No. 1 Huskers Continue Title Quest in Florida

After winning the first two rounds at home, the No. 1 Nebraska volleyball team travels to Gainesville, Fla., for NCAA Regional action this weekend. The Huskers will take on No. 14 San Diego (26-5) in the first of two regional semifinals on Friday, Dec. 8, at 3:30 p.m. (central). Fans can listen to Friday's match on selected Husker Sports Network stations, including B107.3 FM in Lincoln and Omaha and KRVN 880 AM in Lexington and on Huskers.com. If NU wins on Friday, it will face the winner of Friday's second semifinal between No. 7 Florida and No. 9 Minnesota Saturday afternoon at 3 p.m. with a berth in the national semifinals at stake.

It is the 13th straight year that Nebraska has reached the round of 16 in the NCAA Tournament, as NU is now 66-22 (.750) in its 25 NCAA Tournament appearances, ranking second among all programs in both wins and winning percentage.

The Huskers (29-1) advanced to the Sweet 16 win with a pair of wins over the weekend, including a 3-0 sweep of Northern Iowa on Saturday. In that match, the Huskers hit a blistering .423 as a team and had three players - Jordan Larson, Sarah Pavan and Tracy Stalls - all register at least 10 kills. NU was also stout defensively, holding both of its foes under .100 hitting on the weekend.

The Huskers will see some familiar faces in the Gainesville Regional, as Nebraska faced San Diego (26-5) in the season opener and also defeated Minnesota in the non-conference portion of the schedule. San Diego, which won the West Coast Conference with a 13-1 mark, is led by WCC Player of the Year Kristen Carlson, who averages a team-best 5.09 kills per game to rank among the national leaders in that category. Carlson had 27 kills and 17 digs in USD's five-game win over Duke on Saturday, as the Toreros reached the Sweet 16 for the second time in three years.

Did You Know?

- NU will be going for its 30th win of the season on Friday. NU has a total of 17 seasons with 30 or more wins, including seven since the Big 12 was formed in 1996. The rest of the Big 12 schools have combined for one in that same span.

- Seniors Dani Mancuso and Dani Busboom have helped Nebraska to a 120-10 record (.922) and three Big 12 titles over the last four years.

- The 2006 season marks the third straight year and the fourth time since 2000 that Nebraska is the No. 1 seed entering the NCAA Tournament.

- NU is 34-3 (.919) against ranked opponents since the start of the 2004 season and 71-11 (.866) under John Cook.

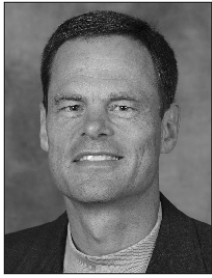

• Nebraska is making its 25th NCAA Tournament appearance, a total which ties for fourth among all Division I programs. Only Penn State, Stanford and UC Santa Barbara have longer streaks, as those three schools have qualified for all 26 NCAA Championships.

• The Huskers' streak of 13 straight NCAA Regionals is the longest active in the country, as only five programs have reached regionals in each of the past four seasons. NU is 26-12 all-time in NCAA regionals.

• This year marks only the second time since 1999 that Nebraska has been on the road for a regional. NU has been on the road for regionals eight times and reached the regional final on five occasions (1984, 1985, 1987, 1997 and 2004).

• Sarah Pavan joined an elite group when she earned her second straight Big 12 Player-of-the-Year honor on Nov. 28. She is the first NU player to be named player of the year in consecutive years since former AVCA National Player of the Year Allison Weston in 1994 and 1995, and only the sixth Husker to ever be named a two-time conference player of the year.

• Nebraska is 8-0 against ranked teams this season, including seven by sweeps.

• NU Head Coach John Cook is a 1979 graduate of the University of San Diego.

• Nebraska's four first-team All-Big 12 selections are the most since 2002 and the fifth time that NU had at least four first-team All-Big 12 honorees (1996-2000-01-02-06).

• Nebraska has hit .400 or better four times in the last six matches, including .423 against Northern Iowa in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. The Huskers had a streak of three straight matches of hitting .400 or better, the first time that has happened since 1998.

• Sarah Pavan now has 15 career matches with at least 20 kills (7 in 2004; 1 in 2005; 7 in 2006). Her 15 matches with at least 20 kills are nearly half of NU's total of 32 since John Cook took over in 2000. Three other current Huskers have had at least one 20-kill match during their Husker careers: Dani Mancuso (2004 at KSU), Christina Houghtelling (2005 at OU) and Jordan Larson (20 vs. KSU).

• Nebraska finished 19-0 at the NU Coliseum, which marked the 16th time - and fourth time in seven seasons - that NU has had a perfect home record.

• NU has won its last 54 home matches, dating back to the 2004 season, including its last 48 at the NU Coliseum. The current home streak is the nation's longest active streak and ranks eighth on the NCAA's all-time list.

FINALS WEEK

Husker Probable Starters

MB - #15 Kori Cooper: 6-2, Fr., Amarillo, Texas - Cooper splits time with Amanda Gates at middle blocker, averaging 1.68 kills and 0.93 blocks per game. Cooper is fourth in the Big 12 with a .347 hitting percentage and was second in league matches (.354). Her best match of the regular season came in a win over Iowa State on Nov. 8, where she totaled a career-high 12 kills on .429 hitting and five blocks. She also totaled six kills in six swings at Kansas on Nov. 22 and had seven kills and a career-best eight blocks at No. 9 Texas on Oct. 18. A Volleyball Magazine Fab 50 pick, Cooper enrolled at NU in January after graduating from Amarillo High School a semester early. Cooper was a co-captain of the 2005 U.S. Youth National Team, helping Team USA to a fourth-place finish.

