2007-08 Season in Review

The 2007-08 Florida women's tennis team survived early-season setbacks and mounted a valiant charge toward collecting championships, coming away with the program's 23rd Southeastern Conference regular-season title in the 29-year history of the event, while marching into the semifinals of the NCAA Championships for the 19th time in the last 22 years.

Injuries dwindled the Gators' senior trio to a just two, with only **Whitney Benik** earning a spot in the dual match lineup by season's end, as Florida compiled a 24-3 overall record, including an 11-0 mark in conference action to produce the 17th undefeated league ledger in school history.

Benik and fellow senior **Lolita Frangulyan** guided the 2007-08 Gators to a perfect 11-0 home record to cap a 53-0 home mark during their four-year career, as they became just the second Gator senior class to go undefeated at home during their collegiate tenure, joining the 1998 senior class of Bonnie Bleecker and Dawn Buth, who helped the Gators compile a 44-0 record in Gainesville.

Individually, Benik and Frangulyan surpassed the 100-win mark in their respective doubles careers, while Benik tallied 99 victories on the singles court.

Benik anchored the middle of Florida's dual-match lineup, settling in at the No. 4 singles spot and the No. 2 doubles position, posting a team-leading 21-4 singles record along with a 21-3 doubles mark. She was, however, surrounded by youth, as the 2007-08 roster did not feature a junior, with three sophomores and a pair of freshmen hitting the court each contest.

The team's doubles' performances became the foundation for its success, as the Gators produced a combined 65-8 dual match record, losing the doubles point just one time. That occurrence, unfortunately, came in the season-ending 4-2 loss to UCLA in the semifinals of the NCAA Championships, where the Bruins carried the momentum onto the singles court and they held off the Gators. Florida was the only team during UCLA's run to its first-ever NCAA title to collect a point in the team scoring, as sophomores **Megan Alexander** and **Anastasia Revzina** earned singles victories.

Those two players will be counted on heavily as the veterans of the 2008-09 squad. Alexander battled through injuries and played the majority of the spring at the No. 3 singles and No. 1 doubles positions, earning All-America honors in the doubles court where she tallied a 29-10 overall record, including a 20-4 spot in team play. Revzina held steady at the No. 6 singles and No. 3 doubles positions where she produced a combined 41-3 combined dual match mark. Revzina paired in dual match-play with **Julia Cohen**, who earned recognition as the 2008 SEC Rookie of the Year and the ITA South Region Freshman of the Year. Alexander teamed with freshman **Marrit Boonstra** atop the doubles lineup, earning a spot in the

NCAA Doubles Championships. Boonstra also suited up at the No. 5 singles position, where she posted a 15-3 record. Sophomore **Csilla Borsanyi** completed the primary dual-match lineup, getting the nod for the No. 2 spot in singles and doubles.

First Serve

Florida made its 19th trip to the semifinals of the NCAA Championship in the last 22 years.

Second Serve

The Gators captured the SEC regular-season title for the 23rd time in the 29-year history of the event.

First Time for Everything

With No. 5 Baylor, No. 6 Florida, No. 7 UCLA and No. 8 California advancing to the NCAA semifinals, it was the first time since the current tournament seeding began in 1999 that the semifinal round did not have any of the top four seeds playing to advance to the championship final.

Florida at the NCAA Championships

*Florida has competed in 26 of the 27 NCAA Championships, missing only the 1986 event.

*The Gators boast a **75-22 all-time record** in the NCAA Championships, winning four national championships (1992, '96, '98 and 2003).

*The Gators won NCAA team titles in 1992, 1996, 1998 and 2003 and have advanced to at least the NCAA Semifinals 19 times in the last 22 years.

*Since the NCAA expanded the field to 64 teams, Florida has been a perfect 10-0 in first-round matches. The Gators are 9-1 in the second round, 23-2 in round of 16 contests, 19-4 in the quarterfinals, 10-9 in the semifinals and 4-6 in the title match.

