to play, but sometimes you just have to find a way."

The goal was the only one of the second half after both teams scored a pair in the opening 45 minutes. The Gators struck first in the 25th minute. Tymrak started the play by using a spin move to create the space and time she needed.

"**Holly (King)** had the ball in the middle and she passed it to me. I saw the defender coming so I knew that if I moved toward the goal, I'd run right into her so I kind of stepped on the ball to spin around her. I looked up and saw **Havana (Solaun)** wide open so I passed it to her. I continued my run and got it back inside the 18. I saw that the keeper was near post so I just slide it far post," Tymrak said. "It was exciting to get my first goal (of the season)."

The Aggies scored the next two goals. An Aggie free kick from deep in the Gator box was crossed by Merritt Mathias and freshman Annie Kunz scored off a volley from 10 yards in the 30th minute. Six minutes later, freshman Kelly Monogue took advantage of a Gator turnover in their defensive third. Monogue brought the ball up the middle and scored from top of the box.

Florida knotted the score in the 39th minute. Senior **Lindsay Thompson**, who just entered the match in the previous minute, crossed the ball from the right and sophomore **Taylor Travis** headed it from 12 yards to the far post for her second goal of season.

"I believe Havana passed the ball down the line to LT who made an amazing cross. It was such a good cross I have to give the credit to her. I just got my head on it and it went in," Travis said. "Let's just say I was excited (to score that goal)."

Both teams had their chances to get a second-half go-ahead goal. In the 52nd minute, Gator defenders **Kathryn Williamson** and Avant both cleared balls off the line in the scrum following an Aggie corner kick. Just four minutes later, an Aggie defender cleared out a Tymrak shot when the keeper was off her line. TAMU's Katie Hamilton tried to take advantage of a Gator turnover in the 71st minute, but her shot hit the post.

In the final 10 minutes, Dragotta had a part in a pair of near misses before playing a part in the game-winning goal. In the 81st minute, Dragotta got open in the box, but her shot was blocked by a defender. With just a couple of minutes left, Dragotta crossed the ball into the box, but Barney just missed getting her foot on it before the keeper snuffed the play.

Senior **Brooke Chancey** made her second start of the season, recording three saves. Jordan Day also had three saves in goal for the Aggies.

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** thought the Gators got away from their game plan, which will be something the team will need to work on as the season progresses.

"I thought the goals were all spectacular – all three of them. They were highlight reel goals," Burleigh said. "I thought we got away from our style of play a little bit and from that standpoint we've got to be more disciplined. We need to have more trust in each other that we can play the way we want to play and get results."

Gator junior **Erika Tymrak** played a part in each goal Friday, as Florida (4-1, 0-0 SEC) opened the home season Friday with a 3-0 win over Texas Tech (3-2, 0-0 Big 12).

A large and enthusiastic crowd welcomed the No. 13 Gators home after a program-record four-match season opening road stretch. The crowd of 3,728 – the fifth largest in school history - also were on hand to celebrate Gator Greats and U.S. World Cup team members [Heather Mitts](#) and [Abby Wambach](#). The pair was cheered boisterously when announced at halftime and then they signed autographs post-match.

After some near misses, Florida got on the board in the 33rd minute. Freshman **Tessa Andujar** was near the top of the box and played a square ball out to Tymrak making a move down the right side. Tymrak took a couple of touches before scoring off a 17-yard shot to the far post.

"We try to work on give-and-gos in practice a lot, so Tessa held it up perfectly and gave it right back," Tymrak said. "I just saw the opening in the left corner and nailed it."

Florida scored its final two goals in an 11-minute span of the second half. The first started when the Red Raiders turned the ball over in the center of the field. **Holly King** took the ball and sent it forward to Tymrak. From there, Tymrak made a move down the field en route to her third assist of the season and second on a **Taylor Travis** goal.

"Erika got the ball. She picked up her head, and she has been working for us all night so I just wanted to put in some work in for her. I sprinted around and got the overlap. Then she played me an amazing ball... and I smacked the heck out of it!" Travis said. "There are two types of shots- you can either tuck it away or you can just hit it. Tonight I was thinking about tucking it away and I then decided "I'm just going to go for it and I hit it". I knew where I wanted to hit it and that's where it went in."

For Travis, it was her third goal of the season – and third consecutive Friday evening with a goal.

Tymrak finished her scoring in the 67th minute, finishing the cross set up by an impressive flash of speed by senior **Jazmyne Avant**.

"Jazmyne is fast as heck. She got down the line, crossed it and **McKenzie (Barney)** was there near post, and **Annie (Speese)** was slot, so we had the whole box engrouped how it's supposed to be. I was far post and got the end of it," Tymrak said. "It was a great cross by Jazmyne."

It was the second double-goal match for Tymrak as a Gator. Her first came in last season's 2-1 overtime win over Georgia.

Freshman **Taylor Burke** turned in three saves Friday in her second start. She was aided in the 37th minute by junior All-American **Kathryn Williamson**, who cleared a Red Raider shot by Taylor Lytle off the line to help Florida to its third shutout of the season. TTU's Victoria Esson posted five saves Friday.

