Court temperature: at start of doubles: 89.6 degrees; at start of singles: 92.6 degrees...today's win sends Florida to its sixth consecutive and 27<sup>th</sup> overall NCAA Round of 16 appearance...UF faces Mississippi (4-0 winner Saturday over Georgia Tech) in Athens, Ga., on May 20th...with today's win, Florida turned in its 20<sup>th</sup> undefeated home season in the program's history – UF was 16-0 in 2010 home action and pushed its overall program record home win streak to 82 (started with opening match of 2005 season)...the clinching win came from senior Marrit Boonstra at the No. 3 position – she leads UF this season with six match clinching wins.