MB - #11 Tracy Stalls: 6-3, Jr., Denver, Colo. - Stalls earned first-team All-Big 12 honors at middle blocker, averaging 2.65 kills and 1.44 blocks per game. She leads the Big 12 and is 11th nationally in hitting percentage and is fourth in the league in blocks. Stalls has reached double figures in kills 10 times, including a career-high 16 kills and 12 blocks at Colorado on Nov. 11. She had six kills and 10 blocks against American and 10 kills on .467 hitting in the sweep of Northern Iowa. She also totaled 14 kills in wins over NCAA qualifiers Long Beach State and Minnesota. Stalls has also had 11 matches where she has hit .500 or better, including a season-best .727 vs. Texas Tech (9-1-11) on Sept. 23 and .714 (10-0-14) vs. NCAA qualifier Middle Tennessee on Sept. 2. Stalls ranked among the top-15 blockers nationally in each of her first two years as a Husker. Before enrolling at NU, Stalls was a two-year member of the U.S. National Developmental Program and a member of Team USA.

OPP - #9 Sarah Pavan: 6-5, Jr., Kitchener, Ontario - The two-time Big 12 Player of the Year, Pavan leads the Big 12 and ranks ninth nationally in kills per game (5.12), while also ranking among Big 12 leaders in points per game (6.02, first) and service aces per game (0.31, eighth). Pavan has seven matches with at least 20 kills, including a season-high 24 kills in three contests (vs. Long Beach State, at Baylor and vs. Iowa State). A two-time Big 12 Player of the Week, she earned her most recent honor on Nov. 21, when she totaled 46 kills on .544 hitting and seven aces in a pair of sweeps. She has reached double figures in her last 27 matches and 29 times in 30 matches this season. Pavan led NU with 18 kills in a sweep of No. 8 Texas on Nov. 25 and finished with 23 kills and matched her career high with four aces against Baylor on Nov. 18. Pavan has three double-doubles on the year, with her most recent coming with 17 kills, 10 digs and eight blocks at Colorado on Nov. 11. She earned MVP honors in both of NU's early-season tournaments and was the Big 12 Player of the Week on Sept. 11, averaging 6.70 points and 5.90 kills (.409 hitting percentage) in three wins. She had one of the best matches of her career against Long Beach State on Sept. 9, totaling 24 kills on .400 hitting against the 49ers, including eight kills on eight swings in the opener. Pavan was the 2005 Big 12 Player of the Year, averaging 3.82 kills, 1.66 digs and 1.25 blocks per game. She established her career high in kills as a freshman with 35 in the NCAA Regional against USC. Pavan, who carries a 4.0 GPA in biochemistry, was a member of the Canadian National Team at age 16.

OH - #10 Jordan Larson: 6-2, So., Hooper, Neb. - Larson is one of the country's top all-around performers, earning first-team All-Big 12 honors for the first time in 2006. She averages 4.25 kills and 3.39 digs per game, ranking in the Big 12's top 10 in aces (0.48/gm, second), points (5.22, third), kills (fourth) and digs (10th). Larson, the co-Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year, is the only player in the league's top 10 in kills and digs. She leads NU with 20 double-doubles, including a stretch of 10 in a row earlier this season. Larson averaged 4.57 kills on .397 hitting, 1.00 blocks and 1.00 aces per game during the NCAA Tournament. She had one of her best matches of the year at Kansas on Nov. 22, totaling 13 kills on a season-high .571 hitting. She had 13 kills, 17 digs and matched her career high with six blocks at Colorado on Nov. 11 and had a match-high 16 kills in a sweep of No. 17 Oklahoma on Nov. 4. Larson earned the Big 12 weekly honor in early October after averaging 5.17 kills and 4.17 digs in two sweeps, including a career-high 20 kills against Kansas State on Oct. 4. As a freshman, Larson led all conference freshmen in kills, digs, hitting percentage and service aces. She was rated the No. 2 player in the country by Prepvolleyball.com and spent two years on the U.S. Junior National Team.

DS - #5 Rachel Schwartz: 5-9, So., Lincoln, Neb. - Schwartz is a former walk-on who is used as a defensive specialist, averaging 2.49 digs and 0.17 aces per game. She has tied or set career highs in digs seven times this season, and has reached double figures in digs 14 times in 2006, including four of NU's last five matches. Schwartz came up with a career-high 15 digs in NU's win at No. 9 Texas on Oct. 18 and enjoyed her best match of the year at Baylor on Sept. 30, totaling a then-career high 14 digs and a career-high three aces. Schwartz had 10 digs and a pair of aces in NU's sweep of Northern Iowa on Dec. 2. She appeared in 30 matches as a freshman as NU's defensive specialist, finishing with 18 digs and five aces. She was a first-team all-state selection at outside hitter at Lincoln East High School in 2004.

-or- **OH - #7 Dani Mancuso: 6-2, Sr., Omaha, Neb.** - Mancuso moved into the outside hitter position vacated after Christina Houghttelling's season-ending injury. Mancuso averages 2.52 kills, 0.67 blocks and 0.77 digs per game, primarily playing the front row. She has reached double figures in kills in five of NU's last seven matches, averaging 2.79 kills per game while hitting .290 in that stretch. Mancuso tied her season highs with 11 kills and six blocks in NU's first-round win over American and had eight kills on .375 hitting against Northern Iowa on Dec. 2. She had 11 kills on a season-high .647 hitting at Kansas on Nov. 22 and had 10 kills on .316 hitting in a sweep of Texas A&M on Nov. 15. She recorded seven kills on .455 hitting at KSU on Oct. 28. Mancuso had nine kills and matched her career best with six blocks in NU's win over No. 9 Texas on Oct. 18 and nine kills on .400 hitting against Missouri on Oct. 11. In 2005, Mancuso was NU's backup at all three outside hitter spots, averaging 1.38 kills, 1.15 digs and 0.68 blocks per game. She shared the outside hitter spot with Houghttelling in 2004, averaging 2.77 kills and 0.29 service aces per game, including a career-high 22 kills in a win at Kansas State.