A stolen look at the crowd before the team came out to the field had Florida excited play in front of their fans.

"There are no better fans than Gator fans. Honestly, it's an amazing feeling to have all them out here. I hope we can have this big of a crowd again. It pumps us up so much," Travis said. "We took a peek outside the door at the locker room and it was just huge today. It makes the whole team want to play better!"

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** thought the team has some things to work on before their next match. "We weren't as sharp as I'd like to see us. I'm happy with the shutout, I'm happy to get three goals, but I just don't think we were that sharp," Burleigh said. "I think we took our foot off the gas a little bit."

The No. 5 Florida State soccer team (6-1, 0-0 ACC) saw the Gators tie the match twice Friday, but in the end, the Seminoles took the 3-2 win over No. 9 Florida (4-2, 0-0 SEC).

It was exactly what was expected for a match featuring two top-10 teams. A big crowd was on hand to witness a tense contest between the intrastate rivals.

The crowd, the intensity and the play of both teams gave Friday's match a play-off feel, UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** said.

"I thought that was an unbelievably great game. It was a great game from both sides, awesome crowd, the whole thing. The whole environment - it felt like a playoff game," Burleigh said. "It was a really fun game to be a part of besides the result."

Meetings between these two teams now make up three of the top four crowds all-time in the 17-year history of Gator soccer. Tonight's crowd of 4,671 at the James G. Pressly Stadium is only behind the 1998 crowd of 5,222 for the Florida-North Carolina meeting and the 4,745 crowd which watched the 1999 season opener between these same two programs.

Florida fell behind early when freshman Dagny Brynjarsdottir hit an 18-yard shot at 3:34. It was the earliest goal the Gators have given up this season. The last time UF allowed a goal in the first 10 minutes was the 2008 opener at Colorado.

Burleigh thought the Gators didn't adjust quickly enough to the pace the Seminoles opened the match with.

"I think we did not adjust quickly enough to the tempo of the game. It was a very high, fast-paced game, and it took us a little while to get into our rhythm from that. Once we did, it became a much more even game," Burleigh said. "It was back and forth after that. I think the lesson we learned from that was to come out ready to play at that speed and that tempo, and not take a half to get into it."

The final minute of the opening half yielded the first Gator goal. **Erika Tymrak**, the reigning Southeastern Conference Offensive Player of the Week, knotted the score with just 22 second left in the first half. She received the ball off a short corner and brought the ball into the box. Tymrak tried to send the ball forward with the ball momentarily bouncing off a pair of FSU defenders. She continued with another touch before scoring on the 10-yard shot.

"It was off a corner kick. It was a short corner to me and I dribbled into the box. I tried to pass and it was a bad pass and the ball bounced back to me. Holly (King) was in the way of the keeper so I sort of just scooted it in," Tymrak said.

The Seminoles knotted the score when Tiffany McCarty scored her first goal of the match from six yards off the assists from Tori Huster and Jessica Price in the 55th minute.

The first goal of the season for **Holly King** tied the match at 2-all in the 68th minute. **Annie Speese** sent the corner kick into the box. **Lindsay Thompson** was at the near post corner and allowed the ball to roll through. FSU's Kelsey Wys got her hand on the ball but it bounced just in front of the goal line. King crashed the goal line, hitting the ball with her left hip before getting it across with her right foot.

"Annie Speese hit it left-footed (off the corner). Lindsay Thompson was sitting on the X inside the six. She pretty much dummied it and let it through her legs," King said. "I thought it was too late, but the keeper bobbed it and I just volleyed it in."

The game-winning goal again came from McCarty. The Seminoles sent a ball forward to the Gator half. McCarty received the ball and moved toward the box before touching it left to Brynjarsdottir. She sent it back to McCarty, who was entering the box. McCarty scored her second goal of the match and her team leading sixth goal of the season from six yards in the 72nd minute.

King knows the Gators can take plenty of lessons from tonight's match.

"I think it's going to be a good learning experience, bottom line. We gave it our all, but it's not good enough, so next week when we go through practice, we'll fix the things we need to work on," King said. "Obviously, it's still a learning experience."

Five different Gators scored Sunday, as the No. 9 Florida soccer team (5-2, 0-0 SEC) posted a 5-0 win over Florida Gulf Coast University (5-3, 0-0 Atlantic Sun) in the first-ever meeting between the two teams.

In Florida's last outing on Friday, the Gators lost 3-2 to No. 5 Florida State. UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** wanted to see how the Gators would come out today after Friday's battle.

"The big question in this game was going to be, "How do we bounce back after such an emotional game like Friday?" and I thought that we responded really well," Burleigh said. "To come out with four goals in the first half, and to dominate the way we did, was a really good testament to the leadership on our team."

The four goals in the opening half were the most for the Gators since its 7-1 win versus Mississippi State on Oct. 1, 2010, when UF also scored four in the first 45 minutes.