Florida as the No. 6 Seed

The 2007-08 NCAA Tournament marked the first time since seedings were assigned in 1987 NCAA Tournament that the Gators were awarded the No. 6 seed ... it also was the lowest seeding for Florida, which entered the 1994 event as the No. 5 seed.

Notable Numbers

***Whitney Benik** tallied 99 career singles wins, 78 in dual match action;

*Benik also won a combined **205 singles & doubles matches**, with the milestone 200th victory coming on the doubles court on May 9 in the first round of the NCAA Championships, as she became the 16th Gator to net 200 in her career;

***Csilla Borsanyi** has won **49 singles matches**.

Who's was Hot?

***The Gator doubles teams!** Florida lost the doubles point just once in 27 dual matches during the season, dropping it only to UCLA in the NCAA semifinals. The Gators ended with a combined 65-8 dual match doubles record.

The Gators had owned the No. 3 position, **winning all 24 matches** that had been contested (South Carolina defaulted the match, so UF received the win but it is not counted in the total) before losing to UCLA's pair in the clinching doubles-point match. The No. 2 position was almost as stingy, posting a **22-2 record**.

*UF's No. 6 singles spot produced a victory in every dual match, with **Marrit Boonstra, Lolita Frangulyan** and **Anastasia Revzina** all contributing to the perfect 26-0 record on that court.

*Senior **Lolita Frangulyan** ended her career on a **20-match singles win streak**, with 15 of those victories coming in dual match action.

*Sophomore **Anastasia Revzina** ended the 2007-08 season on a 16-match singles win streak.

*The doubles team of **Julia Cohen & Anastasia Revzina** had **won 21 consecutive** matches together - the fourth-longest win streak in program history, before falling to UCLA's No. 3 pair in the semifinals of the NCAA Championship.

*Freshman **Julia Cohen**, who became the first Gator rookie to open the dual match season playing the No. 1 singles position since **Anouschka Popp** in 1994, produced a 14-7 singles record in her collegiate career, decisions at the No. 1 position. Cohen also tallied a **24-1 record in collegiate doubles** matches, with the lone setback coming in the 2007-08 season-ending loss to UCLA. No Gator has ever posted an undefeated record in doubles after playing at least 25 matches in a season, but Cohen came close!

*Freshman **Marrit Boonstra** opened her collegiate career with an unprecedented three consecutive double-bagels and posted four 6-0, 6-0 wins in her first five matches! Boonstra was **15-3 in her inaugural collegiate singles** campaign, while posting a **15-3 doubles** mark, pairing with **Megan Alexander** at the No. 1 doubles position in every outing.

Benik Just Misses Double-100

Whitney Benik ended her stellar collegiate career with a 99-31 singles record - just one win shy of becoming the 22nd Gator to win 100 on the singles court.

In the Doubles Record Book

The doubles team of freshman **Julia Cohen** and sophomore **Anastasia Revzina** were 21-1 this season. Their **21-match win streak was the fourth-longest in Gator history.**

Doubles Trouble

Florida had not lost the doubles point in any dual match during the season until encountering UCLA's formidable trio, which halted the Gators' run of winning the doubles point in the semifinals of the NCAA

Championships. The Gators did post an impressive **65-8 combined doubles record** in their 27 dual matches during the season.

Déjà Vu All Over Again

The Gators had a sense that they had already played their NCAA Tournament schedule, having played Auburn in the second round of the 2008 SEC Tournament, before playing Vanderbilt in the third round (semifinals) and Georgia in the final.

In the 2008 NCAA Championship, the Gators defeated Auburn in the second round and Vanderbilt in the third round... with a meeting against another team from the Peach State (Georgia Tech) up next - only this time Florida came away with the victory!

It's been a While

The 2008 NCAA Championships marked only the fourth time ever Florida had traveled the 905 miles to play in the state of Oklahoma, and the first time since March 17, 1990, when the Gators defeated Oklahoma State, 7-2.

Florida also participated in the 1985 NCAA Championship held in Oklahoma City, where the Gators defeated U.S. International 5-4 in the Round of 16, before losing to Miami 7-2 in the quarterfinals.

