Making History

Every national championship is special, but the fourth one claimed by the University of Florida women's tennis team perhaps might be the one that Gator tennis fans cherish the most.

When junior **Julie Rotondi** raised her arms in the air for the final time and sprinted toward her exuberant teammates, it marked the first time in the illustrious 31-year history of the program that Gators had won the NCAA title on their home court.

Florida played host to the NCAA Championships for the fifth time in the 22-year history of the event and the 2003 squad was the third to reach the title match played in Gainesville. Each of the three times UF has advanced the final on their home court, Gators fans have responded. The 2003 championship match was no exception, as a spirited sellout crowd of 1,132 packed Linder Stadium at Ring Tennis Complex, giving the Gators a definite home court advantage and celebrated the national championship with the team.

The 2003 event was the 10th NCAA Championship ever hosted by UF and the women's tennis team became the second to win the title in front of their loyal Gator fans. The 1982 women's swimming & diving team was the only other Gator team to win the national championship in Gainesville.

While winning the NCAA title with a 4-3 upset of top-ranked and two-time defending champion Stanford clearly was the highlight of the 2003 season, it certainly wasn't the only accomplishment of the Gators.

Florida captured the 2003 SEC regular season title before winning the 2003 SEC Tournament crown. The Gators returned to the National Team Indoor Championships for the first time since 1999 and reached the final before losing a 4-3 battle to Duke. Florida received a program-record-tying eight individual bids into the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships, including a program-high three doubles teams.

Eight is Enough

After squeaking through the last three seasons with a total of six players on the roster, the 2003 Florida squad of eight finally gave the Gators some much-needed depth. **Coach Thornqvist** stated that the extra 'bodies' allowed the Gators to push themselves harder in practice and more importantly with conditioning.

Daunting Depth

The Gators owned an impressive 88-4 singles record at the combined Nos. 4, 5 and 6 positions. If the No. 3 spot is included into the mix, the total combined record for those positions was 112-9.

In doubles play, UF's Nos. 2 and 3 tandems combined for a 52-8 record.

Gators in NCAA Finals

Florida made its 10th appearance in the NCAA Final, now owning a 4-6 record in the last match of the season.

Fairy Tale Finish

UF's lone senior, **Julia Scaringe**, celebrated her 22nd birthday in style. On Sunday, May 18, Scaringe played her final collegiate team match on her home court in Gainesville helping the Gators win the NCAA title.

NCAA Title Equaled...

When the Gators upset top-seeded and two-time defending champion Stanford in the final, it was...

*UF's fourth NCAA tennis title (1992, 1996, 1998).

*UF's 14th undefeated home season (first time since 2000).

*the second time a Gator team has won an NCAA title in Gainesville (women's swimming won in 1982).

*the first NCAA team title won by a Florida team since the men's golf squad captured the 2001 crown.

Gators Good as Underdogs

It's not often Florida enters a match as the 'underdog' based on the national rankings. In fact it only happened twice during the 2003 season, and the Gators met that challenge on both occasions. The final role as underdog came during the NCAA Championship final on May 18, when UF defeated top-ranked Stanford 4-3.

On March 26th, fifth-ranked Florida upset No. 1-ranked Duke 4-3 in front of a spirited Gator crowd. The victory also avenged the 4-3 loss on Feb. 9th the Blue Devils handed the Gators in the final of the National Team Indoor Championships.

Streking at Home

Florida ended the year on a 20-match home winning streak, sporting an 18-0 record during the 2003 campaign. UF also improved to 24-4 all-time at home in NCAA Championship matches and have won 12 consecutive in Gainesville.

Four different Gators have played the No. 1 singles position this season. Lindsay Dawaf, Alexis Gordon, Julie Rotondi and Julia Scaringe have all battled on the showcase court.

Welcome Back

The 2003 NCAA Championships was the fifth time UF has played host to the NCAA Women's Tennis Championships. Linder Stadium at Ring Tennis Complex also welcomed the Championships in 1999, 1993, 1990 and 1989.