A pair of freshmen paired up for Florida's first goal. The play started when **Kathryn Williamson** continued her run through the middle of the field and received the ball as she moved by the midfield circle. Williamson sent the ball to **Jillian Graff** who was running down the left sideline. Graff took the ball to the end line, sending it to **Tessa Andujar** at the corner of the box. Andujar moved across the top of the box before sending a right-footed shot into the net at 7:32.

"I saw Jillian going down line so I dropped back and she gave me a great ball," Andujar said. "I just saw the opening to shoot and I did. It was lucky that it went in."

A give-and-go resulted in **Erika Tymrak** scoring her team-leading fifth goal of the season in the 16th minute. Tymrak received the ball off a throw-in and moved from the right sideline to just above the box, sending the ball to **Tahnai Annis**. Annis sent a square ball immediately back to Tymrak. As Tymrak crossed the top of the box, she took one touch and sent the ball into the goal from 10 yards.

Freshman **Lauren Silver** notched her first Gator goal in the 24th minute. Tymrak, located in the middle of the Eagle half, sent the ball left to **Annie Speese**. She immediately passed the ball to Silver who was just above the FGCU box. Silver took a touch down the side of the box before launching a curving shot which scored at the far post upper corner.

Florida's final goal of the opening half started with Speese bringing the ball through the center of the Eagle half. She sent the ball forward to **Taylor Travis** at the top of the goal. Both **Carolyn Triglia** and Speese made runs into the top of the box and the square ball played by Travis found the foot of Triglia. She placed a hard, left-footed shot into the upper far corner for her second collegiate goal and first of 2011.

The second half score came when freshman **Kim Sapienza** broke up an Eagle throw-in at midfield. She sent the ball forward to Speese moving through the upper section of the Eagle half. Speese one-touched the ball, which rolled down the center of the box where **Lindsay Thompson** was able to fend off a pair of Eagle defenders to score from 10 yards in the 58th minute.

Speese tallied three assists on the day, which on Florida's Individual Match Records is behind the four assists posted by Christine Brady in 1997 and Lisa Olinsky in 1996. Speese is the first freshman to turn in three assists in a match since **Karyn Hall** versus Mississippi in 1998.

The two teams had played two similar opponents already this season, with Florida posting 2-0 wins at Miami and at FIU in the opening weekend. The Eagles scored three straight goals Friday to defeat FIU 3-2 and lost 2-1 2OT to Miami on Tuesday. With those results, Burleigh knew the Gators could be challenged by the Eagles.

"I think we just wanted to see what the game was going to bring us. Gulf Coast has played a lot of teams really tough. They played Miami, they played FIU, and this is their third game of the week, so we knew we could take advantage of that," Burleigh said. "I still think our team did a good job of getting after it early and

"It was a high pressure, very high-paced game and our team at times did some good things to take away that high pressure ability with our passing game."

Two freshmen started in goal Friday. Taylor Burke recorded two saves Friday in goal for the Gators. Missouri's McKenzie Sauerwein turned in six saves.

The Gators got on the board early, just one tick over eight minutes in. A goal by **Erika Tymrak** was all the No. 6 Florida soccer team (8-2, 1-0 SEC) needed as the Gators opened Southeastern Conference play Friday with a 1-0 win over Georgia (6-3, 0-1 SEC) in front of a season-high crowd of 2,337 at the Turner Soccer Complex. The loss snapped a five-match win streak for the Bulldogs.

Florida dominated play for much of the match, but it wasn't until the 70th minute before the Gators could get on the scoreboard. A Georgia goal kick was won by sophomore **Taylor Travis** and she played the ball to Tymrak. She brought the ball diagonally through the UGA side, launching a shot which scored at the near post corner.

"Georgia had a goal kick. It headed out and **Taylor Travis** won it. She had two defenders on her and she still won it," Tymrak said admiringly. "I kind of went forward and touched it past a defender. I was basically one-on-one and I cut it in. I saw the keeper go far so I slotted it near post."

Tymrak, who re-entered the match in the 69th minute, was given a reminder from UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** just before she went entered the field.

"Just before she went in, I reminded her of what was written on the white board at our practice field from (past UF All-Americans) Abby (Wambach) and Heather (Mitts). It says 'It only takes one good chance,'" Burleigh said. "And soon as she went in, she stuck her one good chance."

The goal pushed Tymrak's team-leading season goals total to seven.

The Bulldogs had some good looks at the goal in the match, but probably none as dangerous as the 35-yard shot by Jenna Owens in the final minute of regulation. UF freshman goalkeeper **Taylor Burke** showed the ups she possesses as the nation's top prep high jumper, leaping to get a hand on the ball and pushing it up to clip the crossbar. The ball came down in the field of play where she was able to pick it up to end the tying threat.

"I saw it coming and told myself to be calm. I was able to get a hand on it and then the ball hit the crossbar. I wasn't sure if it went out for a corner, but then I saw it come down so I was able to pick it up," Burke said. "I was just happy that I could help the team."

Burleigh thought it was key save.

"Taylor came through with a big save," Burleigh said. "That was Taylor's athleticism coming through."

