TEXAS TOURNAMENT FACTS

- Texas is the No. 4 seed in the NCAA tournament and is the No. 1 seed in the Gainesville Regional bracket ... All four seeded teams in the Gainesville Regional (No. 5 USC, No. 12 St. John's and No. 13 Florida) advanced to regional play ... Three Big 12 teams (Texas, Nebraska and Iowa State) remain in the tournament after first round wins and three (NU, ISU and Penn State) of UT's regular season opponents are playing in Regionals.
- Texas is making its second straight appearance in the NCAA Regional after hosting a regional in 2006 ... The Longhorns are making their 19th NCAA Regional semifinal appearance in program history
- The Horns are participating in their 24th NCAA Tournament, the fourth-most appearances in the nation ... Beginning in 1982 - the team's first NCAA Tournament - Texas advanced to 18 straight tournaments (1982-2000)
- 2007 marks the 18th season Texas has hosted first-round matches ... After its first round win against Texas State, UT is undefeated in opening round action, going 24-0 in first-round matches.
- The Longhorns are one of just three teams located east of California to win an NCAA Championship (1988), joining Nebraska (1995, 2000, 2006) and Penn State (1999).

QUICK HITS

- Texas was ranked No. 3 in the latest CSTV/AVCA poll, released Monday, Dec. 3, holding that position for the sixth straight week ... The Longhorns' ranking is their highest ranking since Sept. 17, 1996 when Texas was ranked No. 3 ... UT has been ranked in the top seven every week this season ... Texas opened the season ranked No. 4 in the preseason poll, equaling its best preseason ranking in program history (1998).
- Texas earned a total of nine Big 12 Conference awards, including five All-Big 12 First Team honors, Freshman of the Year and Coach of the Year accolades ... Head coach Jerritt Elliott claimed his second Big 12 Coach of the Year honor (2004), while outside hitter **Juliann Faucette** earned UT's second straight conference Freshman of the Year award ... Sophomore opposite hitter **Ashley Engle**, Faucette, sophomore outside hitter **Destinee Hooker**, senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** and junior middle blocker **Lauren Paolini** were named to the All-Big 12 First Team ... Senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee** was named honorable mention All-Big 12, while Faucette added All-Big 12 Freshman Team honors.
- The Longhorns extended their season-best winning streak to 22 matches with their 3-0 sweep of LSU in the NCAA Second Round ... Three Longhorns recorded double-doubles in the victory, including an 11-kill, 13-dig effort by sophomore opposite hitter **Ashley Engle** ... senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee** posted 10 kills on .692 hitting, while senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** posted 44 assists, 10 digs and seven total blocks.

Texas improved to 24-0 all-time in NCAA First Round matches with its 3-0 win over Texas State ... UT hit at a season-best .494 clip in the victory, marking its fourth highest team hitting percentage in school history ... Junior middle blocker **Lauren Paolini** headlined Texas' offense with 12 kills on .800 hitting, while senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee** registered 10 kills on .833 hitting.

Texas used four double-digit kill performances to sweep LSU, 30-21, 30-22, 30-23 in the NCAA Second Round at Gregory Gymnasium ... TV-D

In 10 career national television appearances sophomore outside hitter **Destinee Hooker** has shined ... in her first national broadcast this season, Hooker unloaded 23 kills, five blocks and a career-high 16 digs on Pepperdine ... she then notched 13 kills in Texas' national broadcast against Texas A&M and added 17 kills on .455

hitting in UT's upset of No. 1 Nebraska ... she is averaging 5.30 kills and 2.50 digs per-game on TV this season ... last season in Texas' eight nationally televised matches, Hooker recorded 124 kills, including a 4.00 kill per-game average (31 games) in those matches ... against Nebraska (Oct. 18), Hooker recorded a then career-high 24 kills on 39 swings, while hitting at a .538 clip ... Hooker has averaged 17.7 kills per-match and 4.24 kills per-game when the Horns have appeared on national television in two seasons on the Forty Acres.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Texas is currently riding a 18-match home winning streak in regular season play, dating back to Texas' win over then-No. 23 Oklahoma on Oct. 21, 2006 ... in 2007 the Longhorns are a perfect 15-0 in the friendly confines of Gregory Gymnasium, including a 3-0 sweep of No. 1 Nebraska ... Texas owns a 45-2 games won mark in its 15 home victories ... at home the Horns are hitting .392 for the season, while limiting opponents to a .159 attack mark ... Texas out-kills opponents at Gregory 18.72 p/g-to-12.79 p/g and out-blocks its foes 3.46 pg-to-1.48 pg.

TEXAS TOUGH

In Texas' 26 victories this season the Longhorns have limited their opponents to miniscule numbers ... Texas has only lost seven games in its wins, going five games with Kansas State and Iowa State and dropping one game to Texas Tech, Pepperdine and Texas A&M ... in its wins, UT has held its opponents to a .148 hitting percentage, while holding EIGHT opponents to .093 hitting or less ... the Longhorns have forced 127 reception errors in the service game and have out-killed their opponents 1518-to-1097.

