## 2005-06 Season Review

Overcoming adversity became the mantra for the 2005-06 Gator women's tennis team.

Three players could not even compete during the fall because of injury and for the second consecutive year and Florida unexpectedly lost a player ranked No. 1 nationally in singles prior to the start of the dual match season, when Jennifer Magley (the 2005-06 preseason No. 1) graduated early and joined the pro tour. Magley played the No. 1 singles & doubles positions the previous season and was expected to play there in 2005-06.

But coaches **Roland Thornqvist** and **Dave Balogh** again worked their magic, rolling up their sleeves and somehow training the Gators to the 2005-06 Southeastern Conference regular season and tournament titles en route to earning the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Championships and a run to the semifinals.

The climb toward the season-ending NCAA Championships gained momentum when sophomore transfer **Diana Srebrovic** capped a solid first fall season with the Gators, marching through the opening months to win the ITA National Indoor Championships, where she became the first Gator since Lisa Raymond to capture this leg of the collegiate Grand Slam.

When senior and former No. 1-ranked singles player **Alexis Gordon** re-enrolled at UF in January 2006 after leaving school in May 2004 for personal reasons, things really started to come together - once Thornqvist and Balogh saw the conditioning and determination Gordon now possessed.

The coaches thought Gordon might be able to get herself ready to contribute at the No. 4, 5 or 6 spot in the lineup after not having played at all during her three-semester away from the court. But Gordon had an even stronger drive when she returned and emerged as the Gator's No. 1 singles and doubles player. She went from unranked in January 2006 to the No. 14 final national ranking with a 25-3 overall singles record, including a 21-1 record in dual matches at the No. 1 and No. 2 spots. She had a different maturity that her teammates recognize and saw the game in a different way. Her comeback not only inspired her teammates, but the Gainesville community and her coaches.

The makeup of the team was relatively young, with five sophomores & freshmen and just three juniors and seniors, but there was a high level of experience - and Gordon and Srebrovic weren't the only talents on the Gator's deep roster.

Immediately following Florida's semifinal exit from the 2005 NCAA Championships, **Nina Suvak** went to work on her game and her conditioning. Her determination resulted in an impressive 28-6

singles record, including a 20-3 record in dual matches. She was recognized as a unanimous First Team All-SEC selection by the league's coaches, as was teammate **Whitney Benik**, who sported a 19-2 dual match record, playing the majority of the season at the No. 3 spot.

Sophomore **Alex Liles** and freshman **Keri Robison** were Second Team All-SEC honorees, especially impressive since both missed the entire fall season with injuries. Senior **Boglarka Berecz** completed only 12 matches during the spring due to injuries, but marched into the national singles ranking at the No. 50 spot and earned a berth into the NCAA Singles Championships. Sophomore **Lolita Frangulyan**, who earned All-America honors in doubles last season with Benik, immediately meshed

with Srebrovic on the doubles court, where the pair compiled a 22-4 record at the No. 2 position. Their 8-4 win against Baylor's Iva Mihaylova and Klara Zrustova on May 19 in the NCAA quarterfinal round set the program record for the most dual match wins in a season by a No. 2 doubles team.

After impressive shutout victories in the first two rounds of the NCAA Championships, a hard-fought 4-3 win over UCLA in the Round of 16 and a 4-0 victory against No. 5 Baylor, the Gators earned their place in the semifinals, where a dominating and eventual national champion Stanford squad ended Florida's 2005-06 season.

## A Quick Look at Highlights from the 2005-06 Season

The Gators sported a 19-match winning streak entering the NCAA Semifinals, a run that had been the second-longest active streak in the nation behind Stanford's 84-match run. Florida, which earned the No. 4 seed in the 64-team field, had just one loss prior to the NAAs, a 4-3 decision at North Carolina back on February 26th in a match played indoors due to weather.

## Setback in Semifinals

Florida's loss to Stanford moved the team's record to 10-8 all-time in the NCAA semifinals. The Gators were making their 18th appearance in the last 20 years in this round of the event.

## Big Numbers

\***Alexis Gordon** ended her career with 94 doubles wins.

\*Senior **Alexis Gordon** ended her career winning 129 singles matches, tying for eighth in Gator history with **Holly Danforth**, who won 129 matches from 1988-91. She also recorded 94 doubles victories.

Gordon's **combined 223 singles & doubles** victories during her career ranked sixth in Gator history.

\***Roland Thornqvist** ended the 2005-06 season with a 200-60 career coaching record in 10 years as a collegiate head coach, earning the milestone 200th victory against No. 5 Baylor in the NCAA Quarterfinals on May 19.