Possession was held by the Gators for much of the match, as Georgia put numbers behind the ball. Burleigh was glad to open league play with a win.

"I think the fact that Georgia came out and low-pressured us was a big compliment to our team. It showed a lot of respect to us. Georgia played hard and were very organized behind the ball," Burleigh said. "We were happy to come out with the 1-0 win."

A second-half comeback fell short as the No. 6 Florida soccer team (8-3, 1-1 SEC) lost 4-2 at No. 12 Tennessee (8-2, 1-1 SEC) Sunday afternoon in front of a crowd of 1,480 at the Regal Soccer Complex.

The first shot of the match resulted in a Lady Vol goal. Alexis Owens pounced on a misplay of a back pass to Gator goalkeeper **Taylor Burke** on the left side of the box. Her 10-yard shot scored at the far post corner at 4:05. The Lady Vols extended their lead in the 23rd minute when the Gators turned the ball over in the midfield. Caroline Brown's ball hit Emily Dowd in stride as Dowd broke past the Gator back line in a 3-on-2 breakaway. She scored her sixth goal of the season from 12 yard to give UT a 2-0 lead. Owens added her second goal of the half in the 36th minute when she took a wide pass on top of the left corner of the penalty box. She beat her defenders to score at near top corner of goal from six yards.

A penalty kick put the Gators on the board early in the second half. Freshman **Jillian Graff** was fouled by UT's Kylie Bono and the Gators were awarded their second penalty kick of the season in the 47th minute. **Erika Tymrak** successfully converted the PK to push her team-leading goals total to eight.

The Gators narrowed the lead to a single goal in the 65th minute. **Jo Dragotta's** long pass through the middle was misplayed by a UT defender in the box, leaving freshman **Havana Solaun** in a 1 v 1 situation with UT goalkeeper Julie Eckel. The goalkeeper beat Solaun to the ball and attempted a fist clearance 10 yards from goal. The ball hits Solaun in the thigh and went into the empty net.

The final score of the match came when Owens took a long pass from Brown and streaked up the left side. At the six, Owens slotted it past the diving keeper and a sliding defender to earn her first collegiate hat-trick in the 86th minute.

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** thought the Gators' early mistakes gave the team a lot to overcome.

"We just dug a deep hole for ourselves early on our own mistakes," Burleigh said. "We did a good job of recovering from that in the second half but it wasn't enough. As far as the fourth goal, we were chasing the win. I don't care if the final is 3-2 or 4-2 – that goal is inconsequential."

The Gators showed some sparks in the second half, but there wasn't enough to close the gap.

"It wasn't enough of a comeback," Burleigh said. "We have to use that energy that we came back with and some composure. We had the energy and at times, the composure, but not quite enough.

"I give credit to Tennessee for having six shots and scoring four goals," Burleigh continued. "That is efficiency in finishing."

Two opening half goals gave the No. 12 Florida soccer team (9-3, 2-1 SEC) a 2-0 win over Vanderbilt (6-5, 0-3 SEC) Friday evening in front of a James G. Pressly crowd of 2,541.

Both of Florida's first half goals came off play following a corner kick. A pair of fortunate deflections led to **Erika Tymrak's** goal in the 23rd minute. The Gators won a corner kick after a centering pass from **Jazmyne Avant** was cleared out the end line by a VU defender. Sophomore **Maggie Rodgers** received the corner kick and brought the ball down the right side of the box. Her centering pass clipped the heels of a Vanderbilt defender and kicked to the feet of Tymrak at the top of the box. Tymrak took a touch forward and her shot clipped the inside of the near post and flew to the upper far corner.

"That was an awesome ball by (Maggie)," Tymrak said. "I just looked up and I kind of had space. I took a touch and then ripped it and it went in."

The goal pushed Tymrak's team-high season goals total to nine, with all the goals coming in UF's last 10 matches. Six of the goals have come from ranges of 10-18 yards and Tymrak spoke about her options are in that area.

"I like taking little touches. Sometimes we call it the garbage area. I may just need to clean it up, so if the ball goes there, I like to take a quick touch, slip somebody the ball or shoot it," Tymrak said. "It's been pretty successful."

The second goal started when Tymrak's shot from the top of the box was saved out by VU's goalkeeper Alexa Levick for UF's fourth corner of the opening half. Soon after the corner kick, **Lindsay Thompson** had the ball on the end line and sent to freshman **Havana Solaun** who was making a run in the box after taking the corner kick. Solaun took a pair of touches before seeing **Holly King** standing unmarked at the top of the six-yard box. The pass caught King's right foot as it slid forward and the ball went untouched into the far post corner. It was King's second goal of the season.

"I got the ball at the top of the 18 and I looked up and saw a pathway. Holly was just standing there kind of calling for the ball so I shot it through and she had an awesome finish," said Solaun on her third assist of the season.

King was one of two Gators who left the match with an injury. Redshirt junior **Katie Kadera** left in the 21st minute and King in the 73rd minute. Both will be evaluated by UF medical staff.

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** liked the way the Gators moved the ball tonight, but thought there were some balls in the match that should have been finished for Gator goals.

