Records: K-State is 20-10 and 11-9 in the Big 12. Florida A&M is 22-5 overall and are the champions of the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference. Florida is 30-2 overall and champions of the SEC. Florida Atlantic is 29-2 overall and are the champions of the Atlantic Sun Conference.

Series: This is Kansas State's first meeting with Florida A&M. The Wildcats are 0-3 against Florida with the last meeting against the Gators coming in 2004 at the Coca-Cola Invitational in Minneapolis. The Wildcats are 1-0 in the only match-up with the Owls of Florida Atlantic.

Opening Serve

Kansas State (20-10, 11-9 Big 12) will head south to Gainesville, Fla., to begin its 10th consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The Wildcats will take on Florida A&M on Thursday, Dec. 1 at 5 p.m. (ET). K-State has been assigned to the Omaha Region and will play on the campus of the University of Florida at the O'Connell Center.

If K-State advances, they will face the winner of Florida/Florida Atlantic on Friday, Dec. 2 at 7 p.m. (ET).

At a Glance: Kansas State

The Wildcats enter the NCAA Tournament on the heels of its seventh straight 20-win season and on a two-match and six-game win streak. K-State is under the guidance of fifth-year head coach Suzie Fritz, who is the second winningest coach in Wildcat volleyball history with 111 victories. Fritz guided K-State to the 2003 Big 12 Conference title and has advanced K-State to at least the second round in her four previous trips to the NCAA Tournament.

On the floor, Kansas State is led by senior outside hitter and 2005 All-Big 12 First Team selection Agata Rezende, junior outside hitter Sandy Werner and junior middle blocker Joy Hamlin. Rezende, a product of Franca, Brazil, leads the Wildcats in kills with 415 on the year (3.71/game) She has tallied double-figures in kills in 24 of 30 matches this season. Rezende has also provided a defensive lift, tabulating 106 total blocks (0.95/game) to rank third on the squad.

Werner is second in kills with 363 (3.46/game) this season. The Topeka, Kan., native has 709 kills for her career.

Hamlin is third in kills with 247 (2.27/game), but has provided the defensive lift for K-State with 158 total blocks (1.45/game). The Douglass, Kan., product's 149 block assists this season ranks second on the K-State single season block assist chart.

The Kansas State attack has been guided by sophomore setter Stacey Spiegelberg. The Overland Park, Kan., native has 1,374 assists this season (12.27/game) and has tallied a team-high 37 service aces.

The Wildcat defense is led by sophomore libero Angie Lastra. The Carolina, Puerto Rico product is the sophomore record holder for digs with 454 on the year (4.05/game).

At a Glance: Florida A&M

Florida A&M (22-5, 10-0 MEAC) enters the NCAA Tournament earning an automatic bid as the MEAC champion. The Lady Rattlers started the season 2-4, but streaked to wins in 20 of their last 21 matches. Florida A&M has played just 83 games on the year, playing just four matches beyond the minimum of three-games (two 4-game matches and two 5-game matches).

Florida A&M is led by head coach Tony Trifonov, who is in his ninth season with the Lady Rattlers. During this time Trifonov has led Florida A&M to five consecutive NCAA appearances and has registered a 200-72 (.735) record. His team ranks

On the court, Florida A&M is led by two-time Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference Player of the Year Adriana Kostadinova. The senior from Sofia, Bulgaria leads the team in kills with 376 (4.53/game), service aces with 51 (0.61/game) and is third with a .358 hitting percentage. Kostadinova, an outside hitter/middle blocker, is third in total blocks with 50 (0.60/game).

The Lady Rattlers roster also includes three All-MEAC selections to go along with Kostadinova; sophomore setter Diana Genkova, junior middle blocker Maria Andonova and senior middle blocker Jayli Jackson. Genkova leads the team in assists with 1,043 (12.57/game) and is third in service aces with 31 (0.37/game).

Andonova is second on the team with a .364 hitting percentage and 349 kills (4.20/game).

Jackson leads the team with a .394 hitting percentage and has 212 kills on the year (2.55/game).

According to the NCAA Division I stats leaders (as of 11/20), the Lady Rattlers led the nation in hitting percentage at .354.

