## 2001 Florida Track and Field Year in Review ...

The men's and women's track teams will look to build on a wealth of experience.

### Men's Review ...

Looking for a word to describe the University of Florida 2001 men's track season? Try this one ... Roller Coaster. Okay, its two words, but you get the idea.

For what its worth, take a quick look at how the Gators rose, fell and then rose again in the 19 weekly polls released by Trackwire. The preseason ranking had the Gators No. 7. Almost a month later, they were 24th before they began to rise again. Another slight dip in the poll led to dropping out of it for the first time since 1997 only a week before the NCAA Indoor Championships. After the indoor national meet, a steady rise began that had the Gators peaking as the outdoor season approached.

Bayano Kamani had the time to beat in the first heat. It will take a time better than 46.20 to win.

By the second weekend of March, the battle line had been drawn and Florida was not about to roll over and pack it in for the year. The un-ranked Gators had all the necessary components of a sleeping giant waiting to wake up from its slumber. Thirteen members of the team were accepted into the NCAA Championship meet held in Fayetteville, Ark., third most among all Division I teams.

It started out to look like the skeptics were going to be right. Aaron Armstrong didn't advance

### Women's Review ...

As it turns out, the 2001 season for the Florida women's track team was pretty good. Looking at the roster at the beginning of the year, one might think that might not be the case. With only four seniors on the team, only one of them an All-American and one other an SEC Champion, the first thought might be to throw this season in the rebuilding scrap heap and wait until next year. That would have been easy to do, but it's not what happened. Instead, head coach Tom Jones led his athletes to a pair of second place finishes at the Southeastern Conference Championships and a return to the Top 20 in the national ranks.

Perhaps the biggest indicator that the season was better than expected was the fact that the Gators were ranked in each of Trackwire's 17 weekly polls for the sixth straight year, reaching as high as fifth prior to the NCAA Indoor Championships, a feat that is matched by only a handful of other schools. For a team that was as young as Florida was, an eight-week climb from its preseason ranking of No. 24 to the No. 5 spot only a week before the national championship meet may have been out of the question. Nobody told the Gators as they hit the ground running and didn't let up until the final race of the season at the NCAA Championships.

to the 60m final and Rickey Harris, the reigning High School Athlete of the Year, didn't make the final of the 60m hurdles.

The 400m final would come down to two athletes ... Rickey Harris was in lane six, Andrew Pierce in lane four.

Armstrong came back to make the final of the 200m, finishing fifth in 20.84 to earn four points for the team. Freshman Moise Joseph was about to unleash what would turn into a season-long binge on middle distance runners around the nation. Joseph, an automatic qualifier for this meet, ran a perfect race in Saturday's 800m final. Joseph got out fast. The only thing was, so did everyone else. He finished in a time of 1:47.72, third fastest at the school, but only fifth today, another four points for the team.

The 4x400m relay team finished sixth. Still, its three points helped. Joseph returned to action on the distance medley relay team with Geno White, Ali Abiola and Chris Duncan. Joseph went out fast again, handing off to White in second place. White held on to second and gave to Abiola who handed to Duncan for the mile leg. With Stanford on its way to the win, Duncan was battling Arkansas for second. At the line, Arkansas was second and Florida was third.

The real story of Florida's indoor championship was Harris. The talented rookie surprised everyone and won the 400m title in a school record time that was third fastest in the world this season. His 10 points gave the Gators, left for dead only a week prior, a seventh-place team finish and a wake up call for the beginning of the outdoor season. Everyone else had caught on that this team meant business.

At the gun, both got out fast, Pierce was perhaps a step or two faster to make up the stagger to be a half stride ahead at the break to the rail.

Outdoor season was upon everyone no sooner than you could blink. At the Florida Relays, the Gators won 12 events. Included in that was all five relay teams going undefeated. Among others, Stephen Jones won both the collegiate and invitational 110m hurdles and Matt Vincent began an impressive season run with a win in the collegiate high jump. This year's Florida Relays, although rain-soaked, were indeed a success.