S - #12 Rachel Holloway: 5-10, R-Fr., Franklin, Tenn. - Holloway is the first Husker freshman to start in a 5-1 system in the NCAA era (1981-present), earning first-team All-Big 12 honors in the process. She averages

13.47 assists, 2.62 digs and 1.17 kills per game, ranking third in the Big 12 and 10th nationally in assists. Holloway has 12 double-doubles, including one in five of the last seven matches. She has tallied at least 50 assists eight times this year and has helped NU hit .400 or better six times this season, including four of the past six matches. She totaled 39 assists and five kills while helping NU hit .423 against Northern Iowa in the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Holloway tied her career high with 57 assists against both Colorado and Iowa State, adding 13 digs and four blocks at Colorado on Nov. 11 and four stuffs at ISU on Nov. 8. She was chosen as the Big 12's Player of the Week on Oct. 16, after averaging 16.00 assists per game in sweeps of Colorado and Missouri. Holloway, who leads all freshmen nationally in assists, totaled 57 assists, eight digs and seven kills against Minnesota, helping NU hit .337. Last summer, Holloway captained the U.S. Youth National Team to a gold medal at the NORCECA Junior Championships in Mexico. Holloway, who graduated high school a year early, was the Colorado Gatorade High School Player of the Year in 2004.

L - #18 Dani Busboom: 5-11, Sr., Cortland, Neb.
- Busboom earned Big 12 co-Libero-of-the-Year accolades in 2006, totaling 5.07 digs per game to lead the Big 12 while also chipping in .83 assists per game. She has reached double figures in digs 28 times in 30 matches, including a streak of 21 straight matches in double figures before it was snapped against Texas A&M on Nov. 15. Busboom became the first Husker to record 500 digs in a season following her 17-dig effort versus Northern Iowa on Dec. 2 and also ranks second on NU's career dig list (1,203). She has totaled at least 20 digs seven times, including a career-high 23 in three matches. Last season, she averaged 6.45 assists and 1.82 digs in NU's 6-2 offense, helping NU hit .322 as a team. Busboom is seventh on NU's career assists list with 2,919 and is the second player in school history on top-10 lists in both assists and digs, joining former NU All-American Val Novak.

First Round: No. 1 Nebraska 3, American 0

Jordan Larson recorded her 20th double-double of the season with 16 kills and 14 digs, as No. 1 Nebraska used a strong defensive effort to hold off an upstart American squad in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Larson, who tied for team-high honors in kills with Sarah Pavan, hit .343 in the match and added four aces and four blocks, including a pair of solo stuffs. Pavan hit .387 and added five digs and a pair of blocks, as Nebraska improved to 28-1 on the season.

While Nebraska used a balanced offensive attack, it was the Huskers' defense that propelled NU to its 28th victory of the season. NU held American (26-6) below .100 hitting in three of the four games, including a -.051 mark in the first game and a -.184 attack percentage in game four. On the night, the Eagles hit just .050, more than .200 points below their season average of .279. Highlighting the stellar defensive night for the Huskers was senior Dani Busboom, who tallied 20 digs to become NU's single-season digs leader.

The Huskers were also strong at the net, recording 16 blocks, compared to just nine for American. Junior Tracy Stalls led the block parade with 10, two shy of her season high. Dani Mancuso tied her career high with six blocks, while also matching her season high with 11 kills.

Second Round: No. 1 Nebraska 3, UNI 0

Jordan Larson's 16 kills led three Huskers in double figures, as No. 1 Nebraska moved into the NCAA Sweet 16 with a 3-0 sweep of Northern Iowa on Dec. 2.

Larson led a balanced attack with 16 kills on .464 hitting, three aces and three blocks, as the Huskers hit .423 in the match. NU had six attackers hit over .300, as the Huskers' .423 hitting marked the fourth time in the last six matches that NU hit .400 or better.

Rachel Holloway guided a potent attack, finishing with 39 assists and five kills, as NU hit .400 or better in all three games for the first time this season.

Sarah Pavan and Tracy Stalls joined Larson in double figures in kills, totaling 11 and 10 kills, respectively, as Stalls hit .467 and totaled a match-high four blocks, while Pavan hit .375 on 26 swings, including seven kills in the opener.

The Huskers, who improved to 19-0 at home this season, were equally stout on defense, holding the Panthers to just .092 hitting and out-blocking UNI, 9-5. Dani Busboom led NU with 17 digs and became the first Husker to go over 500 digs in a season, while Rachel Schwartz totaled 10 digs, as NU out-dug the Panthers, 47-28.

Quickly Scouting the Field

Florida (30-2): Under Coach Mary Wise (522-53 in 16 seasons at Florida), the Gators are 30-2 on the season and looking for their seventh appearance in the national semifinals. UF, which has a 22-match win streak, is led by SEC Player of the Year Angie McGinnis, who averages 13.27 assists, 1.56 kills, 2.70 digs and 1.08 blocks per game. McGinnis guides and offense which has three hitters averaging over 3.00 kills per game. Right side hitter Amber McCray leads UF with 3.80 kills per game while hitting .375 on the year. The Gators also feature the SEC's Defensive Player of the Year in libero Elyse Cusack, who leads the SEC with 5.51 digs per game.