At a Glance: Florida

Florida (30-2, 15-1 SEC) enters the NCAA Tournament as the No. 8 overall seed. The Gators captured the SEC title with a stellar 15-1 mark in the conference and enter the weekend on a nine-match winning streak. Florida has been extended beyond the minimum of three-games in a match on just six occasions this season. The Gators have defended their home turf in the O'Connell Center this season with a spotless 16-0 record. The Gators' last home loss came on Nov. 21, 2004 in the final of the SEC Tournament against Tennessee.

The Gators are guided by Mary Wise. Wise is in her 15th season with the Florida volleyball program and has accumulated a record of 489-50 (.907). Wise has steered the Gators to 12 SEC Tournament titles, including this season. She has also earned 10 SEC Coach of the Year honors and is the only female to coach in the NCAA national championship match.

On the floor, Florida is led by SEC tournament MVP Kisyia Killingsworth. Killingsworth, a sophomore middle blocker from Deltona, Fla., leads the team in total blocks (140; 1.33/game) and is second on the team in kills (356; 3.39/game) and hitting percentage (.398).

The Florida attack is set by sophomore Angie McGinnis. The product of Fraser, Mich., has 1,413 assists (13.46/game) this season.

At a Glance: Florida Atlantic

Florida Atlantic (29-2, 9-0 Atlantic Sun) reached the NCAA Tournament with an automatic bid as winners of the Atlantic Sun Conference. The Owls have won 13 straight matches coming into Gainesville this weekend. This will be the third trip to the NCAA Tournament for the Owls and the first in this century (1998-99-2005).

The Owls are mentored by Jody Brown, who is in his 11th season at Florida Atlantic. Brown has amassed a 145-135 (.518) mark during his time in Boca Raton.

Statistically, Florida Atlantic is led by senior outside hitter and Atlantic Sun Conference Tournament MVP Kelly Paiva. Paiva has tallied 660 kills (6.00/game). According to the NCAA Division I stats leaders (as of 11/20), Paiva led the nation in kills with 5.97 per game.

The Owl attack is also supplemented by freshman middle blocker Katie Arvidson. The product of Franklin, Tenn., is second in kills (366; 3.33/game) and total blocks (108; 0.98/game). Coordinating the attack for the Owls is freshman setter Casey LaRocca. LaRocca, a native of St. Louis, has 1,361 assists this season (12.49/game).

Wildcat Career Corner

Agata Rezende surpassed 600 kills for her career at Nebraska... Rezende also set a career-high with 63 attempts vs. the Huskers... Angie Lastra is now in eighth place on K-State's career digs list, passing Devon Rynning (1994-97) and Kate DeClerk at Nebraska... Lastra also holds the sophomore digs record with 454 this season... Sandy Werner set a career-high in kills at Texas Tech with 23 on Nov. 9; surpassed her career-high for a season with the effort... Werner surpassed 700 kills for her career against Oklahoma; now has 709 in three seasons... Megan Kroeker is eight block assists from setting the K-State freshman record currently held by Kelle Branting in 1997... Stacey Spiegelberg ranks eighth in career assists with 1,427.

The Wildcats have four different uniforms and have the following marks in these uniforms: black (5-4), white (4-2), purple (9-2) and grey (2-2).

Ace(s) in the Place

K-State has the second-longest current streak in the nation of 223 straight matches with at least one service ace. Alabama A&M has the longest current streak at 224 straight matches.

K-State's streak started on Nov. 13, 1998 in a 3-1 win over Missouri in Ahearn Field House. The last time K-State failed to register a service ace was on Nov. 7, 1998 in a 3-1 win over Colorado.

Wildcats' "Big Dance" Card Punched

K-State has advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of the last 10 seasons. The Wildcats, along with Nebraska and Texas A&M, are the only Big 12 Conference schools that have advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each year since the league began in 1996.

K-State Reaches 600 Wins

In its 31 years of volleyball Kansas State has a 610-494-11 (.547) mark. In this decade, K-State is 132-51 (.721) and 253-119 (.680) since the 1994 season.

The Wildcats passed the 600-win plateau with a 3-0 win over Texas Tech on Sept. 17.

The Wildcats have a 137-63 (.685) mark in the Big 12 Conference since its inception in 1996.

Wildcats in Gainesville

Kansas State will make its second appearance in Gainesville in three years. The Wildcats reached the Sunshine State in 2003 to play Penn State in the Sweet 16. The Nittany Lions got the best of the Wildcats in the that match, 3-1 (12-30, 30-27, 30-21, 31-29).

Over the past 10 years, K-State has traveled east of the Mississippi River just three times. The Wildcats are 0-2 in these matches, playing in Madison, Wis., and Gainesville. K-State is 10-6 west of the Mississippi.