The Gators didn't let up as the relay festival season hit full stride. At the Sea Ray Relays, the shuttle hurdle relay team set the school record with its win. Harris, Paul Brown, Dan Butler and Jones ran 54.93, the third fastest time in history by any team. Six NCAA qualifiers

were registered at the meet. Among them was Harris and the 4x400m relay. Maurice Lewis posted a provisional qualifier in the long jump.

With 250 meters to go, Francique was attempting to be a factor. He wouldn't be on this day. It was down to Harris and Pierce. One lap to go.

The polls continued to take notice. There was still time as the the end of April approached.

Florida had competed in just about every Penn Relay carnival since the team's inception in 1923. Perhaps never before had Florida done as well as it would do in 2001. There were a total of seven "Championship of America" relay plaques up for grabs at the beginning of

the week. At the end of the week, officials were packing two of them for shipment to Gainesville. The sprint medley relay team of Harris, Armstrong, White and Joseph ran a school record time of 3:13.21. The same 2001 four-some teamed up again for the 4x400m relay. Harris ran a 44.8 split on the final lap to run down both LSU and Auburn for the win. And he wasn't finished. He won the 400m hurdles in a time of 49.83.

Coming out of the final turn, Harris made his move. The two were side by side into the home stretch.

Florida was one of seven SEC teams to be ranked in the top eight of the national poll when the conference

championship hit. At No. 5, the Gators were looking up at Arkansas, LSU and Tennessee in positions two through four. The 2001 SEC team race was wide open. Everyone was talking about Arkansas, Tennessee and LSU, forgetting about the Gators. Florida just went out and took care of its business.

In the end, it was Harris that won the only title for the Gators, the 400m hurdles. Senior Mike King was third to give Florida 16 points in the event. Joseph was second in the 1,500m and then came back 30 minutes later to finish second behind the eventual national champion in the 800m. Joseph's time of 1:46.58 was third at Florida, second in the nation and would end the season as the sec-

ond fastest time by an American in the world. Vincent was second in the high jump with a height that exceeded everyone's expectations except his own. Add in the other events and Florida ended up with a total of 107.5 points. A good meet, but not as good as it could have been. But, it was good enough for a second place finish behind Tennessee. People were talking about Florida now.

At the tape, the senior from Ohio State leaned while the freshman from Florida kept his stride. It was too close to call.

Now getting the respect it deserved all season, Florida was set for the national championships. Since the beginning of the outdoor season, Florida had been ranked

in the Top 10. A slow, steady climb now had the Gators at the No. 4 slot. After the last chance meets were finished and the final list of accepted athletes was announced, Florida was projected to finish fifth at the NCAA meet in Eugene, Ore. All that was left now was to make the cross-country trip and take care of business ... again.

Pierce and Francique stood together as the sellout crowd of 5,350 waited. Harris paced.


Florida had nine athletes that were competing, seven of them and, its relay team, were ranked among the Top 10. The relay team was undefeated on the outdoor season, having beaten three of the top six teams head to head and two Gators were ranked in the top three of their events. They were competing on hollowed ground, the same Hayward Field that was a Mecca of their sport. If the planets weren't aligned, then at least luck could have been on their side.

As it turns out, the only thing that Florida had going for it was that the meet would eventually end. First there was Armstrong not making the 200m final. Then there was Joseph running his second fastest time of the season and not making the final, then Vincent blowing out at the second height of the high jump. Jones, perhaps the hardest worker of anyone on the team, breezed through his preliminary heat of the high hurdles in a personal best time only to hit the first hurdle of his semifinal heat. He couldn't negotiate the second and didn't finish. To top it all off, the mile-relay team, old reliable, was never a factor in the preliminaries..

On the brighter side, White was third in the 400m dash, coming in first among American athletes. Harris managed a seventh place performance in the 400m hurdles. And Lewis, the man projected to finish 14th or lower in the long jump was eighth, giving Florida its first point.

Jones would recover. Two weeks after the NCAA meet, he returned home to his native Barbados to compete in his national championships. Jones won the title and will compete in the World Championships.

Pierce: 45.779. Harris: 45.775. Pierce's head dropped as Harris started his victory lap. Officially: 45.78, school record, third fastest in the world, National Champion.