UF has reached the finals three times (1990, 1999 & 2003) when playing in Gainesville and faced Stanford in all three contests, winning the title in 2003.

First Time for Everything

Florida has won four NCAA Women's Tennis titles, but the 2003 crown was the first the Gators have won after incurring a loss prior to the championships.

Scaringe Climbed Charts

Julia Scaringe won her 100th career doubles match during the first round of the NCAA Team Championships, becoming only the eighth Gator do to so.

Flashback to 1999

When Florida played host to the 1999 NCAA Tennis Championships...

...live scoring was provided on the internet for the first time ever at the NCAA Tennis Championships.

... **Stephanie Nickitas**, who now is an assistant coach at Harvard, was the lone senior on the squad.

...current UF head coach **Roland Thornqvist** was in his first year as head coach at North Carolina, guiding the Tar Heels to their first-ever NCAA Championship bid and reaching the second round.

...current UF assistant coach **Dave Balogh** was the assistant at Vanderbilt, which lost to the Gators 5-0 in the Round of 16.

Gordon Streaking Along

Alexis Gordon completed the 2003 season on a 23-match singles winning streak, which ranks as the seventh all-time longest streak in Gator history. She won all six singles matches during UF's NCAA run to the national championship. Included during the stretch were three 6-0, 6-0 victories, one each in the first two rounds of the NCAA Championships.

When Jennifer Won, We All Won

All 27 matches freshman **Jennifer Magley** won in dual match play resulted in a Florida win. In the two singles dual matches she lost, the Gators lost.

Welcome Back Stephanie!

Perhaps one of the biggest upsets of the 2003 NCAA Championships was Harvard eliminating 16th-seeded Arizona. Not surprisingly, a Gator was on the sidelines to help the Crimson win their first-ever NCAA matches and reach the Round of 16.

Stephanie Nickitas, who in 2003 completed her first year as an assistant coach at Harvard, starred at Florida from 1996-99.

During her four years in Gainesville, she was instrumental in helping the Gators compile a remarkable 120-3 dual match record, winning two NCAA team titles and placing second the other two years. Individually, Nickitas completed her career with a 128-22 singles record and a 128-15 doubles mark. Her 256 combined wins still stands as the third highest total in Gator history. Nickitas teamed with Dawn Buth to win the 1996 and 1997 NCAA Doubles titles, becoming the first tandem in NCAA history to win consecutive titles.

NCAA Final Highlights

UF wins fourth NCAA team title ... eighth time the Cardinal and Gators have met in the title match, with Stanford claiming six of those decisions. Gators Get Eight

Florida received a total of eight individual bids into the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships, the most of any school in the country.

Five Gators received an entry into the 64-player singles draw, while a program-record three doubles team received a bid into the 32-team doubles event.

Lindsay Dawaf advanced to the second round, while **Julie Rotondi** and **Julia Scaringe** both fell in the opening round. **Alexis Gordon** and **Zerene Reyes** withdrew the morning the event began because of injury and fatigue.

In doubles, the tandems of **Jennifer Magley** and **Reyes**, **Dawaf** and **Rotondi**, and **Gordon** and **Scaringe** all received a bid to compete.

Magley and **Reyes** reached the semifinal round, **Gordon** and **Scaringe** advanced to the Round of 16, while **Dawaf** and **Rotondi** fell in the first round.

UF had received two doubles bids seven different times prior to the 2003 selections. A record six Gators were selected to the 1997 singles field.

The Odd Couple

Visually, Florida's No. 1 doubles pair of **Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** were an unusual couple. **Magley** stands 6-foot tall, while **Reyes** is 4-foot-10, making the height differential between the tandem 14 inches.

Home Sweet Home

Florida boasts a 31-year dual match home record of 309-24, including an 18-0 mark during 2003.

However, since the addition of Linder Stadium in May of 1987, the Gators are 192-10 at home.

Alexis wins Big 4-0 in Style

Sophomore **Alexis Gordon** posted her team-high 40th singles win this season with an impressive 6-0, 6-0 victory in the during the NCAA First Round.