K-State Against Teams in 2005 NCAA Tournament

K-State played 16 matches against teams in this year's NCAA Division I Volleyball Tournament during the 2005 season. The Wildcats are 6-10 in these matches, defeating Utah State, Arkansas, Missouri State, Kansas, Colorado and Texas A&M. K-State suffered defeats to Nebraska (twice), Texas (twice), Missouri (twice), Minnesota, Kansas, Colorado and Texas A&M.

K-State vs. the Conferences

Kansas State has played against teams from two out of the three conferences represented in Gainesville during its 31-year volleyball history. K-State has an 8-9 record against the SEC, including a 3-2 win this season at Arkansas.

Kansas State is 3-0 against the Atlantic Sun Conference, defeating Central Florida, Florida Atlantic and Jacksonville State.

The Wildcats will play their first team from the MEAC on Thursday when they face Florida A&M.

Fritz Against the Big 12

Since taking over the reins of the K-State volleyball program in 2001, Suzie Fritz has amassed a record of 73-27 (.730) against Big 12 foes.

Fritz Second in School History in Career Wins

Head coach Suzie Fritz is rewriting the K-State record books for career wins, overtaking Mary Phyl Dwight with her 108th career win on Nov. 9 at Texas Tech.

Fritz became the third coach in Wildcat history and second in the modern era to surpass the 100-win mark on Sept. 14 at Oklahoma. She was the fastest in school history to 100 and was also the fastest to 50, 60, 70, 80, and 90.

She now trails only one former Wildcat leader, Scott Nelson with a 168-176-1 record from 1980 to 1990.

Wildcats Rank 26th in National Attendance Figures

After 15 home matches in 2005, K-State ranks 26th in the NCAA Division I attendance figures.

In total, 17,958 fans have passed through the doors of Ahearn Field House for an average of 1,197. The top attendance mark for the Wildcats this season at home was registered on Oct. 19 against No. 1 Nebraska, 3,107.

The national leader is Hawai'i with an average of 7,302 fans in 18 matches (131,434 total).

Rezende Named to All-Big 12 First Team

Kansas State volleyball placed one student-athlete on the All-Big 12 First Team as senior Agata Rezende earned her first career All-Big 12 honor and is the 27th Wildcat to earn an All-Big 12 citation.

Rezende, an outside hitter from Franca, Brazil, leads the Wildcats with 415 kills this season and 3.71 kills per game. She set a career-high earlier this season with 23 kills against Utah State on Sept. 2. She registered six 20-kill matches this season to tie for eighth on the K-State single season list for 20-kill matches in a season.

For her career, Rezende has 624 kills, 191 digs and 173 total blocks. She has totaled 26 matches in which she has hit .300 or better.

Eight Wildcats Earn Academic All-Big 12 Citations

The Kansas State volleyball team saw eight of its student-athletes earn Academic All-Big 12 honors early

Wednesday. The eight selections were the most for K-State since the inception of the Big 12 in 1996, when the Wildcats had nine honorees.

K-State's first team selections were juniors Joy Hamlin (anthropology), Jamie Perkins (nutrition sciences/pre-medicine) and Sandy Werner (kinesiology), sophomores Angie Lastra (biology) and Stacey Spiegelberg (life sciences/pre-nursing) and redshirt freshman Jenny Jantsch (business). The Wildcats' second team selections were senior Katie Stanzel (marketing) and sophomore Rita Liliom (social science).

Stanzel, a native of Omaha, Neb., earned her fourth career Academic All-Big 12 selection. Hamlin, Perkins and Werner garnered their second straight citation. K-State trailed only Texas A&M in overall selections. The Aggies had nine selections.

Nominated by each institution's director of student-athlete support services and the media relations offices, the volleyball academic all-league team consisted of 52 first team members combined with nine on the second team. First team members consist of those who have maintained a 3.20 or better GPA, and the second team are those who have a 3.00 to 3.19 GPA.

To qualify student-athletes must maintain a 3.00 GPA or higher either cumulative or the two previous semesters and must have participated in 60 percent of her team's scheduled contests. Freshmen and transfers are not eligible in their first year of academic residence. Senior student-athletes who have participated for a minimum of two years and meet all the criteria except percent of participation are also eligible.

