## 2004-05 Season Review

The 2004-05 season wasn't the typical Florida tennis campaign, but somehow the Gators found their way back into a familiar position of advancing to the semifinals of the NCAA Championships for the 16th time in the last 18 years, completing the season with a 22-3 record.

Sure, Florida captured its fourth consecutive and 14th overall Southeastern Conference Tournament title. The team finished tied for second in the SEC regular season standings, as the squad has finished either first or runner-up every year in league history.

However, even before those events took place, the 2004-05 Gators were faced with significant setbacks. The team lost three starters from the previous season, including senior-to-be Alexis Gordon, who left the team for personal reasons one year removed after earning the No. 1 singles ranking in the country. Gordon's departure meant junior **Jennifer Magley** and UF's lone senior **Zerene Reyes** were forced higher in the lineup than expected. Combine that with three freshmen - the most on a Gator roster since the 1996-97 season - and coaches **Roland Thornqvist** and

**Dave Balogh** had their work cut out for themselves.

Despite the lack of experience, the Gators grew as the year progressed. Magley advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Singles Championships, falling to eventual national champion Zuzana Zemenova from Baylor 7-5, 6-4. Reyes reached the round of 16 at the NCAA singles and doubles events, while the freshmen tandem of **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan** also marched to the round of 16 at the NCAA Doubles Championships, falling to eventual runner-up Amber Liu and Anne Yelsey from Stanford.

The fall season began with the amazing run of the freshmen doubles team of **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan** winning the Riviera/ITA All-American Women's Tennis Championships title after playing their way through pre-qualifying.

The Gators were young, but still able to prove themselves among the nation's best and were ranked No. 2 in the pre-season team listings. However, Florida had three early matches canceled due to rain, which didn't help the team's lack of experience when they began SEC play.

The Gator's first significant test of the season came on March 11, when UF traveled to No. 5 Vanderbilt. The Gators won the doubles point, but still lost the match, 4-3, playing indoors because of the weather. Two days later, Florida was forced indoors again and lost at No. 6 Kentucky, 5-2. The Gators won the doubles

point, but the Wildcats captured five of the six singles matches en route to their first-ever victory over Florida. That weekend was the first time the Gators had lost back-to-back dual matches since the 1985-86 season. Florida later dropped to No. 17 in the national rankings, its lowest since the 1985-86 season.

The Gators had little time to feel sorry for themselves with top-10 teams North Carolina and Duke next on the schedule. But Florida dug deep and topped both the ninth-ranked Tar Heels and the seventh-ranked Blue Devils.

The team's next significant challenge was two weeks later, when Florida traveled to No. 3 Georgia on April 1st and No. 25 Tennessee on April 3rd. The Gators dropped the doubles point to the Bulldogs, the first time in 36 regular season matches, but didn't panic, and emerged with a thrilling 4-3 win in Athens. They followed that with a 5-2 victory versus the Lady Vols, keeping themselves in the hunt for the SEC title. Florida continued to win, but couldn't catch Kentucky, which claimed its first-ever SEC title.

Florida entered the SEC Tournament as the No. 3 seed, its lowest in the 18-year history of the event. Determined to show that they weren't the third-best team in the league, the young Gators showed their heart and competitive spirit, avenging regular-season losses to Vanderbilt and Kentucky to claim the postseason crown.

UF staged an improbable comeback

during the final against Kentucky, losing the doubles point but rallying in singles. Reyes rallied for a 2-6, 6-3, 6-3 victory over Kim Coventry on court No. 2 in two hours and 35 minutes, earning the win just seconds before Boglarka Berecz capped her 2-6, 7-5, 7-5 comeback over Danielle Petrisko to clinch the title for Florida. Benik gave the Gators their first victory of the day with a 6-1, 6-2 decision over Joelle Schwenk, while Nina Suvak topped Sarah Foster 6-1, 6-1 on court No. 3.

The young Gators, who matured and were battled tested, fought their way through the NCAA Championships and ended the season knowing that they were one of the best teams in the country.

### NCAA Tourney Talk

The Gators received the No. 2 seed in the NCAA Championship for the fifth time UF has been awarded the No. 1-seed 11 times in the 24-year history of the event.

### NCAA Runs

Florida advanced to the semifinals of the NCAA Team Championship for the 17th time in the last 19 seasons, reaching the final match a total of 10 times and winning four titles.

### Roland Collects Gator Win No. 100

Head coach Roland Thornqvist collected his 100th Gator win following the team's 4-2 victory over Southern California in the NCAA quarterfinals. His four-year Florida record at the time of the milestone win was 100-7. That victory also marked Thornqvist's 175th of his nine-year head coach career.

### Reviewing Reyes

\*Zerene Reyes was the lone senior on the 2004-05 Gator team.

\*During the NCAA Second Round, Reyes defeated FIU's Egle Petrauskaite 6-1, 6-2 to record her 100th career singles victory, becoming just the 20th Gator to reach the 100-singles victory plateau in the illustrious history of the program.

\*Reyes ends her four-year career with a 104-16 record, tying for the seventh most singles wins in UF history.