Series History: *Nebraska leads the all-time series, 7-1, including a 2-0 record in the NCAA Tournament. The Huskers won regional finals against Florida in 2001 and 2005.*

Minnesota (25-7): The Golden Gophers come into this weekend's regional as one of the hottest teams in the country. The Gophers, who opened the season with a 2-4 mark, have won 23 of their last 26 matches and finished second in the Big Ten with a 17-3 record. Coach Mike Hebert (282-97 in 11 seasons at Minnesota) and the Gophers feature a trio of first-team All-Big Ten honorees in right side hitter Kelly Bowman, middle blocker Meredith Nelson and libero Malama Peniata, who also claimed the conference's defensive player of the year. Nelson leads the Gophers with 3.28 kills per game and is one of three Gophers averaging better than 3.00 kills per game. Bowman is one of the league's top all-around performers, averaging 2.29 kills, 1.10 assists and 3.06 digs per game, while Peniata leads the Big Ten with 5.23 digs per game. Papillion native Kyla Roehring is second on the team in kills with 3.26 per game.

Series History: *The Huskers lead the series, 25-4, and have won the last 10 meetings in the series, including a 3-1 NU win in Lincoln in September.*

San Diego (26-5): The Toreros, directed by interim head coach Brent Hilliard, reached the regional with wins over Jacksonville State and Duke last weekend in Knoxville. The Toreros are paced by WCC Player of the Year Kristen Carlson, who is averaging 5.09 kills and 3.47 digs per game. She had 27 kills and 17 digs in USD's second-round win over Duke. The Toreros placed three members on the All-WCC team, including Christie Dawson (4.06 kills/gm) and .311 hitting and Laurel Abrahamson (3.15 k/gm and .338 hitting).

Series History: *NU leads the series, 3-0, including a 3-0 sweep in this season's opener. NU and USD also met in the 1999 NCAA Tournament.*

What to Watch For

- Nebraska needs one win to reach the 30-win plateau for the third straight year and the 18th time in school history.

- Nebraska is 13-3 against the current members of the West Coast Conference and has won its last 13 matches against WCC foes.

- With 507 kills this season, Sarah Pavan is 23 kills away from climbing from seventh to fourth on NU's

single-season list.

- Jordan Larson is closing quickly on the Huskers' single-season top-10 list. With 48 service aces, she is one away from tying for 10th on NU's career list. She would be the only the second Husker in 15 years to total at least 49 aces in a season.

- Larson is also one solo block away from tying Melissa Elmer for 10th place on NU's single-season solo blocks list, an impressive feat since Elmer averaged 1.89 blocks per game in 2004, while Larson averages 0.68 blocks per game.

- With 15 service aces in eight career NCAA matches, Larson is three aces shy of Jennifer Saleaumua's career postseason record. Larson has played just 25 games in the NCAA Tournament, while it took Saleaumua 54 games to reach her mark.

- With 13.47 assists per game, Rachel Holloway is threatening to be the seventh Husker - and first since 1998 - to average more than 13.50 assists per game.

The CliffsNotes Season in Review

Nebraska takes a 29-1 record and a No. 1 ranking into this weekend's NCAA Regional. In honor of CliffsNotes (which was founded in Lincoln in 1958), here is a quick refresher of the 2006 season.

- The Huskers graduated two AVCA All-Americans in middle blocker Melissa Elmer and outside hitter Jennifer Saleaumua from last year's NCAA runner-up squad, while reigning AVCA National Player of the Year Christina Houghtelling underwent season-ending shoulder surgery in July.

- The Huskers opened No. 1 in the AVCA preseason poll for the third time in school history (2001 & 2005) and have remained No. 1 in all 15 polls during the season.

- NU sold out its entire season ticket package prior to the season, needing less than two weeks to sell out all 17 home matches.

- The Huskers are 8-0 against ranked opponents, including seven sweeps (No. 20 San Diego, No. 20 Louisville, No. 25 Cal Poly, No. 17 Oklahoma, No. 8 Texas and Missouri, which was ranked 15th and 16th in both matches).

- NU held Middle Tennessee to -.088 hitting, the third-lowest percentage by a Husker opponent since the 2000 campaign.

- NU's victory over Long Beach State on Sept. 3 snapped a three-match losing streak to the 49ers dating back to 1985.

- Nebraska held No. 20 Louisville to 13 points in two of the three games - the Cardinals' lowest-ever total in rally scoring. In addition, it was the eighth and ninth times that NU held a ranked opponent to 15 points or less.

- The Huskers opened the season with six straight sweeps for the first time since 1976.

- Sarah Pavan earned Big 12 Player-of-the-Week honors for her performance at the Ameritas Players Challenge. In three matches, she averaged 6.70 points, 5.90 kills on .409 hitting and 2.30 digs per game.

- Nebraska wrapped up an unbeaten non-conference

•-Nebraska totaled 72 digs against K-State on Oct. 4, its highest three-game total in the rally-scoring era.

•-On Oct. 9, Jordan Larson was named Big 12 Player of the Week, as she averaged 5.17 kills and 4.17 digs per game in sweeps of Kansas State and Texas A&M.

•-On Oct. 16, Rachel Holloway was named the Big 12 Player of the Week, averaging 16.00 assists, 2.00 digs, 1.17 kills and 0.83 blocks per game in a pair of wins. She is the first Husker setter to earn the Big 12's weekly honor since 2002.

•-Nebraska became the first Big 12 team since 2004 to win at Gregory Gym, defeating No. 9 Texas, 3-2 on Oct. 18.

•-Nebraska picked up its 50th consecutive home win in a sweep of Texas A&M on Nov. 15. NU became the ninth team (11 times) in NCAA Division I history to win 50 straight home matches.

•-Sarah Pavan earned Big 12 weekly honors for the second time in 2006 on Nov. 20, averaging 7.67 kills on .557 hitting and 1.17 service aces per game.