The Florida Gators saw some of the highest peaks and the lowest valleys this season. The memories of Harris winning his national title or Joseph stunning the track world with his middle distance ability will far outweigh the visions of Vincent hitting the bar for the third time or the painful image of Jones tumbling over his hurdle. Things will only get better. Look at it this way, from this point, they can't get much worse.

## Women's Review (cont.) ...

Florida's run to a 9-0 dual meet record began at the indoor SEC Quad meet on the same Arkansas track that the NCAA Championships would be run. At that meet, junior transfer Keyon Soley made her mark as a Gator. The defending NCAA Champion in the indoor long jump, this former UCLA Bruin soared to 20-11.75. The mark was good enough for an automatic NCAA qualifying mark and was far enough to beat the nine-year old school record. Seven other Gators won events at the scored meet, which Florida won going away.

There was a seamless segway from the trip to Hog Town back to the friendly confines of the O'Connell Center for the Gator Invitational. Traditionally a strong meet, the Gator Invitational has been the place where many national leaders, not to mention NCAA qualifiers, have been posted. For the Gators, rookie Candice Scott was both a double-winner and a double-qualifier. Her shot put of 49-0.75 would not get her to the national meet later in the season, but her weight throw mark of 61-8.5--which she would later improve on by nearly two feet--would stamp her ticket to the championships. On this day, those marks won her a pair of medals on the winner's platform.

At the SEC Championships, run at the University of Kentucky for the first time since 1996, Florida went in as the No. 6 team in the country. With two SEC teams (Arkansas, No. 2 and South Carolina, No. 3) ahead of it, UF came out with the runner-up trophy. A rather quiet Day 2 led to a second day that saw the Gators win two events and finish second in several more. Kamille Bratton won the 800m with her twin sister Kristina a close second. Melissa DeLeon and Nona Allen also finished among the top five scoring 27 points in that one event, more than five teams would the whole weekend. Kamille Bratton's win was Florida's sixth consecutive conference crown in the indoor 800m. Scott would also add to the trophy case with a win in the weight throw while the 4x400m team was busy automatically qualifying for nationals.

Florida's third trip to Arkansas in a little over a month had some bigger stakes. This meet was for the National Championship. Florida had 13 athletes make the trip, the most of any school in the nation. Soley wouldn't defend her title in the long jump, but she would still earn All-America honors. Yolanda Thompson also earned the same honor in the triple jump. Three of the four members of the distance medley relay team would earn their first All-America honors as the team itself would finish fifth with the fifth fastest time in the world this season. Perhaps Florida's best story of the

meet was in the shortest race of them all. Quiet freshman Niki Benjamin surprised the field with a runner-up performance in the 60m dash. Benjamin ran 7.30 in her semifinal heat, which put her in among the top three in University history. She ran 7.31 in the final and was edged out by Jacksonville's Monique Tubbs who ran 7.29. Benjamin's eight points went a long way in Florida's hard-earned 12th place finish.

Two more wins were tagged on to the dual meet record with an easy win at the outdoor-season opening SEC Triangular. Eight wins were recorded by Gators including provisional qualifiers by Soley, Scott and Erin Merten. Now, with the proper momentum, the Gators

went into the 58th annual Florida Relays with all pistons firing. Another eight wins were recorded, including a perfect five-for-five in relay races. The 4x400m relay team ran a time of 3:32.74, automatically qualifying it for the NCAA meet in Eugene, Ore., in late May.

In the collegiate division of the hammer throw, Jukina Dickerson was getting warmed up for what would become one of the best stretches a thrower at Florida has ever seen. Dickerson won the collegiate hammer with a provisional mark of 191-9. However, she wasn't even close to being finished for the year. The Florida Women's Track and Field Challenge, held the very next weekend, would be where Dickerson turned in

## Of Note from the 2001 Season ...

### ◆ What a Weekend ...

The University of Florida track programs had one the most successful Penn Relays weekends ever. There were a total of 16 "Championship of America" Relay plaques given out between men's and women's teams. Five of them went to Florida. The men's team won the sprint medley relay in a school record time, the women's 4x100m relay team tied for the national lead with its win and women's sprint medley team also won. On the final day of the festival, the women's 4x800m team scored a win only to be followed up by the men's 4x400m title.