CLIMBING THE CHARTS

Several current Longhorns are etching their names into the Texas career record books ... senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** claimed the top spot on the career assists chart in 2006 and **Brandy Magee** is UT's all-time leader in career hitting percentage (.375) ... senior **Alyson Jennings** moved into third place all-time in digs with her 14-dig effort against No. 1 Nebraska (Oct. 24), and currently has 1,525 career digs ... Moriarty ranks 10th all-time with 962 career digs and ties with Jennings for 11th place with 420 career games played ... Magee ranks fourth in block assists (390), eighth in total blocks (427) and 14th in kills (1056).

MORIARTY CLAIMS BIG 12 POW ACCOLADES

After recording 16.33 assists per-game and helping Texas to a .404 attack mark last week, Longhorns' senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** was named the Big 12 Conference Player of the Week (Oct. 15) ... the league honor is the second of Moriarty's career ... Moriarty led Texas to a pair of Big 12 Conference victories over Baylor and Kansas for the week, adding 2.50 digs per-game to her 16.33 assists average.

HOOVER EARNS AVCA NATIONAL POW HONORS

Sophomore outside hitter **Destinee Hooker** was named Sports Imports/AVCA National Player of the Week and Big 12 Player of the Week (Oct. 1) after leading Texas to a pair of Big 12 Conference victories over Texas Tech and Colorado ... the national honor is the first of her career, while the league honor is the fourth of her career and second this season ... in the Horns' victories she posted 5.43 kills per-game, while hitting at a .431 clip ... Hooker averaged 1.57 digs and 1.29 blocks for the week and led Texas with a team-high 6.57 points per-game.

BLOCK PARTY

At Texas Tech, the Longhorns posted their best blocking effort in over five years, tallying 20.0 total blocks ... the mark was the best UT has posted since registering 22.0 blocks against Akron on Sept. 13, 2002 ... senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee** (11 blocks), sophomore opposite hitter **Ashley Engle** (nine blocks) and sophomore outside hitter **Destinee Hooker** (eight blocks) all set new career-highs in blocks against the Red Raiders.

Texas has been in the national spotlight of late, earning coveted spots on the cover of *Volleyball Magazine* and *VBall Magazine's* Collegiate Preview issues ... Senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** was featured on the cover of *Volleyball*, while the Texas team is showcased in a four-page spread inside the magazine ... Sophomore opposite hitter/setter **Ashley Engle** graces the cover of *VBall* and is featured with a full-page Q&A inside the issue.

TAKE TWO

Texas' freshman class has been ranked No. 2 in the country by PrepVolleyball.com and *Volleyball Magazine* ... the class is highlighted by No. 2 national recruit **Juliann Faucette** and No. 3 national recruit **Jennifer Doris** ... high school All-American **Elizabeth Graham** adds depth to the class, while defensive specialists **Chelsey Klein** and **Alexandra Lewis** strengthen the Longhorns' back row.

ENGLE, HOOKER & MORIARTY GARNER PRESEASON HONORS

Sophomore opposite hitter/setter **Ashley Engle**, sophomore outside hitter **Destinee Hooker** and senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** each were chosen to the 14-member 2007 Preseason All-Big 12 Team ... all three Horns earned All-Big 12 and All-America honors in 2006.

FAB FOUR

The Horns returned four All-Americans to the 2007 squad, including senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee**, who returned after missing most of the 2006 season with a knee injury ... Magee garnered All-America honors in 2005, while **Ashley Engle**, **Michelle Moriarty** and **Destinee Hooker** each claimed All-America honors in 2006.

LIVIN' IN THE U.S.A.

In the offseason several Longhorns played in the USA Volleyball national programs ... junior **Lauren Paolini** and seniors **Michelle Moriarty** and **Alyson Jennings** competed for the U.S. A-2 teams at the 2007 USA Volleyball Adult Open championships ... sophomore **Ashley Engle** and freshman **Jennifer Doris** led the U.S. Junior National team to a fourth place finish this summer at the FIVB U-20 Junior World Championship in Nakhon Ratchasima, Thailand ... sophomore **Destinee Hooker** took time off from her usual summer track schedule to train for two weeks with the U.S. National team in Colorado Springs, Colo.

MAGEE RETURNS

Senior middle blocker **Brandy Magee**, a 2005 AVCA Third Team All-American, returns for her fifth season at Texas after missing the 2006 season with a knee injury ... Magee tore the anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee in the Longhorns' first match of the 2006 season against Wisconsin.

RECORD-BREAKER

Senior setter **Michelle Moriarty** set the Texas career record for assists in 2006, her third season at the helm of the UT offense. In the Horns' NCAA Second Round victory over Stephen F.
