### Shortened Season

With the program's standard set as high as it is, anything short of winning the national championship is a disappointment for the University of Florida women's tennis team. Needless to say, the Gators ended the 2003-04 on a sour note after their shocking 4-3 loss to Miami in the second round of the NCAA Championships.

That stunning defeated snapped UF's overall 40-match winning streak and ended the team's 32-match run at home. Prior to that March 15 loss, the Gator's last defeat was a 4-3 setback to Vanderbilt on March 16, 2003 in Nashville. UF had not lost at home since a 4-3 thriller to then-No. 2 ranked Georgia on April 7, 2002.

However, once the Gators have a chance to let some of the sting subside after the season ended earlier than they would have preferred, they will look back on 2003-04 as a year of great accomplishments:

The 2003-04 Gator squad marched through the regular season with a perfect 22-0 record, winning the overall Southeastern Conference title and the SEC Tournament crown.

It marked the seventh time UF entered the NCAA Championships undefeated, and the first time since 1998.

### SEC Champs!

The 2004 Florida squad won the Southeastern Conference overall title for the 20<sup>th</sup> time in the 25-year history of league play.

### SEC Tournament Talk

\*Including 2004, the Gators have won 13 of the 17 SEC Tournament titles (1982, '90, '91, '92, '93, '95, '96, '97, '98, '00, '02, '03 & '04). Georgia has claimed three crowns (1983, 1994 & 2001), while Ole Miss captured the 1999 tournament.

\*Florida advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 16 of the 17 years the event has been played, capturing 13 titles.

\*The 2001 event marked the first - and only - time the Gators failed to reach the title match, falling to Georgia in the semifinals.

\*Florida boasts a 46-4 all-time record in SEC Tournament action, with three of those losses coming against Georgia and the other to Ole Miss.

### Injuries Shaped Line-Up

Senior **Lindsay Dawaf** missed the entire fall season, sitting out while rehabilitating her knee which underwent surgery during the 2003 summer. Dawaf was ready for dual match action, but head coach Roland Thornqvist didn't want to rush her return, so she didn't play doubles. That opened the door for the No. 3 duo of sophomore **Boglarka Berecz** and freshman **Nina Suvak** to emerge as a solid and dependable team, amassing a 20-2 dual match record entering the NCAA Championships.

Senior **Julie Rotondi** had been a regular in the singles lineup until her bout with compartment syndrome (a chronic illness in which the sheath that surrounds the muscles in Rotondi's calves - a compartment - is too small, and when the muscles swell it restricts blood supply and causes intense pain) peeked during the March 5 dual match against Vanderbilt, when she was forced to retire during the second set. Rotondi did continue to play No. 1 doubles with **Alexis Gordon**, however, freshman **Nina Suvak** benefitted with extra time on the singles court at the No. 6 position.

Prior to the SEC Tournament, sophomore **Zerene Reyes** was nursing a pulled groin and did not play singles during the quarterfinal and semifinals to rest the injury. With Reyes out of action, Rotondi returned to the singles court for the first time since March 5 and was inserted back in the lineup at the No. 6 spot, where she was rusty with her strokes, but her competitive level remained as intense as ever and propelled her to a 3-0 record from April 16-18 en route to being named Most Valuable Performer of the SEC Tournament. Rotondi felt strong enough physically and was slotted into the No. 6 position for the NCAA Championships, where she earned two wins.

### Perfect SEC Season

The season's 11-0 conference run marked the 16<sup>th</sup> time UF has ended the regular season with a perfect record in SEC play.

### Home Sweet Home: in the NCAAs

UF is 25-5 all-time at home in NCAA Championship matches, including 11-1 in NCAA First & Second Round action.

### Home Sweet Home: Overall

Florida boasts a 32-year dual match home record of 321-25, including a 12-1 mark in 2004

However, since the addition of Linder Stadium in May of 1987, the Gators are 205-11 at home.

### Streaking at Home

Florida extended its home winning streak to 32 matches until its 4-3 loss to Miami in the second round of the NCAA Championships. Prior to that setback, UF's last loss in Gainesville was a 4-3 thriller to then-No. 2 ranked Georgia on April 7, 2002.

### Automatic

As winner of the SEC Tournament, Florida received the league's automatic bid into the 64-team NCAA Championships. This is the 22<sup>nd</sup> time in the 23-year history of the event the Gators have earned a bid into the championships.