### ◆ Anchors Aweigh ...

After anchoring both the 4x800m and sprint medley relay teams to victories at the Penn Relays, junior **Erin Merten** was named the women's MVP of the Penn Relays. She led Florida to a 8:24.25 in the 4x800m race and then ran the 800m leg of the sprint medley relay to lead the team to a 3:43.22 finish.

### ◆ Ranking in History

The Florida women's 4x100m relay time of 43.43 not only puts it in a tie for the national lead with LSU, but it also ranks second all-time at Florida and is the third fastest time in the 107-year history of the Penn Relays. The women's sprint medley relay team ranks fourth in Penn Relays history.

### ◆ Man on The Move

Over the past six weeks of the season, senior hurdler **Stephen Jones** improved his standing in the 110m hurdles. At the Sea Ray Relays, Jones ran an automatic qualifying time of 13.68. He began his qualifying run at the Florida Relays with a 13.84. Then at the Yellow Jacket Invitational he ran 13.81 which led to a 13.68. His Florida-best 13.64 from the preliminaries of the NCAA Championships, he ran 13.64.

### ◆ King of the List ...

Senior sprinter on the men's team **Geno White** was named the SEC Athlete of the Week for March 19-26. White is the first Gator athlete, male or female to win the

award since the cross country season last fall. With her 2:05.86 800m at the Sea Ray Relays, **Kristina Bratton** was named the SEC Athlete of the Week for April 17. Bratton finished .05 seconds ahead of her sister, Kamille and was ranked ninth in the nation in the event. After automatically qualifying for the NCAA Championships in the 400m intermediate hurdles, **Rickey Harris** was named the SEC Athlete of the Week for May 1-7. Harris finished in 49.83 at the Penn Relays ranking him second in the nation and top in the SEC at the time.

### ◆ 'I'm Honored'

Florida's women's head coach, Tom Jones was named the South Region Indoor track Coach of the Year by the United States Track Coaches Association (USTCA). Jones has now been so honored for five straight indoor seasons, dating back to the 1997 season. Jones was presented his award at the coaches banquet prior to the NCAA Championships.

### ◆ It's A Boy!!!

Associate Head Coach for the Florida men's team **Mike Holloway** and his wife Angela celebrated the birth of their first child on April 10. **Michael "MJ" Dwayne Holloway II** was born at 7:54 p.m., weighing in at seven pounds.

### ◆ A League of His Own

**Rickey Harris** was the only male, out of 271 competitors at the NCAA Indoor Championships, to be entered in four events. He was a qualifier in the 60m hurdles, the 400m dash, which he ended up winning, the 4x400m relay and was a member of the qualifying team of the distance medley relay. Harris scored 13 points for the Gators over the weekend.

### ◆ International Flavor

**Ebony Shotwell** ran 11.67 into a headwind to win the USATF Jr. National Championship and qualify her for the team that will take on Ireland and Scotland in dual meet competition in August. **Mason Cathey** was second in the 1,500m also earning a spot on the team.

her best. On her second throw of the competition, she let loose on a throw that looked like it was never coming down. It did ... 204-feet, one-inch later, a new school record by eight feet. She went on to win six hammer throws on the year, all consecutively. In the end, she had the six of the top eight hammer throws in school history and became only the second Florida hammer thrower to compete at the NCAA Championships.

The midpoint of the outdoor season saw another thrower get into a groove. Kimberli Barrett posted an NCAA qualifier in the shot put at the UTEP Invitational. Later in the season she would improve to


51-4.5 to solidify her spot in the title meet. Ebony Shotwell, a freshman sprinter like Benjamin, would also hit her stride as a member of the 4x100m relay and individually in the 100m. Shotwell won the Gator Twi-Light 100m with a personal best 11.33, ranking her fourth in Florida annals and giving her the confidence she needed.

