Gators Conclude Disappointing Season at 9-17

The Florida men's tennis team posted a 9-17 record (3-8 SEC) in 2001 and was eliminated from the NCAA Tournament in the first round. UF opened the season 4-0 but a combination of injuries, a young lineup and fierce scheduling (21 of UF's 26 matches came vs. NCAA Tourney selections) led to a disappointing final result to the season. Still, three Gators earned a total of four All-SEC selections while UF was represented in both the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships. Hope abounds for 2002 as five of UF's six regulars return a year wiser and more experienced.

Gators Lasooed By OSU Cowboys in NCAA Opener

Ross Greenstein was Florida's lone singles winner as the Gators lost by a 4-1 score to Oklahoma State in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at Stanford's Taube Family Tennis Stadium. Florida concludes its season at 9-17. It marks the first year since 1994 that UF lost in its NCAA opener...The match opened with thrilling doubles action. UF and OSU split at No. 2 and 3...The No. 1 doubles match did not see a single break of serve until OSU broke to go up 6-4. Florida eventually fell behind 7-4 but forced a tiebreaker which OSU would take 7-5...Florida evened the score at 1-1 as the singles competition began. Greenstein posted his first singles win since March 25 by taking down Anthony Zafiris, 6-4, 6-2, at No. 6...Oklahoma State clinched victory at No. 4 where Frantisek Krepelka beat Troy Hahn 7-6 (7), 7-6 (5)...UF led in the third set of both suspended matches, including No. 1 where Nathan Overholser was just three points away from a three-set win.

Overholser Beats No. 1, Sets Record in SEC-Opening Win Over Hogs

Senior Nathan Overholser broke the UF career doubles win record, and defeated the nation's No. 1-ranked singles player, to power UF to a 5-2 win over Arkansas on Feb. 18 in Gainesville in the Gators' SEC opener. Overholser and Jeremy Wurtzman teamed to defeat Oskar Johansson and Henrik Tofft, 8-4, at No. 1 doubles for Overholser's 89th career doubles win, breaking Justin O'Neal's mark of 88 set from 1996-2000. Overholser then rallied to defeat Johansson in singles, taking down the nation's top-ranked player 4-6, 7-5, 6-3. Matt Behrmann would clinch UF's victory in a tiebreaker at No. 6 while Wurtzman and Olivier Levant were also singles winners for UF.

Georgia on Their Minds: Gators Earn NCAA Singles and Doubles Berths

Florida was represented in both the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships, May 24-28 at Georgia. Senior Nathan Overholser was chosen for both fields while junior Olivier Levant teamed with Overholser in doubles. Freshman Jeremy Wurtzman was an alternate for the singles field. This marked Overholser's fourth appearance in the doubles field, going in 1998-2000 with Jeff Morrison, and his second singles bid (1999). Overholser joined Mark Merklein (1991-94) as the lone Gators to make four NCAA Doubles fields. It was Levant's first individual NCAA berth. Unfortunately neither fared well though. Overholser lost to eventual finalist Brian Vahaly of Virginia, 6-2, 6-1, in the first round while the doubles team got a tough draw and fell to #4 seed Amer Delic and Graydon Oliver, 6-4, 7-6 (8), in the opening round.

Florida Falls in First Round of SEC Tournament For First Time

The Gators dropped a 4-0 match to No. 17 Alabama in the opening round of the SEC Championship at Kentucky's Boone Tennis Complex on April 19. It marked the first time in school history that UF did not advance past the first round of the SEC Tournament...Alabama opened the match by taking the doubles point. UF took the first doubles match as Nathan Overholser and Olivier Levant, playing together for the first time since the National Team Indoors on February 15, cruised to an 8-2 win at No. 1. The Tide took the point though with 8-5 wins at No. 2 and No. 3...Singles play was fairly even but Alabama converted on each of the first three matches for a 4-0 win.

Gators Earn SEC Honors

Three Florida players were named to the All-SEC second team and three were named to the SEC's Academic Honor Roll on April 18 prior to the conference championships. Nathan Overholser was named All-SEC second team in both singles and doubles while Jeremy Wurtzman was named All-SEC in singles and Olivier Levant in doubles. The citations raise Overholser's career All-SEC total to five while it is the first such honor for either Levant or Wurtzman. Also, Tory Hahn, Levant and Overholser were named to the SEC's Academic Honor Roll. It was Hahn and Levant's first year on the list and Overholser's second.