### UF as the No. 1 Seed in NCAAs

The 2004 event marked the 11<sup>th</sup> time the Gators received the No. 1 seed in the 23-year history of the NCAA Championships. Prior to 2004, UF had advanced to at least the semifinal round each of those years, making seven trips to the championship match and winning NCAA titles in 1992 and 1996.

### NCAA Runs

Florida has advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Team Championship 16 times in the last 18 seasons, reaching the final match a total of 10 times and winning four titles.

### One Hiccup

Florida has competed in 22 of the 23 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

### Where it Ranked

UF's 40-match winning streak was the third longest in program history. The second-longest win stretch is 53 matches, which ran through the 1998 and 1999 seasons ... and was ended in the final of the 1999 SEC Tournament by Ole Miss.

### Quick Start

The Gators had won the doubles point in their first 23 dual matches of the season, sweeping all three spots 15 times while posting an impressive 61-4 combined dual match doubles record at all three positions.

However, when Miami snatched the early lead by winning the doubles point with victories on courts Nos. 1 and 3, it marked the first time UF had lost the doubles point since May 10, 2003, when Tulane won two of the three doubles matches to get an early start in the NCAA Second Round match, which the Gators went on to win 4-1.

### Dualing Record

The Gators compiled an impressive 120-11 singles record in dual matches this season and an amazing 62-6 mark in doubles dual match action.

### Gordon Ranked No. 1

When the April 6, 2004 national rankings were released, UF junior **Alexis Gordon** moved into the No. 1 position in the Intercollegiate Tennis Association national women's singles rankings. Gordon also received the No. 1 ranking on April 20.

Gordon, a junior from Windsor, Conn., was ranked No. 1 in the ITA women's singles rankings for the first time in her career. She is the first Gator to hold the top ranking since Jessica Lehnhoff did on April 29, 2002.

### Roland Along

Head coach **Roland Thornqvist** captured his 150th career victory on April 16, 2004, when the Gators defeated Mississippi 4-0 in the quarterfinal round of the SEC Tournament. The win also marked Thornqvist's 75th victory on the Florida sideline, where he is in his third season.

### Significant Singles Streaks

Junior **Zerene Reyes** ended the 2004 season winning her last 17 singles matches.

### Double the Fun

The Gator doubles team of **Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** have posted a 62-14 career record together. Their win total as a doubles duo ranks third all-time in UF history. Sitting second all-time on the chart is the doubles team of Cisse Donigan and Ilene Friedland, who won 70 matches as a pair in the late-70s, early-80s.

### Double the Streak

**Jennifer Magley & Zerene Reyes** ended the 2004 season on a 22-match winning streak. It is the third longest win streak by a Gator doubles team in program history. The second longest streak is 24 matches assembled by the duo of Nicole Arendt and Siobhan Nicholson in 1987-88.

### Is that a Rankings Record?

Florida always has been well represented in the individual national singles and doubles rankings and the 2004 season was no exception. The Gators received a total of eight national rankings (six singles, two doubles) in the April 6, 20, 27, May 1 and final 2004 listings, however, the impressive total is not a program record.

Florida had six players and three doubles teams listed in the Feb. 26, 2003 and again in the March 26, 2003 Intercollegiate Tennis Rankings. The nine total combined rankings achieved during the 2003 season is a Gator record, surpassing the seven individual rankings (six singles & two doubles) earned by the 1996 squad.

The 2003 season was the first time since the 1998 campaign when six Gators have received a national singles ranking.

The 1996, 1998 and 2003 teams all went on to win the NCAA title that season.

### The Odd Couple

Visually, Florida's No. 1 doubles pair of **Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** were an unusual couple. Magley stands 6-foot tall, while Reyes is 4-foot-10, making the height differential between the tandem 14 inches.

## Milestones Topped

Senior **Lindsay Dawaf** and junior **Alexis Gordon** each logged their respective 100th career singles victory during the April 2 dual match at Mississippi State. They became the 18th and 19th different Gators who have won at least 100 singles matches during their UF career.

**Julie Rotondi** notched her 100th career singles victory on April 17, when she clinched UF's SEC Tournament semifinal win. Rotondi, who transferred from North Carolina following her sophomore season, won 60 of those matches playing for the Tar Heels.

## SEC Champions

In the 25-year history of SEC women's tennis, only Florida and Georgia have won the overall SEC championship since competition began in 1980.

In 2004, UF captured its 20th league title, its 19th outright.