Roland's Rolling

UF's NCAA First Round victory was the 125th career win for head coach **Roland Thornqvist**. It also was his 50th as a Gator.

Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gator's **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories**.

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gator's **64-match regular-season home winning streak**.

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an **overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories**.

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of **Whitney Laiho** and **Jessica Lehnhoff** won a **program-record 29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.

One Hiccup

Florida has competed in 21 of the 22 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

Is That a Rankings Record?

Florida had six players and four doubles teams listed in the April 23 and 27th Omni Hotels Collegiate Tennis Rankings. The 10 total combined individual rankings is a Gator record, surpassing the seven individual rankings (six singles & two doubles) earned by the 1996 squad (and the nine in 2002).

This season is the first time since the 1998 campaign when six Gators have received a national singles ranking.

Both the 1996 and 1998 teams went on to win the NCAA title that season.

UF Second at National Team Indoors

Florida lost a thrilling 4-3 decision to No. 4 Duke in the final of the 2003 USTA/ITA National Team Indoor Championships. The match came down to the No. 2 singles position, where Duke's Amanda Johnson outlasted Alexis Gordon 3-6, 6-4, 6-3 to clinch the Blue Devil's first-ever national indoor title. The Gators entered the match aiming to win a record-seventh indoor crown.

The match was UF's 10th appearance in the final. The loss to Duke snapped the Gator's 15-match winning streak in the event. UF had won the title each of the last three times it competed in the prestigious event, the last time coming in 1999.

Florida reached the title match after posting wins against Tulsa in the first round, ninth-ranked UCLA in the quarterfinals and seventh-ranked Southern California in the semifinals.

UF Wins #300 Home Match in Style

The Gators produced their 300th home win on March 26 with a 4-3 upset victory over No. 1-ranked Duke. UF's all-time record in Gainesville stood at 300-24 when the milestone victory was achieved.

Florida Ruled the SEC Court in 2003

The Gator men and women's tennis captured the SEC regular season titles in 2003. Amazingly, it is the first time Florida has won both regular season tennis titles in the same year. Georgia is the only other school that has won the men's & women's titles in the same season (1994 & 2002).

SEC Tournament Talk

*Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 15 of the 16 years the event has been played.

*The 2001 event marked the first - and only - time the Gators failed to reach the title match, falling to Georgia in the semifinals.

*The Gators have won 12 of the 16 SEC Tournament titles. Georgia has claimed three crowns (1983, 1994 & 2001), while Ole Miss captured the 1999 tournament.

*2003 was the first time since 1998 was that the SEC regular season champion claimed the SEC Tournament title.

A Closer Look at the SEC Tournament Final

Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament 15 of the 16 years the event has been played, capturing 12 tournament titles (1982, '90, '91, '92, '93, '95, '96, '97, '98, '00, '02, '03). Georgia claimed the SEC Tournament crown three times (1983, '94, '01), while Ole Miss secured the 1999 Tournament title.

Gator Glory in Gainesville

The 2003 NCAA Women's Tennis Championships was the 10th NCAA National Championship event hosted by the University of Florida, not including first and second round regional-type events.

The 2003 women's tennis title marked the second time a Gator team was able to capitalize on its home turf advantage. The first UF team to do so was the 1982 women's swimming & diving team that captured the inaugural NCAA Championship.

UF Individual Champions

Since 1980, Gator student-athletes have won 140 individual national titles and earned 2,690 All-America honors. Overall, UF student-athletes have captured 183 individual national titles and 3,097 All-America accolades.

In 2003, 65 Gators collected 127 All-America honors, while two won individual NCAA crowns. Candice Scott won the NCAA Hammer Throw (69.79m/228-11) at the Outdoor Track & Field Championships, while Erin Gilreath captured the weight throw (72-2.75, 1st) at the Indoor Track & Field Championships

Gators in SEC Tournament Final

The Gators own a 12-3 record in the finals of the SEC Tournament, with two of those losses coming against Georgia. Ole Miss stopped Florida with a 5-4 decision in the 2000 final, a loss that ended the Gator's overall winning streak at 53 matches. UF lost to the Lady Bulldogs 5-4 at the 1983 tournament and 5-3 in 1994.

