The Pride of a Gator

There was not another team in the country during the 2008-09 season that played with more heart and got more passion and grit out of its team than the University of Florida.

Any year without a championship is considered a 'down' year for the Gators, who have grown accustomed to winning titles seemingly at will during its illustrious history. It's true, that the 2008-09 Florida squad ended its season without a crown and a few head-scratching results. Simply knowing the details of what the Gators endured throughout the course of the grueling year would make it easy to use those things as an excuse and state that every program has a down year once in a while. The 2008-09 Gators refused to let adversity stand in their way, as they played with as much heart and Gator pride as any team that has ever suited up.

In spite of everything, Florida still marched into the NCAA Championship round of 16, where it dropped a brilliant fight to the event's No. 2 seed. The Gators received the honor of playing host to one of the 16 NCAA Regional sites. Florida earned a first-round bye in the powerful Southeastern Conference Tournament and made its way into the semifinal round.

The drive of each player to improve their individual game was remarkable. Junior **Marrit Boonstra** played the No. 5 and No. 6 spots in the previous season's dual match lineup and played just two matches at the No. 4 position. She emerged in 2008-09 as UF's No. 1 singles player and rocketed up the national rankings to a career-high No. 5, as she compiled a team-best 36 singles wins, along with a team-leading 28 doubles wins. She tallied a 21-4 dual match record and earned All-America honors.

A similar story could be told about fellow junior **Anastasia Revzina**, who traded off with Boonstra last year at the No. 5 and 6 positions. In 2008-09, Revzina took her game to another level and anchored the No. 2 spot, where she posted a 15-5 record and earned a berth into the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships.

Only two other players remained healthy enough to become mainstays in the lineup: freshmen **Joanna Mather** and **Jessica Alexander**. Mather began her collegiate career losing her first four singles matches, but her trust in Head Coach **Roland Thornqvist** and Associate Head Coach **Dave Balogh** was unwavering, as she continued to learn and followed those opening matches by finishing the year winning 23 of her final 29 contests, while playing the No. 3 spot in the lineup, where she was 9-1 versus SEC foes.

Alexander enrolled at UF in January of 2009 and had little time to adjust to college life on and off the court. She too, however, rolled up her sleeves and produced a 19-6 record,

with all of those matches coming in dual match action.

Along with oft-injured freshman **Barbara Pinterova** and late-season walk-ons **Brooke Allen** and **Lauren Wolken**, the 2008-09 Gators fought for every point and somehow managed to walk off Linder Stadium at Ring Tennis Complex with an unblemished 13-0 record, fending off the likes of No. 2 Georgia, No. 15 Tennessee and No. 18 Florida State to keep several home win streaks intact.

Florida may not have added trophies to its case during the year, but the 2008-09 squad played with a heart of a champion and the pride of a Gator.

Home-Sweet-Home Streak

Florida completed its 2008-09 home slate sporting an **overall program-record 66-match home win streak**, including **13 wins in postseason play** (SEC and NCAA Tournament). The Gators set a new standard with their 6-1 victory over Mississippi State on March 29, 2009. The previous record was the 60-match home winning streak that stretched from the 1993-94 season until May 23, 1999, when Stanford halted the run in the final of the NCAA Championship.

The last time the Gators fell at home came on May 15, 2004, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to Miami (Fla.), 4-3.

Perfection at Home - for the 19th Time

The Gators' 4-2 victory over Florida State in the NCAA second round capped the 19th undefeated home season in program history. Florida compiled a 13-0 record this year at the Ring Tennis Complex.

Regular-Season at Home

Florida has **won 77 consecutive regular-season** (not including SEC Tournament or NCAA Championship) home matches through the 2008-09 regular-season.

The Gators last regular-season setback at Linder Stadium was on April 7, 2002, when Georgia defeated Florida, 4-3.

The **current streak is the longest of its kind in program history**, recently passing the 71 in a row compiled from 1994-2001. The record-tying victory was a thrilling 4-3 upset win over then-No. 2 Georgia on March 13, while the record-breaker was a 5-2 upset against then-No. 15 Tennessee on March 15.

UF vs. SEC at the Ring Complex

The Gators sport an incredible **147-1 record all-time at home** against SEC opponents, which includes all regular-season and postseason matches. The only team that has managed to escape Gainesville with a victory is Georgia, as the second-ranked Lady Bulldogs won the hard-fought 4-3 decision on April 7, 2002.