K-State has had six different players lead a match in kills this season. Senior Agata Rezende has led the most with 14 (.467), while junior Sandy Werner has paced the Wildcats eight times (.267). Junior Joy Hamlin and sophomore Rita Liliom have led three times (.100) with red-shirt freshmen Megan Kroeker and Megan Farr leading once apiece (.033).

Rezende Wreaks Havoc Against CU, NU

Senior outside hitter Agata Rezende recorded one of her best weeks of her K-State career during Nov. 14-20. The product of Franca, Brazil helped K-State upset No. 24 Colorado in five and push the Wildcats to a 3-1 loss to No. 1 Nebraska. Rezende tallied 39 kills on 104 chances for a .269 hitting percentage and seven block assists.

Rezende led the Wildcats to an upset win over the No. 24 Buffaloes with 19 kills on a .390 hitting percentage. During the second-longest fifth-game in 31 years of K-State volleyball, Rezende turned up her performance with five kills in the frame, including four during K-State's final six points.

On Saturday against No. 1 Nebraska, Rezende took her game to another level with 20 kills and a career-high 63 attempts. She pushed K-State to a game two 34-32 win with eight kills on 15 chances for a .467 hitting percentage. Rezende also surpassed 600 kills for her career during the match and has 610 with the Wildcats.

Werner Wednesdays

Junior Sandy Werner led the Wildcats vs. Baylor on Nov. 23 with 21 kills, the third time this season she has surpassed 20 kills in a match. Werner set a career-high at Texas Tech on Nov. 9 with 23 kills.

Entering the Nov. 2 match at Iowa State, Werner had just one career 20-kill match (20, vs. Wichita St., 9/7/04). In the Iowa State match, the Topeka, Kan., native tallied a then-career-high 22 kills in the 3-2 Wildcat win.

In 10 Wednesday Big 12 matches, Werner has 153 kills and a .278 hitting percentage in 39 games (3.92/game). In the 10 Saturday Big 12 matches, she has 101 kills and a .149 hitting percentage in 34 games (2.97/game).

Liliom Leaps into Attack

Sophomore Rita Liliom has emerged as a serious threat in Big 12 play for the Wildcats, after limited action to begin the conference season.

The Budapest, Hungary product has made the most of her time by playing in 50 games since Oct. 15 at Baylor. During this period, Liliom has registered 130 kills (2.60/game), 120 digs (2.40/game) and 22 block assists (0.44/game). At Texas Tech on Nov. 9, she recorded her fifth double-double with 13 kills and 16 digs. In five of her last eight matches she has 10 or more digs and in eight of her last 10 matches she has tallied 10 or more kills.

Liliom saw limited action to open Big 12 play with just six kills. Entering the Baylor match, Liliom had just 20 kills and 20 digs in 13 games of Big 12 play.

Double Figures x 2 for Rezende

Senior Agata Rezende has 24 double-figure kill matches in 30 matches this season, including a career-high 23 against Utah State on Sept. 2. She has tallied 20 or more kills in six matches this season, including two back-to-back efforts of 20 or more (Sept. 2 vs. Utah State and at Arkansas; Oct. 26 vs. Missouri and Nov. 2 at Iowa State).

In 27 matches in 2004, Rezende tallied nine matches of 10+ kills. She has 33 for her career.

Spiegelberg Reaches Career, Season Milestones

Sophomore setter Stacey Spiegelberg has entrenched herself on the K-State career and season assist lists during her first full season of action.

The Overland Park, Kan., native ranks eighth in career assists with 1,427, passing Wendy Garrett (1991-93) in Wildcat history.

Spiegelberg passed Gabby Guerre (1,265) from a season ago for eighth on the season assists list with 42 at Nebraska. She is just 15 assists from passing Devon Rynning (1,388) for seventh place.

Lastra Leading the Dig

Sophomore libero and reigning Big 12 Libero of the Year Angie Lastra has 454 digs this season and 947 digs in her career. She is now ninth in K-State history for digs in a career with 947, passing Devon Rynning and Kate DeClerk with 25 at Nebraska on Nov. 19.

She is also fifth for most digs in a single season, passing Dawn Cady during the match against Baylor on Nov. 23. Lastra also broke the sophomore record for digs in a season on Nov. 12 at Texas A&M and is the freshman record-holder as well.

The Carolina, Puerto Rico product has played in 61 straight matches for the Wildcats, since debuting against Oral Roberts on Sept. 1, 2004. In that span, Lastra has 53 matches (.869) of 10 or more digs, 28 matches (.459) of 15 or more digs and 11 matches (.180) of 20 or more digs.