SEC Champions

In the 23-year history of SEC women's tennis, only Florida and Georgia have won the overall SEC championship since competition began in 1980. The Gators have captured 19 league titles - 18 outright - while the Bulldogs have won the other six - five of those outright including the 2002 championship. The two programs shared the SEC title in 1990.

Home Sweet Home in the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable 114-1 all-time home record against SEC foes, including the 6-0 mark in 2003 and versus Vanderbilt in the NCAA Quarterfinals.

Entering the 2002 season, Florida had never ever lost an SEC dual match at home. During the year, the Gators extended that incredible streak to 108 matches. The run finally ended on April 7, 2002, when Georgia became the first-ever SEC team to defeat Florida in Gainesville.

Gators Returned to No. 1

On February 26th, Florida moved into the No. 1 position in the Omni Hotels Collegiate Tennis Rankings.

It was the 79th time the Florida women have been the top-ranked team in the country. The Gators spent three weeks last season at No. 1, including the final listing of the 2002 regular season.

The Gator women's tennis team also was the third different UF athletic team this year to receive a No. 1 ranking. The Gator women's indoor track and field was ranked No. 1 for two weeks this spring, while the men's basketball team received a No. 1 ranking in the February 3rd national polls.

A total of 11 different Gator sports teams have been ranked No. 1 at some time during the history of those respective programs, which includes baseball, men's basketball, football, men's golf, women's golf, gymnastics, soccer, men's swimming & diving, women's swimming & diving, women's tennis and volleyball.

Thornqvist Collects 100th Win

Florida's 7-0 season-opening victory over South Florida on January 25 was the 100th career victory for head coach **Roland Thornqvist**, claiming the milestone in his 152nd match. He is in his seventh year as a collegiate head coach and in his second season with the Gators.

Thornqvist joined the UF program with five previous years of head coaching experience, compiling a 75-50 record at North Carolina and Kansas.

Lisa Raymond Inducted into UF Hall of Fame

On Friday, April 11th, former Gator great **Lisa Raymond** was inducted into the University of Florida Athletic Hall of Fame. She is the fifth member of the women's tennis team entering the Hall, joining Nicole Arendt (2001), Jillian Alexander (2002), Jill Hetherington (1999) and Shaun Stafford (1999).

Athletes are eligible for the Hall of the Fame 10 years after their eligibility has passed. Raymond, who was a first-ballot honoree, was one of the most dominating players in the history of college tennis. She won NCAA Singles titles in 1992 and 1993, posting a remarkable 84-4 record. After her two-year UF career, Raymond joined the WTA Tour, where she has won six professional Grand Slam titles.

Opening Weekend Highlights

The Gators opened their 2002-03 dual match season with a 7-0 shutout over South Florida and followed that 24 hours later with a 7-0 victory over South Alabama. It was the first time UF has opened the season with back-to-back sweeps since the 1991 season.

UF followed those with a 7-0 blanking of Florida International, marking the first time since 1990 that the Gators have started the year with three shutouts.

Gators Down Under

Two former Gator greats were competing in the 2003 Australian Open.

Lisa Raymond, who was the No. 27 seed and ranked 28th in the world, was upset in the second round 6-3, 6-1 by Anca Barna (GER). In doubles, the third-ranked Raymond paired with Lindsay Davenport and reached the semifinals before falling to top-seeded Serena and Venus Williams 6-2, 6-2. She also played mixed doubles with Mike Bryan, where she advanced to the second round before losing to Todd Woodbridge and Eleni Daniilidou 7-6 (3), 6-4. Lisa has won a total of six professional Grand Slam events, most recently the 2002 U.S. Open Mixed Doubles crown with Bryan.

Jill Craybas, who was ranked a career-high 51, lost in the first round of singles 7-6 (9-7), 4-6, 6-1 to Virginie Razzano (FRA).