Familiar Faces Everywhere!

Florida played 14 of its 22 pre-NCAA matches against teams in the 2008 NCAA Championships field, fielding a 12-2 record in those outings.

The Gators were one of NINE of the 12 SEC schools earning a bid into the 2008 event, with Florida (No. 6), Georgia (No. 2) and Vanderbilt (No. 11) each receiving a top-

16 seeding.

Round of 16 Familiarity

Of the other 15 teams advancing to Tulsa, the Gators faced five of them during the season (Georgia, Vanderbilt, Arkansas, Duke & Texas), posting a 5-2 record in those matchups.

Florida vs. SEC Teams

Florida is an incredible **347-19 all-time against the SEC**, including a 296-12 record in regular-season matches.

Seniors Set Mark

During UF's 7-0 win at Alabama on Sunday, April 6, the Gators secured the SEC regular-season title outright, fueled by historic wins by their two seniors. **Whitney Benik and Lolita Frangulyan** won the 100th doubles matches of their respective careers.

Benik paired with sophomore **Csilla Borsanyi** at the No. 1 doubles spot and earned the first victory of the dual match, blanking Andrea Brenes and Paulina Bigos, 8-0, as Benik became just the 11th Gator to reach the 100-win milestone in doubles, improving to 100-49. **Frangulyan** and sophomore **Megan Alexander** netted an 9-8 (8-6) win over Meritt Emery and Tiffany Welcher to solidify the sweep and present Frangulyan with her 100th career doubles win, as her record stood at 100-28.

NCAA Singles & Doubles Selections

Csilla Borsanyi and **Julia Cohen** were selected to compete in the NCAA Women's Tennis Singles Championships, while the pair of **Megan Alexander and Marrit Boonstra** earned a spot in the NCAA Doubles Championship.

pearance in the NCAA Singles Championship, lost in the opening round of the 2008 event after advancing to the quarterfinals her rookie season.

Cohen, who played the No. 1 singles position in the dual match lineup, also bowed out in the first round.

The doubles team of Alexander and Boonstra received the No. 5-8 seeding in the 32-team event, but dropped their first-round contest.

Cohen Named SEC Freshman of the Year

Rookie **Julia Cohen** was recognized by the league's coaches as the SEC Freshman of the Year, becoming the third Gator to earn the honor since the award began in 2000.

The other two Gators are **Lindsay Dawaf** (2001) and **Zerene Reyes** (2002).

More SEC Awards

Earning First-Team All-SEC honors this season were **Whitney Benik**, **Csilla Borsanyi** and **Julia Cohen**, who also was named to the inaugural SEC All-Freshman Team.

Gator sophomores **Megan Alexander** and **Anastasia Revzina** were honored as All-SEC Second Team performers by the league's coaches.

UF Freshmen Opening at the No. 1 Positions

Florida began its 2007-08 dual match season with freshman **Julia Cohen** playing the No. 1 singles position and freshman **Marrit Boonstra** playing the No. 1 doubles position (with sophomore **Megan Alexander**).

The last time Florida opened the dual match season with a freshman playing the No. 1 singles and doubles positions was during the 1993-94 season, when **Anouschka Popp** started the year playing the No. 1 singles. She also played the No. 1 doubles position with fellow freshman **Cathrine Insteboe** in the 1993-94 campaign opener.

Popp also was the last freshman to play on the No. 1 singles court, regardless of the doubles line-up.

Jessica Lehnhoff was the last Gator freshman to open the season at the No. 1 doubles position (with senior **Stephanie Nickitas** in 1998-99), but sophomore **Whitney Laiho** began the year at the No. 1 singles spot.