\*In 34 years of varsity action, the Florida program has accumulated 751 wins, achieving the milestone victory against UCLA in the NCAA round of 16 on May 18.

### Semifinal Recap: Stanford def. Florida 4-0

Stanford continued its dominance and showed why it is was her No. 1-ranked and top-seeded team in the country, breezing past No. 4 Florida, 4-0, in the semifinals of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championships Monday afternoon.

Stanford, the two-time defending national champion, finally got the rematch it had been seeking since losing 4-3 to the Gators in the 2003 NCAA final, the last time the Cardinal lost. In a one-day rain-delayed semifinal, Stanford sprinted past Florida to win the doubles point in 40 minutes en route to extending its NCAA-record win streak to 85, including a daunting 106 home winning streak at the Taube Tennis Center.

In doubles, UF's No. 3 pair of Keri Robison and Nina Suvak fell to Lejla Hodzic and Jessica Nguyen, 8-2, shortly before the No. 2 tandem of Lolita Frangulyan and Diana Srebrovic were dominated by Stanford's 22<sup>nd</sup>-ranked Celia Durkin and Amber Liu, 8-0, marking the first time any Gator doubles team had been shutout this season. UF's team of Whitney Benik and Alexis Gordon, continued to battle on court No. 1, where they were down one break, receiving at 6-4 to top-ranked Alice Barnes and Anne Yelsey when play was halted.

Stanford didn't let up at all on the singles courts, racing out to win the first set on all six courts, where every Cardinal was ranked in the top 52 in the country, with four players ranked among the nation's top 11.

### Quarterfinal Recap:

#### Florida def. Baylor 4-0

Florida waited out a three-hour rain delay before defeating fifth-seeded Baylor 4-0 in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships late Friday evening.

Florida got off to a better start in Friday's match against Baylor then during Thursday's Round of 16 victory, earning the first team point of the dual match by capturing doubles wins at the No. 1 and No. 2 positions.

Senior **Alexis Gordon** then knocked off Baylor's sixth-ranked Zuzana Zemenova, who is the defending NCAA Singles champion, 6-3, 6-0, to give Florida a 2-0 lead. Junior **Nina Suvak** got back on the winning track by posting a 6-3, 6-1 victory over Iva Mihaylova on court No. 5 before sophomore **Alex**

**Liles** provided the clinching win for the second straight match with her 6-2, 6-4 decision over Zuzana Krchnakova at the No. 6 spot to end the dual match at 12:14 a.m. PT (3:14 a.m. ET).

### Round of 16 Recap: Florida def. UCLA 4-3

UF defeated UCLA in a thrilling 4-3 decision in the NCAA Championships Round of 16, moving into the quarterfinals for the 21<sup>st</sup> time in the 25-year history of the event.

With Florida holding a slight 3-2 lead in the team scoring, the remaining two singles matches each were deep in the third set. With the final point on both courts being played at the exact same time, the match at the No. 3 position went in favor of the Bruins (15-7), seconds before sophomore **Alex Liles** provided the clinching victory for Florida with her 6-2, 5-7, 6-3 decision over Elizabeth Lumpkin.

Other Match Notes: This was the 750 win in the 34-year history of the Florida program ... This was the fifth time this season Florida has lost the doubles point ... Florida extended its win streak to 18 straight ... **Alexis Gordon** won her 11th consecutive singles matches ... **Alex Liles** won her eighth straight singles matches ... **Roland Thornqvist** collected his 199th career coaching victory in 10 years as a collegiate head coach.

### Second Round Recap: Florida def. South Florida, 4-0

Florida defeated South Florida for the second time this season, most recently posting a 4-0 victory in the NCAA second round. The Gators carried the momentum of winning a hard-fought doubles point onto the singles courts, where **Alex Liles**, **Nina Suvak** and **Bolgarka Berecz** earned straight set victories to send Florida to the NCAA Round of 16 for the 23<sup>rd</sup> time in the 25-year history of the NCAA Championships.

### First Round Recap: Florida def. Samford, 5-0

Florida earned a quick 5-0 victory in the NCAA first round match in its first-ever meeting against Samford. The Gators captured the doubles point and cruised behind straight set singles victories from **Keri Robison**, **Diana Srebrovic**, **Alexis Gordon**

and **Nina Suvak**. UF improved to 8-0 all-time in NCAA Round of 64 matches and moved to 28-5 all-time at home in the postseason.