\*Her winning percentage of 86.7 percent is second only to Gator legend **Lisa Raymond**, who won an astounding 95.4 percent of her matches, posting an 84-4 record during her two-year collegiate tenure.

\*Reyes posted her 100th career doubles win during the NCAA quarterfinals round, becoming just the ninth Gator to reach the doubles-win plateau.

\*Reyes is one of only five Gators in history who have recorded 100 singles and doubles victories during their careers: Stephanie Nickitas, Nicole Arendt, Jessica Lehnhoff and Dawn Buth.

\*With wins on the singles and doubles court during the May 19 NCAA Team Quarterfinal match against Baylor, Reyes reached the 200-win plateau for combined singles and doubles matches, becoming just the 12th Gator to reach that milestone.

\*Reyes was named Most Valuable Performer of the 2005 SEC Tournament. She was the lone Gator to record three singles

victories, in addition to winning one doubles contest to post a 4-0 combined record during the event.

\*Reyes was the first four-year player at UF under head coach Roland Thornqvist.

\*Standing 4-foot-10, Reyes was the smallest of 459 student-athletes on Gator rosters for the 2004-05 season.

### Program Milestone Win

Florida's 4-2 victory over Baylor in the NCAA Round of 16 was the 725th in program history. The Gators sported an all-time record of 725-104 in 33 years of varsity competition at the time of the milestone victory.

### Take That!

During the SEC Tournament, the Gators avenged both regular season losses, topping No. 4 Vanderbilt 4-1 in the semifinal round and No. 3 Kentucky 4-2 in the championship match.

### Familiar Faces Everywhere!

Florida played 16 of its 20 regular season matches against teams in the 2005 NCAA Championships field, including six versus top-16 seeded teams.

Ten of the 12 SEC schools earned a bid into the 2005 event, with five earned a top-16 seeding.

### Automatic

As winner of the SEC Tournament, Florida received the league's automatic bid into the 64-team NCAA Championships. This is the 23rd time in the 24-year history of the event the Gators have earned a bid into the championships.

### One Hiccup

Florida has competed in 23 of the 24 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

### Gator Quartet Selected

**Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** both were selected to compete in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships. Joining the pair in the 32-team doubles field are **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan**. **Boglarka Berecz** was named as the 10th alternate to compete in the 64-player singles draw, but did not get the opportunity.

Magley reached the semifinal of the singles draw, while Reyes advanced to the round of 16. In doubles, both Gator tandems played into the round of 16.

### Doubles Trouble... or Not?

When Georgia captured the doubles point on April 1, 2005, it was the first time since March 26, 2003 at UF lost the doubles point during the regular season, snapping a string of 36 regular season matches winning the doubles point. The Gators won both of those matches by 4-3 scores, rallying in 2003 to upset then-No. 1 Duke by winning four singles matches.

### Lots of Fresh Faces

The 2004-05 freshmen class of **Whitney Benik, Lolita Frangulyan** and **Alex Liles** contained the most true freshmen on a Gator roster since 1996-97, when the team also featured three rookies.

### Gator Bytes

\*Florida is an incredible 308-16 all-time against the SEC, including a 267-11 record in regular-season matches.

\*Florida boasts a remarkable 125-1 all-time home record against SEC foes. The Gator's lone home conference loss was a 4-3 decision on April 7, 2002 when Georgia became the first - and still only - SEC team to earn a victory against UF in Gainesville.

### Rain, Rain, Go Away!

Florida had three matches during the 2004-05 season cancelled due to weather.

### All-American Debut

The freshmen doubles team of **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan** won the Riviera/ITA All-American Women's Tennis Championships doubles title, while junior **Jennifer Magley** captured the consolation singles final October 10, 2004 at the Riviera Tennis Club in California.

UF's unseeded and unranked Benik and Frangulyan upset Notre Dame's seventh-ranked Catrina and Christian Thompson 8-3 in the doubles final, playing their way through the pre-qualifying draw en route to the title. The Riviera/ITA All-American was the first time Benik & Frangulyan had ever played together.

Magley started uncharacteristically slow in her singles final against Alabama's 16<sup>th</sup>-ranked Robin Stevenson, but regrouped to take the title 0-6, 6-4, 6-4. Magley's lone loss during the tournament was to the eventual champion.

The two titles capped an outstanding tournament for UF. Senior **Zerene Reyes** advanced to the semifinal round of the singles main draw but withdrew from her match after having played more than 18 hours in the three days prior to reaching the round of four. Reyes also paired with Magley in reaching the doubles semifinal where they fell to their Gator teammates.

### Winning Streak Snapped

Florida's 4-3 loss on March 11 to Vanderbilt snapped the Gators 33-match win streak in consecutive regular-season dual matches.

That setback also ended UF's 18-match streak in SEC regular-season contests.

### Doubles Streak Snapped

When Georgia won the doubles point on April 1st, it snapped UF's streak of 36 straight regular season doubles points.

### Two in a Row...?

When Florida lost back-to-back matches against in Vanderbilt and Kentucky on March 11 & 13, it marked the first time the Gators had lost consecutive matches since the 1985-86 season.