•-Nebraska earned the outright Big 12 title with a sweep of Kansas on Nov. 22, its ninth Big 12 title in 11 years.

•-The Huskers received the top overall seed in the NCAA Tournament for the third straight season when the bracket was released on Nov. 25.

•-Nebraska advanced to the NCAA Regional for the 13th straight year following wins over American and Northern Iowa.

Huskers Look to Buck Title Trend

Nebraska looks to become the sixth team to win an NCAA title after ending the season ranked No. 1 in the final regular-season AVCA poll since the 64-team format began in 1998. The Huskers will look to become the first team since USC in 2003 to win after entering the tournament ranked No. 1. In seven of the previous eight years, the No. 1 team has advanced to the national title match, including NU in both 2000 and 2005.

Five Huskers Earn Big 12 Honors

Two-time Big 12 Player of the Year Sarah Pavan headlines a group of five Husker award winners, as the Big 12 announced its yearly honors on Nov. 28.

Pavan, a three-time, first-team All-Big 12 performer became first Husker to repeat as conference player of the year since Allison Weston in 1994 and 1995. The junior from Kitchener, Ontario, led the league in both kills (5.15) and points (6.11) per game in conference action and was fourth in service aces (0.36/gm).

Pavan was joined by a trio of teammates as first-team selections: redshirt freshman setter Rachel Holloway, junior middle blocker Tracy Stalls and

sophomore outside hitter Jordan Larson. In addition, senior Dani Busboom also shared the Big 12's Libero-of-the-Year honors with Oklahoma's Anna Monson.

A first-team All-Big 12 honoree, Holloway directed the NU offense to the best hitting percentage and most kills per game in Big 12 matches during her first season as setter for the Huskers. She averages 13.47 assists per game, including 13.59 per game in conference play, as NU ranks among the top-two nationally in kills, assists and hitting percentage.

Larson earned both first-team honors and shared the league's Defensive Player of the Year with Iowa State middle blocker Erin Boeve and Oklahoma middle blocker Eliane Santos. Larson is fourth in the Big 12 with 4.25 kills per game while ranking 10th in digs at 3.39 per game and the only player in the Big 12 in the top 10 in both kills and digs. Larson also ranks third in the Big 12 with 28 solo blocks.

Stalls rounds out Nebraska's first-team honorees, as she averages 2.65 kills and a team-best 1.44 blocks per game. She leads the Big 12 with a .406 hitting percentage and is fourth in the league in blocks.

Busboom became the first Husker to earn the Big 12's top libero honor. She leads the Big 12 with 5.07 digs per game and is on pace to become only the second player in conference history to average more than 5.00 digs a game.

Pavan Named Academic All-American of the Year

Nebraska volleyball player Sarah Pavan earned one of the most prestigious honors in college athletics on Nov. 29, as she was selected as the ESPN the Magazine Academic All-American of the Year.

A two-time first-team Academic All-American, Pavan carries a perfect 4.0 GPA in biological sciences and adds to Nebraska's NCAA-leading total of 234 Academic All-Americans. She is the fourth Husker volleyball player to earn the honor and the first since Nancy Metcalf in 2001.

Weston and Lisa Reitsma as the only group to both average more than 4.00 kills per game. In fact, two Huskers have totaled 3.80 kills in the same season only four other times.

Pavan Produces Points at Prolific Pace

Junior All-American Sarah Pavan is producing kills at a record-breaking pace in 2006. The 6-foot-5 right side hitter from Kitchener, Ontario, leads the Big 12 by more than a half kill per game (Texas Tech's Philister Sang is second with 4.68 kills per game) with 5.12 kills per game. She also leads the conference in points per game (6.02) and is hitting .315. At this pace, Pavan will re-write the Husker record books this season.

- A two-time Big 12 Player of the Year, she will look to become the first Husker to lead the Big 12 in kills since Lisa Reitsma in 1996 - the only time a Husker led the Big 12 in that category and would rank seventh on the Big 12's single-season list.

- Pavan is just the fifth Husker to total at least 500 kills in a season, joining Lisa Reitsma, Nancy Metcalf, Kathi Deboer and Allison Weston in that exclusive club.

- She is threatening to break NU's single-season record for kills per game, a mark of 5.09 kills per game that was set in 1999 by U.S. Olympian Nancy Metcalf. Pavan is on pace to become only the third Husker to average more than 5.00 kills per game.

Air Jordan's All-Around Game Shines

One of the reasons for Nebraska's continued success is the improved all-around play of outside hitter Jordan Larson. The Big 12 Freshman of the Year in 2005, she was a first-team All-Big 12 performer and was one of three players who shared the league's top defensive player honor in 2006.

Larson ranks in the top 10 in the Big 12 in kills (4.25, fourth), services aces (0.48 second), digs (3.39, 10th) and points per game (5.22, third) and is the only player in the Big 12 on the top-10 list for both kills and digs.

The Hooper, Neb., native has a team-high 20 double-doubles (kills-digs) in NU's 30 contests and picked her 20th double-double of the season with 15 kills and 14 digs against American on Dec. 1.

Larson saw her string of 10 consecutive double-doubles snapped against Missouri on Oct. 25. The streak was the longest by a Husker in the Big 12 era and included a career-high 20 kills and 10 digs against Kansas State on Oct. 4, a 14-kill, 14-dig effort at No. 15 Missouri on Oct. 11 and a 13-kill, 13-dig performance at No. 9 Texas on Oct. 18. Nebraska is 24-1 in Larson's career when she totals a double-double.

Busboom is Digging the Move to Libero

After serving as the Huskers' setter for three seasons, Dani Busboom has been the Big 12's top libero in 2006.