The Penn Relays were celebrating its 107th anniversary. Florida has been competing in the carnival since the team's inception in 1973. Before 2001, no Gator team had ever won three "Championship of America" relay plaques. The sprint medley and 4x800m relay teams both won with Merten as the anchor legs. Her

efforts were not overlooked, as she was selected the Most Outstanding Performer of all female competitors. The third winning relay team was the 4x100m relay. Amber Robinson was the leadoff runner, Shotwell second, Soley was third and Benjamin was the anchor leg. Together the four got the stick around the track in the final in 43.43 seconds, tying the national lead. That time would stand as the country's fastest for the rest of the season. A promising fact for Gator fans is that all four members return for next season.

All aspects of a track and field team paced Florida's second place finish in the SEC Championships. Florida got a champion in the pole vault with Megan Westfall's school, meet and track record. Florida got another heap of points in the 800m, with Allen winning her first career title and four others in the top eight. Thompson, Barrett, Dickerson and Merten all posted second-place finishes in their specialty events. Even the SEC Cross Country Freshman of the Year added to the point total, Hilary White set a school record in the 3,000m steeplechase, a new event this year.

In the end, the Gators were set for the NCAA Championships at the University of Oregon. Florida had both its relays ranked in the top five with the 400-meter relay tied for first, its hammer thrower in the Top 10, three participants in the 800m, two long jumpers--one of them doubling as a triple jumper--and a participant in each of the three short sprints. However, bad luck and injuries plagued the Gators all week. Kamille Bratton fell in both heats of the 800m and the long season had taken its toll on both relay teams, each finishing no higher than fifth. Gator track fans saw the bright futures of Thompson and Dickerson as they both earned All-America certificates in the three events they were entered. Merten would add an honor of her own in the 800m to cap a stellar junior year. In the end it was a 20th place finish for the Gators, an improvement from 30th in 2000.

If this still looks like a bad year for the Florida women's track team, look deeper. It wasn't even a rebuilding year. It was a year that had the ups and downs of any season, but it was also one that sets up well for the years to come. 

## Of Note ... Continued ...

◆ **"True" National Champion**  
Stephen Jones ran 13.66 into a headwind to win the Barbados National Championship in the 110m hurdles and qualify for the IAAF World Championships to be run in August.

◆ **Ready For Launch**  
Florida's shuttle hurdle relay team of Rickey Harris, Paul Brown, Dan Butler and Stephen Jones has won its two races this season, both coming in school record times. At the Sea Ray Relays, the Gators' time of 54.93 was the third fastest time ever recorded (behind Tennessee 54.40, 1981 and Clemson 54.90, 1998). In the first race, run at the Florida Relays, the Gators defeated defending champion Clemson by running a time of 55.35. At the Sea Ray Relays, the Gators bettered that record again with a time of 54.93 for the win.

◆ **The Final Word on the Indoor Season**  
In the final world rankings for the 2001 indoor season, one individual and two relay teams rank in the Top 5 of their respective events. Rickey Harris' indoor national championship run of 45.78 ranked him third in the world behind Andrew Pierce, the man he defeated in the title race and Great Britain's D. Chaines. Florida's distance medley relay teams also ranked in the Top 5. The men's team of Moise Joseph, Geno White, Ali Abiola and Chris Duncan ran 9:34.51 at the NCAA Championships to finish third. The women's DMR team of Kamille Bratton, Amber Robinson, Nona Allen and Erin Merten ran 11:16.68 at the NCAA Championships, good enough for fifth on the planet.

◆ **All Hail Hilary**  
Gainesville's own Hilary White was named the SEC Cross Country Female Freshman of the Year by the conference's coaches. White was the University of Florida's top finisher in all but one race this season. She tallied three Top 10 finishes in her first three races and was one spot shy of earning All-SEC honors. White was the top freshman finisher at the SEC Championships in October and was

the top freshman from the SEC to finish at the NCAA Regional Championships.

◆ **Power Surge**  
Both of Florida's track teams are in the Top 15 of the outdoor Track and Field Power Rankings. The rankings can be found at the following web site:  
<http://team-power.org>

The web site allows anyone to view and print each team's ranking form. The rankings are based on the team's top two athletes in each event. Both Florida's men's and women's teams ranked at the top of the list in the Indoor Track and Field Team Power Rankings, making them the 2001 Indoor Power Rankings Champions.