Additional notes: Gators win 16th consecutive dual match and 25th straight at home ... UF improves to 8-0 all-time in the NCAA Round of 64 ... Suvak wins 15th straight singles match ... Gordon wins 10th straight ... Robison improves to 6-0 in singles ... UF wins doubles point for 19th time.

### Florida as the No. 4 Seed

The 2005-06 season was the third time Florida was awarded the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Championship. In 2000 and 2001, the Gators also advanced to the semifinals, losing to the eventual national champion both times - to Georgia in 2000 and Stanford in 2001.

### Double Talk

Florida won the doubles point 21 times this season, eventually winning the dual match in each of those matches. UF swept doubles competition 10 times.

On the other side, the Gators lost the doubles point six times (Miami, North Carolina, Vanderbilt, Kentucky, UCLA-NCAA & Stanford-NCAA), getting swept twice (Miami & Kentucky).

### No. 2 is No. 1

With their 8-4 victory over Baylor's Iva Mihaylova and Klara Zrustova in the NCAA quarterfinals, UF's No. 2 doubles team of **Lolita Frangulyan** and **Diana Srebrovic** improved its dual match record to 22-3 this season at the No. 2 position. Their 22 dual match wins set the season record at UF by a team playing the No. 2 spot in the lineup, passing the win total compiled by the pair of Jennifer Magley and Zerene Reyes (21-0) in 2004.

### Roland's 200th Win = Semifinal Trip

Head coach Roland Thornqvist collected his 200th career victory on May 19 with the Gator's 4-0 decision over Baylor in the NCAA quarterfinals. His 10-year career coaching record at the time of the milestone win was 200-59.

### NCAA Individual Championships

**Boglarka Berecz**, **Alexis Gordon** and **Diana Srebrovic** earned berths into the NCAA Singles Championships, while the Gator tandem of Gordon and **Whitney Benik** tackled the doubles event.

All three Gators lost in the first round of singles, while the doubles duo reached the round of 16.

### Automatic

As winner of the SEC Tournament, Florida received the league's automatic bid into the 64-team NCAA Championships. This is the 24th time in the 25-year history of the event the Gators have earned a bid into the championships.

### One Hiccup

Florida has competed in 24 of the 25 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

### Familiar Faces Everywhere!

Florida played 16 of its 22 pre-NCAA matches against teams in the 2006 NCAA Championships field, fielding a 15-1 record in those outings.

The Gators were one of eight of the 12 SEC schools earning a bid into the 2006 event, with only UF and Vanderbilt receiving a top-16 seeding.

### Home Sweet Home

Florida extended its impressive home record to 348-25, including a 15-0 mark during the 2005-06 season, ending the year having won 26 consecutive dating back to a 4-3 loss to Miami on May 15, 2004 in the second round of the NCAA Championships.

### Perfect at Home

Florida's 4-0 victory over South Florida in the second round of the NCAA Championships capped the Gator's home season with a perfect 15-0 record, marking the 16th undefeated home season in program history.

### 20-20 Vision

Florida's 4-0 victory on April 23 in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament was the Gator's 20th win of the season, marking the 20th straight year Florida has won at least 20 matches in a season. The Gators have posted a total of 24 20-win seasons in the 34-year history of the program.

### All-Time vs. SEC Teams

Florida is an incredible 321-16 all-time against the SEC, including a 276-11 record in regular-season matches.

### Home Sweet Home vs. the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable 134-1 all-time home record against SEC foes. The Gator's lone home loss to a conference team was a 4-3 decision on April 7, 2002 when Georgia became the first - and still only - SEC team to earn a victory against UF in Gainesville. Florida had won an incredible 108 straight home matches prior to that setback.

### Benik Joins 100-Win Club

With her impressive 6-0, 6-1 victory over South Carolina's Christyn Lucas during the SEC Tournament quarterfinal match on April 21, sophomore **Whitney Benik** became the 34th Gator to join Florida's 100-Combined Win Club. The victory was Benik's 50th career singles win, adding to her 50 doubles wins.

### SEC Tournament Talk

\*In 2006, Florida won the SEC Tournament for the fifth consecutive time and its 15th overall SEC Tournament title in the 19-year history of the event. Oddly, the 2006 title run was the first time the Gators swept every opponent to capture the crown.

\*The Gators have won the SEC Tournament event every year under head coach Roland Thornqvist.

\*Florida has been either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed in the SEC Tournament 18 times in the 19-year history of the event, as the Gators entered the 2005 tournament with the No. 3 seed before winning the title.

\*Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 18 of the 19 years the event has been played, capturing 15 titles.