Hamlin Blocks Way to Season, Career Marks

Junior Joy Hamlin has joined the elite company of K-State's top middle blockers with her effort this season and throughout her career. The Douglass, Kan., native has 279 career block assists to rank seventh all-time, passing Helen Bundy for seventh all-time. Hamlin has the highest per game total at 1.20, surpassing overall block assist leader Val Wieck (1995-98) at 1.18.

Hamlin passed Wieck for third and second on the block assist season list with 149. Hamlin has the best block assist per game average for a season at 1.42 and is just two block assists from passing Lisa Martin for first in a season.

Kroeker Kracks Top Three

Redshirt freshman Megan Kroeker tied five other players for the third-most block assists in a three-game match with nine against Kansas. The last K-State player to register nine block assists in a match was Lauren Goehring with nine, ironically enough, against Kansas on Sept. 17, 2003.

The Solomon, Kan., native set a new career-high with 10 total blocks for the match, including one solo block.

Wildcats Register Top Kill Game of Season Against Sooners

K-State's game two effort of 22 kills on a .381 hitting percentage was its highest kill total for a game this season. It was the 11th time this season the Wildcats have surpassed 20 kills in a single frame.

The Wildcats pieced together a back-to-back 20-kill effort on Sept. 17 against Texas Tech with 21 in game one and 20 in game two.

Cats-Buffs Play Second-Longest 5th Game in K-State History

The Wildcats' five-game win over Colorado on Nov. 16 featured the longest fifth game in K-State history since rally scoring began in 2001. K-State outlasted the Buffaloes in the fifth game 18-16 to capture the match. The previous high was a 16-14 fifth game win over Texas on Oct. 15, 2003 in Ahearn.

The longest fifth-game in K-State history took place on Sept. 20, 2000 at Texas Tech, as the Red Raiders outlasted the Wildcats 22-20 in pre-rally scoring.

.400 and .400 Equal Win

Kansas State's game three and game four hitting percentages against Colorado on Nov. 16 were the end of a long drought. The Wildcats registered consecutive .400+ hitting percentages in games for the first time since Sept. 17 against Texas Tech.

K-State hit .405 during a game three 28-30 loss to the Buffaloes in which they registered 21 kills. The Wildcats recovered to piece together a .467 hitting percentage with 15 kills in the 30-23 game four win. K-State registered just

one attack error in the frame on 30 total attacks.

The Wildcats had gone 38 straight games without registering a .400+ hitting percentage before Nov. 16.

November Reign During Fritz Era

Under head coach Suzie Fritz, Kansas State is 34-11 (.756) in the month of November.

Her three predecessors (Jim McLaughlin, Jim Moore and Patti Hagemeyer) notched a 29-41 (.414) mark in the 11th month. McLaughlin was 18-14 (.563) during his four seasons in Manhattan. Moore was 10-11 (.476) in his three years and Hagemeyer was 1-16 (.059) in her three years with the Wildcats.

First 11-1 Start in Fritz Era, Best Since 1996

This year's Kansas State squad already tied the school record for best unbeaten start at 8-0 with the 1988 squad, but this year's edition of the Wildcats has also accomplished another first in the Fritz era. It is the first time she has led a team to 11 wins in 12 tries.

The last Wildcat team to reach 11-1 was the 1996 squad. That team opened the season 13-1 and was the first team to go to the NCAA Tournament in school history, finishing with a 26-9 mark.

Wildcats Tie Best Start in School History

Following the Varney's Kansas State Invitational, the 2005 edition has placed itself atop the list for best starts in school history

K-State made it eight straight wins to open 2005 after defeating Florida State and Houston. The streak was halted after the Sept. 10 loss to the fifth-ranked Minnesota.

No Blocks for You

Kansas State recorded 95 total attacks against Texas A&M on Oct. 1, out of these attacks zero were blocked by the Aggies. It is the first time since 1996 that this phenomenon has occurred. The closest K-State came to achieving this feat earlier was on Sept. 16, 2004 against North Dakota State. The Bison registered one block in K-State's 3-0 win.

K-State Inks Chipman

Head coach Suzie Fritz and Kansas State volleyball has announced the signing of one student-athlete in the early-signing period. Kelsey Chipman, a Topeka, Kan., native has signed on the dotted line to play for the Wildcats in 2006.