Busboom lead the Big 12 with 5.07 digs per game en route to sharing the league's Libero of the Year with Oklahoma's Anna Monson. The total is more impressive when you consider the league also returned its Libero of the Year in both 2004 (KSU's Angie Lastra) and 2005 (MU's Tatum Ailes).

Busboom is on pace to become only the second player in Big 12 history to average over 5.00 digs per game and broke NU's single-season record for digs with a 20-dig effort against American in the Huskers' NCAA opener. She has 502 digs, breaking Amanda McCormick's school record of 480 set in 2004.

Busboom has been a model of consistency at the position, recording double-figure digs 28 times, including a school-record stretch of 21 straight matches earlier this season. She has had at least 20

Traditionally, Nebraska's strength has been the play of its middle blockers, and junior Tracy Stalls has continued the excellence at the position in 2006, earning first-team All-Big 12 honors for the first time in her career.

Stalls averages 2.66 kills and 1.44 blocks per game while hitting .406. She leads the Big 12 in hitting percentage and is in the top-10 nationally in that category. Her hitting percentage is challenging the Big 12 single-season mark of .415 set by Missouri's Nicole Wilson in 2005.

Stalls, who is fourth in the league in blocks, reached double figures in kills 10 times this season, most recently a 10-kill effort on .476 hitting against Northern Iowa on Dec. 2. She enjoyed her best offensive performance of the year with a career-high 16 kills and 12 blocks at Colorado on Nov. 8. In addition, she has had 11 matches when she has hit over .500, highlighted by a season-high .727 (9-1-11) against Texas Tech on Sept. 23.

Stalls totaled 14 kills against Long Beach State on Sept. 3 and against Minnesota on Sept. 10. She had 13 kills and three blocks at No. 9 Texas on Oct. 18 and played one of her best matches of the year at No. 15 Missouri on Oct. 11 with nine kills and eight blocks.

The Set-Up on Holloway

Rachel Holloway made Husker history in the season opener against San Diego on Aug. 29, becoming the first NU freshman in the NCAA era (1981-present) to

start a match under the 5-1 system. While two other NU freshmen have shared time in a 6-2 offense, neither were on the court for the start of their collegiate careers.

Holloway, who graduated high school a year early and enrolled at NU last fall, impressed the Big 12 coaches enough to be a first-team selection and the league's newcomer of the year in 2006. She averages 13.47 assists per game to rank third in the Big 12 and 10th nationally, while helping the Huskers rank second nationally with a .304 hitting percentage. Holloway already holds the NU freshman assist record and tops all freshmen nationally in assists per game.

Holloway, who is second on the team with 12 double-doubles, has been named to a pair of all-tournament teams and was selected as the Big 12 Player of the Week on Oct. 16 after averaging 16.00 assists per games in wins over No. 15 Missouri and Colorado to earn her first Big 12 honor. She has helped NU hit .400 or better six times, including four times in the Huskers' last six contests, as NU hit .400 or better in three straight matches for the first time since 1998. Holloway also guided the Huskers to a .487 hitting percentage against St. Mary's - NU's best single-match performance since 2002.

Holloway, who also averages 2.62 digs and 1.17 kills per game, was impressive in a sweep of No. 8 Texas on Nov. 26, totaling 42 assists, 13 digs, four blocks and four kills on .571 hitting. She nearly posted a triple-double at Baylor on Sept. 30 with seven kills, 54 assists and 15 digs, setting season bests in both kills and digs at the time.

Holloway, who redshirted last season, has also excelled internationally, spending the summer leading the U.S. Junior National Team to a gold medal at the NORCECA Junior Championships.

Huskers Benefit from Strength of Schedule

A major reason the Huskers are the No. 1 overall seed was the schedule they faced in 2006. NU's eight non-conference opponents combined for a 177-59 (.750) regular-season record with San Diego and Minnesota reaching the Sweet 16. Seven of the eight teams reached the 20-win plateau, while six teams reached the NCAA Tournament.

Nebraska Coach John Cook has been amazingly successful during his seven seasons at the helm, posting a 216-14 record (.939 winning percentage). All 14 losses entering have come against teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament, including the

eventual NCAA champion in 2001 (Stanford), 2002 (USC) and 2005 (Washington).

A two-time AVCA National Coach of the Year, Cook has enjoyed greater success in the Big 12, going 135-5 in conference play. The Huskers have won six Big 12 titles over the last seven seasons (2000-02, 2004-06) and have dropped just 48 of the 456 conference games they have played over the past seven years.

Four Huskers Named Academic All-District

Four members of the top-ranked Nebraska volleyball team were honored on Nov. 9, with selections to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District VII Team.

The honorees included two-time All-American Sarah Pavan, who was a first-team honoree for the second straight season while Tracy Stalls, Dani Busboom and Amanda Gates were all selected for the first time. Stalls and Busboom were second-team selections, while Gates was a third-team honoree.

Huskers Strong on the Block

Nebraska volleyball has been traditionally known for its blocking attack, and the 2006 squad is looking to continue NU's blocking reputation. The Huskers, who have led the nation in blocks in five of the last six seasons, are second in the Big 12, averaging 3.20 blocks per game.

Last season, Nebraska averaged a nation-leading 4.12 blocks per game, topping the 4.00 blocks per game mark for the sixth time in school history (also 1986, 1998, 2000, 2001 and 2004) and fourth time under Head Coach John Cook.

Huskers No Strangers to Big Crowds

Nebraska is used to playing in front of the biggest crowds in college volleyball. Not only have the Huskers sold out their last 90 home matches at the 4,030-seat Nebraska Coliseum, but they also have their fingerprints on the NCAA attendance marks.