Florida in the Rankings

Florida finished the year ranked 33rd in the nation by the ITA as a team. Three Gators are ranked in singles (Nathan Overholser - 48, Jeremy Wurtzman - 61 and Olivier Levant - 89) along with two doubles teams (Levant/Overholser - 24, Overholser/Wurtzman - 31).

Overholser Knocks Off No. 1

Nathan Overholser rallied for a 4-6, 7-5, 6-3 win over top-ranked Oskar Johansson of Arkansas on Feb. 28 in Gainesville. **Overholser became the first Gator to beat a No. 1-ranked player since Jeff Morrison beat top-ranked James Blake of Harvard on May 30, 1999 to win the NCAA Singles Championship.** Overholser trailed Johansson, 6-4, 3-0 but produced a stirring rally. Tied at 5-5 in the second set, Overholser broke serve and won four straight points on his own to take the second set 7-5. The third set was all even at 3-3 when Overholser again broke serve to take command of the match. Up 5-3 and 30-40 with Johansson serving, Overholser benefited from an unforced error as Johansson pushed match point wide, giving the Gator senior the victory. **The win came just hours after Overholser had broken UF's career doubles record.**

"It's safe to say I'm very happy," Overholser said. "Going into today I had a lot of things on my mind. Setting the doubles record isn't everything but it's something. It will be more important to me down the road but it's still something I'm very proud of. I was a little nervous but (Wurtzman and I) played well and we got the job done."

"[In singles] I knew I had a tough match. He's just a great player. Down a set and 3-0, I stayed positive and hung in there. In my match against Texas A&M I wasn't positive. I put way too much pressure on myself and I didn't play well. Tonight I was able to come through. Even though I'm ranked (21) I had nothing to lose and I used that to my advantage."

"That was one of the best matches I've ever seen him play, if not the best," UF head coach Ian Duvenhage said. "If you asked me to come up with something he didn't do well, I couldn't. Down a set and 3-0 he didn't give up on himself. He kept fighting and found a way to win this match. That was really tremendous."

Playing the Best

Florida posted a 4-17 record this year against NCAA Tournament selections. **UF played 21 of its 26 matches this year against NCAA participants** and the 17 losses account for all of UF's team losses for the season. Florida's four wins came over Illinois, Vanderbilt, Arkansas, and Kentucky. The Gators lost to NCAA selections Stanford, Washington, Texas A&M, Wake Forest, Duke, Auburn, South Carolina, Texas, South Florida, LSU, Alabama (twice), Mississippi State, Ole Miss, Georgia, Tennessee and Oklahoma State. **The Gators got a regular dose of NCAA competition in league action as all 12 SEC teams were selected for the NCAAs, including national champion Georgia.** In addition, five of UF's non-conference opponents (Stanford, Texas A&M, Washington, Illinois and Duke) earned Top 16 seeds for the NCAA Tournament.

Overholser Doubles His Pleasure

Nathan Overholser broke the UF career doubles win record with his win against Arkansas on Feb. 28. **The senior from Okemos, Mich. won his 89th career doubles match when he and Jeremy Wurtzman defeated Oskar Johansson and Henrik Tofft, 8-4 on Feb. 28.** Justin O'Neal's previous school-record total of 88 was set from 1996-2000. Overholser is tied for sixth with his 83 career singles wins at UF and stands all alone in fourth place with his 176 combined wins. Overholser played the early part of the season with nagging elbow and back injuries which forced him to sit out most of March before returning to the UF lineup on April 6 at Mississippi State for doubles.