UF's NCAA Championship Review: Gators Push Eventual NCAA Champion UCLA, But Fall, 4-2:

Florida had its dual match season come to a close with a 4-2 loss to UCLA in the semifinals of the NCAA Championships. Florida lost the doubles point for the first time during the season, placing the Gators in the unfamiliar position of trailing early. It

began when the No. 2 tandem of Whitney Benik and Csilla Borsanyi fell to 56th-ranked Elizabeth Lumpkin and Stephanie Wetmore, 8-3. The Gators still had a chance to battle and capture the important doubles point, but the nearly-automatic pair of Julia Cohen and Anastasia Revzina couldn't overcome a 4-0 deficit and lost to 26th-ranked Alex McGoodwin and Yasmin Schnack, 8-5. Florida had been a perfect 25-0 at the No. 3 doubles position this season, including a 21-0 record by Cohen and Revzina prior to the loss.

If the No. 3 pair could have battled back, the action on court would have continued and given the Gators' eighth-ranked pair of Megan Alexander and Marrit Boonstra an opportunity to upend top-ranked Tracy Lin and Riza Zalameda. Alexander and Boonstra

had triple break-point for a chance to go up 7-5, but play halted as soon as the Bruins captured their second doubles win. After winning the doubles point, UCLA (23-5) jumped out to a quick 2-0 lead after eighth-ranked senior Riza Zalameda defeated Cohen, a freshman ranked No. 29, 6-2, 6-1.

That's when Florida began its push.

Alexander upset 42nd-ranked Yasmin Schnack, 6-4, 6-3 at the No. 3 position. The two traded breaks to open the match and again midway through the first set before the Gator sophomore got hot at the end of frame, holding with a strong service game for a 5-4 lead and then broke Schnack to take the first set. Alexander then earned a break midway through the second and road that the rest of the way, capitalizing on her third

match-point opportunity to close the team scoring to 2-1.

Revzina was the next Gator to record a singles decision and posted a 6-4, 6-3 victory over Alex McGoodwin at the No. 6 spot to even the team scoring at 2-all. The first set featured five breaks, but it was Revzina who came out on top with three to claim the early lead. The second set held steady until Revzina collected a break in the fifth game and polished off the match with another in the ninth game to net her 16th consecutive singles victory and end the season with a team-leading 28-4 singles record, including a 20-2 mark in dual matches.

Near the time when Alexander and Revzina appeared in control of their singles matches, Benik seemed to swing the momentum Florida's way after she recovered from losing her first set against Andrea Remyse to go up a break, 3-2, in the second. Remyse, however, broke right back and the rest of the set was on-serve until the Bruin earned one final break in the 10th game to earn the 6-3, 6-4 decision and put UCLA back on top, 3-2.

Florida would need victories on the remaining two singles courts in order to pull off the dual match win and it looked like the Gators were in position on court No. 5, where freshman Marrit Boonstra had impressively forced a third set against Elizabeth Lumpkin. It was during that deciding set where the Bruin senior showed her experience and emerged with the clinching 6-4, 2-6, 6-2 victory that capped UCLA's win.

UF Upsets #3 Georgia Tech, 4-2

UF won the doubles point for the 26th time this season (every dual match), en route to upsetting third-seeded Georgia Tech, the defending NCAA champion, 4-2.

Florida won the crucial doubles point in thrilling fashion, before **Whitney Benik**, **Marrit Boonstra** and **Anastasia Revzina** provided singles victories to secure the Gators' spot in the semifinals for the 19th time in the last 22 years. Revzina won her 16th consecutive singles match, Benik collected her 99th career singles win and Boonstra defeated highest-ranked opponent in her career (No. 46).

The dual match victory also marked Florida's 799th in the 36-year history of the program.

UF Downs Vanderbilt, 4-1 in Rnd of 16

The Gators continued their doubles dominance and captured the initial point of the dual match, while riding the depth of their singles lineup to top Vanderbilt, 4-1. On the singles courts, Florida's depth came through with straight set wins, as **Whitney Benik**, **Anastasia Revzina** and **Marrit Boonstra** collected victories to help the Gators defeat the Commodores for the third time this season.

Gators Top Auburn 4-0 in Second Round

Florida advanced to the NCAA Championship Round of 16 for the 21st time in the last 22 years after posting a 4-0.

