2006-07 Season At A Glance

If Florida head coach **Roland Thornqvist** was seen grinning at the end of the 2006-07 season, it would be as a result of what began to emerge at the conclusion of the year. The 2006-07 Gators were a relatively young team, relying heavily on three freshmen throughout the dual match season.

What transpired during the course of the year was the experience of pressure situations gained by the three rookies, who contributed towards Florida's run into the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships and a share of the Southeastern Conference regular-season title. Individually, **Megan Alexander** and **Csilla Borsanyi** marched into the round of 16 in the NCAA Singles Championships, marking just the second time in history that a pair of Gator freshmen reached that round of the national event. **Anastasia Revzina**, the third rookie, joined the team in January of 2007 and quickly climbed the dual match ladder, ending the season playing the No. 2 singles position. The trio also earned a spot in the dual match doubles lineup, helping the Gators set the tone for each competition.

The 2006-07 Gators, however, were not without a leader. **Nina Suvak**, the lone senior, quietly completed her four-year career with 219 combined singles and doubles victories - the eighth most in Florida history. She became just the sixth Gator in the illustrious history of the program to tally 100 singles and 100 doubles wins. Suvak, the consummate team-player, never complained about which singles position she held during a dual match, just wanting to "get the win to help the team." She compiled a 75-13 dual match record during her tenure, including a team-best 22-3 mark during her final season.

Junior **Diana Srebrovic** was the only Gator who played just one spot throughout the dual match season, battling each match at the No. 1 position, as she earned a bid into the NCAA Singles Championships, ending the year ranked No. 17 in the country and being named an All-American for the second consecutive season.

While there was much to celebrate at the end of the year, the 2006-07 edition of the Florida women's tennis team faced some difficult, personal, off-the-court adversity. Several players were unable to compete during a large portion of the dual match season, which significantly altered the Gators' singles and doubles lineups.

While the squad was able to patch together six semi-healthy players for singles, the doubles pairings were blown apart. **Thornqvist** and associate head coach **Dave Balogh** did an amazing job during a very trying stretch of finding the right chemistry to re-build the doubles lineups. One of those newly-formed teams featured **Borsanyi** and **Srebrovic**, who immediately went on a six-match win streak. They moved up to the No. 1 position after defeating four top-18-ranked opponents, with the highest-ranked win coming against Kentucky's 11th-ranked Kim Coventry and Joelle Schwenk, 8-3, that clinched the doubles point and sparked a 4-3 dual match victory. Two days prior to win over the Wildcat pair was an 8-1 victory over Vanderbilt's 18th-ranked Amanda Taylor and Amanda Fish, helping UF earn the 4-3 team triumph and defeat the Commodores in Nashville for the first time since April 1, 2000.

Those were just two of the five matches the Gators won 4-3 this season - thanks greatly in part to the team's ability to win the all-important doubles point.

In spite of the adversity and a relatively young roster featuring

three freshmen, three juniors and one senior, Florida still captured a share of the SEC Eastern Division and Overall titles en route to earning the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Championship and finishing with a 24-3 record.

Florida was one of 16 schools selected to play host to the first and second rounds of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championships and the Gators took care of business, downing Jacksonville, 4-0, and South Florida, 4-1, to reach the Round of 16, where they earned a hard-fought 4-2 win against Baylor before falling to eventual runner-up UCLA in a 4-3 thriller.

Quarterfinals Recap: UCLA 4, Florida 3

Florida lost a heartbreaking 4-3 decision to UCLA in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Championships.

After the Bruins (20-7) stormed out to a 3-0 lead in the team scoring, the Gators (24-3) clawed their way back into the dual match with three consecutive singles wins to tie the score at 3-all.

The deciding match came down to court five, where Gator freshman **Csilla Borsanyi** battled **Alex McGoodwin** and it was the Bruin senior who fought off a furious comeback attempt to earn the 6-4, 7-6 (4) decision and clinch the dual match for UCLA. This was UF's seventh 4-3 decision of the year (5-2).

Round of 16 Recap: Florida 4, Baylor 2

Florida defeated Baylor in the NCAA Championships for the third consecutive year, as **Csilla Borsanyi** defeated **Iva Mihaylova** in a three-set thriller to provide the clinching dual match point in a 4-2 victory over No. 13 Baylor. **Borsanyi** overcame a rowdy Bear's contingency and steadied her nerves to outlast **Mihaylova**, 6-3, 3-6, 6-4 in two hours and 24 minutes to secure Florida's 22nd trip to the quarterfinal round. Florida took a 3-2 lead after taking the doubles point and singles victories from **Megan Alexander** and **Nina Suvak**, leaving play on courts number five and six to determine the dual match. UF improved to 22-2 all-time in NCAA Round of 16 matches. The 4-2 victory was the 775th win in the 35-year history of Florida tennis (overall record: 775-110).