"I think the only thing that wasn't efficient about our play in that game was our finishing. It was probably one of our most complete efforts in terms of limiting the other team's offense and what we did offensively," Burleigh said. Three second-half goals within a seven-minute span broke open a halftime tie as the No. 11 Florida soccer team (12-3, 5-1 SEC) posted a 4-1 win over Alabama (6-6-2, 1-4-1 SEC) Sunday afternoon under threatening skies at the James G. Pressly Stadium. Three of the Gators' four goals came from a pair of freshmen.

The Tide scored first in the 21st minute when they were awarded a free kick at midfield. Carly Mygrant sent a lofted ball to just above the six-yard box. Several players tried to get a touch but it was junior Kaitlyn Smith who got a head on it to score her first goal of the season.

Florida tied the score in the 38th minute. Sophomore **Taylor Travis** received the ball just above the Tides' final third from **Jo Dragotta**. Travis sent an angled ball into the box for senior **Lindsay Thompson** making a run into the box. Thompson got a foot on the ball in a 1v1 situation with Alabama goalkeeper Justine Bernier but the ball deflected outside the right side of the box. Travis hustled over to retrieve it and crossed the ball into the box. Thompson let the ball roll through her legs as freshman **Annie Speese** was coming through the middle of the box. With her left foot, Speese placed it in at the far post.

Travis liked the effort shown by her teammates on the goal.

"I got the ball from Jo, and I turned, opened up and LT (Lindsay Thompson) made a fantastic run. I slipped her the ball and she just barely nicked it off the keeper and I followed up on that and whipped the ball in. LT dummed it - it went right through her legs - and Annie scored," Travis said. "It was a very good goal. It's hard to stop when you get a rhythm like that - not many teams can stop it. We are fortunate enough to have such good personnel who can do that."

When the clock hit the 70th minute, it started a three-goal flurry for the Gators. Florida went ahead when center back **Kathryn Williamson** sent a ball to the Alabama box. Freshman **Jillian Graff**, who just entered the match eight minutes prior, ran onto the bouncing ball and when she saw Bernier was off her line, chipped it into the goal in the 71st minute. The goal was the first for the Gator freshman.

"Kat gave a great ball over the top and I was running through," Graff said. "The goalie was coming out so I put it over her head. Kat played a great ball through."

Alabama's Ashley Willis was called for a handball just a step outside the top of the UA box, giving the Gators a free kick. Speese placed her left-footed shot in the upper slot in the 73rd minute, giving her the third double-goal match of the last eight contests just a day after her 19th birthday.

It was the first of her seven collegiate goals, which ranks second on the team, which came directly off a free kick. For Speese, it was a situation she sees often in practice.

"That's what we practice every week. That's the spot that I take for the free kicks in practice so I was really excited when I saw where it was," Speese said. "They had a huge wall and I knew that it would be hard for her to see, so I didn't try to kill it or anything like that. I knew that placement was all that mattered."

Florida's final goal started when Speese brought the ball to the top of the box and sent it to Graff who was unmarked on the end line. Graff played a square ball to **Tahnai Annis** making a run through the box and her one-touch shot scored at the near post at 77:28. It was the fourth goal of the season for Annis.

"Annie played a great ball through and I was making the run," Graff said. "Tahnai was at a great spot in the middle of the box so I was able to fire it to her and she finished it off."

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** acknowledged that it was slow start for the Gators, but she liked how the team was able to shake it off.

"I thought we started out really slow, not just because we gave up on the goal, but because we weren't connecting, just technically not as strong as we usually are. What I said at the end of the game was that it's a credit to our team that we got ourselves out of that funk. In years past, we might've stayed in that," Burleigh said. "I think it was very good of our team to recognize that we needed a little boost and they were resilient in their ability to get back on track."

Travis said the team handled most of the halftime pep talk themselves.

"It wasn't the changes that were made - it was attitude changes that were made. When we got to the locker room, the coaches didn't need to say a word and we knew what we had to get done," Travis said. "We said a lot of things to fire each other up and that's what it took, and that's how it is."

A pair of goals from senior All-American **Tahnai Annis** gave the No. 23 University of Florida soccer team (15-6, 7-4 SEC) a 2-0 win over Georgia (12-6-2, 6-3-2 SEC) Wednesday in the final match of the opening day of play of the Southeastern Conference Tournament at the Orange Beach SportsPlex.

The win sends Florida to its 16th SEC Tournament semifinal appearance where it will meet No. 8 seed Alabama on Friday, who advanced with a 1-0 win over top-seeded South Carolina.

A pair of Gator seniors combined on the final two touches to score Florida's first goal in the 26th minute. **Lindsay Thompson**, standing a few paces above the 18-yard box, flicked the ball sent in from Gator goalkeeper **Taylor Burke** into the box. Annis ran onto the ball, fighting through a pair of Bulldog defenders to get a touch on the ball, and get the score from 10 yards.