\*The 2001 event marked the first - and only - time the Gators failed to reach the title match, falling to Georgia in the semifinals.

\*The Gators have won 15 of the 19 SEC Tournament titles (1982, '90, '91, '92, '93, '95, '96, '97, '98, '00, '02, '03, '04, '05 & '06). Georgia has claimed three crowns (1983, 1994 & 2001), while Ole Miss captured the 1999 tournament.

\*Florida boasts a 52-4 all-time record in SEC Tournament action, with three of those losses coming against Georgia and the other to Ole Miss.

### Regular Season at Home

Florida has won 41 consecutive regular season home matches. The Gators last regular season setback at Linder Stadium was on April 7, 2002, when Georgia defeated Florida, 4-3.

### SEC Regular Season Champs

The Gators won the SEC regular season for the 21st time in the 27 years the league has sponsored a women's tennis championship. Of the previous 20 SEC titles, UF has captured 19 of them outright, sharing only the 1990 crown with Georgia. This also was the 19th time Florida has posted an undefeated SEC record.

### Srebrovic Earns No. 1 Singles Ranking

Sophomore **Diana Srebrovic** received the No. 1 singles ranking in the Fila Collegiate Tennis Rankings compiled and released by the Intercollegiate Tennis Association on January 10, 2006

Srebrovic became the fourth different Gator to be ranked No. 1 since the 2002 season, two more than another other program since that time. **Jessica Lehnhoff** was ranked No. 1 for three weeks during the 2002 season, while **Alexis Gordon** held the top spot for two weeks in 2004 and **Jennifer Magley** was No. 1 in the 2005-06 fall rankings.

### Cissie Donigan & Former Coach Andy Brandi Inducted into 2006 UF Hall of Fame

On Friday, April 21, 2006, former Gator **Cissie Donigan** (1979-82) and former Gator head coach **Andy Brandi** were inducted into the University of Florida Athletic Hall of Fame. They became the eighth and nine members of the women's tennis program to enter the Hall, joining Judy Acker (1993), Nicole Arendt (2001), Jillian Alexander (2002), Jill Hetherington (1999), Lisa Raymond (2003) and Shaun Stafford (1999).

Donigan was a member of the inaugural Southeastern Conference team that began play in 1982. She was named a First Team All-Conference performer and helped the Gators win the 1982 SEC Tournament, the first year of the league's postseason tournament. Prior to the 1982 season, the SEC played an individual SEC Tournament, where Donigan won the No. 1 singles and doubles events in 1981, the No. 1 doubles in 1980 and the No. 5 singles draw in 1980. Donigan also collected All-America honors in 1981.

On Tuesday, May 29, 2001, **Andy Brandi** announced his resignation as head coach of the Florida women's tennis team. Brandi stepped down after a brilliant 17-year career at UF with a 460-43 record. His winning percentage of 91.5-percent was the all-time highest among college coaches who have coached for a minimum of five years.

### Gators Sign One for 2007

**Megan Alexander** (Tyler, Texas), one of the top girls tennis players in the country, signed a National Letter of Intent to play for the University of Florida beginning with the 2006-07 season.

Alexander, who is ranked No. 6 in the USTA National Girls 18 standings, has been ranked as high as No. 1 nationally during the 2004 and 2005 seasons.

In February, she won the 2005 USTA National Open Championships held in Waco, Texas, and was a finalist in the doubles event. She also won the 2004 Girls 18 Singles and the 2002 Girls 16 Singles titles at that event. In December 2004, Alexander reached the finals of the USTA National Winter Championships. A quarterfinalists at the 2005 Easter Bowl ITF Tennis Championships, Alexander also reached that round at the 2005 Chanda Rubin Pan-American Closed ITF Jr. Tennis Championships and the USTA National Championships. Additionally, Alexander posted a 4-0 singles record as a member of the 2005 USTA Junior Federation Cup team. During the 2004 season, she swept the singles and doubles crowns for two ITF Girls 18 events, placed second at the Winter National Girls 18 Singles and at the Clay Court National Girls 18, while finishing third in doubles. In 2003, Alexander took second at the Clay Court National Girls 16 Doubles tournament, while finishing third at the Winter National Girls 16 Doubles.

Alexander was given the 2005 Chuck McKinley-No. 1 National USTA Ranking award, as well as the 2005 Mary Lowden - Texas Female Player of the Year honor.

## Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gator's **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories.**

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gator's **64-match regular-season home winning streak.**

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an **overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories.**

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of Whitney Laiho and Jessica Lehnhoff won a **program-record 29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.