Second Round Recap: Florida 4, South Florida 1

Florida defeated South Florida, 4-1, in the second round, but the final score was not indicative of how tight a dual match it was, as every court was closely contested before the Gators emerged with their 42nd consecutive home victory and spot in the NCAA Round of 16 for the 24th time in the 26-year history of the event. Florida won the doubles point, 2-1, before getting singles victories from **Nina Suvak**, **Whitney Benik** and **Anastasia Revzina**, who found herself on the receiving end of a 5-2 deficit in the second set before rallying to force a tiebreak. **Revzina** and her opponent - **Jessica Sweeting** - exchanged mini-breaks before **Sweeting** held to take a 2-1 lead. That's when **Revzina** turned up her game and ripped off the final six points to seal her 14th consecutive singles win in two hours and 10 minutes and send the Gators to the Round of 16.

First Round Recap: Florida 4, Jacksonville 0

Florida defeated Jacksonville, 4-0, in the first-ever meeting between the two programs. The Gators depth was the deciding factor in the match, with UF earning singles wins on courts numbers 4-6, losing just one game on the three courts, combined. Freshman **Csilla Borsanyi** posted her first career double-bagel, while junior **Whitney Benik** tallied her first shutout of the season and the third of her career. The doubles team of **Megan Alexander & Anastasia Revzina** claimed their first 8-0 decision, providing the first individual victory of the match.

As a team, Florida improved to 9-0 all-time in NCAA Round of 64 matches, while posting its 41st consecutive home win.

Florida at the NCAA Championships

*Florida has competed in 25 of the 26 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

*The Gators boast a 71-21 all-time record in the NCAA Championships, winning four national championships (1992, '96, '98 and 2003).

*The Gators won NCAA team titles in 1992, 1996, 1998 and 2003 and have advanced to at least the NCAA Semifinals 18 times in the last 21 years.

*Since the NCAA expanded the field to 64 teams, Florida has been a perfect 9-0 in first-round matches. The Gators are 8-1 in the second round, 22-2 in round of 16 contests, 18-4 in the quarterfinals, 10-8 in the semifinals and 4-6 in the title match.

Rookie Review

Freshmen **Megan Alexander** and **Csilla Borsanyi** advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championships. Their run marked only the second time two Gator freshmen have reached the round of 16, equalling the run in 1988 by Nicole Arendt and Halle Cioffi, who eventually fell in the final match to Gator sophomore teammate Shaun Stafford.

All-American Run

Megan Alexander and Csilla Borsanyi earned All-America honors by reaching the quarterfinals of the NCAA Singles Championships. Junior **Diana Srebrovic** also received All-America notice for the second consecutive season after finishing the year ranked among the top-20 players in the final ITA Fila National Rankings.

Thrillers

The Gators played seven matches this season that ended in a 4-3 decision, earning a 5-2 record in those matches. This was the most number of '4-3' matches the Gators have played since the seven close decisions the team faced during the 2003 season (5-2) - when Florida ended its year with a thrilling 4-3 victory over Stanford in the 2003 NCAA Championship final.

The scoring format for women's tennis changed at the beginning of the 2001 season, when the doubles matches combined for one team point as opposed to previous years when each doubles match counted for one team point (nine total team points). Since the 7-team-point inception, Florida has played 27 matches ending in a 4-3 decision, with the Gators holding a 19-8 record in those contests.

Double Time

Florida was 20-0 this season when winning the doubles point, but just 2-3 when

dropping the doubles point. Two losses came against Georgia, including in the SEC Tournament final when the Bulldogs rallied from a 5-1 deficit on court No. 1 to win the deciding match and take the all-important first point of the dual match. The other setback was during the season-ending 4-3 decision to UCLA.

Florida as the No. 4 Seed

This was the fourth time Florida has been awarded the No. 4 seed in the NCAA Championship. In 2000, 2001 and 2006, the Gators advanced to the semifinals, losing to the eventual national champion all three times - to Georgia in 2000 and Stanford in 2001 & 2006.

Familiar Faces Everywhere!