"We've been working on the long balls from Taylor Burke and she played a perfect ball, which I was able to flick," Thompson said. "Tahnai was running and got there before their defenders and goalkeeper to place it in. I was really happy we were able to get that lead."

For Burke, she becomes only the second Gator goalkeeper in the program's 17-year history to be credited with an assist. The last goalkeeper to assist on a goal was **Brittini Goodwin**, who earned the assist on **Angela Napolitano's** goal in Florida's 7-0 win versus Jacksonville on Sept. 10, 2006.

The first corner kick awarded to the Gators resulted in the lead being pushed to 2-0 just seconds before halftime. Thompson took the corner and sent it to the middle of the box. **Holly King** headed the ball forward and several players from both sides compacted together to try to make a play on the loose ball. But it was Annis who got a foot on it to score her second goal of the half.

"Usually I haven't taken the corners but time was running out and I was already over there so I thought I should take it," Thompson said. "Holly got up really high and headed it. It bounced off their defender and their keeper and then Tahnai made a really great effort to put it in the back of the net."

It was Annis who **McKenzie Barney** handed her captain's armband after Barney's season ended on Oct. 28 when she suffered multiple facial fractures in the regular-season finale. Annis was surprised that Barney selected her to take the armband and she wanted to perform well for her sidelined teammate.

"I had no idea that Mac (McKenzie Barney) was going to do that. Mac means so much to this team and how she is as a leader. I look up to her in that way and she inspires me day in and day out," Annis said. "It really meant a lot to perform for her and to represent her as a leader on and off the field. I was glad we came out and played so hard and came out with the win."

The two-goal effort was the seventh double-goal match of Annis' career and her second of the season. She now shares second among the Gators with freshman **Annie Speese** with seven goals each.

Florida Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** thought it wasn't one of the Gators' prettiest performances, but she's happy Florida found a way to win, advancing the team to Friday's semifinal round.

"For us, we're going to take wins any way we can get them. That was not one of our prettier performances in terms of the way we played, but I love the way we battled and I love the fact that we got a shutout and that we're moving on to the next round."

A goal in each half sends the No. 23 University of Florida soccer team (16-6, 7-4 SEC) to the Southeastern Conference Tournament final, as the Gators posted a 2-1 win Friday over Alabama (10-8-3, 4-5-2 SEC) in the day's second semifinal match at the Orange Beach SportsPlex.

The win sends Florida to its second consecutive and 13th overall SEC Tournament final appearance on Sunday where it will meet Auburn. The Tigers advanced with a 2-0 win over Tennessee in Friday's first semifinal.

Florida claimed its ninth SEC Tournament title in 2010 with a 1-0 win over South Carolina.

Sunday's championship match airs at 3:30 p.m. ET on ESPNU (Gainesville/Ocala Cox Cable channel 251) with Tony DiCiccio and Sam Gore calling the action.

All the scoring of the opening half came within a 40-second span. Alabama struck first at 32:07 when freshman Pia Rijdsdijk scored off a corner kick for her fifth goal of the season.

Then it was Florida's turn. The Gators brought the ball down to the Tide half. Sophomore **Caroline Triglia**, located at the top of the Tide box, played a diagonal ball for **Erika Tymrak** on the left side of the box. She hit a hard strike from seven yards to the far corner at 32:47.

"Caroline came off the bench and immediately had a couple of amazing passes. I think there were a couple of give and goes and she gave me the perfect ball," Tymrak said. "All I had to do was look up and I hit it far."

The goal pushes Tymrak's team-leading season goals total to 12.

The Gators had several dangerous chances to get the go-ahead goal in the second half but UF finally pulled ahead when senior **Lindsay Thompson** scored in the 81st minute.

Tymrak brought the ball down the field to the top of the box and the ball she sent forward was right on target, as Thompson just needed to tap it in for her third goal of the season. With the goal, she moves up to a tie for the No. 8 spot on the Gators career points chart with 68 points off of 28 goals and 12 assists.

"Erika had been dribbling the whole game and it seemed she couldn't find the last pass because the runs were off or whatever," Thompson said. "Finally she gets through and just lays it right across the goal for me to basically tap in."

Florida Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** thought the quick score to tie was key.

"We didn't panic when they scored. We didn't spend much emotional energy chasing the game because we got that goal back right away and that was big. It was just then back to business as far as us trying to break them down," Burleigh said. "It was just a matter of being patient in the second half until we found a way to get one in."

Burleigh thought Alabama's goalkeeper, Justine Bernier, a member of the Canadian National Team and a 2011 All-SEC second team selection, had some big saves Friday.

"You have to credit Alabama's keeper Bernier. She came up with some really big saves. She kept them in the match," Burleigh said.

For the match, Bernier turned in eight saves and Florida's Taylor Burke posted one save.

A come from behind effort fell short, as the No. 23 University of Florida soccer team (16-7, 7-4 SEC) lost 3-2 to Auburn (14-6-2, 5-5-1 SEC) in the Southeastern Conference Tournament championship match, held Sunday in front of an Orange Beach SportsPlex crowd of 1,444. The two teams played to the same score just a month ago in Gainesville, with Florida taking the 3-2 overtime win.