The last time UF lost two regular season matches was during the 2003 campaign, when then Gators went on to win their fourth NCAA championship title.

### Double the Fun

The Gator doubles team of **Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** concluded their collegiate doubles pairing with an 86-21 record. Their win total as a doubles duo ranked second all-time in UF history, sitting behind the legendary tandem of Dawn Buth and Stephanie Nickitas who in the late 1990s compiled an amazing 91-8 record together while capturing four Grand Slam titles.

### Is that a Rankings Record?

Junior **Jennifer Magley** and senior **Zerene Reyes** headlined six Gators who received a national singles ranking on January 11, 2005, while three UF doubles teams also appeared in the initial 2005 listing.

The nine total individual national rankings tied the Gator's program record. UF also had six players and three doubles teams listed in the Feb. 26, 2003 and the March 26, 2003 rankings.

### The Odd Couple

Visually, Florida's No. 1 doubles pair of **Jennifer Magley** and **Zerene Reyes** were an unusual couple. Magley stands 6-foot tall, while Reyes is 4-foot-10, making the height differential between the tandem 14 inches.

At 4-foot-10, Reyes was the smallest of all 459 student-athletes on 2004-05 Gator rosters... including the gymnastics team!

### Home Sweet Home

Florida owns an impressive 334-25 record at home, including a 12-0 mark in 2005, which was the Gator's 15th undefeated home season.

### Home Sweet Home in the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable 125-1 all-time home record against SEC foes, including the 5-0 mark in 2005.

Entering the 2002 season, Florida had never ever lost an SEC dual match at home. During the year, the Gators extended that

incredible streak to 108 matches. The run finally ended on April 7, 2002, when Georgia became the first-ever SEC team to defeat Florida in Gainesville.

### SEC Tournament Talk

\*This was the first time in the 18-year history of the SEC Tournament that Florida was not a No. 1 or No. 2 seed.

\*The 2005 SEC Tournament title was the Gators' fourth consecutive postseason league championship.

\*Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 17 of the 18 years the event has been played, capturing 14 titles.

\*The 2001 event marked the first - and only - time the Gators failed to reach the title match, falling to Georgia in the semifinals.

\*The Gators have won 14 of the 18 SEC Tournament titles (1982, '90, '91, '92, '93, '95, '96, '97, '98, '00, '02, '03, '04 & '05). Georgia has claimed three crowns (1983, 1994 & 2001), while Ole Miss captured the 1999 tournament.

\*Florida boasts a 49-4 all-time record in SEC Tournament action, with three of those losses coming against Georgia and the other to Ole Miss.

### Andrea Farley Inducted into UF Hall of Fame

On Friday, February 6, 2005, former Gator great **Andrea Farley** was inducted into the University of Florida Athletic Hall of Fame. She is the seventh member of the women's tennis team entering the Hall, joining Judy Acker (1993), Nicole Arendt (2001), Jillian Alexander (2002), Jill Hetherington (1999), Lisa Raymond (2003) and Shaun Stafford (1999).

Athletes are eligible for the Hall of the Fame 10 years after their eligibility has passed. Farley, who was a first-ballot honoree, posted a 116-23 career singles record during her injury-plagued tenure from 1990-93. She was a member of UF's first NCAA Championship team in 1992. Farley now is an attorney in Atlanta.

### Remembering a Former Gator

A moment of silence was observed at the 2004-05 ITA National Indoor Championships in memory of former Gator great **Jillian Alexander-Brower**, who lost her battle with cancer on Oct. 25 at the age of 36. Alexander-Brower won the 1991 ITA National Indoor Doubles title, as well as the 1991 NCAA Doubles crown.

### Gators Sign One for 2006

**Keri Robison**, one of the top junior tennis players in the country, signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of Florida, head coach **Roland Thornqvist** announced during the early signing period in November 2004.

Robison (pronounced ROB-is-sun), a native of Decatur, Ill., currently is the 12<sup>th</sup>-ranked singles player in the USTA Girls 18 listing. Also one of the top junior doubles players in the country, Robison captured the International Tennis Federation Chanda Rubin Event doubles title on Nov. 14, 2004.

"I don't know who's more excited about Keri becoming a Gator, her or me. Her enthusiasm toward becoming a Gator is unmatched," Thornqvist said. "She has a big serve and a big backhand. Keri has a great feel on the court and will be a tremendous addition to our team."

Robison's most recent singles title came in July 2004, when she claimed the St. Louis Junior Championships crown after posting five consecutive straight-set victories as the event's No. 1 seed.

### NCAA Format Change Coming...

The 2005 NCAA Championships are the last year the men's and women's tennis events will be played at different sites. Following this year's tournament, the entire team Championships beginning with the round of 16, as well as the 64-player singles and 32-team doubles draws for men and women will be held at one venue.

## Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gator's **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories.**

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gator's **64-match regular-season home winning streak.**

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an **overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories.**

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of Whitney Laiho and Jessica Lehnhoff won a **program-record 29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.