Florida played 15 of its 23 pre-NCAA matches against teams in the 2007 NCAA Championships field, fielding a 13-2 record in those outings.

The Gators were one of eight of the 12 SEC schools earning a bid into the 2007 event, with Florida (No. 4), Georgia (No. 2) and Vanderbilt (No. 16) each receiving a top-16 seeding.

The Youngest One of All

Anastasia Revzina was the youngest of all 479 student-athletes listed on any Gator 2006-07 roster. Born June 20, 1989, she is three days younger than men's swimmer Omar Pinzon.

Talk Amongst Yourselves

The 2006-07 team had an international flair to it. Not only is head coach **Roland Thornqvist** a native of Stockholm, Sweden, several of his players are multilingual and foreign-born. Senior **Nina Suvak** is from Mojstrana, Slovenia, junior **Diana Srebrovic** is from Oakville, Ontario, freshman **Csilla Borsanyi** is from Siofok, Hungary, and rookie **Anastasia Revzina** hails from Moscow, Russia. Junior **Lolita Frangulyan** now calls Bradenton, Fla., home, but she was born in Tashkent, Uzbekistan, and her family lives in Moscow, Russia.

Nina Suvak in the Doubles Record Book

In addition to compiling a **105-28 career singles** record, Suvak also owned a **career 114-38 doubles** record, as she finished tied for fourth in the Gator record book with **Jessica Lehnhoff** (1999-02). Ranking third is **Nicole Arendt**, who compiled 119 doubles wins from 1988-91.

Her **219 combined singles and doubles wins** ranked eighth all-time in UF history.

Home Sweet Home

Florida improved its impressive home record to 363-25, including a 15-0 mark during the 2006-07 season.

17th Time We're Perfect at Home

Florida's 4-1 win over South Florida in the NCAA Second Round capped the 2006-07 home slate for the Gators, who finished with a 15-0 home record, the 17th undefeated home season in program history.

Home Sweet Home Streak

Florida extended its home winning streak to **42 matches**. The last loss was a 4-3 decision on May 15, 2004 against Miami in the second round of the NCAA Championships.

20-20 Vision

Florida's 4-1 victory on April 20 in the quarterfinals of the SEC Tournament was the Gator's 20th win of the season, marking the 21st straight year Florida has won at least 20 matches in a season. The Gators have posted a total of 25 20-win seasons in the 35-year history of the program.

All-Time vs. SEC Teams

Florida is an incredible 333-18 all-time against the SEC, including a 286-12 record in regular-season matches.

Five Earn All-SEC Honors

Five members of the women's tennis team were recognized on 2007 SEC postseason awards teams. Junior **Diana Srebrovic** and senior **Nina Suvak** honored as First-Team performers, while the Gators' freshmen trio of **Megan Alexander, Csilla Borsanyi** and **Anastasia Revzina** were voted to the Second Team compiled by the league's 12 coaches.

UF Wins SEC Regular-Season Title

UF and Georgia shared the SEC regular-season title after posting 10-1 league records. The Gators and Bulldogs also shared the 1990 crown, the only other time there have been co-champions. The league title is the second consecutive for the Gators, who have won 22 SEC championships in the 28 years of conference play.

Home Sweet Home vs. the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable 139-1 all-time home record against SEC foes. The Gator's lone home loss to a conference team was a 4-3 decision on April 7, 2002 when Georgia became the first - and still only - SEC team to earn a victory against UF in Gainesville. Florida had won an incredible 108 straight home matches prior to that setback.

We're No. 1, but No. 2

The Gators tied for the regular-season title with Georgia, but received the No. 2 seed in the 12-team event since the Bulldogs won the head-to-head meeting, 4-3, in Athens back on March 11th.

SEC Tournament Talk

*In 2007, Florida's five-year reign as the Southeastern Conference Tournament champion came to an end, when the second-seeded Gators lost to top-seeded Georgia, 4-2, in the final.

*The 2006 title run was the first time the Gators swept every opponent to capture the crown.

*The Gators have won the SEC Tournament title in five of the six years under head coach Roland Thornqvist.

*Florida has been either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed in the SEC Tournament 19 times in the 20-year history of the event, as the Gators entered the 2005 tournament with the No. 3 seed before winning the title.

*Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 19 of the 20 years the event has been played, capturing 15 titles.

Florida posted its 350th home victory during the 2006-07 season, sporting an impressive 350-25 record at the time of the historic victory. The milestone win No. 350 was a thriller, as the Gators earned a 4-3 over No. 8 North Carolina on Jan. 28.