After gaining the momentum by winning the doubles point, Florida raced out to early leads on the singles courts, winning the first set at all six positions en route to collecting victories at the No. 4, 5 and 6 spots to cap its home season with an 11-0 record, the 18th undefeated home campaign in program history. Seniors **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan** made history in their final home match, as they ended their four-year tenure in Gainesville helping the Gators to a 53-0 record.

Marrit Boonstra set the tone on the No. 5 singles court, where she blitzed past Jil Hastenrath, 6-0, 6-1, nearly collecting her second consecutive double-bagel. Benik followed shortly afterwards with a 6-3, 6-0 victory over Whitney Chappell at the No. 4 position, as she earned her 97th career singles victory. Sophomore **Anastasia Revzina** then polished off the dual match with her 6-1, 6-3 victory over Dunja Djuranovic on court No. 6 to post her team-leading 14th consecutive singles victory and send the Gators to the NCAA Round of 16.

The Gators were equally impressive on the doubles courts, winning the initial point for the 24th time (every dual match this season), highlighted by the No. 3 pair of **Julia Cohen** and Revzina, who improved to 19-0 this year after defeating Djuranovic and Hastenrath, 8-1, in just 35 minutes.

UF Blanks Jacksonville in NCAA First Round

Florida showed little signs of rust from having a 19-day break since playing its last match, overpowering Jacksonville, 4-0, in the first round.

The Gators raced out to a quick 1-0 lead after collecting the doubles point, something they have accomplished in every dual match this season. During their NCAA opening round victory, the Gators received singles wins from freshmen **Marrit Boonstra** and **Julia Cohen**, before sophomore **Anastasia Revzina** polished off Florida's 52 consecutive home victory and its 22nd straight versus in-state foes. The win also improved the Gators overall record in NCAA Round of 64 matches to 10-0. Boonstra earned her fifth double-bagel victory in her young career, blanking Iva Jaresova in 56 minutes. Cohen followed four minutes later with an impressive 6-1, 6-0 decision over Lina Xu at the No. 1 spot. Revzina played a steady and determined final game to net her 13th consecutive singles win, downing Fernanda Carrero, 6-0, 6-1 on court No. 6.

On the doubles courts, UF's No. 1 pair collected the first decision, before **Csilla Borsanyi** and **Whitney Benik** clinched

the doubles points with an 8-2 win. Benik's victory was historic, as it marked her 200th combined singles and doubles win during her four-year Gator career, becoming the 16th player in program history to reach the plateau.

Perfection at Home in 2008

Florida's 4-0 victory over Auburn in the second round of the NCAA Championships capped an 11-0 home record and the program's 18th undefeated home season.

Super Senior Class at Home

Seniors **Whitney Benik** and **Lolita Frangulyan** helped Florida log a perfect 53-0 home record during their four-year career. The Gators' 4-0 win against Auburn in the NCAA Second Round marked their final home appearance and placed them in elite company, joining only the 1998 senior class of **Bonnie Bleecker** and **Dawn Buth** as the only other four-year class to go undefeated at home during their careers. Bleecker & Buth helped the Gators to a 44-0 home record from 1995-98.

Happy Hosts

Florida was one of 16 schools selected to play host to the first and second rounds of the NCAA Women's Tennis Championships, having served as a host site every year since the tournament expanded to its current format of 64 teams in 1999.

Home-Sweet-Home Streak

Florida capped the 2007-08 season extending its **overall home win streak to 53 matches**. The last loss was a 4-3 decision on May 15, 2004 against Miami in the second round of the NCAA Championships. The current streak is the second-longest of its kind in program history, trailing only the 60 in a row compiled from 1994-97.

Home Sweet Home vs. the SEC

Florida boasts a remarkable **145-1 all-time home record against SEC foes**. The Gator's lone home loss to a conference team was a 4-3 decision on April 7, 2002 when Georgia became the first - and still only - SEC team to earn a victory against UF in Gainesville. Florida had won an incredible 108 straight home matches prior to that setback.