Over the last two years, there have been five matches in NCAA that have had crowds of at least 10,000 fans - and Nebraska has been a part of all five.

Nebraska is one of two teams to be ranked in the CSTV/AVCA Coaches poll for all 350 weeks of its existence. The Huskers have been ranked in the top 10 for 316 of the 350 weeks, which ranks second behind Stanford's 321.

With the No. 1 ranking in the Dec. 4 AVCA poll, the Huskers have now spent 70 weeks all-time at No. 1, the most of any Division I program, including 51 of the weeks coming since the 2000 season. UCLA is second all-time in the AVCA poll with 51 weeks ranked No. 1.

NU has been ranked No. 1 in 30 of the last 31 polls dating back to the start of 2005 and has played its last 69 matches as the nation's top-ranked team.

Husker Volleyball Signs Four

Houghttelling to Miss 2006 Season

Nebraska Head Coach John Cook announced on Aug. 8 that AVCA National Player of the Year Christina Houghttelling will miss all of the 2006 season following shoulder surgery. Houghttelling, underwent surgery on her right shoulder on July 13, and underwent arthroscopic surgery on her right knee two weeks later.

In 2005, Houghttelling averaged 3.69 kills, 2.49 digs and 1.03 blocks per game, ranking among the Big 12 leaders in kills (10th) and hitting percentage (.375, fifth).

Omaha Hosts 2006 NCAA Championships

For college volleyball teams around the country, Omaha is the destination, as the University of Nebraska and Qwest Center Omaha play host to the 2006 NCAA Championship. The NCAA semifinals take place on Thursday, Dec. 14, with the national championship match taking place on Saturday, Dec. 16.

Husker fans have come out in full force, selling out the arena in just four hours the day tickets went on sale in January. The Qwest Center hosted an NCAA Regional for the first time in 2005 to record-setting numbers. The two-day event drew an NCAA postseason record of 29,608 fans, including a near sellout of 15,119 for the regional final.

Johnson-Tagalao Inducted into BYU Hall of Fame

Nebraska assistant coach Charlene Johnson-Tagalao received a special honor earlier this fall - induction into BYU's Athletic Hall of Fame. Johnson-Tagalao was a two-time All-American during her playing career at BYU from 1991-94, earning Western Athletic Conference Player-of-the-Year honors when she guided the Cougars to an NCAA semifinal appearance in 1994.

Following her BYU career, she was a member of the U.S. National Team from 1997 to 2001, representing the United States at the Sydney Olympics in 2000.

Husker Volleyball on Television

Nebraska volleyball has been annually among the nation's most televised programs and the 2006 season is no exception. The Huskers made 11 televised appearances during the regular season, including matches on CSTV, FSN and ESPNU. The Huskers, who are 11-0 on TV this season, will look to make their 12th appearance on Saturday in the NCAA regional final against Florida or Minnesota.

Huskers Open Year with Sweep of USD

Lincoln—Behind a career-high 10 blocks from sophomore Amanda Gates, No. 1 Nebraska opened the season with a 30-18, 30-25, 31-29 victory over No. 20 San Diego on Aug. 29.

Gates, making her first career start, put on a blocking clinic against the Toreros, establishing a career high after totaling just 13 in nine matches as a freshman.

Gates led a stifling Husker defense that held San Diego (3-1) to just .016 hitting after the Toreros hit .307 in their first three wins. All-American Sarah Pavan had eight blocks and 12 kills, while outside hitter Dani Mancuso had five blocks — one off her career high — and seven kills.

NU Sweep Saint Mary's

Lincoln—All-American Sarah Pavan's 19-kill night led a potent offensive attack, as No. 1 Nebraska turned in one of its best hitting nights in school history in a 30-23, 30-19, 30-14 sweep of previously unbeaten Saint Mary's at the Nebraska Invitational.

Pavan totaled a match-high 19 kills on .600 hitting, marking the third time in her career that the Kitchener, Ontario, native hit over .600 in a match.

Huskers Topple Long Beach State

Lincoln – Tracy Stalls matched her career high with 14 kills, leading No. 1 Nebraska to a 3-0 victory (30-15, 31-29, 30-25) over Long Beach State at the Nebraska Invitational Sunday on Sept. 3.

A 6-foot-3 middle blocker from Denver, Stalls totaled 14 kills on just 20 swings and added a match-high four blocks, as the Huskers improved to 4-0 on the season and extended their home winning streak to 38 matches.

Lincoln—Behind double-doubles from Sarah Pavan and Jordan Larson, No. 1 Nebraska survived Minnesota's upset bid, posting a 28-30, 30-25, 20-22, 30-22 victory over the Golden Gophers to win the Ameritas Players Challenge on Sept. 10.

Huskers Dig Wildcats, 3-0

Lincoln—Jordan Larson totaled a career-high 20 kills, while Nebraska's floor defense keyed the top-ranked Huskers to a 30-17, 30-22, 30-17 sweep of Kansas State on Oct. 4.

Larson posted her sixth consecutive double-double with 20 kills on .400 hitting and 10 digs, as she eclipsed her previous career high of 19 kills set at Minnesota in 2005.

While Larson placed a solid offensive attack with five players totaling at least eight kills, NU's floor defense sparked the Huskers' 11th sweep in 14 matches, holding KSU to season-low .061 hitting.

NU totaled 72 digs, setting a Big 12-high for a three-game match this season and also matching its best three-match total of the rally scoring era.

Dani Busboom led the defensive effort with 19 digs, while Larson, Sarah Pavan (13 kills and 10 digs) and Rachel Holloway (46 assists and 11 digs) all recorded double-doubles. In addition, Rachel Schwartz matched her career high in digs for the fourth straight match with 14 digs.