◆ **One for the Thumb ... Plus One**  
Kamille Bratton's SEC championship in the 800m indoors gave Florida six consecutive titles in the event. A streak that dates back to 1996, thanks in large part to Hazel Clark, the Florida women's team has won six consecutive indoor 800m championships. Two athletes from Arkansas won the 5,000m six consecutive years from 1992-1997 for the longest such streak in any event.

◆ **Candi Girl**  
Candice Scott had a freshman season most athletes dream about (or at least a half season). A freshman from Trinidad, she won her first Southeastern Conference championship with a 61-6.5 weight throw. She was a double winner in the weight throw and the shot put at the Florida Intercollegiate. Her marks in were good enough to provisionally qualify her for the NCAA championships in both events. She had surgery to repair the ACL in her knee in late March and is out for the remainder of the season.

◆ **"Soley" Survivor**  
A transfer from UCLA, Keyon Soley came to Florida as the defending NCAA champion in the indoor long jump. Her 20-11.75 win in the long jump at the SEC Quad on Jan. 19 was one centimeter over the NCAA automatic standard and beat Dionne Rose's nine-year old record by two inches.

## Clutch Performances and Near Misses ...

One of the attributes of a good team in any sport is its ability to deliver in the clutch. The 2000 University of Florida men's cross country had plenty of chances to do just that when crunch time hit. The end result was a return to the top three of the conference and a stunning performance at the national regional meet that provided equally stunning results.

At the early September Nike Twi-Light Invitational Chris Duncan took the lead at the starting gun and never looked back until the season ended in November. Duncan led the charge of five Gators that all recorded sub-21 minute times on the four-mile course. Duncan recorded his first-career victory in a new four-mile personal best time. Rolando Ortiz and Rob Evans finished third and fourth overall respectively to help the Gators to the win. Freshman Carlos Hinojosa was the fourth Gator to cross, kick-starting him to a successful first year.

Duncan made it two for two with his second win the next week at the Volunteer Invitational. Evans finished sixth overall and second for the team and Ortiz was close behind with a seventh place finish. Those three Top 10 finishes were not enough to lift Florida to the win, coming in second behind the Naval Academy.

A week off helped the Gators get back into the win column at the Gator Invitational. Duncan completed the hat trick winning again from wire to wire. Duncan obliterated the field and shaved over 42 seconds off his previous 8,000-meter personal best. His time was the third fastest ever on the Florida course by a Gator athlete. Evans and Ortiz completed the one-two-three sweep for the Gators and lifted them to a blowout win. Twenty five points was all Florida needed to overtake the other 14 teams.

After another week off, Florida headed north for the Wolverine Interregional. The temperature in Ann Arbor, Mich., normally in the 30's and 40's in mid-October, was an unseasonably warm 65. Florida, the only team south of Tennessee at the meet would have a distinct advantage, but that was not

the case. The Gators struggled on the hilly course and finished ninth out of the 12 teams. Duncan kept his team lead, but he finished in 16th place overall.

While the team went north, Evans went west... very west. Evans left the team for two races to pursue a childhood dream of participating in the Paralympic Games in Sydney, Australia. He ran the 1,500 and the 5,000 meters and won gold medals in both events. Added to that, he set world Paralympic records in both events.

The second race that Evans missed was the SEC championship race. The six Gators that made the trip knew they would have to step up their game in order to make up the talent lost by Evans. Duncan and Ortiz both finished in the top 15 to earn All-SEC honors, the first of their careers. Donnell Bowen ran only a few seconds off of his personal best to finish third for the team while Courtney Chambers came through with a

21st-place finish. Hinojosa, running in his first collegiate championship race, was the final Florida scorer in 40th place. The team had run one of the best races of the season and helped lift it back into its rightful place in the top three of the conference.