The tournament title is the first for the Auburn Tigers. As the No. 7 seed, AU becomes the lowest seed ever to claim the tournament title. As the champion, Auburn takes the SEC's automatic berth into the NCAA Championship field.

The Tigers put two on the scoreboard off free kicks in the first 30 minutes, with both coming off the foot of senior All-American **Katy Frierson**. The first goal came when Frierson settles the ball sent off Heather Havron's free kick and then places it in from a short distance at 11:09.

Frierson took advantage of Florida's difficulty clearing the ball off a long upfield free kick to score her second goal. Tatiana Coleman volleys a cross to Frierson above the box. Frierson volleys the ball toward goal and it glances in at near post off a UF defender's leg in the 30th minute.

A goal from Gator junior **Holly King** in the 43rd minute cut the lead to one before half. **Jo Dragotta** took a 30-yard free kick and King beat her marker to the ball at the penalty kick spot. King touches the ball two yards into free space and shoots back across the goal keeper into the lower left corner for her third score of the season.

A pair of Gator freshmen teamed up to give Florida the tying goal in the 54th minute. **Annie Speese**, located about 35 yards above the AU goal, sent a through ball on pace to **Jillian Graff** on the right side of the 18-yard box. Graff takes the ball in stride and in the clear, stroking a first-time strike into the lower left corner. The goal was her second of the season.

The game-winning goal came off the foot of junior Ana Cate in the 64th minute. The play started when Julie King sent a long cross from the right side to the front left corner of the six-yard box. Cate stretches and slides to volley the ball in for her team-leading ninth goal of the season.

The Gators had some good looks to tie the match, including five in the final 10 minutes. With eight minutes remaining, junior **Erika Tymrak** took the pass from **Kathryn Williamson** and moved toward goal. She took a shot, but the ball was high. Later, **Maggie Rodgers** sent a cross across the goal, but AU's goal keeper Amy Howard makes the stop just before Speese was able to get a touch on it. The two Gators nearly connected on the same play in the 87th minute, with Speese trying to get a head on it, but she and an AU defender collided on the play and both players ended up on the ground. The Gators were awarded a free kick in the 86th minute when **Tahnai Annis** was fouled just above the box, but Speese's shot was just above the cross bar. The Gators' last shot by Tymrak in the final minute was blocked.

UF Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** liked the physical presence displayed by the Gators in their first two tournament wins, but thought the lack of that presence today, especially in the opening half, hurt Florida Sunday.

"I'm disappointed because I thought in the first two games of the tournament, we brought a great physical presence defensively and in this game, we were not able to match that," Burleigh said. "Ultimately, we lost this game in the first half by not bringing the physical presence we showed in the first two games."

Florida placed three juniors on the SEC All-Tournament team – Dragotta, King and Williamson. AU's Frierson picked up the Most Valuable Player award.

Two Gator seniors used their heads Saturday to give No. 2 region seed Florida (17-7, 7-4 SEC) a 3-0 win over Florida Gulf Coast (14-5-2, 7-1-1 A-Sun) in NCAA Soccer Opening Round action Saturday evening in front of a [James G. Pressly Stadium](#) crowd of 1,025.

These two teams had faced off in Gainesville on Sept. 11, with the Gators taking a 5-0 win. Florida Head Coach **Becky Burleigh** knew that margin of victory was unlikely for this second go-around with so much on the line.

"I've known Jim Blakenship (FGCU head coach) for a long time and have coached against him forever," Burleigh said. "I knew he wasn't happy with their performance here in Gainesville the first time, and knew they would come back harder this go round."

For the Eagles, it was their first NCAA Division I post-season appearance – not only for the soccer team, but for the entire FGCU athletic program. The FGCU program received official notice on Aug. 11 that it is now a NCAA Division I program after waiting out the four-year DI transition period.

Florida knew it needed to be prepared for its opening round match against a motivated opponent who was making program history. There were some game aspects focused on in this week's practices and Burleigh liked that the Gators were able to show results from that devoted training time in today's match.

"For us, the main objective going into tonight was to advance, and we did that, so that was all good," Burleigh said. "Probably more important than that for us though, was to start off this post season doing some of these things that we really emphasize – bringing a strong defensive presence and executing when we can offensively. Two of the three goals were set pieces. Those were some things we spent time on, both offensively and defensively. Moving onto the next round was our goal, and we did that."

Tahnai Annis headed in the Gators first goal in the 16th minute. Florida was awarded a corner kick and **Erika Tymrak** sent in the ball to the far post. Junior **Holly King** came flying in and got a head on the ball but it deflected up and back to Tymrak located on the end line. She let the ball bounce twice and then took a touch away from the end line before sending a right-footed cross into the box. The ball found the diving head of Annis, located at the top of the six-yard box, and she scored at the far post corner.

Annis saw Tymrak eying her options so she knew she needed to get in a spot where she could make a play on the ball.

"I was just trying to get in the best possible position to get a touch on it," Annis said. "I was trying to separate myself from a defender so that Erika Tymrak could find me."