Larson was one of two Huskers to establish career bests in kills, as freshman Kori Cooper totaled eight kills and five blocks in the win.

Huskers Sweep Texas A&M

College Station, Texas—Sarah Pavan pounded a match-high 17 kills, while Jordan Larson recorded her seventh straight double-double, powering No. 1 Nebraska to a 30-25, 30-24, 30-20 sweep of Texas A&M at G. Rollie White Coliseum on Oct. 7.

Pavan, who has averaged nearly six kills per game in her career against Texas A&M, totaled 17 kills on .394 hitting and four blocks to pace the Huskers to a .342 hitting performance, their best offensive total in nearly a month.

Huskers Take Command with 3-0 Win

Lincoln –Jordan Larson had a match-high 16 kills, leading No. 1 Nebraska past No. 17 Oklahoma, 30-19, 30-26, 30-27 in front of a season-high crowd of 4,294 at the NU Coliseum and a national television audience.

Larson narrowly missed her 17th double-double of the season, totaling 16 kills on .324 hitting, nine digs and two blocks, as the Huskers improved to 22-0 on the season and 14-0 in the Big 12. The win gave the Huskers a three-match lead over both Oklahoma and Texas in the Big 12 standings and extended the Huskers' home win streak to 49 matches.

Larson was one of three Huskers to reach double figures in kills, as Sarah Pavan had 13 kills and a team-high six blocks, while Tracy Stalls had 10 kills on .444 hitting and three blocks. It was the seventh time that Stalls has finished with at least 10 kills in a match this season.

The Huskers out-hit Oklahoma, .288-.178 and totaled 12 blocks in handing the Sooners (20-5, 11-3) only their second loss in the last 12 matches. Dani Busboom recorded a match-high 15 digs, the 19th straight match that she has been in double figures.

Colorado Upsets No. 1 Nebraska, 3-2

Boulder, Colo. – Despite a career night from Tracy Stalls, the No. 1 Nebraska volleyball team suffered its first loss of the season, falling in five games (19-30, 30-28, 15-30, 30-27, 15-12) to Colorado in front of a Coors Event Center record crowd of 4,111.

Colorado, (15-9, 11-6 Big 12) not only snapped the Huskers' 23-match win streak, but downed a No. 1 team for the first time in program history. CU's win also snapped an 18-match losing streak to Nebraska (23-1, 15-1 Big 12) that dated back to 1997.

Stalls was one of the lone bright spots for the Huskers in a losing effort, recording a career-high 16 kills while matching her personal best with 12 blocks, while hitting .357. Behind the efforts of Stalls, Nebraska dominated the overall stats, out-hitting Colorado, .229-.162, while totaling a season-high 23.5 blocks, but the Huskers were out-hit in each of the final two games, including a .308-.214 total in the finale.

Stalls was one of four Huskers to finish in double figures, as Sarah Pavan totaled 17 kills and 10 digs, while Jordan Larson and Dani Mancuso chipped in 13 and 11 kills, respectively. In all four Huskers - Stalls, Pavan, Larson and Rachel Holloway (57 assists and 13 digs) - totaled double-doubles in the loss.

Lincoln – Behind a match-high 23 kills and four aces from All-American Sarah Pavan, No. 1 Nebraska clinched a share of the Big 12 title with a 30-17, 30-20, 30-22 sweep of Baylor on Nov. 18.

NU Opens NCAA Tourney with Win over AU

Lincoln – Jordan Larson recorded her 20th double-double of the season with 16 kills and 14 digs, as No. 1 Nebraska used a strong defensive effort to hold off an upstart American squad in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Larson, who tied for team-high honors in kills with Sarah Pavan, hit .343 in the match and added four aces and four blocks, including a pair of solo stuffs. Pavan hit .387 and added five digs and a pair of blocks, as Nebraska improved to 28-1 on the season.

While Nebraska used a balanced offensive attack, it was the Huskers' defense that propelled NU to its 28th victory of the season. NU held American (26-6) below .100 hitting in three of the four games, including a -.051 mark in the first game and a -.184 attack percentage in game four. On the night, the Eagles hit just .050, more than .200 points below their season average of .279.

Highlighting the stellar defensive night for the Huskers was senior Dani Busboom, who tallied 20 digs to become NU's single-season digs leader.

The Huskers were also strong at the net, recording 16 blocks, compared to just nine for American. Junior Tracy Stalls led the block parade with 10, two shy of her season high. Dani Mancuso tied her career high with six blocks, while also matching her season high with 11 kills.

Huskers Sweep UNI for Sweet 16 Berth

Lincoln – Jordan Larson's 16 kills led three Huskers in double figures, as No. 1 Nebraska moved into the NCAA Sweet 16 with a 3-0 sweep of Northern Iowa on Dec. 2.

Larson, who topped NU in kills for the 10th time this season, led a balanced attack with 16 kills on .464 hitting, three aces and three blocks, as the Huskers hit .423 in the match. NU had six attackers hit over .300, as the Huskers' .423 hitting marked the fourth time in the last six matches that NU hit .400 or better.

Rachel Holloway guided a potent attack, finishing with 39 assists and five kills, as NU hit .400 or better in all three games for the first time this season.

Sarah Pavan and Tracy Stalls joined Larson in double figures in kills, totaling 11 and 10 kills, respectively, as Stalls hit .467 and totaled a match-high four blocks, while Pavan hit .375 on 26 swings, including seven kills in the opener.

The Huskers, who improved to 19-0 at home this season, were equally stout on defense, holding the Panthers to just .092 hitting and out-blocking UNI, 9-5. Dani Busboom led NU with 17 digs and became the first Husker to go over 500 digs in a season, while Rachel Schwartz totaled 10 digs, as NU out-dug the Panthers, 47-28.