Two weeks passed before the Gators returned to the same course in Tuscaloosa, Ala., for the NCAA south region championship. This time, with a full battery of runners, Florida was expecting a good race, a team finish in the top two and an automatic berth in the NCAA championships. What Florida got was a perfect race. Three Gators earned All-South honors and all five scorers were in the top 35. When the final score was tallied, Florida had a stunning 78 points to show for it. What was even more stunning, was that two teams finished ahead of it, thus knocking the Gators out of the national meet. Duncan's seventh place finish was good enough to qualify him for the NCAA meet as an individual, but the team had to stay in Gainesville.

After falling at the 800-meter mark of the championship race, Duncan gathered himself to finish 174th overall. He was trampled by several runners and ended up needing six stitches to close a cut following the race.

With only one senior graduating this spring, the future is bright for the Gators. A talented freshman class will help out and complement an already experienced core of upperclassmen in 2001.

## Youth Movement for Gator Harriers ...

If there were any questions as to just how young the 2000 University of Florida women's cross country team was going to be, try this on for size: of the top six runners, three were freshmen, two were juniors and only one was a senior. That said, all that was left was for the Gators to roll over and use the youth excuse for its shortcomings. Only one thing, there were no shortcomings.

Sure, they did not make the NCAA championships for the first time in three years and they finished outside the top three of the conference for the first time in six, but in a conference like the SEC those were hardly shortcomings.

Florida's youth came shining through in the early evening hours of Sept. 7 at the Nike Twi-Light Invitational. Freshman Hilary White was second overall and was the first Gator to cross the finish line. Erin Merten and Nona Allen took third and fourth places overall while Mason Cathey and Kelly Walker, two more first-years, finished out the scoring for the Gators. The end result was a first-place finish in a meet that got everyone's feet wet.

Even though there were not as many teams, the Volunteer Invitational also served a good purpose. The Gators came out on top of that one with almost the exact same lineup doing the scoring. Only Allen and Merten changed places and Eliana Lopez, the lone senior on the team, jumped to the No. 5 position.

The "B" team kept the status quo by taking first place at the Jacksonville Track Club Invitational on Sept. 22. Alicia Weber, a sophomore transfer student from Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, ran her way to a fifth overall finish and earned the SEC's Athlete of the Week award. Both the "A" and "B" teams were back in action the next weekend at the final home meet of the season. A total of 14 Gator participants ran in the first 6,000-meter race in Florida history. White was third overall and was followed by Merten in fourth place and Allen in seventh. Walker earned her second career Top 10 finish by finishing ninth and Cathey finished 12th overall to complete the scoring. A total

of 24 points was enough to win the Gator Invitational for the 12th time in the 13-year history of the event.

Weber led the "B" team to a seventh-place finish at the Disney Classic on Oct. 7. She was followed by Melissa DeLeon and Marisa Kenyon for the top three Gator scorers. A week later, the "A" team was back in action, finishing fourth at the Furman Invitational. White kept her strangle hold on the team's top spot. Allen and Merten continued their battle for the second runner, finishing third and fourth on the team. The fourth-place finish was a good tune-up for the postseason run.

Florida took the course in Tuscaloosa, Ala., for the SEC championships having not finished any lower than third place in the conference meet since 1994. The Gators, champions of the league in 1996 and 1997, were outrun by three other teams. Arkansas won the title followed by Georgia as a surprise second team. Auburn slipped in front

of the Gators into third place. White was 16th overall, one place shy of earning All-SEC honors. Merten finished second for the team and 19th overall while Walker came through with a Top 25 performance of her own to help the Florida cause. Even though it was not the finish it was looking for, Florida got the experience it badly needed with the NCAA regional meet upcoming in two weeks on the exact same course.

The Gators returned to Alabama for the South Regional championships two short weeks after the conference meet. Merten finally broke through and took the top team spot from White. She finished 16th overall and finished one position out of the all-region awards just as White had missed the all-conference honor. Following White was Allen and Walker. Weber finished out the scoring for the Gators. All seven runners that made the trip improved their times from the previous week and three of them recorded new 6k-personal bests.

Despite the top individual performances at the regional meet, the Gators' season ended two places shy of a berth in the NCAA championship meet. The season wasn't a total loss, the young Florida team gained experience that will only help it as it continues to grow into a contender.