20-20 Vision

UF's 4-2 victory over Vanderbilt in the semifinals of the SEC Tournament was the 20th win of the season, marking the 22nd straight year the Gators have won at least 20 matches in a season. The Gators have posted a total of 26 20-win seasons in the 36-year history of the program.

Florida vs. In-State Opponents

Florida owns a remarkable 180-32 record against in-state rivals and has reeled off **22 straight victories** against Sunshine State opponents, with the most recent a 4-0 win against Jacksonville in the 2008 NCAA First Round. The last loss was a 4-3 decision on May 15, 2004 against Miami in the second round of the NCAA Championships.

Frangulyan in Four

Senior **Lolita Frangulyan** received her bachelor's degree in criminology on May 3, 2008.

Regular-Season at Home

Through the end of the 2007-08 regular season, Florida had won **65 consecutive regular-season** (not including SEC Tournament or NCAA Championship) home matches. The Gators' last regular-season setback at Linder Stadium was on April 7, 2002, when Georgia defeated Florida, 4-3. The current streak is the second-longest of its kind in program history, trailing only the 71 in a row

compiled from 1994-2001.

UF Wins SEC Regular-Season Title

The Gators captured the SEC regular-season title for the 23rd time in the 29-year history the league has sponsored women's tennis. Florida's 2008 crown was the program's 17th time it has posted an undefeated league record (11-0).

Florida's 23 SEC titles are the most number of conference titles won by any other SEC women's program in any sport.

2008 SEC Tournament Recap

The Gators advanced to the final of the SEC Tournament, but lost a 4-3 heartbreaker to Georgia. That loss snapped the Gators' 17-match win streak, as the Bulldogs captured the league's postseason crown for the second consecutive year.

SEC Tournament Talk

*The Gators have won 15 of the 21 SEC Tournament titles (1982, '90, '91, '92, '93, '95, '96, '97, '98, '00, '02, '03, '04, '05 & '06). Georgia has claimed five crowns (1983, '94, 2001, '07 & '08), while Ole Miss captured the 1999 tournament.

*Florida boasts a **56-6 all-time record** in SEC Tournament action, with four of those losses coming against Georgia and the other to Ole Miss.

*Florida has been either the No. 1 or No. 2 seed in the SEC Tournament 20 times in the 21-year history of the event. The lone exception was in 2005, when the Gators entered the tournament with the No. 3 seed before winning the title.

*Florida has advanced to the finals of the SEC Tournament in 20 of the 21 years the event has been played, capturing 15 titles.

*In 2007, Florida's five-year reign as the Southeastern Conference Tournament champion came to an end, when the second-seeded Gators lost to top-seeded Georgia, 4-2, in the final.

*The 2006 title run was the first time the Gators swept every opponent to capture the crown.

*The Gators have won the SEC Tournament title in five of the seven years under head coach Roland Thornqvist., finishing runner-up in 2007.

*The 2001 event marked the first - and only - time the Gators failed to reach the title match, falling to Georgia in the semifinals.

Gator Great Jill Craybas Enters Hall of Fame

On April 11, 2008, former Gator great **Jill Craybas** was inducted into the Florida Athletics Hall of Fame. Craybas, who won the 1996 NCAA Singles title and guided the Gators to the team championship that season, became the 10th women's tennis representative in prestigious Hall of Fame, joining: **Judy Acker-Smith** (inducted 1993), **Nicole Arendt** (inducted 2001), **Jillian Alexander** (inducted 2002), **Head Coach Andy Brandt** (inducted 2006), **Cissie Donigan** (inducted 2006), **Andrea Farley** (inducted 2004), **Jill Hetherington** (inducted 1999), **Lisa Raymond** (inducted 2003) and **Shaun Stafford** (inducted 1999).

Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gators' **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories.**

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gators' **64-match regular-season home winning streak.**

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories.

Florida held a program-record **60-match overall HOME winning streak** until Stanford ended the run, 5-2, on May 23, 1999 in the final of the NCAA Championship, snapping a stretch that began during the 1993-94 season.

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of Whitney Laiho and Jessica Lehnhoff won a program-record **29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.