Chipman is a 6-1 product of Washburn Rural High School. The middle blocker comes to K-State with impressive credentials including first team All-State honors in 2004 and cited on the first team of the All-State 6A Tournament team in 2003 through 2005. During the 2005 season, Chipman led the Blues with 313 kills, a .479 hitting percentage and 93 total blocks in 44 matches.

The daughter of Bob and Carol Chipman, she has also excelled in the classroom being named to the National Honor Society in 2004 and 2005 and to the Kansas Volleyball Association All-Academic Team in 2004.

In just four seasons at the helm of the Kansas State volleyball program, Suzie Fritz has quickly established herself as not only one of the most successful coaches in KSU history, but also the nation. Fritz has led the Wildcats to four straight NCAA Tournament appearances as head coach, eight dating back to

her days as an assistant coach, the school's first-ever conference title in 2003 and two Sweet 16 appearances. She currently holds the highest winning percentage among former coaches after compiling a 111-43 (.721) mark in five seasons. In nine seasons total on staff, Fritz has seen seven All-Americans, 12 All-Region performers and 28 all-conference players come play as Wildcats.

Named officially as the program's eighth head coach in October 2001 after serving the first two months of the season as interim head coach, Fritz has guided the Wildcat volleyball program to three straight NCAA Tournaments and has compiled a sparkling three-year record of 71-22 and was named 2002 and 2003 Big 12 Coach of the Year.

To say Suzie Fritz's first four years as a head coach were successful would be an understatement. The former top assistant coach for Jim McLaughlin from 1997-2000, Fritz was named the program's interim head coach on August 1, 2001, just a day after the resignation of McLaughlin and mere days before the players were to report for the start of fall practice. Despite facing the task of replacing two starters and playing one of the nation's toughest schedules in 2001, including two 2000 Final Four teams, Fritz posted the highest winning percentage (20-8, .714) by a first-year head coach in school history, surpassing the .686 winning percentage tallied by Ron Spies in 1979. In addition to tallying 20 wins for the third straight season, she helped the program to a school-record 15 wins in Big 12 Conference play and a third-place finish. In a conference that sent an NCAA-record eight teams to the "Big Dance", the Wildcats swept the season series from a school-best six conference opponents, including NCAA Tournament teams Baylor, Missouri and Texas.

In 2002, she took a team that was picked to finish fifth in the preseason coaches poll with just one senior starter and helped guide it to a program-best 16-4 mark in league play and a second-place finish.

Under Fritz's guidance, the program has hosted first- and second-round action of the NCAA Tournament at Ahearn Field House for three of the past four seasons.

After the 2001 season, Liz Wegner became the first player in Kansas State history to be named to an All-American team twice in her career, as she was named an honorable mention All-American by *Volleyball* magazine. Wegner joined fellow senior Lisa Mimick on the 2001 All-Big 12 first team while 2002 saw three Wildcats make the first team, marking the fifth year in a row - all under Fritz's tenure - that the program has placed two players on the league's first team. Lauren Goehring, Gabby Guerre and Cari Jensen all were named to the 2002 All-Big 12 First Team.

In 2003, Fritz led Kansas State to perhaps its greatest season ever in volleyball. The Wildcats finished the season 30-5, ranked 11th nationally, and won the program's first-ever conference title with an 18-2 league mark. The 2003 squad, led by All-Americans Lauren Goehring and Gabby Guerre, advanced to the Sweet 16 before falling to 10th-ranked Penn State.

And all the program's success was not relegated to the court, as Kansas State

was named as one of the volleyball programs nationally to receive the 2003-04 American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA)/Molten Team Academic Award. It marks the third straight season that the Wildcats have received this prestigious honor and the fourth time overall.

The award, which has been given annually since 1992-93, honors college and high school teams that displayed excellence in the classroom by maintaining at least a 3.30 cumulative team grade-point average on a 4.0 scale or a 4.10 cumulative team GPA on a 5.0 scale during the school year.

Last season, K-State again reached 20 wins and the NCAA Tournament as the Wildcats finished 20-11 and advanced to the second round of the tournament before falling to national power Southern Cal.

Fritz was named the program's permanent head coach on October 11, 2001 after guiding the team to a 9-5 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big 12 Conference play, as the team's interim coach.

While an assistant at K-State, she helped produce two All-Americans, including the program's first in Dawn Cady in 1999, three all-district selections, 11 All-Big 12 honorees and 22 Academic All-Big 12 pick.