Wurtzman Hardly The Worst; Freshman Wins 10 of First 11 Duals

Playing at four different positions including No. 1, freshman Jeremy Wurtzman went 13-10 as a freshman in dual matches. After winning his first eight dual matches he stood the only undefeated Gator in dual match singles this year but dropped his debut at No. 1, 6-3, 6-4 to 30th-ranked Phillip King of Duke on March 4. Wurtzman, who has played at No. 1-4 this spring, posted his first ranked dual win against Washington when he defeated 74th ranked Andrej Bizjak, 6-4, 6-2. He posted a career-best win over No. 10 Ajay Ramaswami of LSU during a March 30 dual match. **For the entire season he led UF with 24 wins and peaked at No. 41 in the ITA rankings. He was an NCAA Singles alternate.**

Levant/Overholser Win ITA All-American

Olivier Levant and Nathan Overholser won the ITA All-American Doubles Championship in October in Stone Mountain, Ga. The event is the second leg of the collegiate grand slam and marks **UF's first grand slam doubles championship since David Blair and Mark Merklein won the 1993 NCAA Doubles Championship.** The duo won five matches in five days to claim the title, including a victory over ninth-ranked Taborga and Talarico of Notre Dame in the semifinal and one over 11th ranked Montgomery and Vahaly of Virginia in the final. Overall the team was 6-0 together this fall. The All-American title propelled Levant and Overholser to a No. 3 national ranking as the regular season approached.

Head Coach Ian Duvenhage

Ian Duvenhage recently completed 13th and final year as head coach at Florida. **Duvenhage posted a 221-126 (.637) record in his 13 years at UF and has a 352-170 (.674) combined record in his 20 year career**, including his tenure as women's coach at Miami from 1982-88. Duvenhage has led UF to the NCAAs in each of the last 11 seasons (1991-2001), including a trip to the semifinals in 2000. His teams won the 1994 and 2000 SEC Championships and he was rewarded with three SEC Coach of the Year citations. Duvenhage was also named the ITA's Region III Coach of the Year three times and was named the 1986 National Coach of the Year at Miami.

Home Sweet Home

The Gators were a far better team at home this year than away from Gainesville. **UF was 6-6 on its home courts in 2001, while posting a 3-11 mark at road and neutral sites.** Some individual singles results were also drastically different on the road. Trey Johnson did not win a match on an opponent's home court this year while Matt Behrmann won his first on April 8 at Ole Miss. Ross Greenstein, West Nott and Nathan Overholser also had just one road win apiece. Troy Hahn was winless on the road until winning in both legs of the Auburn-South Carolina swing in mid-March. Only Olivier Levant at 5-4 had a winning record on the road.

Florida Ties For Seventh At USTA/ITA National Team Indoors

The Gators tied for seventh place at the prestigious USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships, Feb. 15-18 at the University of Washington's Nordstrom Tennis Center in Seattle. UF edged No. 9 Illinois, 4-3, in its opening match before losing 4-0 to No. 1 Stanford in the quarterfinals and No. 19 Washington, 4-1, in consolation play. Against the Illini, Troy Hahn won the clinching match, 6-4, 4-6, 6-4 while both Nathan Overholser and Olivier Levant posted ranked singles wins for UF. The Gators lost the doubles point but rallied with four singles wins. Against the top-ranked Cardinal UF was swept in its attempt to avenge a loss to Stanford in last year's NCAA semifinals. Washington topped UF, 4-1, with Jeremy Wurtzman providing the Gators' lone singles win, beating 74th ranked Andrej Bizjak in straight sets.

Odds and Ends

Florida did not defeated a higher ranked team this year...Matt Behrmann's win over Paul Ciorascu at Ole Miss on April 8 was his first road win and first win when playing at No. 5...Three of Behrmann's five dual match singles wins have come in SEC matches...That Ole Miss match saw UF forfeit the #6 singles match due to a lack of healthy bodies...Prior to Overholser and Wurtzman's win over fifth ranked Matias Boeker and Travis Parrott of UGA on April 13, UF had not beaten a ranked doubles team since November 3. Boeker and Parrott went on a team after that match and won the NCAA Doubles Championship...Matt Behrmann and Ross Greenstein were 4-0 in SEC play as a doubles team...**Battling injuries, UF used 14 different doubles teams in its dual matches.** Freshman West Nott left the team in early April after announcing his intention to transfer.

Nathan Overholser broke the school career doubles wins record and also defeated the nation's No. 1-ranked singles player to lead the Gators to a 5-2 win over No. 37 Arkansas in their conference opener.