Another set piece and another header for Annis put the Gators up 2-0 at the 68th minute. Tymrak was fouled by FGCU's Brittany Burt on the top edge of the Eagles defensive third. **Annie Speese's** left-footed service found the head of Annis in the middle of the box and she redirected the ball into the far post corner for her ninth goal of the season, which stands second on the team.

Free kicks get a lot of time in training, Speese said, and what she is told during those sessions ran through her mind before the strike.

"We put a lot of work into that at every practice. Vic (Campbell, UF Associate Coach) always tells me to put it on the top of the six and drive it in there," Speese said. "Tahnai did a great job getting in there."

Saturday's performance was Annis' eighth double-goal match of her career and third of the season.

Senior **Lindsay Thompson** completed Florida's scoring with a header off the run of play in the 80th minute. The Gators were moving the ball quickly between players located at the middle of the field and the right sideline. When King had the ball in the middle, she saw Speese open at the top of the Eagles defensive third. Speese had space and time to move forward and then right. The ball she sent between two defenders found Annis just outside the corner of the box. Annis sent a ball to the far post, where **Thompson** headed it in for her fourth goal of the season.

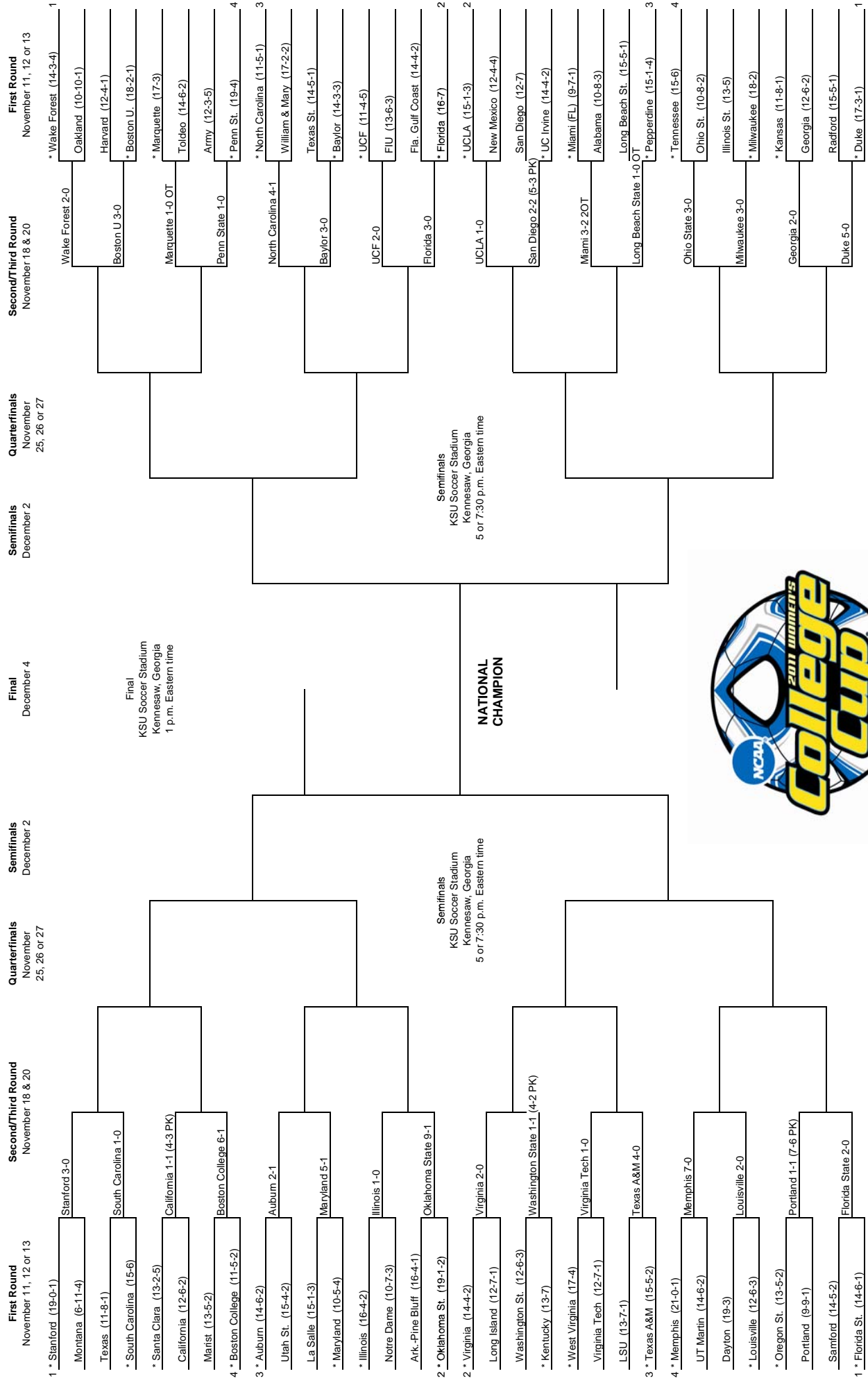