Most of Fritz's experience as an assistant coach at Kansas State was spent on the offensive side, as she served three years as the team's offensive coordinator and chief recruiting ace before working with the defense in 2000.

As offensive coordinator from 1997-99, she worked primarily with the team's setters, developing Disney Bronnenberg into an all-conference performer. In 1998, under Fritz's supervision, freshman setter Disney Bronnenberg shattered the NCAA record with a 15.54 assist per game ratio. In 1999, Bronnenberg finished fourth in the Big 12 and 12th nationally with a 13.83 assists per game ratio. She became the first Kansas State setter in nearly 15 years to earn first team all-conference honors since Renee Whitney accomplished the feat in back-to-back years in 1984 and 1985.

In her position, she also tutored some of the best hitters in school and Big 12 Conference history, including Kansas State's career kills leader and two-time All-American Liz Wegner and the school's first All-American Dawn Cady.

Along with individual honors, Kansas State set numerous offensive records during Fritz's tenure as offensive coordinator, including single-season team marks for assists (1,830 in 1998) and total attacks (5,020 in 1998). In fact, her offensive teams own three of the top 5 all-time marks in school history in team kills, total attacks and assists.

Fritz is not the first coach in her family. Steve, her husband, is entering his 14th season as an assistant track and field coach for the nationally-renowned Kansas State program, while her parents and both brothers serve in some coaching capacity. Suzie's father, Larry Wiemers, spent more than 25 years as head football coach at Clay Center High School and currently serves as the linebackers' coach for his oldest son, Dave Wiemers, who was named the head coach at Division II Emporia (Kan.) State University on December 8, 2000. Also on the staff is Suzie's youngest brother, Jon, who is the Hornets' offensive coordinator.

Suzie's mother, Sandi, has been a teacher of baton twirling for years and has held positions in her national organization.

Fritz earned a master's degree in educational administration and leadership from Kansas State in August 2002.

A native of Clay Center, Kan., the former Suzie Wiemers, 32, was married to Steve Fritz on June 17, 2000. Steve Fritz, a member of the Kansas State Sports Hall of Fame, was a decathlete who placed fourth in the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games. The couple has two children, Thomas Jon (T.J.), 4, and Jake, who is 1.

Playing host to Big Sky Conference champion Cal State-Northridge in the first round, the Wildcats would prove they belonged in the Big Dance with one of the most impressive offensive shows in NCAA history. The Wildcats set school records and cracked the NCAA record books in kills (108, t-2nd in NCAA history), total attacks (264, 10th in NCAA history), and assists (95, 6th in NCAA history). Devon Ryning churned out a school-record 88 assists, the third-highest total in NCAA history. She set a K-State offense that saw five players notch 18 or more kills.

Northridge's Nancy Ma (35) and Getty Dimitrova (32) combined for 67 kills but were the only players on their team with double-figures. Ma's 35 kills is the most ever recorded against a Kansas State team in a four-game match.

MALIBU, Calif. – Kansas State earned its third consecutive trip to the second round of the NCAA Tournament, as the Wildcats edged upset-minded Loyola-Chicago, 15-7, 15-4, 6-15, 15-9, in the first round of the Midwest Regional held Pepperdine's Firestone Fieldhouse.

Higher-seeded Kansas State jumped out to an early 2-0 lead in game one then used two key 4-0 runs

when the pesky Ramblers were rallying to take the opening set, 15-7. Junior outside hitter Liz Wegner led the Wildcat attack with seven kills on .385, while senior middle blocker Kelle Branting added three kills on .400 hitting. Both teams struggled offensively, as K-State and Loyola hit .212 and .000, respectively.

Building on the momentum of the opening win, Kansas State used an impressive .515 hitting percentage in the second game with 19 kills to take a 2-0 lead in the match. Loyola led to open the match, 1-0, and rallied to tie it at 3-all, but the Wildcats used a 4-0 run to take a commanding 7-3 then ended the game with an 8-0 run for a 15-4 victory.

Despite being down in 0-2 in the match, the ever-persistent Ramblers broke open a tight game three at 5-all with an 8-0 run to take a commanding 13-5 lead in game three. The Wildcats could never get a rally going, as the Ramblers posted a .512 hitting percentage en route to a 15-6 victory.

Building on the momentum of its victory in game three, Loyola jumped out to a 5-1 lead in the decisive game four before the Wildcats clawed their way back to a 5-all tie.