## Gators in SEC Tournament Final

The Gators own a 13-3 record in the finals of the SEC Tournament, with two of those losses coming against Georgia. Ole Miss stopped Florida with a 5-4 decision in the 2000 final, a loss that ended the Gator's overall winning streak at 53 matches. UF lost to the Lady Bulldogs 5-4 at the 1983 tournament and 5-3 in 1994.

## Perfect Entering SEC Tournament

UF ended the regular season undefeated and entered the SEC Tournament for the seventh time in program history. It was the first time the Gators have been undefeated at this stage of the season since 1998, when UF eventually went on to win its third of four NCAA titles.

## Home Sweet Home in the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable 120-1 all-time home record against SEC foes, including the 6-0 mark in 2004.

Entering the 2002 season, Florida had never ever lost an SEC dual match at home. During the year, the Gators extended that incredible streak to 108 matches. The run finally ended on April 7, 2002, when Georgia became the first-ever SEC team to defeat Florida in Gainesville.

## Andrea Farley Inducted into UF Hall of Fame

On Friday, February 6, former Gator great **Andrea Farley** was inducted into the University of Florida Athletic Hall of Fame. She is the sixth member of the women's tennis team entering the Hall, joining Nicole Arendt (2001), Jillian Alexander (2002), Jill Hetherington (1999), Lisa Raymond (2003) and Shaun Stafford (1999).

Athletes are eligible for the Hall of the Fame 10 years after their eligibility has passed. Farley, who was a first-ballot honoree, posted a 116-23 career singles record during her injury-plagued tenure from 1990-93. She was a member of UF's first NCAA Championship team in 1992. Farley now is an attorney in Atlanta, Ga.

## Gators Sign Three for 2005

### Whitney Benik (pronounced BEN-ick) of Delray Beach, Fla.

Benik has trained at the International Tennis Academy from 1997 and is coached by Alan Ma. She was a member of Team USA from 1999 to 2002, traveling extensively with the USTA. Benik appeared on the cover of *USTA Magazine* as a "Future Star" with Ashley Harkelroad and Sunitha Rao. In 2003, Benik captured the singles, doubles and team title for the second consecutive year, tying a 51-year old record for the most state titles earned by an individual in Florida state history. During the 2002 season, Benik reached a singles ranking of No. 501 on the WTA tour after playing only seven tournaments. In 2001 she was ranked No. 2 in the Girls age 18 division in the state of Florida, while receiving a No. 8 ranking in the USTA. Benik reached the singles round of 16 and

the doubles quarterfinals of the prestigious 2001 Easter Bowl. She finished in fourth place at the 2000 Super National Clay Courts, earning the Sportsmanship Award for that event. In 1999, she won the Gator Bowl singles title and was selected to the Maureen Connolly Cup Team that represented the USA in England.

### Lolita Frangulyan (pronounced low-LEE-tah fraun-GOO-lee-on) of Bradenton, Fla.

Frangulyan was the No. 1-ranked singles player in the USTA Girls-18 ranking in June 2002 and has been ranked as high as No. 650 in the WTA professional world listings. In June 2003, Frangulyan, who is a 5-foot-10 right-handed player, won the G18 Florida State Closed Championship singles title. Frangulyan was a singles finalist at the 2002 Gator Bowl, but her talents are exclusive to the singles court. In doubles action, Frangulyan won the 2002 Mixed Doubles title at Eddie Herr International, as

well was the 2001 doubles crown at the same event where she also was a singles finalist.

### Alex Liles (pronounced LIE-els) of Wesley Chapel, Fla.

Liles most recently was a finalist at the 2003 Super National Clay Courts, where she dropped a tough 6-7 (4), 6-0, 7-6 (1) decision to top-seeded Julia Cohen. Liles also was a doubles quarterfinalist at the 2003 Milo Cup played in Santiago, Chili. She has trained at Saddlebrook Academy and has been coached by Horacio Rearte and Jimmy Brown. In 2001, Liles reached the round of 16 at the 2001 Orange Bowl, won the Chanda Rubin International doubles crown while reaching the semifinals of the singles draw. That same year she was a mixed doubles quarterfinalist at the Eddie Herr International. Liles, who has played in tournaments throughout the world, reached a season-high USTA singles ranking of No. 8 in 2003.

## Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gator's **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories**.

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gator's **64-match regular-season home winning streak**.

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an **overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories**.

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of Whitney Laiho and Jessica Lehnhoff won a **program-record 29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.