When junior **Megan Alexander** became unable to perform following UF's Feb. 13 match against UCLA, the Gators were forced to look on campus for assistance in completing their lineup.

Four Earn Bids to NCAA Singles & Doubles Championships
Jessica Alexander, Marrit Boonstra, Joanna Mather and Anastasia Revzina were selected to compete in the NCAA Women's Tennis Singles and Doubles Championships.

Boonstra and Revzina earned spots in the 64-player singles draw as well as in the 32-team doubles field, where Boonstra paired with Mather and Revzina joined Alexander on the court for the six-day event that got underway May 20 at Texas A&M University's George P. Mitchell Tennis Center in College Station, Texas.

Boonstra, the nation's eighth-ranked singles player, made her debut in the singles portion of the NCAA's individual tournament, and marched into the quarterfinal round, as her path included a 7-5, 6-1 Round of 16 win over Stanford's seventh-ranked Hilary Barte.

Revzina, who entered the singles event ranked No. 40, competed for the first time in the NCAA Singles and Doubles Championships, but dropped her opening-round contest in both.

Mather paired with Boonstra on the doubles court, where the tandem upset North Carolina's No. 4-ranked team of Grabinski

and Marand, 6-2, 6-2, before falling in a tough three-setter in the second round.

This was the first time since 2005 two Florida teams has been selected for the doubles tournament.

Florida Wins ITA Postseason Attendance Challenge

In the ITA Postseason Attendance Race, Florida posted the highest overall total attendance (812 fans) and the highest overall average (406 per match) than any other women's program that hosted a 2009 NCAA Regional site. The 490 fans who attended the NCAA First Round match against College of Charleston was the second-highest individually attended postseason match, while the 322 fans who attended the May 10th NCAA Second Round battle against Florida State ranked third among all women's programs in 2009.

Incredible Gator Streaks

On March 5, 2000, fifth-ranked Wake Forest upset Florida 5-4 in Winston-Salem, N.C., snapping the Gators' **regular-season dual match winning streak at 114 consecutive victories.**

Stanford ended Florida's program-record **overall dual match winning streak at 62 matches**, claiming a 5-1 decision on May 18, 1997 in the final of the NCAA Championship held in Palo Alto, Calif.

March 28, 2001 was a bitter cold and windy evening at the Ring Tennis Complex, where No. 5 Florida lost 4-1 to No. 2 Duke, a defeat that snapped the Gators' **64-match regular-season home winning streak.**

Florida boasted a remarkable **108-0 all-time home record against SEC opponents** until April 7, 2002, when No. 2 Georgia handed the Gators a 4-3 setback.

The Gators had won **69 consecutive dual matches against SEC opponents** until No. 8 Ole Miss upset Florida with a 5-4 decision on April 25, 1999 in the final of the SEC Tournament. The loss also snapped an overall win streak of 53 straight dual match victories.

Lisa Raymond ended her collegiate career on a **44-match singles win streak**, capturing a pair of NCAA titles.

The Gator doubles team of Whitney Laiho and Jessica Lehnhoff won a program-record **29 consecutive doubles matches** during the 2000-01 season.

ACTIVE STREAKS entering 2009-10 season

Florida has **won 77 consecutive regular-season** (not including SEC Tournament or NCAA Championship) home matches through the 2008-09 regular-season.

The Gators last regular-season setback at Linder Stadium was on April 7, 2002, when Georgia defeated Florida, 4-3.

The **current streak is the longest of its kind in program history**, recently passing the 71 in a row compiled from 1994-2001. The record-tying victory was a thrilling 4-3 upset win over then-No. 2 Georgia on March 13, while the record-breaker was a 5-2 upset against then-No. 15 Tennessee on March 15.

Florida sports an **overall program-record 66-match home win streak**, including **13 wins in postseason play** (SEC and NCAA Tournament). The Gators set a new standard with their 6-1 victory over Mississippi State on March 29, 2009. The previous record was the 60-match home winning streak that stretched from the 1993-94 season until May 23, 1999, when Stanford halted the run in the final of the NCAA Championship.

The last time the Gators fell at home came on May 15, 2004, in the second round of the NCAA Tournament to Miami (Fla.), 4-3.
